- Ampelopsis Veitchei. The best known vine for covering walls. 2yr. plants 50¢ each \$5.00 per doz.
- Akebia Quinata. A graceful hardy climber, foliage small and deep green color, flowers purple. Excellent vine where dense shade is not desired. 50¢ ea.
- Actinidia, or Silver Vine. Strong hardy climber. Flowers white with purple center. Fine for covering arbors or trellises where dense shade is wanted. 2 year plants. 50¢ each.
- Euonymus Radicans. Deep green foliage, useful for covering foundation walls, or may be trimmed same as boxwood for border plants. 50¢ each.
- Euonymus Vegeta. A stronger grower than the above. Produces bright orange red berries that remain till well into the winter. One of the best hardy evergreen wall covering plants. 75¢ each.
- Polygonum or Silver Lace Vine. A most desirable flowering climber. Strong and rapid grower. Plant is covered with a mass of foamy sprays of white flowers. 75¢ each.
- Clematis Paniculata. Dense foliage covered with a mass of fragrant white flowers. 75¢ each.
