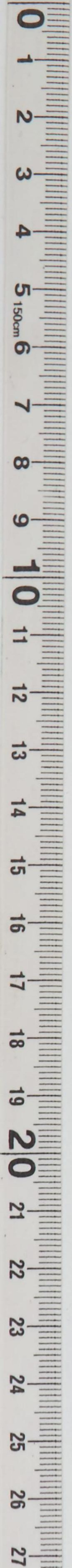

MEMO. FOR RECORD:

SUBJECT: Request for Photo Interpreters Kit, F-2

1. Problem: Photo Interpreters Kit, F-2, for 8th A requirements.
2. Corres refs:
 - a. Ltr 8th A file AGE0 413.53, subj, Request for Photo Interpreters Kit F-2, 22 Sept 49 for use 24 & 25 Div schools.
 - b. C/N #1 G-4 to Engr 24 Sept 49, same subj, requesting Engr action to secure kits.
 - c. Par 34 - Sect V AFR 67-22, 15 July 49.
3. Add. Data: Ref 2a was transmitted to Engr for action by ref 2b. Action taken by Engr was to cite provisions of ref 2c which in substance provides for transfers of supplies between Army and AF in overseas commands. Excess of requirements of an activity of either D/A or D/AF will be made available for transfer. If items are allocated between Army and Air Force components, adjustment is required in ZI between AMC and approp tech services. The indorsement prepared for CINCFE was found incorrect in that it referred to the check note ref 2a above as GHQ auth for transfer and inclosed a copy of the C/N, a type correspondence not transmitted out of GHQ-FEC. Since in addition to above the indorsement prepared was unaccompanied by any M/R it was necessary to prepare this administrative paper to comply with existing s.o.p.
4. Decision: To re-write 1st Ind as prepared by Engrs eliminating therefrom any reference to G-4-Engrs C/N, ref 2a and to prepare the necessary M/R. Copy of corrected 1st Ind and accompanying M/R to be furnished Engr for their info & file. Instant 1st Ind and M/R effect this decision.

1. Request forty (40) Photo Interpreters Kits F-2 be obtained from Far East Air Force for use in Division level Photo Interpreters Schools.
2. The following information is submitted as a basis for this request:
 - a. 24th and 25th Divisions have scheduled a six-weeks course of instruction in Photo Interpretation. These schools will train specialists for each Division.
 - b. The kits will be distributed, 20 per Division, and distribution will be made on the basis of 40 students per class in each Division, or 2 students per kit.
 - c. We are advised by Headquarters Fifth Air Force, HAGOYA, that sufficient kits are available and in storage at FEAMCOM.
3. The Photo Interpreters' school is considered essential in the training of intelligence personnel in I Corps, to further increase the standard of proficiency in Combat Intelligence.

MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD: GD SP ELT/EHM/lg 27 Sept 49

1. Problem: Request by MANED for authority to retain reproduction equipment on Mil Prop Acct 435.
2. Refs:
 - a. AR 310-5, para 8f above, is auth for CG's of overseas comds to permit acquisition by transfer and to store printing and binding equipment w/in comds. Does not auth purchase, disposal or sale as surplus items w/o approval Adj Gen.
3. Additional Data:
 - a. Govt reproduction facilities exist at Manila or vicinity in the U.S. Embassy (US Information Service Embassy Printing Plant) and at 29th Engr Topo Bn, Cavite. It is not known whether these facilities are available or capable of satisfying MANED requirements, however, para 4 of MANED ltr states "no other govt reproduction facilities locally available." Facilities of very limited nature exist at Fort Stotsenberg - ClarkAF Base which is about 60 miles from MANED Hq in Manila.
 - b. Indications are that MANED will remain for a considerable period of time in Manila in connection with rehabilitation in the Philippine Islands.
 - c. MANED has requested auth to retain equipment now in possession. CINCFE has auth to act on this request under ref 2a above.
4. Decision: Since the property in question is a procurement responsibility of the QM, and the AG is responsible for staff supervision over all matters pertaining to printing and binding, and the property under discussion is in use by the Engr, indicated action is to refer to QM and Engr for comment and to AG for recommendation.

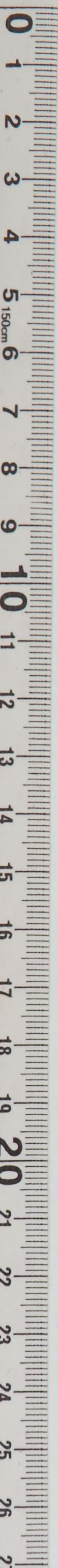

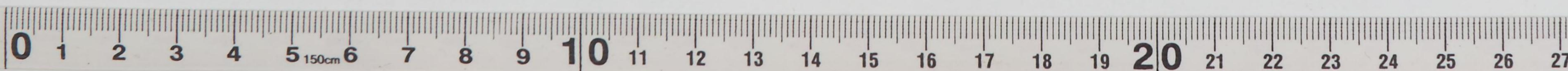

INSTRUCTIONS FOR PREPARING AND SUBMITTING FORMS REQUIRED IN
CONNECTION WITH REPORTS ON PRINTING AND DUPLICATING FACILITIES

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS:

The accompanying report, as required by the Department of Defense, is to be prepared and submitted in accordance with the instructions contained herein. The report consists of:

PART I. PRINTING AND DUPLICATING FACILITIES REPORT.
This will require as many reports as there are facilities and will include facilities operated for occupational therapy, rehabilitation and educational purposes.

PART II. PRINTING AND DUPLICATING EQUIPMENT INVENTORY.
This will require as many reports as there are facilities and will include all equipment in use as well as in storage.

DEFINITIONS:

For purposes of this report, the following definitions will be applicable.

1. "Printing or duplicating plant or unit" will be interpreted to mean equipment for printing and duplicating, or auxiliary thereto, including equipment, irrespective of location, using spirit masters, stencils, or direct-image plates; equipment for making photographic or transfer images, such as photographic negatives, photostats, blueprints, ozalid, vandykes, brown-line or black-line prints, etc. Installations engaged solely in the production of photographs, photostats, blueprints, ozalid, vandykes, brown-line or black line prints and operating apart and not furnishing such services to a printing or duplicating facility will be considered as a facility (*Printing and Duplicating*) for purpose of this survey.
2. "Office-type duplicating machine installation" will be interpreted to mean any installation using typing-machine prepared stencils, spirit masters, or direct-image plates and not having other auxiliary equipment, such as platemaking, binding, collating, drilling, or finishing operations. For the purpose of this survey such installations shall be considered as "printing and duplicating" facilities.
3. Plant. The use of the word "plant" in these instructions or on the reporting forms will be interpreted to mean any plant, unit or installation producing printing or duplicating as outlined in definitions 1 and 2 above.
4. Reports of individual machine locations will be accompanied by an explanation of the purpose served by such installation and the type of material reproduced.

COVERAGE OF REPORTS:

The military departments will have individual reports prepared by each plant, other than those at the seat of Government, now operated by them or any of their constituent bureaus, agencies, and divisions, or regional, branch, or district offices and all other field locations, including mobile units, and overseas and shipboard installations.

PART I. PRINTING AND DUPLICATING FACILITIES REPORT.

(To be prepared by the person in charge of the facility or the official on the next lower level of responsibility).

As two copies of each report submitted by the individual plants are required by the Department of Defense Administrative Management Council, each department will supplement these instructions by providing information to its reporting activities as to the number of additional copies that may be required within the parent military department, and also through what reporting channels the reports should flow. The figures required in Part I of this report will be "actual" for the fiscal year 1949 and "estimated" for the fiscal year 1950. If records for the fiscal year 1949 were not maintained, an estimate should be made

which will reflect as accurately as possible the cost of operation and the work performed. The reports will be signed by the plant, unit, or office-type duplicating supervisor or immediate responsible official.

The answers required in the upper portion of Part I, i. e., "Department" "Bureau or Division" are self explanatory. The answers required under Space are to be interpreted as follows:

SPACE:

(a) Plant Production - Area occupied by production and auxiliary plant equipment and working areas necessary thereto, including shipping and receiving areas.

(b) Plant Storage - Area occupied for storage in the plant or such storage area immediately adjacent thereto.

(c) Other Storage - Area in other buildings used for storage of plant equipment, material, supplies, etc.

(d) Plant Administration - Area occupied by the administrative and office clerical force who perform a full-time function in connection with the plant.

(e) Unused - Area that is immediately adjacent to and under jurisdiction of the plant not presently occupied.

(f) Total - The total of the square feet shown as items (a), (b), (c), (d), and (e).

PERSONNEL:

The employees reported will be only those employees, both military and civilian, charged or detailed to the plant as of 30 June 1949. If employees working on operations are not regularly assigned or detailed to the plant they will not be reported, i. e., composing and copy preparation might possibly be done by secretaries, typists, or graphic-arts personnel, none of whom are charged to or are responsible to the plant supervisor.

Military will be reported as officers or enlisted; no rank designation will be reported.

Civilian personnel will be reported as classified (Group IVb) or Non-classified (Non-IVb).

Plant. The working force engaged in performing the plant functions, which is chargeable and/or responsible to the plant supervisor. Stockroom, maintenance, shipping, etc., personnel should be reported if such work is conducted solely for the plant. Employees engaged in the operation of a common stock or supply room serving the plant as only a part of its function should not be reported.

ADMINISTRATION:

The working force engaged in performing the administrative and clerical functions directly connected with the plant.

BUDGET REPORT:

The items under "Classification of Expenditures" are self explanatory and it will be noted that no provision is made for reporting pay (salaries) of the military. For the purpose of this report, that item is not required.

(a) Material and Supplies will be reported as the amount expended for all items which are charged as a part of the operating cost of the plant.

(b) Rent and utility services will be reported only if such services are charged as a part of the operating cost of the plant.

(c) Other Contractual Services will be reported only if such services are charged as a part of the operating cost of the plant.

(d) Other - will report any charge that is a part of the operating cost of the plant and is not covered under items "a" through "c".

BUDGET REPORT (Continued)

(f) and (j) Administrative Salaries and (g) and (k) Plant Salaries will be reported as the salaries paid to all personnel, except military, as outlined under Personnel.

APPROPRIATION CHARGEABLE:

Opposite each individual item shown under "Classification of Expenditures" will be reported the appropriation to which these items of operating costs were charged. If any individual "Classification of Expenditure" item is paid out of more than one appropriation, show each appropriation chargeable and the amount chargeable to each appropriation. If front of form does not allow enough room for such reporting, the back of the form may be used. It is of extreme importance that all "appropriations chargeable" and the amount charged to each appropriation be shown in detail. Do not group or combine appropriation data.

PART II - PRINTING AND DUPLICATING EQUIPMENT INVENTORY

Space for identifying the reporting facility, also the necessary instructions for listing the equipment by classes, are printed at the top of the form. Columns 1 to 5 are self explanatory. Column 5 will report the number of hours used for fiscal year 1949. (Some machines may be in full use and others may be used only part time; i.e., a press may be operated 8 hours per day, yet a cutting machine, essential to the operation of the plant, may only be operated a few hours per day. In all such instances, report only the actual time of operation of such equipment. In column 6, the following units of production will be used for the types of machines listed in the inventory.)

Printing and Duplicating - Units are to be interpreted as follows: a unit is a single sheet printed on one side in one color, on an 8-1/2 - by - 11 inch size or smaller. If it is printed on two sides or in two colors on one side, it becomes two units. All sizes over 8-1/2 - by - 11 inches will be computed on the basis of two or more units. Example: A sheet 14 - by - 20 inches printed on one side in one color is considered four units; if printed on two sides in one color, or in two colors on one side, it is considered eight units, or, if printed on two sides in two colors each side, it is considered sixteen units.

Vari-Type, Electromatic, and similar copy typing - Pages as originally prepared for final printing or duplicating.

Linotype, Intertype, Monotype, and similar typesetting - Ems. (If production cannot be properly measured by ems, explain by footnote reference).

Photostat, Ozalid and Blueprint - Number of prints (based on 8-by-10-1/2 units).

Plate whirlers	Plates
Folding	Sheets (number of full sheets through machine)

1. C/N 1 from G-1 to G-4:
 - a. Requests ^{THAT} G-4 take the necessary steps to expedite delivery of 2 photostat machines to CG PHILCOM.
 - b. Advises that the equipment is necessary to enable CG PHILCOM to fulfill his commitments to the Veterans Administration in servicing of Philippine Army records.
2. DA radio WCL 44679, 17 Feb 49 to CG PHILCOM, info CINCFE, advised that the QMG had been requested 17 Feb 49 to ship the two machines to CG PHILCOM. The radio further advised that the machines needed overhauling and that the work would require approximately 45 days.
3. PHILCOM rad GX 30809 GSSAC, 1 Mar 49, to CG SFPE, with info DA and CINCFE, gave SFPE the requisition no. and shipping instructions for subj machines.
4. Two photostat machines were previously shipped to CG PHILCOM in January but they were in unserviceable condition upon arrival.
5. Indicated action is to dispatch a 2-part radio to DA and SFPE. The part to DA requests that every effort be made to expedite repair and shipment of the machines to the port; and requests the port to expedite shipment of the machines by MARINEX upon arrival.

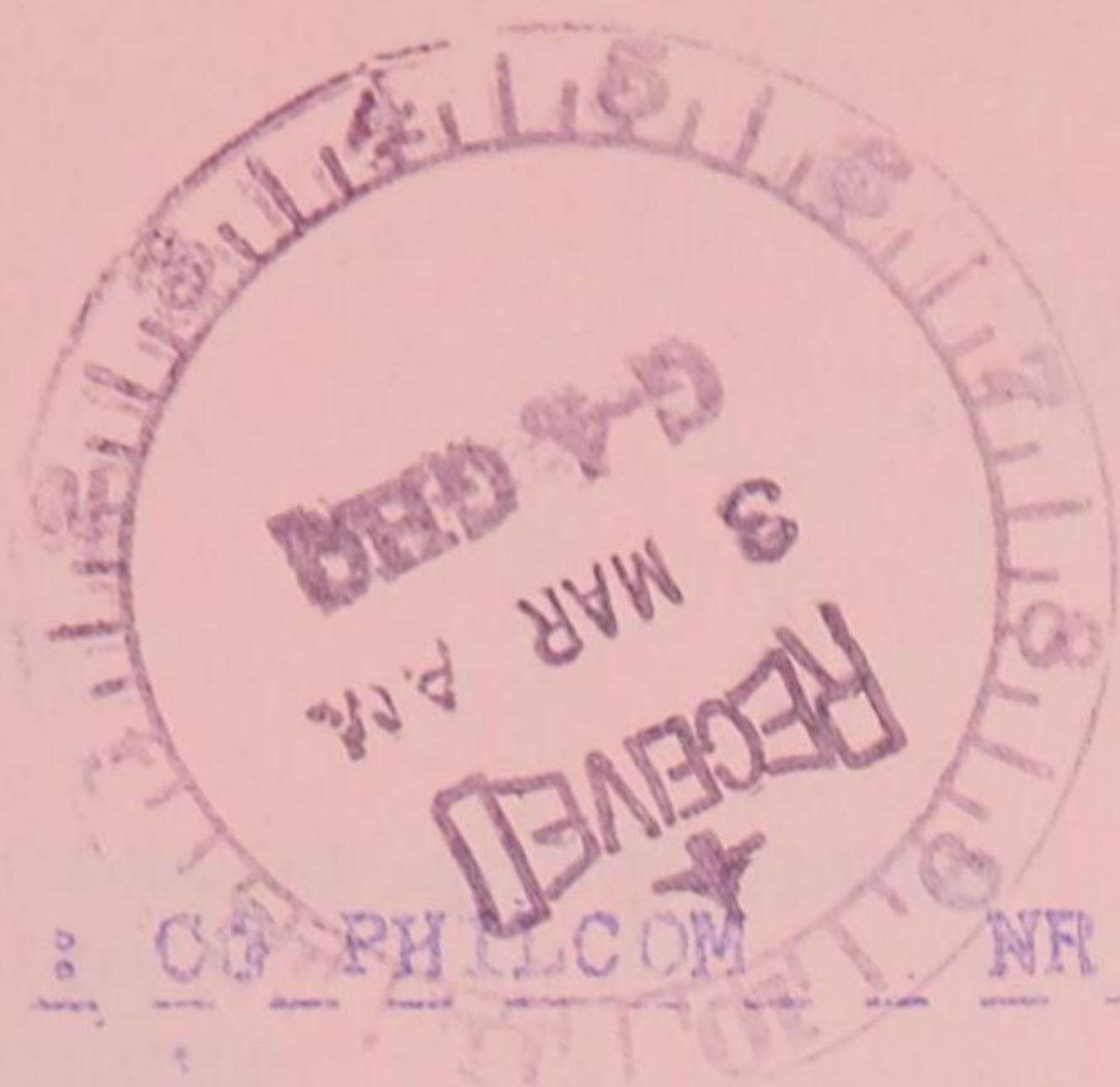

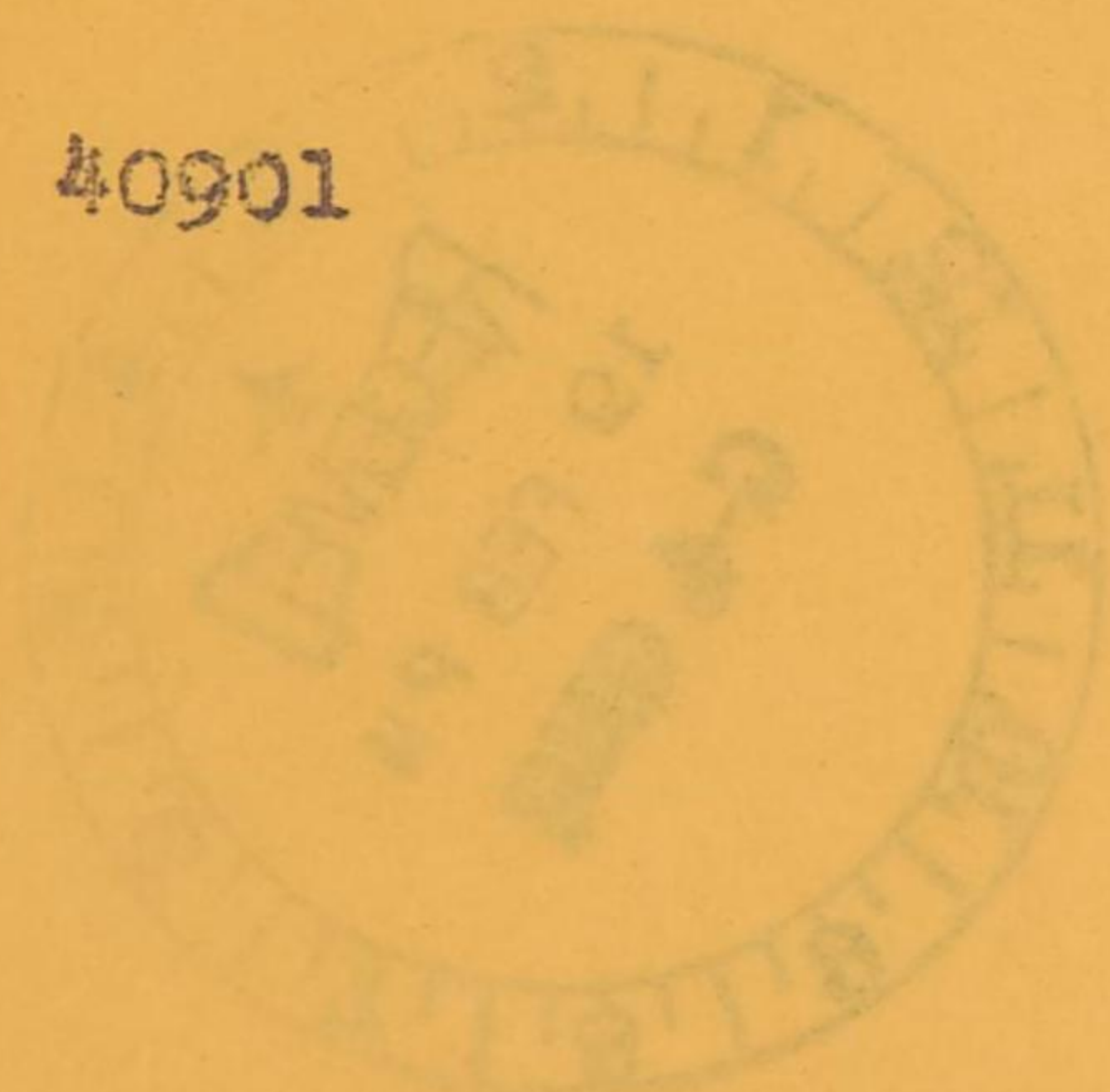

1. Problem: FEAF request that typewriters and office machines of AF units in RYCOM be sent to Japan for repair.

2. Correspondence Refs:

a. For prior history see M/R to c/n (1), G-4 to QM, 18 Jan 49, requesting info on which to base reply to FEAF 4th Ind, 10 Jan 49, which requested favorable consideration to use of Japanese sources to process typewriters and ofc machines for repair which are beyond the capacity of RYCOM repair shops.

b. C/n (2), QM to G-4, 18 Jan 49

(1) Cites G-4 c/n dtd 13 Jan 49, "Indigenous Procurement for Export to the Ryukyus", to all tech services and certain staff sections, which stated that indigenous procurement actions involving export to the Ryukyus will not be processed until further notice.

(2) Cites WCL 38756 (18 Mar 48) to Oversea Comds which stated unserviceable and uneconomically repairable typewriters may be shipped to ZI for rebuild and immediate replacement will be made from ZI stocks. PHILCOM rad G-27367 GSQMS (29 Apr 48) stated their shipment included typewriters from Philippines and Ryukyus respectively.

(3) In Sept 48 MARBO arranged with SFPE to return a 2nd shipment on same basis. Lt Col McCoy, Depot QM, RYCOM, when in Tokyo in Nov 48 was advised by QM to contact SFPE and arrange for shipping typewriters to ZI for replacement.

But RYCOM is receiving its machines as excess from other commands and it is necessary that RYCOM QM Depot process all ofc machines thru Repair Shops before issues can be made.

(3) Estimates 13th AF has 200 ofc machines in need of repair and that this load is too big for repair facilities in Okinawas.

(4) Recommends shipment of typewriters to FEAMCOM for repair under a negotiated contract with a Japanese contractor.

e. 4th Ind, Hq FEAF to CINCPAC, 10 Jan 49, requests favorable consideration be accorded the repair services of Japanese origin to process typewriters and ofc machines which are beyond the capacity of RYCOM to accept. That funds to pay for this service be provided from QSA funds available to GHQ FEC, or if funds not available recommends shipment of machines to ZI and emergency requisitions fwded to ZI for replacements.

3. Correspondence indicates inadequacy of QM repair facilities RYCOM and alleges RYCOM QM Depot has actually issued unserviceable machines to 13th AF. It is therefore pertinent that QM Sec GHQ, FEC investigate these allegations. This action fwds paper to QM for info and data on which to base reply.
