Subj Summary Steering Committee Meeting, OCT 19, 1948.

At suggestion UK member, Mr. Blaine Hoover in personal capacity spoke to Steering Committee on background Natl Public Service Law and its proposed revision. Emphasized defects present labor relations practices existing among govt employees and described how semi-independent Natl Personnel Authority with its bureaus to deal with recruitment, efficiency, compensation and equity would correct such defects.

US, USSR members proposed certain changes Second Annual Public Report on Commission Activities (FEC-316) which, in addition Replacement Lost Cultural Objects (SC-272/9); Policy Towards Japanese Shipbuilding and Shipping (SC-297/7); and Revival Aircraft and Private Munitions Plants from Japan (SC-312), was retained on agenda.

Removal Aircraft and Private Munitions Plants from Japan (SC-312): US member said there was no change his position.

NZ member stated supported UK request and described situation as QUOTE rather curious UNQUOTE. Found it difficult see why no explanation had been offered by US Added member. It appeared on face of issue that US on own motion has determined not carry into execution certain policies FEC pending determination its own policies in broader field. If that explanation incorrect Steering Committee had right ask US member for early explanation. Did not feel this issue tied up with other grave and weighty matters now known be under consideration by US Govt.

USSR member stated was interested in explanation by
US concerning alleged violations policy decisions. Chi
member stated would appreciate it if US member would give
Committee info on subj of whether certain policy decisions
are to be implemented or not.
