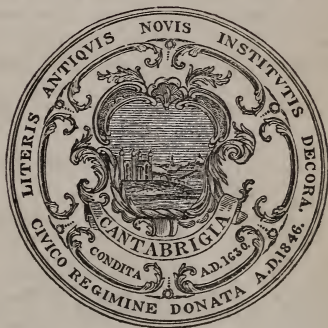

## ECLIPSES OF THE SUN AND MOON.

There will be four Eclipses this year ; two of the Sun, and two of the Moon.

I. A total Eclipse of the Sun, April 4th, invisible in America, Europe, and Africa ; but will be total and central in Australia. It will be partial in New Guinea and Borneo. This Eclipse will begin April 4th, 11h. 0m. A., and will end April 5th, 3h., 32m., M., mean time at Boston.

II. A partial Eclipse of the Moon, April 20th, a part of which will be seen at Boston, as follows :

III. An Annular Eclipse of the Sun, Sept. 28th and 29th, invisible at Boston, but may be seen in the northern part of North America, and the northern part of Europe and Asia. It will be central in Siberia, and the Sun will set eclipsed at Behring Straits. This Eclipse will begin Sept. 28th, 8h. 45m., A., and will end Sept. 29th, 1h. 44m., M., mean time at Boston.

IV. A partial Eclipse of the moon, Oct. 13th, visible in America and Europe, as follows :

CONGRESS.—The Senate is composed of two members elected by the Legislature of each State for the term of six years. Of course the number of Senators is now sixty-two. The Vice President of the United States is President of the Senate. In his absence, a President *pro tempore* is chosen by the Senate.

THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES is composed of representatives from each State, in the ratio of one to every 70,680 of the population. The present number of members is two hundred and thirty-four; and there are seven delegates, one each from Oregon, Minnesota, Utah, New Mexico, Washington, Nebraska and Kansas territories, who have a right to speak, but not to vote. The compensation of the members is \$8, and that of the Speaker \$16 per day during the session, and \$8 for every twenty miles' travel in going and returning.

Presidential election, in each state in the Union, 1st Tuesday in November.

Penny Post delivery to and from the Post Office, 1 or 2 cents.

Letters to or from California and Oregon 10 cents.

To Canada, New Brunswick, Cape Breton, Prince Edwards Island, Nova Scotia, and Newfoundland, 10 cents, when not over 3000 miles; 15 cents, if more than that distance from the line—may be prepaid or not.

Letters to Cuba, British West Indies, Chagres, Panama, Mexico, and other Foreign Places where the rates are not fixed by treaty, 10 cents, when the distance does not exceed 2500 miles—20 cents for any greater distance. *Postage must be prepaid.*

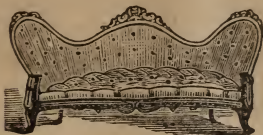
