Mining News

Roseland Camp.

The Roseland camp opens the new year under favorable auspices, the shipments for the first four days of 1902 being 3,550 tons, says the Roseland Miner.

The prospects for another record breaking year in the history of Roseland's mines seem bright. All the big mines are in better shape than ever before to produce a larger tonnage than heretofore.

It is difficult at this juncture to define with any measure of accuracy the exact programme which the various mines will follow in the present year.

Centre Star.—At the Centre Star the forthcoming year will witness consistent progress in the direction of opening up the lower levels of the mine.

War Eagle.—What has been said about the Centre Star applies in general measure to the War Eagle.

Roseland Great Western.—The Nickel Plate mine of the Roseland Great Western Company is one of the properties in the Roseland camp that is generally regarded as having a bright future ahead of it.

Splitze.—In the Splitze mine Roseland has a property that promises exceedingly well. There is every reason to believe that within the next few weeks such arrangements will be completed as will enable the Splitze Company to proceed with development on the scale and under favorable auspices which the results attained up to the present time thoroughly justify.

Green Mountain-St. Louis Consolidated.—The opening up of the Green Mountain mine has proceeded steadily, and the programme of the present year is clearly defined.

I. X. E.—It was the intention of the I. X. E. Company early last fall to resume operations in the mine, but the date of resumption was postponed and has not yet been announced.

New St. Elmo.—The programme for the year's work is an open secret. The drifts intended to tap the ore body at the west end of the claim will be carried along steadily, and the greater part of the year will be required to bring the workings to the point where they are expected to break into the extensive ore body known to exist at the portion of the claim indicated.

O. K.—During the latter part of the old year work was resumed on the O. K. by John Y. Cole, and these operations are still under way, although suspended temporarily during the holidays.

a widow and family residing at Pogo, Townsend.

**THE PILOT.**

Capt. Roberts, Former Employee of C. P. N. Company, Was Resident of This City.

Capt. George W. Roberts has long been a master mariner on this coast. He has followed sea life for twenty-nine years. He came to British Columbia twelve years ago, having previously been employed in the Buenos Ayres trade. He first shipped on the Cariboo and Fly, one of the pioneer craft on this coast, and on leaving her went as mate on the Boscovitz. Afterwards he spent eight years in the employ of the C. P. N. Company, having for long been in charge of the steamer Maude when that steamer plied regularly on the West Coast run. At different times he has had command of nearly all the fleet of the company, and since severing his connection with the company has acted as pilot on different steamers in the coasting service. For a time he was master of some of the Klondike river steamers. He had charge of the Eldorado and Bonanza King while in this latter service. Capt. Roberts has a wife and two daughters, the elder in this city, the elder being sixteen, and the younger six years of age. On the Bristol he was acting as pilot, as he has done on many voyages of the Wellington, Mananense and other vessels. He was 48 years of age, and as far as known only met with one other shipwreck, having lost his vessel, the brigantine Keldouh, in the English channel. Of three brothers, one was lost when rounding Cape Horn, and the others died some years ago. His parents still reside at River John, Nova Scotia, his birth place.

**THE COLLIER BRISTOL.**

Steamer Belonged to R. Dunsmuir & Sons, and Was Bound North.

The loss of the Bristol removes a familiar craft on this coast. She was owned by R. Dunsmuir & Sons, and was probably valued at \$60,000. Her coal cargo was probably worth a sixth of that amount. The steamer came here in 1888. She was known at that time as the Costa Rica, and carried the Hawaiian flag. Since that time she has been employed almost the entire time in the coal trade. During the first rush to the Klondike she made one or two trips to St. Michael in that service, carrying one of the largest crowds ever leaving here. On another occasion she carried coal to the fleet in Behring Sea. The steamer was an iron vessel of 1,274 tons register. She was built at Stockton in 1875 by M. Pearce & Co. for Marquis de Campo, of Punta Arenas. A few years ago the steamer was extensively overhauled here, the work being done in the upper harbor, by the Albion Iron Works.

—There was one case in the police court this morning. James McGilre, who undertook to demonstrate the speed of a team driven by him at Beacon Hill last Monday, was fined \$5 for fast driving.

—The quarterly meeting of the B. C. Board of trade will be held to-morrow afternoon at 3 o'clock, when northern transportation and other subjects of importance will be brought up for discussion.
