Reference is made to SAB Serial No. 196, dated December 20, 1946, in which certain information regarding the receipt and origination of Top Secret material was requested from the government agencies.

Although the Board has not received an official reply from you in this connection, it is my understanding that the volume of Top Secret material originated and received by the Department of State continues to be large. 
