- Two US-based data centers
- Two edge caching data centers (Netherlands, Singapore)

Current (Small) Mitigations

- Partially sourced with alternative energy

- Possible to offset with carbon credits

Global Air Travel

The IPCC has estimated that aviation is responsible for around 3.5% of anthropogenic climate change, a figure which includes both CO₂ and non-CO₂ induced effects. The IPCC has produced scenarios estimating what this figure could be in 2050. The central case estimate is that aviation's contribution could grow to 5% of the total contribution by 2050 if action is not taken to tackle these emissions, though the highest scenario is 15%.

The WMF Board recently approved a new Investment Policy

On May 8, 2018, the WMF Board approved the creation of a Long-Term Reserve Fund with a focus on investing in “companies that are focused on environmental stewardship and sustainability strategy while yielding a total return.”

Among the primary objectives is the building of a “Sustainable Investing Portfolio,” which will “focus on companies with a superior sustainability profile, particularly relating to environmental factors.
