**ROAD TRAFFIC**

**The A419 Trunk Road (Commonhead Roundabout, Swindon)  
(Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2010**

*Made* - - - - - *9 February 2010*

*Coming into force* - - - - - *13 February 2010*

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A419 Trunk Road (“the A419”), is satisfied that traffic on a length of that road in the Borough of Swindon should be prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order:-

**1.** This Order may be cited as the A419 Trunk Road (Commonhead Roundabout, Swindon) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2010 and shall come into force on 13 February 2010.

**2.** In this Order –

“the A419” means the southbound carriageway of the A419 between the tip of the nosing of the southbound exit slip road to the Commonhead Roundabout, Swindon, and the tip of the nosing of the southbound entry slip road from that roundabout;

“tip of the nosing” means the first point where an entry slip road joins the carriageway of a trunk road or the last point where an exit slip road leaves the carriageway of a trunk road;

“the works” mean works in relation to the installation of a CCTV base;

“a works period” means a period of 10 hours starting at 20.00 hours on 15 February 2010 or any subsequent day and ending when the said works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

**3.** Subject as mentioned in article 4, no person shall, during a works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the A419.

**4.** The provisions of article 3 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs and shall not apply to:

(a) a vehicle being used for police, traffic officer, fire and rescue authority or ambulance purposes;

(b) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a police officer or traffic officer in uniform;

- (c) a vehicle being used for or in connection with the works or for winter maintenance purposes.
