
Emergency Response Coordination Centre (ERCC) – ECHO Daily Map | 22/12/2015 Philippines – Severe weather



Humanitarian Aid and Civil Protection



SITUATION

- Heavy rains are still affecting several areas of northern and central Philippines, causing more floods, landslides and deaths. Four more people died in Calabarzon region (Luzon) on 19 December, due to a landslide, and another five were injured in Central Visavas.
- In the meantime, due to the passage **Typhoon MELOR** (locally known as "**NONA**") over central and northern Philippines on 14-16 December, government reported 42 deaths, 24 people injured, four people missing, 286 552 people displaced (80 210 people inside 302 evacuation centres, 206 342 people outside evacuation centres), and 246 780 houses damaged or destroyed (as of 22 December, NDRRMC).
- Moreover, due to the passage of Tropical Depression TWENTYNINE (locally named "ONYOK") over Mindanao on 18-19 December, eight houses were reported damaged in CARAGA (as of 22 December, NDRRMC).
- Over the next 24 h thunderstorms and moderate rainfall may still affect some areas of central and southern Luzon.
