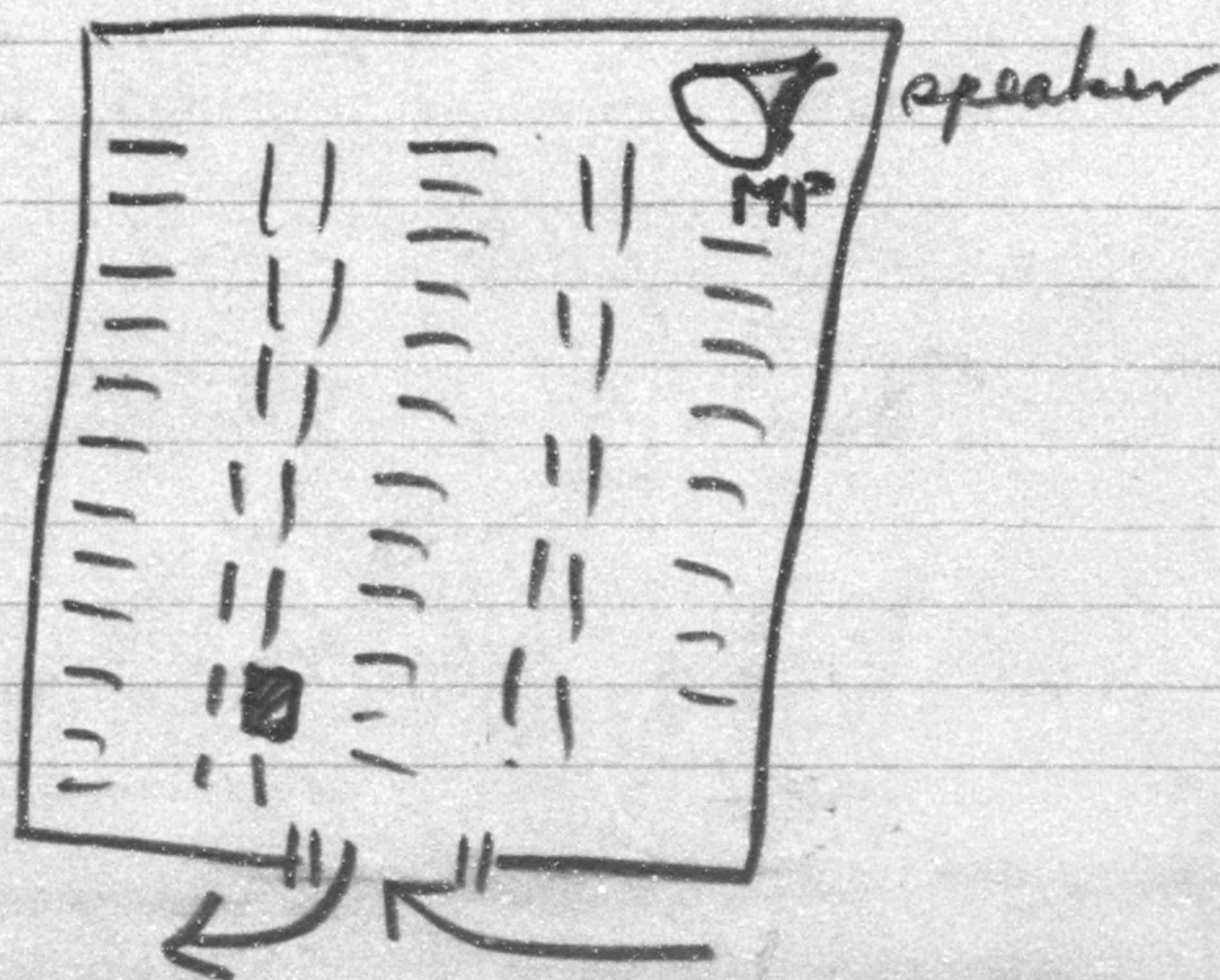


We got to the Club rather late



SUBJECT: Japanese "B" Encephalitis Immunizations

TO: Chiefs, Staff Sections, GHQ, FEC and SCAP, APO 500
Chiefs, Staff Sections and Unit Commanders, Hq & Svc Comd,
GHQ, FEC, APO 500

1. It is desired that the immunization records of all personnel who have been assigned to your unit subsequent to 1 June 1951 be checked to determine if Japanese "B" Encephalitis immunizations are up to date.

2. Personnel who require the complete series or the booster shot only, may receive these immunizations at the Tokyo General Dispensary (corner 4th Street and "Y" Avenue) on any Monday or Friday between the hours of 0830 and 1600 during the months of July and August 1951. Personnel requiring the full series of three doses will maintain an interval of three to four days between doses. Example: 1st dose on Monday; second dose on following Friday; third dose on following Monday.

3. Personnel must present immunization register WD-AGO Form 8-117 when reporting for immunization.

4. Personnel who were required to receive the complete series starting 1 June 1951 and failed to do so, are required to initiate a new series at once.



Subject: Independence Day

Note From: G-1 To: See Distribution Date: 2 July 1951

1. While Independence Day is a legal holiday, the current situation does not permit relaxation of essential support to operations in the field. In the interests of economy, staff section chiefs may suspend such activities and functions as will not jeopardize such essential support.

2. Attention is invited to the following Civilian Personnel Regulation "All * * * full-time employees, except (Temporary Wage Board employees), who are prevented from working because of the occurrence of a legal holiday, will receive pay for that day at regular straight-time rates, provided the holiday falls within the first 40 hours of the employee's regularly scheduled tour of duty. In the event the holiday falls outside the regular 40-hour basic tour of duty, no compensation will be payable for the day unless work is performed." In this connection, the regularly scheduled work week will not be rescheduled to require additional work hours or to permit additional nonwork hours for any period of the holiday which falls outside the regular 40-hour basic tour of duty. Work performed on 4 July 51 will be compensated for at holiday or overtime rates, as applicable. (Approved by C/S, 1 July 51).
