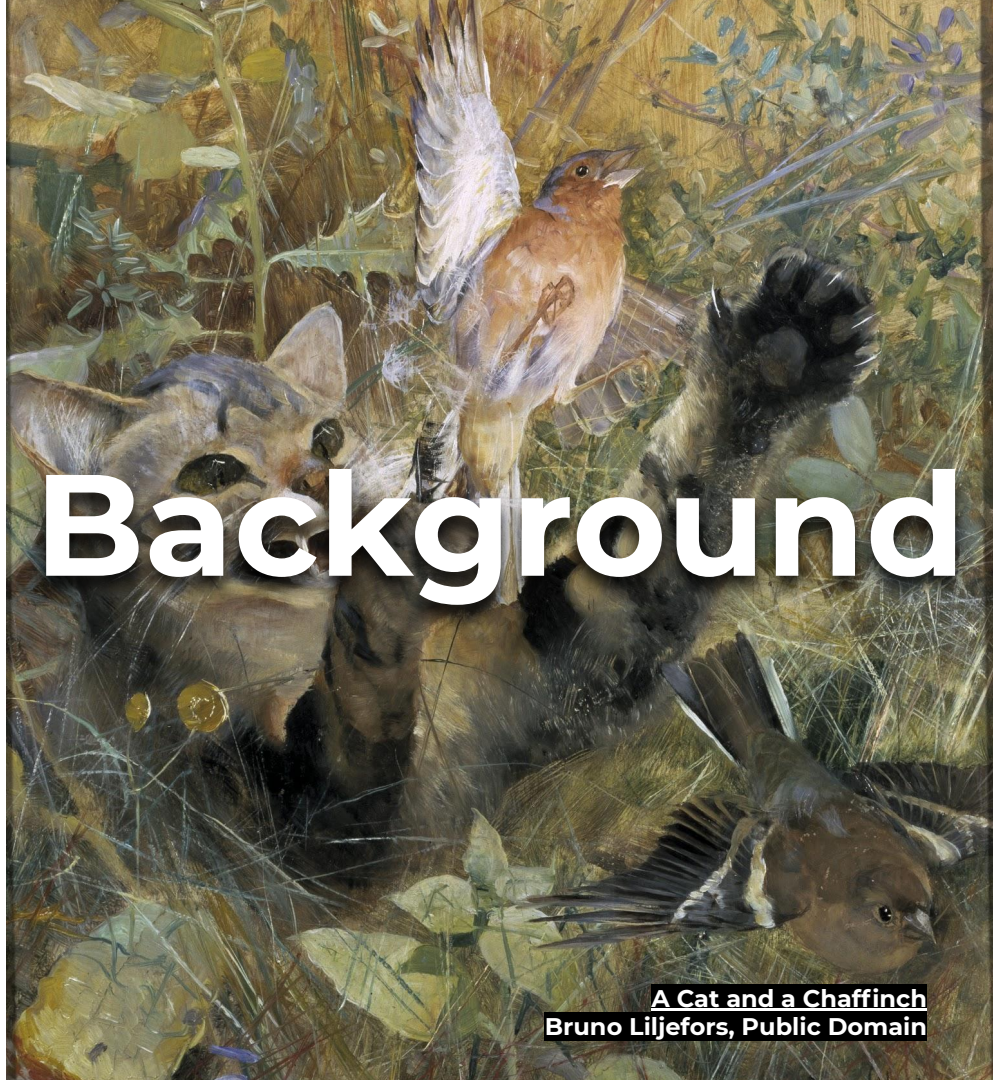
# Usable Authorities for Data-driven Cultural Heritage Research

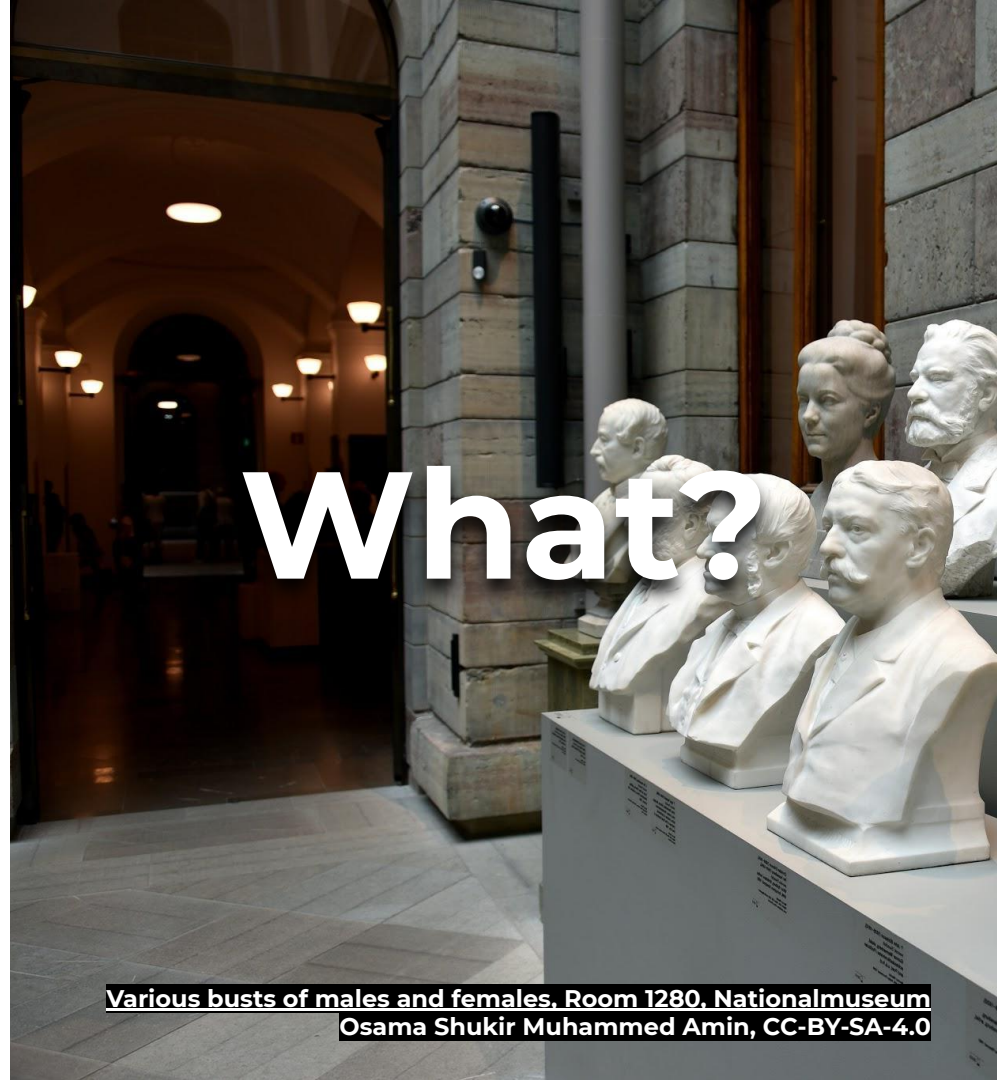

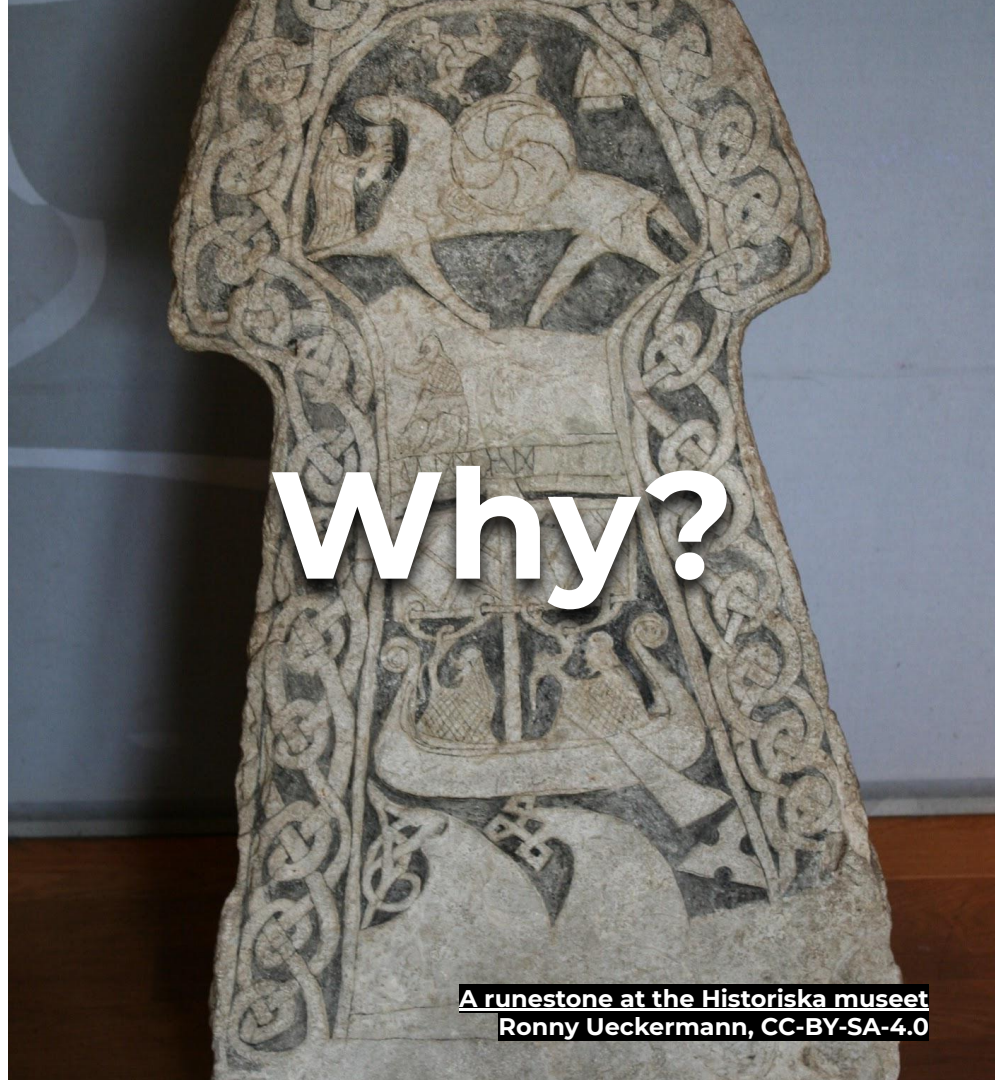

- In-house Wikidata expertise benefits the GLAM in the long term and can be shared with other institutions

- The museum staff go through and clean up their data
- Regular check-ins and training with WMSE
- Both editing Wikidata and ingesting Wikidata IDs into museums' systems
- Developing in-house skills in Wikidata, OpenRefine and SPARQL
