Dear Brother,

Yrs of - 22^d was duly rec^d. I think I can accommodate you with a loan; & yet make a small investment in + Worcester R. Road. Geo. Newbury of ^{of the city.} my ^{church} does business with "Davis & Peabody". He was in Boston East week, & had conversations with them on + subject of investment for Mrs. He frequently has Boston funds, & makes them remittances. He writes them to day on business, & if to authorize them to buy some stock for Mrs. He will remit to them + money, & thus I can save $\frac{1}{2}$ of 1 per cent, & I should have to pay for a draft.

I think I can raise 500 dols. for you, on + conditions you propose. My brother Edward owes Mrs over 300, who I presume he would be willing to pay, or let Mrs transfer + note, ^{to some one,} & raise + money on it. The security you offer seems ample; if + sum is formally made over to you on + condition of paying + debts. Should you take + ^{sum} & as said, I probably should not care about + payment of + principal for a number of years. As my salary is not due, any part of it, except at + $\frac{1}{2}$ of $\frac{1}{2}$ annually, a little semi ann^e interest would be a convenience to Mrs. I expect to start ^{late} on Monday next, on a trip of 3 weeks weeks effort, in this for + Board Missⁿ Soc^y; & expect to return on Tuesday of + week of yr anniversary; & rather think I shall then hasten on to Boston. So, I will see you on + subject of + loan.

I expect to see my brother C. next week, & then shall be prepared to let you know certainly as to ^{the} matters. I will endeavor to write you on ^{the} week of ^{the} anniversary, if I do not come over in person. What I wish in regard to ^{the} small funds at my disposal, is, perfect security rather than great interest. I have lately been applied to by ^{the} H. Miss. Soc^y to leave my pos., & take an agency for that cause in Ct. & Eastern N. H. With no domestic ties to bind me here, & no children to care for, were it not that I am very pleasantly settled ~~among~~ among an excellent & dear pos., I think I wd undertake ^{the} work. However in my occasional efforts for ^{the} cause this summer, (by a previous appointment of ^{the} State Soc^y.) I intend to press up parties to do their duty on ^{the} subject, or somehow make arrangements, so as to dispense with a permanent agent, if possible. Whenever you visit Farmington, just come this way, & make me a visit; & then take ^{the} stage for Kentford. I am pleased that you are engaged in so great & good a work, & so well sustained by salary. I trust that, with care only, you may be able to lay up something against future contingencies, if you wish.
