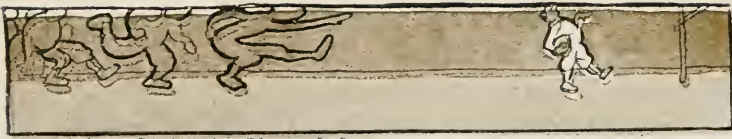


When the Captain Begins to Swear

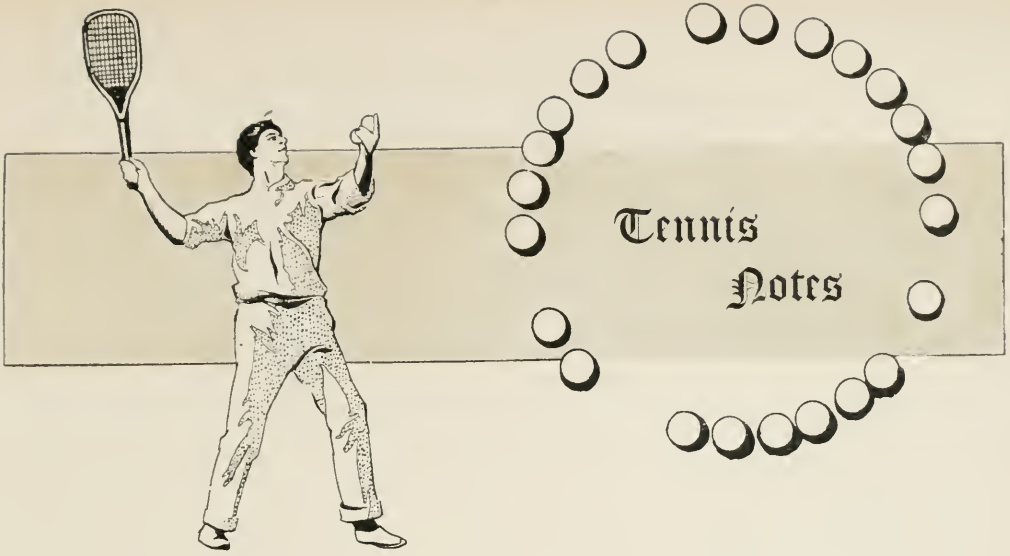

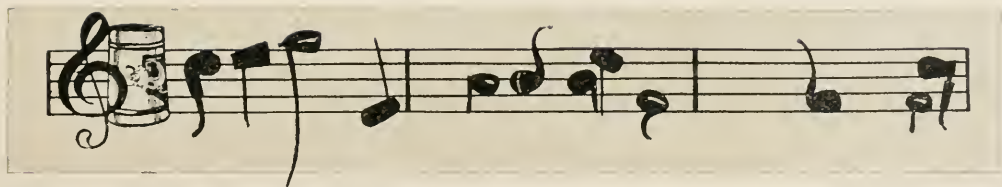

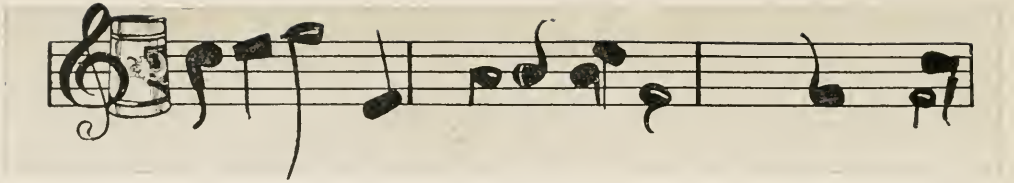

My rooms on the campus tonight.”



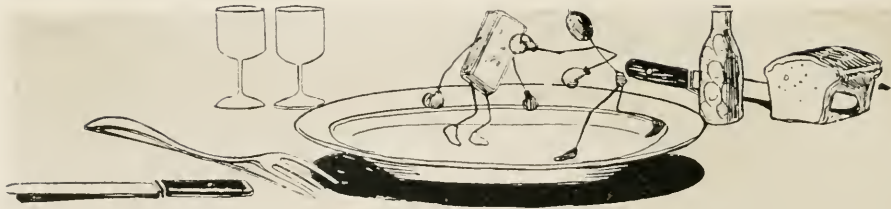
The prof he appeared on the hour,
