

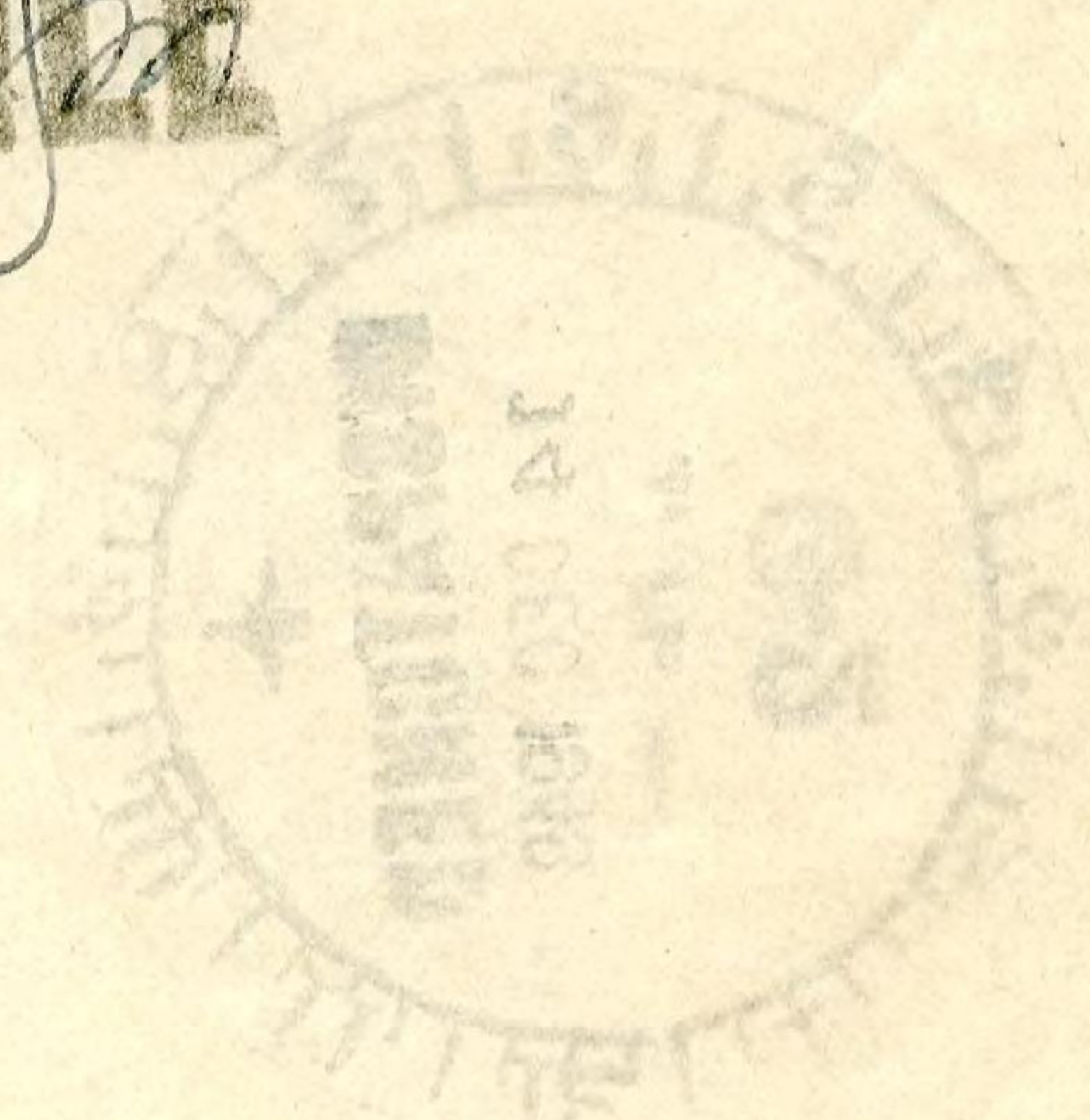

1. Reference is made to the following:
 - a. Letter, The Adjutant General, AGAO-1 322 (11 Jul 49), dated 15 July 1949, subject, Inactivation of Certain Units in the Far East Command.
 - b. Operational Instructions No. 8, Far East Command, dated 12 July 1949.
 - c. Paragraphs 71 and 72, TM 30-215.
2. Paragraph 5 of reference 1a, directs the records of the 229th CIC Detachment be shipped to the Records Administrative Center, AGO, St. Louis, Missouri.
3. Paragraph 3a(2) (d) of Annex 1, reference 1b, directs that certain records of the 229th CIC Detachment be turned over to PHILAIRCOM and that such other records, as are not needed by PHILAIRCOM, be sent to GHQ, Far East Command.
4. Under the provisions of reference 1c, the Chief, CIC, is seeking to establish at Camp Holabird, Baltimore 19, Maryland, a Central CIC file, world-wide for historical and future training purposes.
5. It would appear from the above that while the Far East Command has taken adequate steps to retain for Department of Army control some of the files of the 229th CIC Detachment, other files of more immediate interest, are to be turned over to PHILAIRCOM and therefore may be lost to Department of the Army control.

SUBJECT: Disposition of FBI Reports

TO : Director of Intelligence, General Staff, United States Army,
Washington 25, D. C.
ATTENTION: Chief, Security & Training Group

1. Clarification is desired as to the proper disposition in oversea commands of FBI full field investigations, prior to, and subsequent to final action in loyalty cases under the purview of Special Regulation 620-220-1, dated 7 October 1949.

2. It has been noted that recent letters from the Director of Intelligence, which forward FBI full field investigations, state that in the event the employee's service is terminated for any reason subsequent to a final adjudication in the case, one copy of the report of investigation will remain in the intelligence field file and be forwarded to the G-2 of the Army Area in which the individual has his permanent residence. The proper disposition of the remaining copy of the FBI full field investigation in cases of this kind is not stated.

3. Also current instructions specify that for those individuals who are finally separated from the service or transferred to another Federal Agency, before final decision is made as to their loyalty, both copies of the FBI reports of investigation will be forwarded to the Departmental Personnel Operation Branch, Civilian Personnel Division, Office of the Secretary of the Army. Attention is invited to the fact that the individual's intelligence field file in instances of this nature will not contain a copy of the FBI report and hence will not be complete when forwarded under the provision of paragraph 110b, TM 30-218.

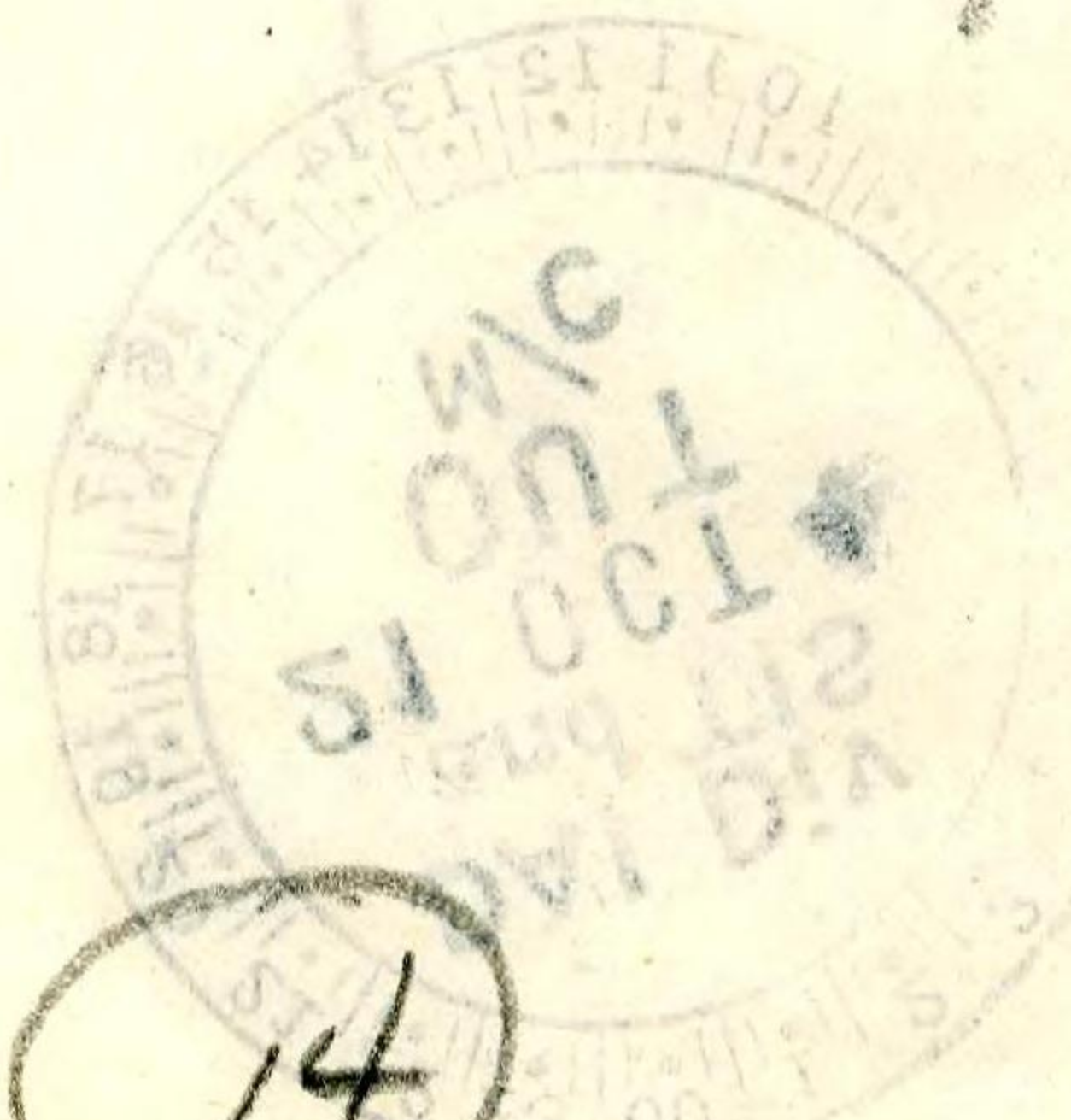

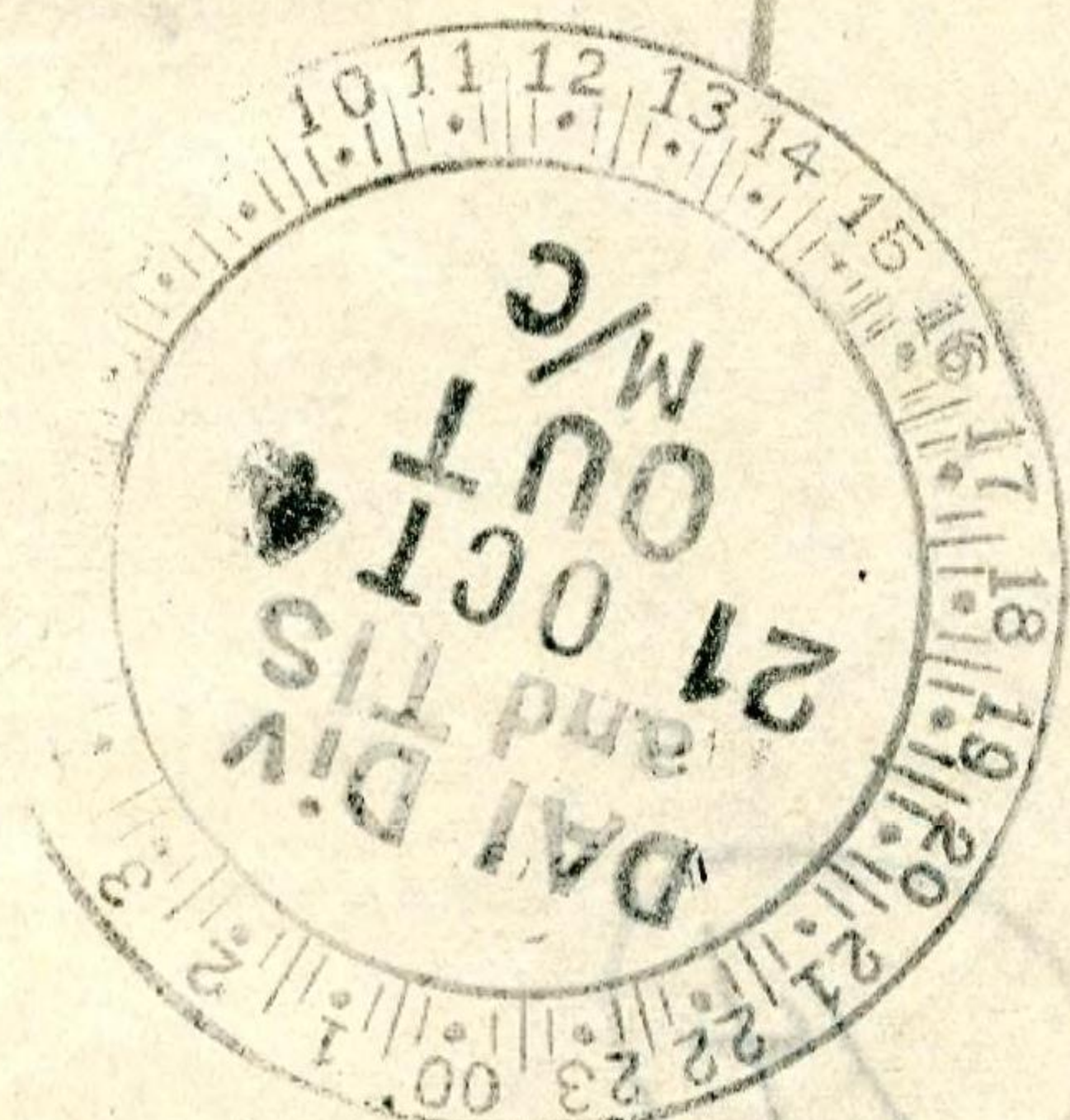

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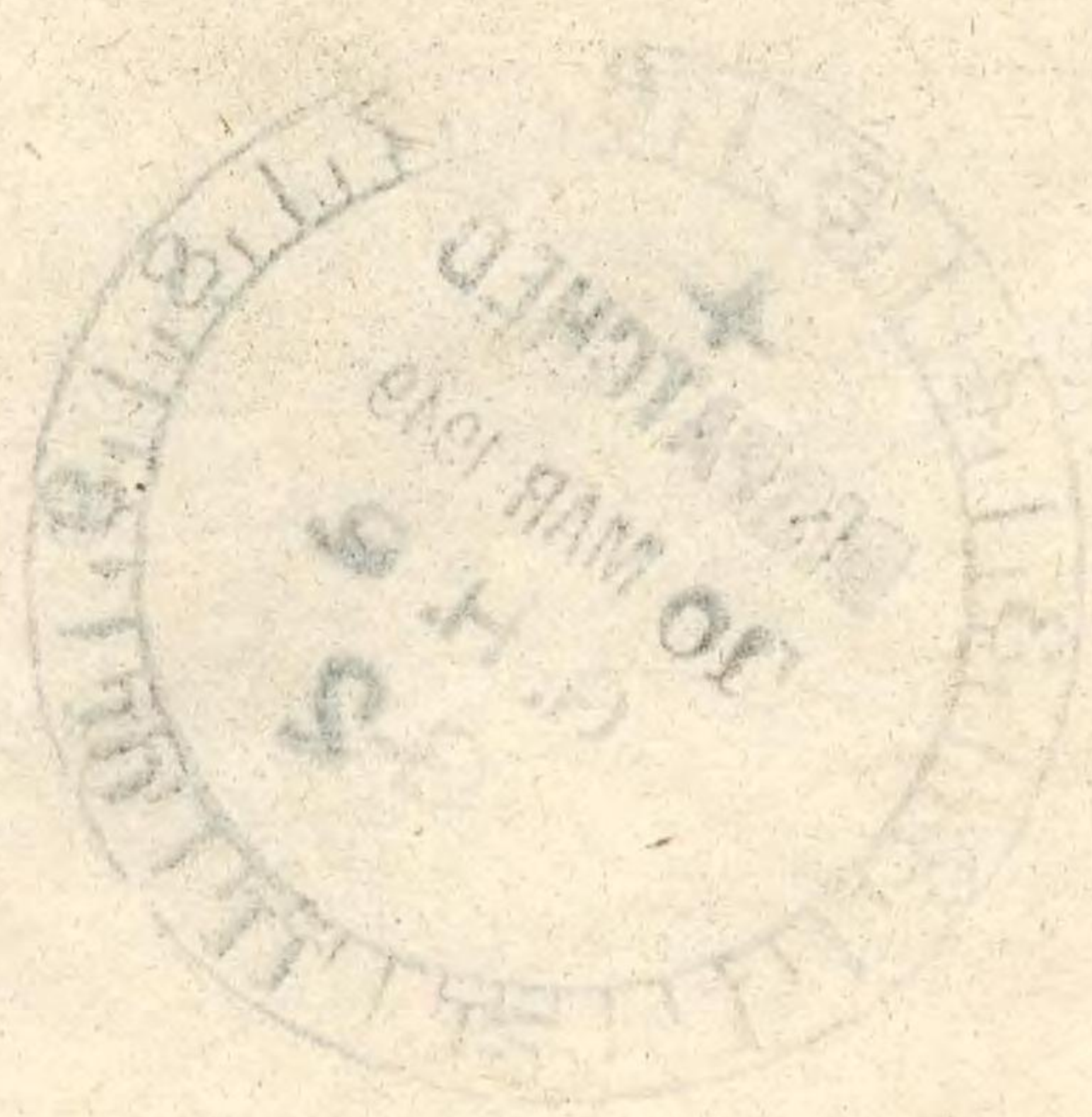

1. Reference the request of par 3, basic communication for advice covering the proper disposition of Control Files no longer of use within your command, the following statement of policy has been obtained from the Office of the Director of Intelligence, GSUSA:

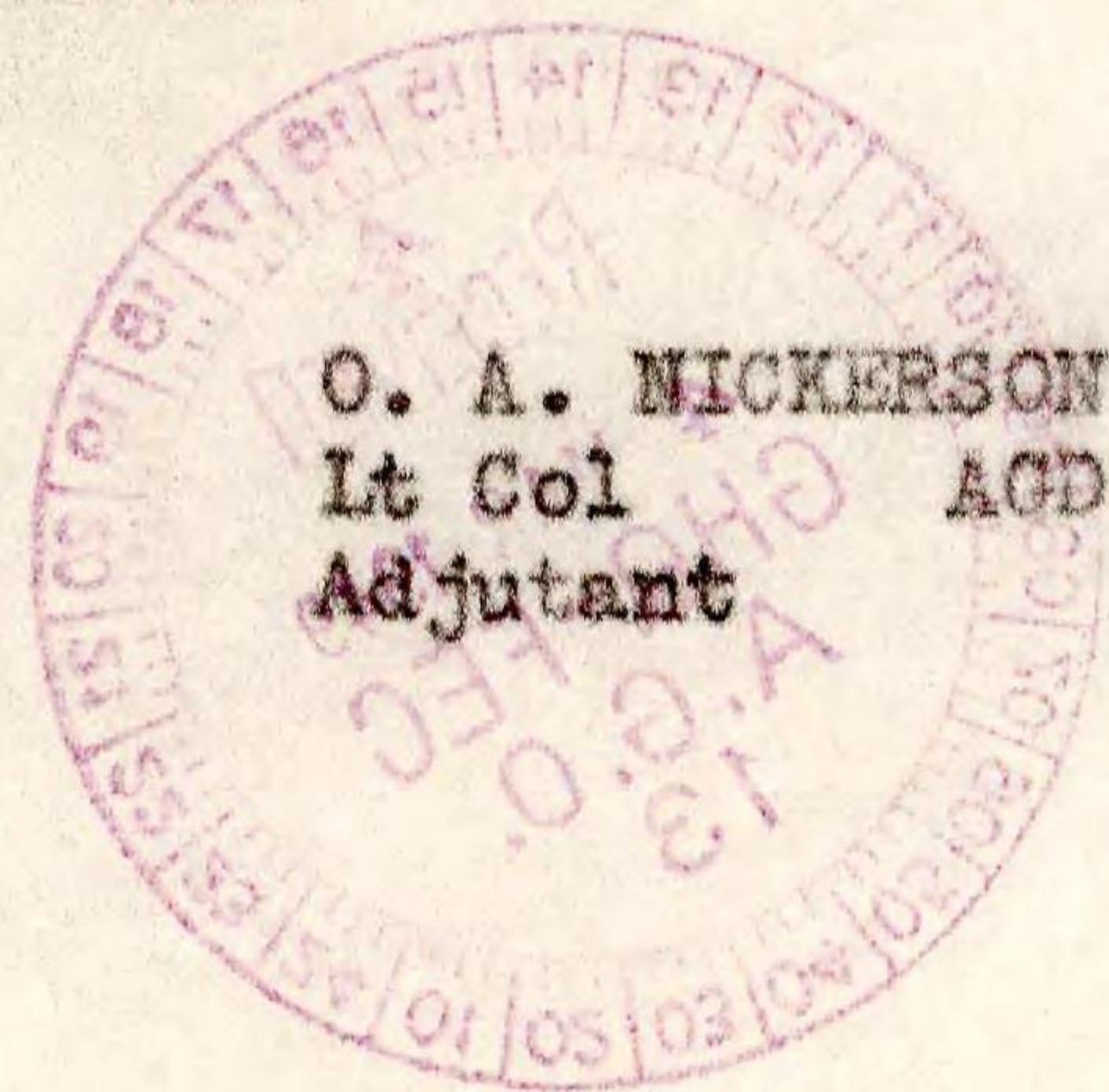
"Normally control files are not forwarded from their office of origin except in accordance with par 101, TM 30-218, for the reason that it has been found impossible, in most instances, to separate such files from the files of the headquarters concerned because of cross-references to other cases and because information valuable in the local area and not readily useable elsewhere is contained in them.

If it can be accurately determined that the control files mentioned in basic communication are of no further use to your command, those which contain derogatory information may be forwarded to the Intelligence Division, Attention: Chief, Records Section, Department of the Army, for incorporation in the Central File. Files which contain nothing more than results of ZI records check should not be forwarded as they contain no information not already present in the ZI. At the discretion of the Philippine Command, nonderogatory files may be destroyed as such files on personnel no longer connected with the Army would be of no value to the Intelligence Division."

2. Reply is forwarded through Commander-in-Chief, Far East Command for any additional comment or instructions in accordance with Far East policy.

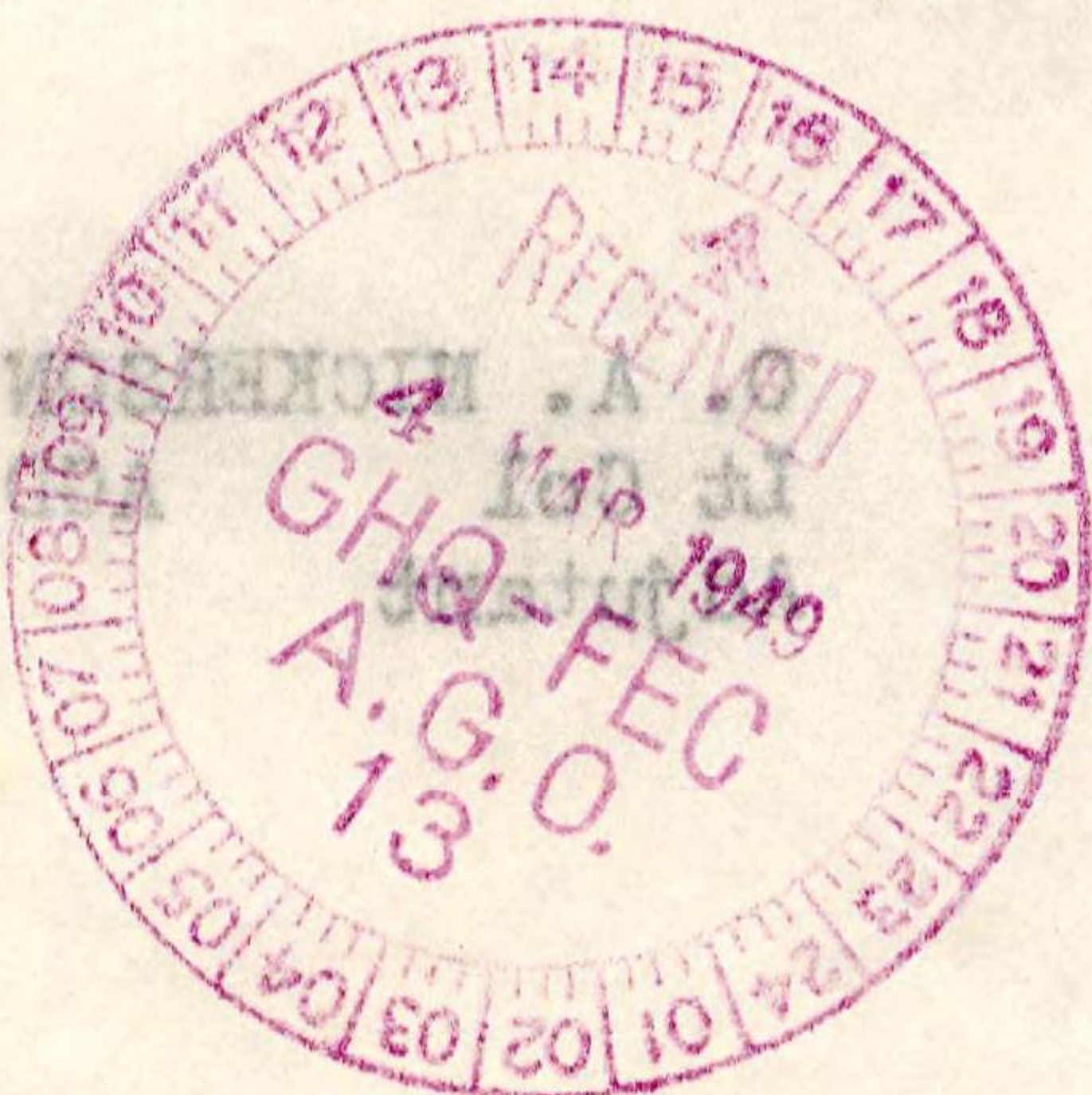
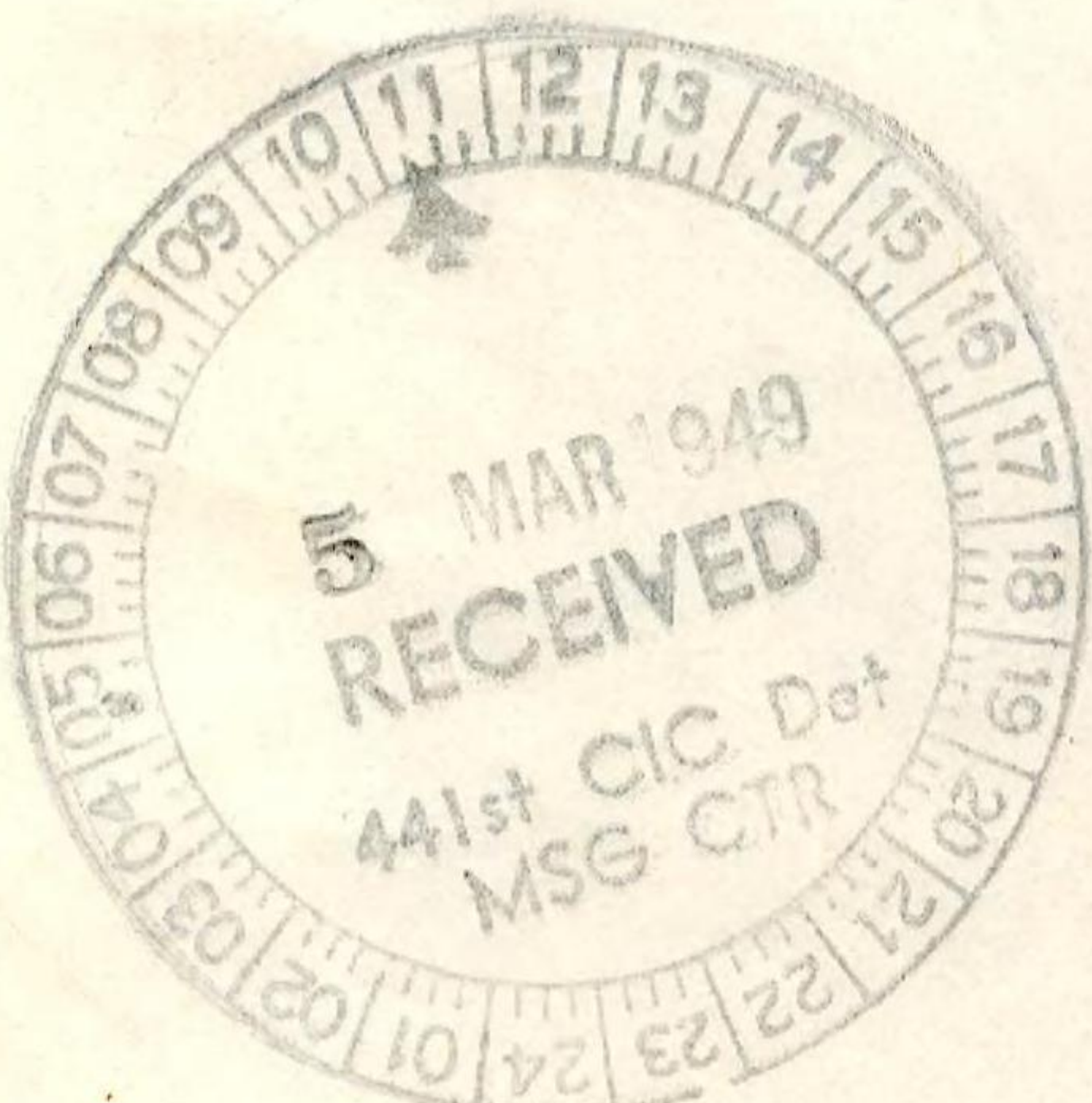
1. Reference the request of par 3, basic communication for advice covering the proper disposition of Control Files no longer of use within your command, the following statement of policy has been obtained from the Office of the Director of Intelligence, GSUSA:

"Normally control files are not forwarded from their office of origin except in accordance with par 101, TM 30-218, for the reason that it has been found impossible, in most instances, to separate such files from the files of the headquarters concerned because of cross-references to other cases and because information valuable in the local area and not readily useable elsewhere is contained in them.

If it can be accurately determined that the control files mentioned in basic communication are of no further use to your command, those which contain derogatory information may be forwarded to the Intelligence Division, Attention: Chief, Records Section, Department of the Army, for incorporation in the Central File. Files which contain nothing more than results of SI records check should not be forwarded as they contain no information not already present in the SI. At the discretion of the Philippine Command, derogatory files may be destroyed as such files on personnel no longer connected with the Army would be of no value to the Intelligence Division."

2. Reply is forwarded through Commander-in-Chief, Far East Command for any additional comment or instructions in accordance with Far East policy.
