

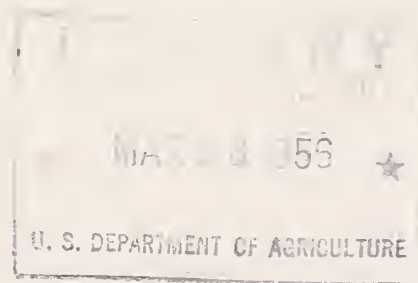

DEFINITIONS OF TERMS USED FOR REPORTING PURPOSES

1. Full-Time is the minimum number of hours constituting the official work week for a particular group or class of employees.
2. Part-Time Employees are those regularly employed on a pre-arranged schedule, whose hours or days of work are less than the prescribed hours or days of work for full-time employees in the same group or class.
3. Intermittent Employees are those employed on an irregular or occasional basis whose hours or days of work are not based on a pre-arranged schedule and who are compensated only for the time when actually employed or for services actually rendered.
4. W. O. C. (Without Compensation) represents those engaged to perform services on a regular or intermittent basis whose appointment does not provide for salary or wage payment.
5. Casual Employees are those hired informally "on the spot" for short intervals of time in connection with emergency work.
6. Persons on Leave Without Pay are those currently in a nonpay status for scheduled periods longer than 30 days (other than furlough by reduction in force).
7. Washington, D. C. Metropolitan Area includes the District of Columbia; Alexandria City, Arlington and Fairfax Counties, Falls Church City, Virginia; and Montgomery and Prince Georges Counties, Maryland.
8. Turnover Formula: Full-time accessions or separations divided by the average number of full-time employees for the period reported (the number of full-time employees at the end of the past period plus the number of full-time employees at the end of the period reported, divided by two.)

SUMMARY OF GROUPS OF EMPLOYEES REGULARLY EXCLUDED FROM THE MONTHLY REPORTS

1. All persons on a scheduled leave without pay period longer than thirty days.
2. All persons placed on furlough by reason of reduction-in-force after the last day of active duty specified in the reduction-in-force notice.
3. Casual employees (those employees hired informally by pickup "on the spot," for a definite job usually of short duration, and includes such classes as harvest hands, laborers on forest roads and trail work, emergency fire fighters). The number of casual employees will be reported from time to time when complete reports are received.
4. Personnel cooperating or collaborating with, but not appointed nor paid by the Department of Agriculture (included in this group are "ASC County Committeemen and County employees other than Committeemen, Extension Agents, REA cooperatives, Civilian Public Service Assignees, Crop Reporters, etc.). The number of those persons will be reported annually, as soon as possible after June 30 of each year.

Full-time employment of the Department of Agriculture numbered 58,738 on January 31, 1956, as compared with 59,249 on December 31, 1955. Part-time and intermittent employment totaled 18,782 as compared with 17,109 on December 31, 1955.

Total paid employment on January 31, 1956, was 77,520, an increase of 1,162 since December 31, 1955. This figure applies to total paid employment in the Department including employees outside the Continental limits of the United States and part-time workers as well as those regularly employed.

The decrease in Soil Conservation Service was due to seasonal employment. The decrease in Forest Service was due to curtailment of an active field season. The decrease in Federal Crop Insurance Corporation was due to decreased seasonal activities.



There were more Committeemen who performed service during the month which accounts for the increase in employment in the Farmers Home Administration.

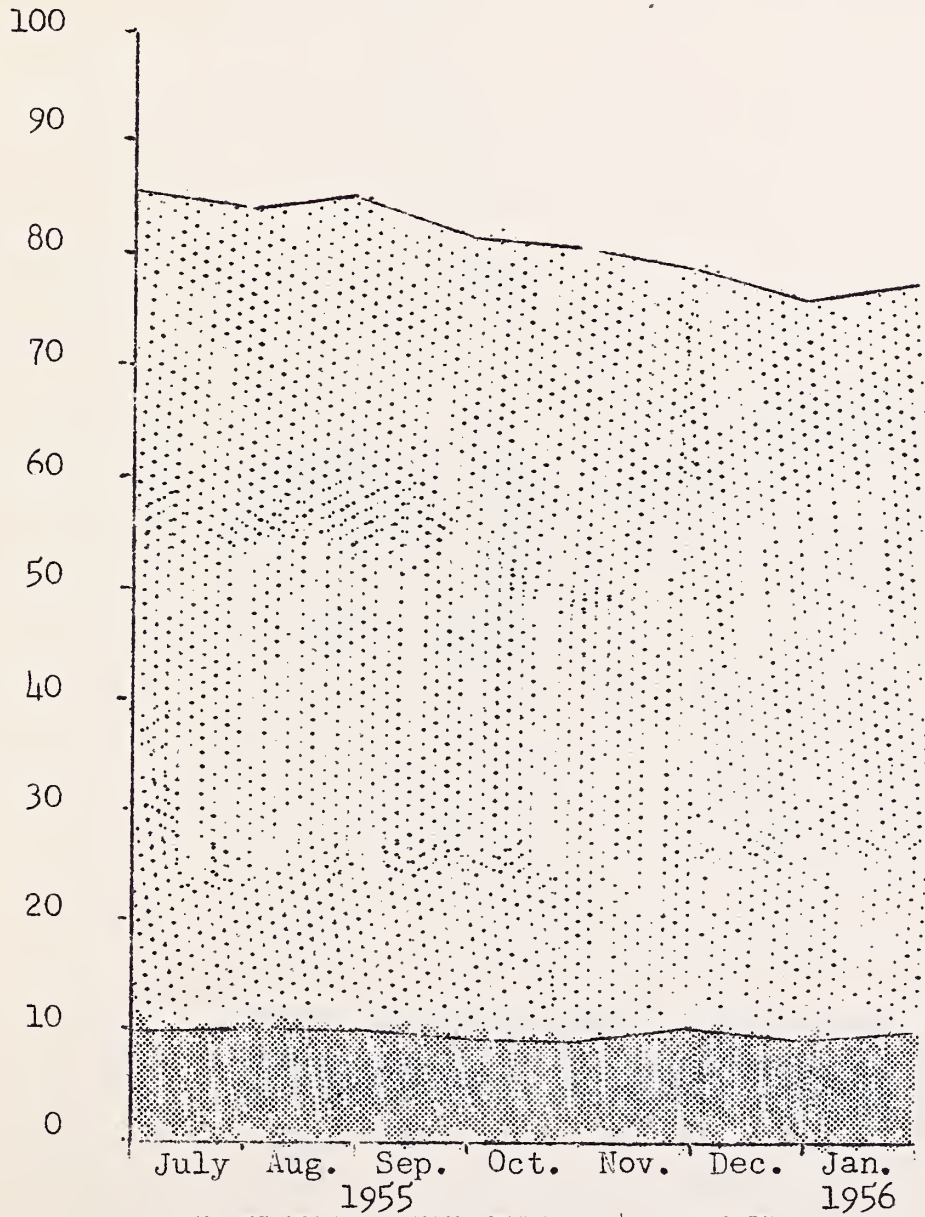
The separations from the Department on January 31, 1956, of full-time personnel within the Continental limits of the U. S., including temporary employees amounted to 1,583, or 2.7 percent, a decrease of 0.7 percent since December 31, 1955. There were 121 separations or 1.2 percent in the Washington, D. C. Area, no change since December 31, 1955. Outside the Washington, D. C. Area, there were 1,462 separations, or 3.0 percent, a decrease of 0.9 percent since December 31, 1955.

The greatest percentage of separations falls in the terminations group which consists of separations of temporary employees, termination of excepted appointments, etc.

 BY MONTHS FOR CURRENT FISCAL YEAR




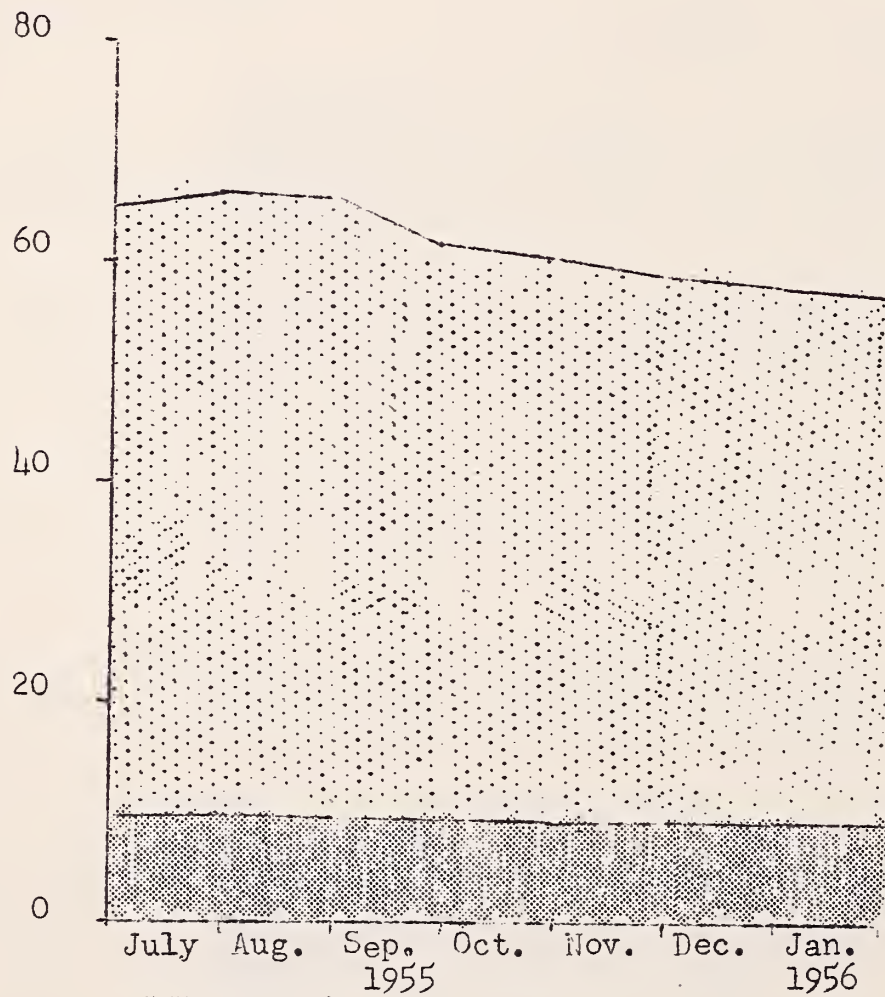

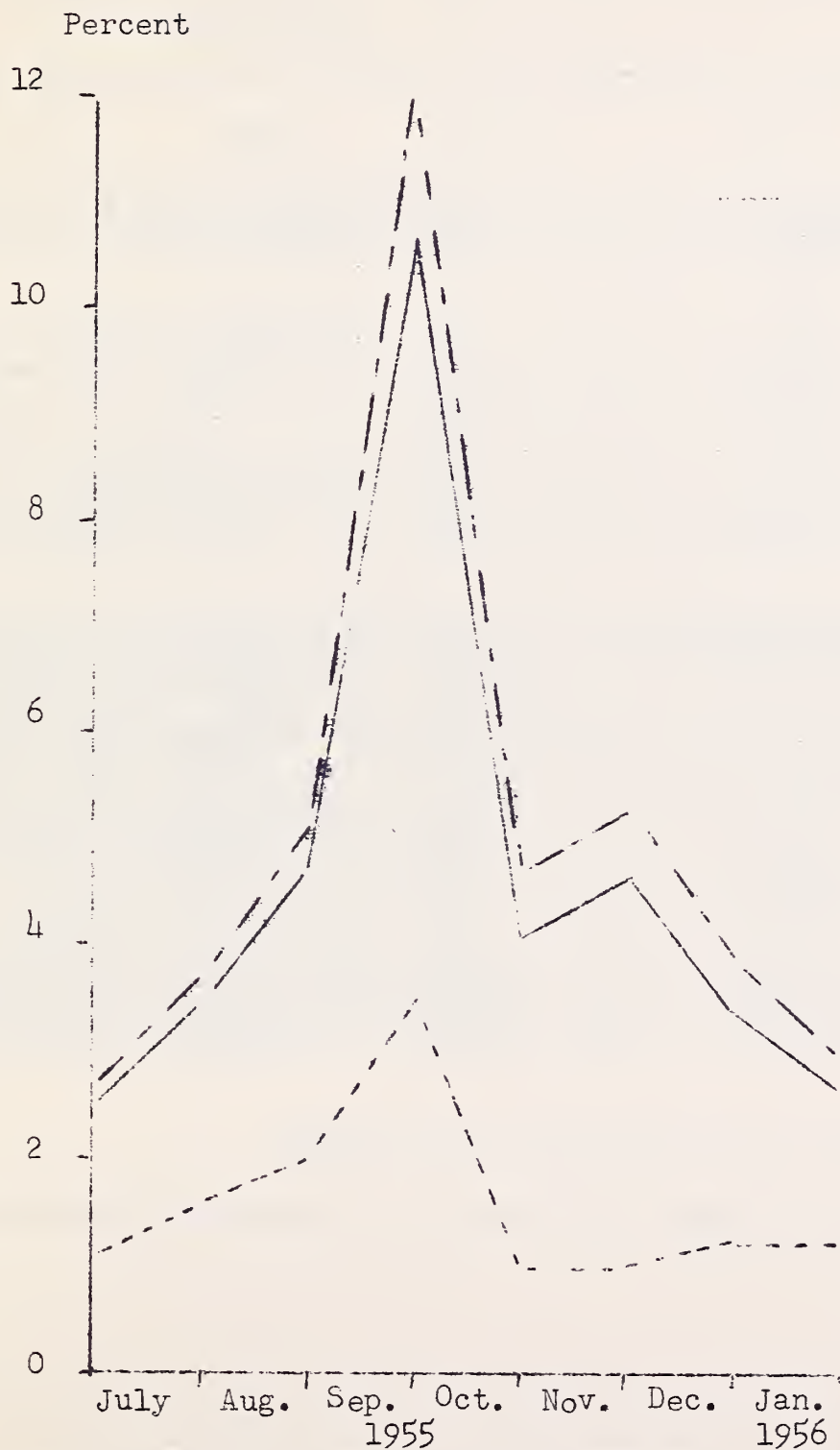

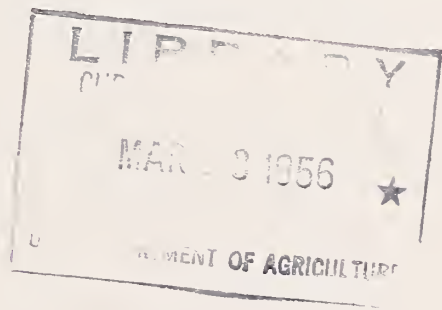

Total paid employment on February 29, 1956, was 77,080, a decrease of 440 since January 31, 1956. This figure applies to total paid employment in the Department including employees outside the Continental limits of the United States and part-time workers as well as those regularly employed.

The decrease in Soil Conservation Service was due to seasonal employment. The decrease in Forest Service was due to curtailment of an active field season. The decrease in Federal Crop Insurance Corporation was due to decreased seasonal activities.

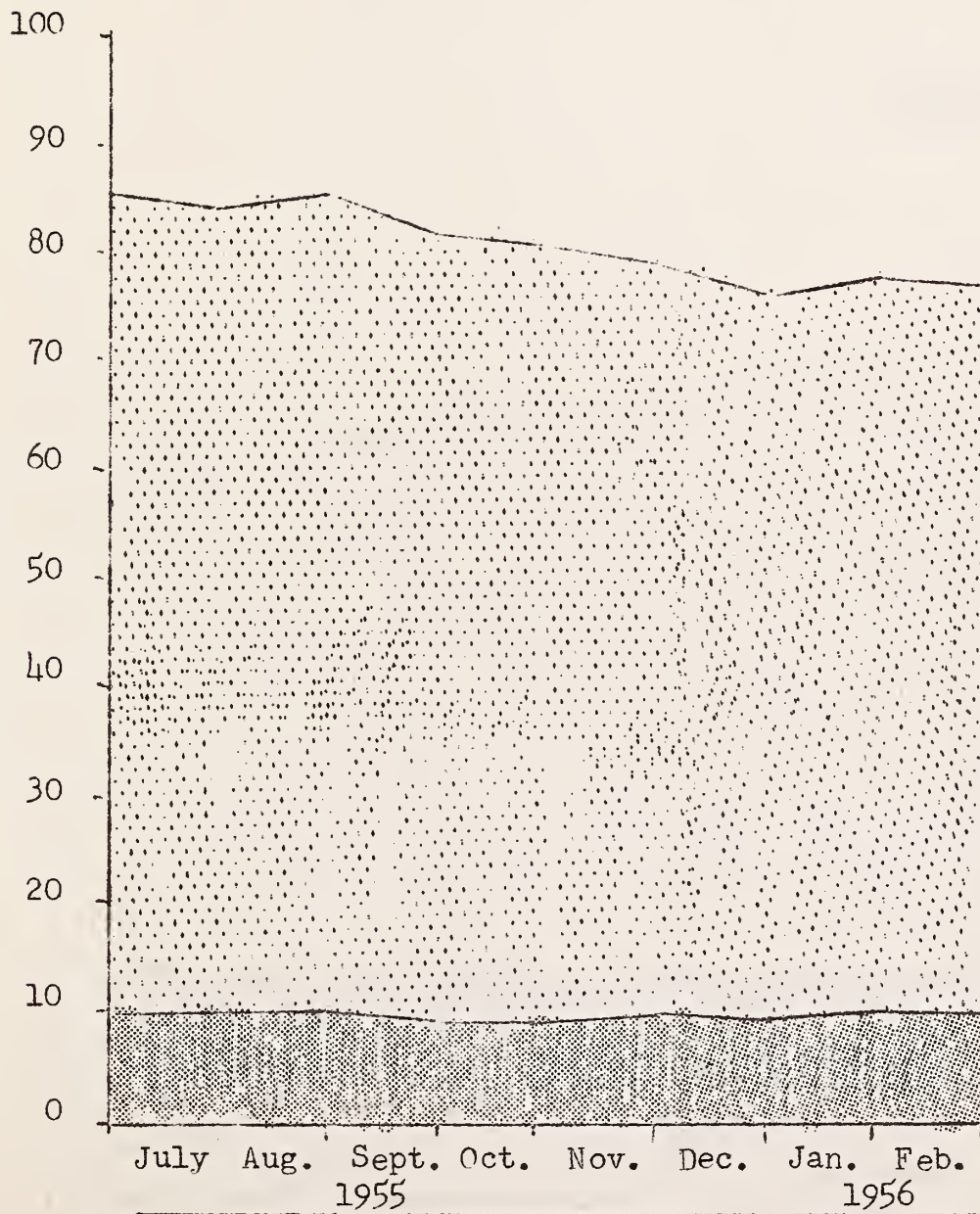
The separations from the Department on February 29, 1956, of full-time personnel within the Continental limits of the U. S., including temporary employees amounted to 1,043, or 1.8 percent, a decrease of 0.9 percent since January 31, 1956. There were 93 separations or 0.9 percent in the Washington, D. C. Area, a decrease of 0.3 since January 31, 1956. Outside the Washington, D. C. Area, there were 950 separations, or 2.0 percent, a decrease of 1.0 percent since January 31, 1956.

The greatest percentage of separations falls in the terminations group which consists of separations of temporary employees, termination of excepted appointments, etc.

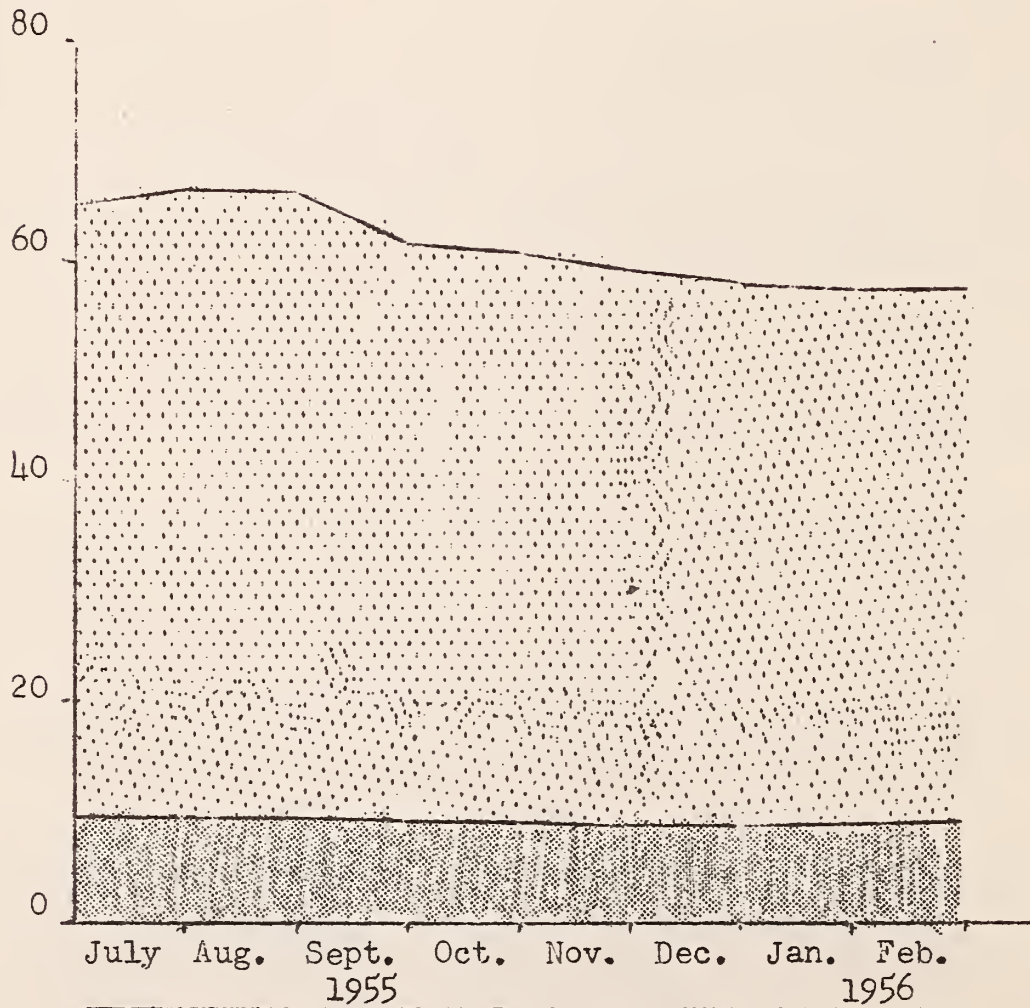

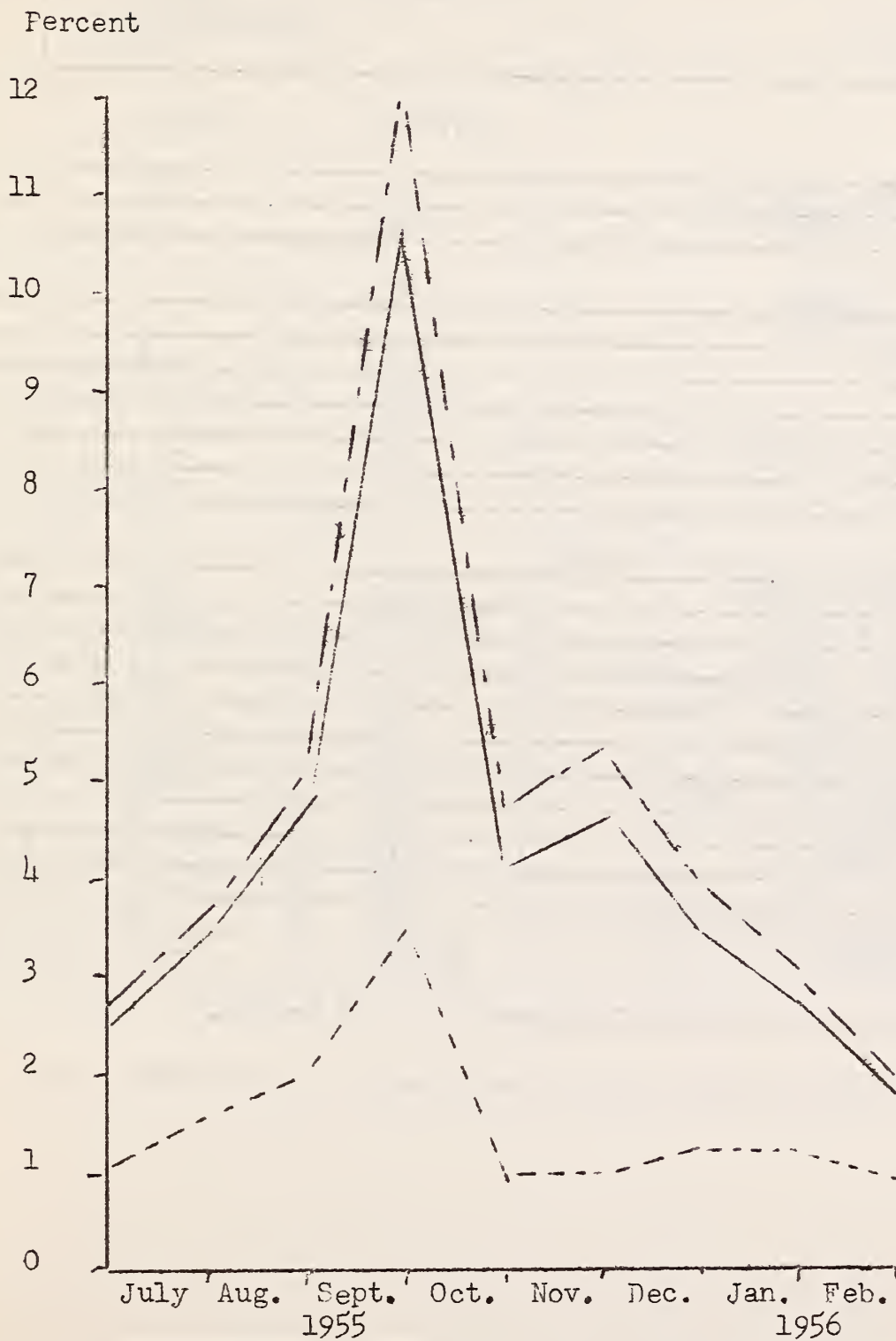

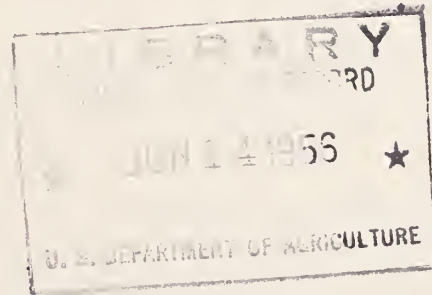

DEFINITIONS OF TERMS USED FOR REPORTING PURPOSES

1. Full-Time is the minimum number of hours constituting the official work week for a particular group or class of employees.
2. Part-Time Employees are those regularly employed on a pre-arranged schedule, whose hours or days of work are less than the prescribed hours or days of work for full-time employees in the same group or class.
3. Intermittent Employees are those employed on an irregular or occasional basis whose hours or days of work are not based on a pre-arranged schedule and who are compensated only for the time when actually employed or for services actually rendered.
4. W. O. C. (Without Compensation) represents those engaged to perform services on a regular or intermittent basis whose appointment does not provide for salary or wage payment.
5. Casual Employees are those hired informally "on the spot" for short intervals of time in connection with emergency work.
6. Persons on Leave Without Pay are those currently in a nonpay status for scheduled periods longer than 30 days (other than furlough by reduction in force).
7. Washington, D. C. Metropolitan Area includes the District of Columbia; Alexandria City, Arlington and Fairfax Counties, Falls Church City, Virginia; and Montgomery and Prince Georges Counties, Maryland.
8. Turnover Formula: Full-time accessions or separations divided by the average number of full-time employees for the period reported (the number of full-time employees at the end of the past period plus the number of full-time employees at the end of the period reported, divided by two.)

SUMMARY OF GROUPS OF EMPLOYEES REGULARLY EXCLUDED FROM THE MONTHLY REPORTS

1. All persons on a scheduled leave without pay period longer than thirty days.
2. All persons placed on furlough by reason of reduction-in-force after the last day of active duty specified in the reduction-in-force notice.
3. Casual employees (those employees hired informally by pickup "on the spot," for a definite job usually of short duration, and includes such classes as harvest hands, laborers on forest roads and trail work, emergency fire fighters). The number of casual employees will be reported from time to time when complete reports are received.
4. Personnel cooperating or collaborating with, but not appointed nor paid by the Department of Agriculture (included in this group are "ASC County Committeemen and County employees other than Committeemen, Extension Agents, REA cooperatives, Civilian Public Service Assignees, Crop Reporters, etc.). The number of those persons will be reported annually, as soon as possible after June 30 of each year.

Full-time employment of the Department of Agriculture numbered 59,262 on March 31, 1956, as compared with 59,249 on December 31, 1955. Part-time and intermittent employment totaled 19,523 as compared with 17,109 on December 31, 1955.

Total paid employment on March 31, 1956, was 78,785, an increase of 2,427 from the December 31, 1955 figure. This figure applies to total paid employment in the Department including employees outside the Continental limits of the United States and part-time workers as well as those regularly employed.

The increase in the Agricultural Research Service was due to seasonal increase in fee basis employees in the Animal Disease Eradication Branch. The increase in Federal Crop Insurance Corporation was due to increased activities and the increase in the Forest Service was due to the spring planting season. The decrease in Agricultural Marketing Service was due to putting tobacco inspectors on LWOP.

There were more Committeemen who performed service during the month which accounts for the increase in employment in the Farmers Home Administration.

Full-time employment of the Department of Agriculture numbered 59,262 on March 31, 1956, as compared with 58,785 on February 29, 1956. Part-time and intermittent employment totaled 19,523 as compared with 18,295 on February 29, 1956.

Total paid employment on March 31, 1956, was 78,785, an increase of 1,705 since February 29, 1956. This figure applies to total paid employment in the Department including employees outside the Continental limits of the United States and part-time workers as well as those regularly employed.

The increase in the Agricultural Research Service was due to seasonal increase in fee basis employees in the Animal Disease Eradication Branch. The increase in Federal Crop Insurance Corporation was due to increased activities and the increase in the Forest Service was due to the spring planting season. The decrease in Agricultural Marketing Service was due to putting tobacco inspectors on LWOP.

There were more Committeemen who performed service during the month which accounts for the increase in employment in the Farmers Home Administration.

TURNOVER

The separations from the Department on March 31, 1956, of full-time personnel within the Continental limits of the U. S., including temporary employees amounted to 1,210, or 2.1 percent, an increase of 0.3 percent since February 29, 1956. There were 93 separations or 0.9 percent in the Washington, D. C. Area, no change since February 29, 1956. Outside the Washington, D. C. Area, there were 1,117 separations or 2.3 percent, an increase of 0.3 percent since February 29, 1956.

The greatest percentage of separations falls in the terminations group which consists of separations of temporary employees, termination of excepted appointments, etc.

CASUAL EMPLOYMENT

Casual employees (not included in the regular monthly reports of employment) are reported whenever information is received. For the month of February, 1956, there were 1,067 casual employees in the Department, representing an increase of 39 over the January, 1956, figure. The Forest Service is the only agency employing casual personnel during the period.

PERSONNEL TURNOVER

THIRD QUARTER, FISCAL YEAR 1956

Accessions of regular full-time employees totaled 3,765 during the third quarter ending March 31, 1956, excluding transfers between reporting units. The accession rate of full-time employees for the third quarter of Fiscal Year 1956 was 6.5 percent. This represents a decrease of 0.7 percent from the second quarter of Fiscal Year 1956.



Separations of full-time personnel from the Department amounted to 3,836 during the Third Quarter. The rates for Inside Washington, D. C. Met. Area were: Separations 3.1 percent, Accessions 3.9 percent, an excess of accessions over separations of 0.8 percent. The rates for Outside Washington, D. C. Met. Area were: Separations 7.3 percent, Accessions 7.0 percent, an excess of separations over accessions of 0.3 percent.

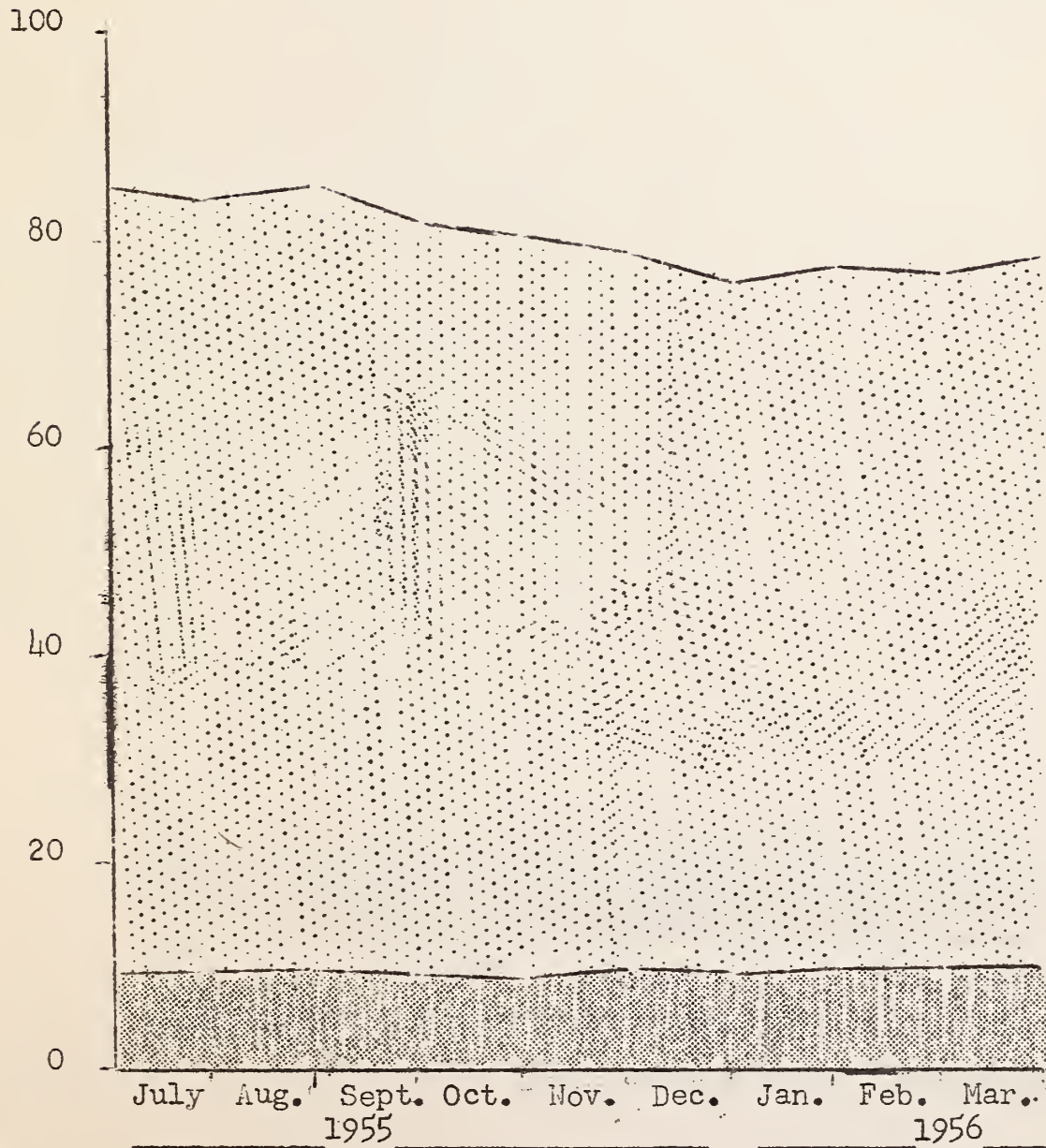

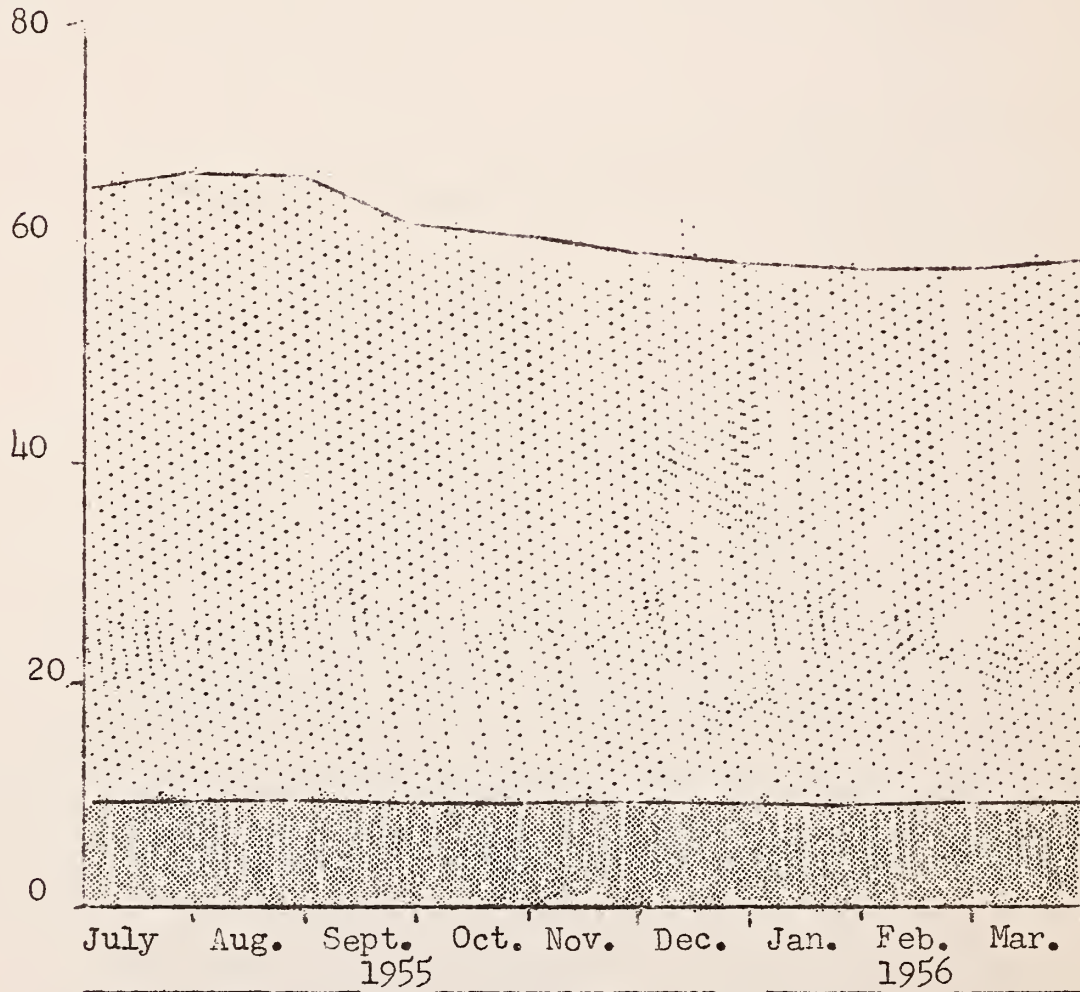

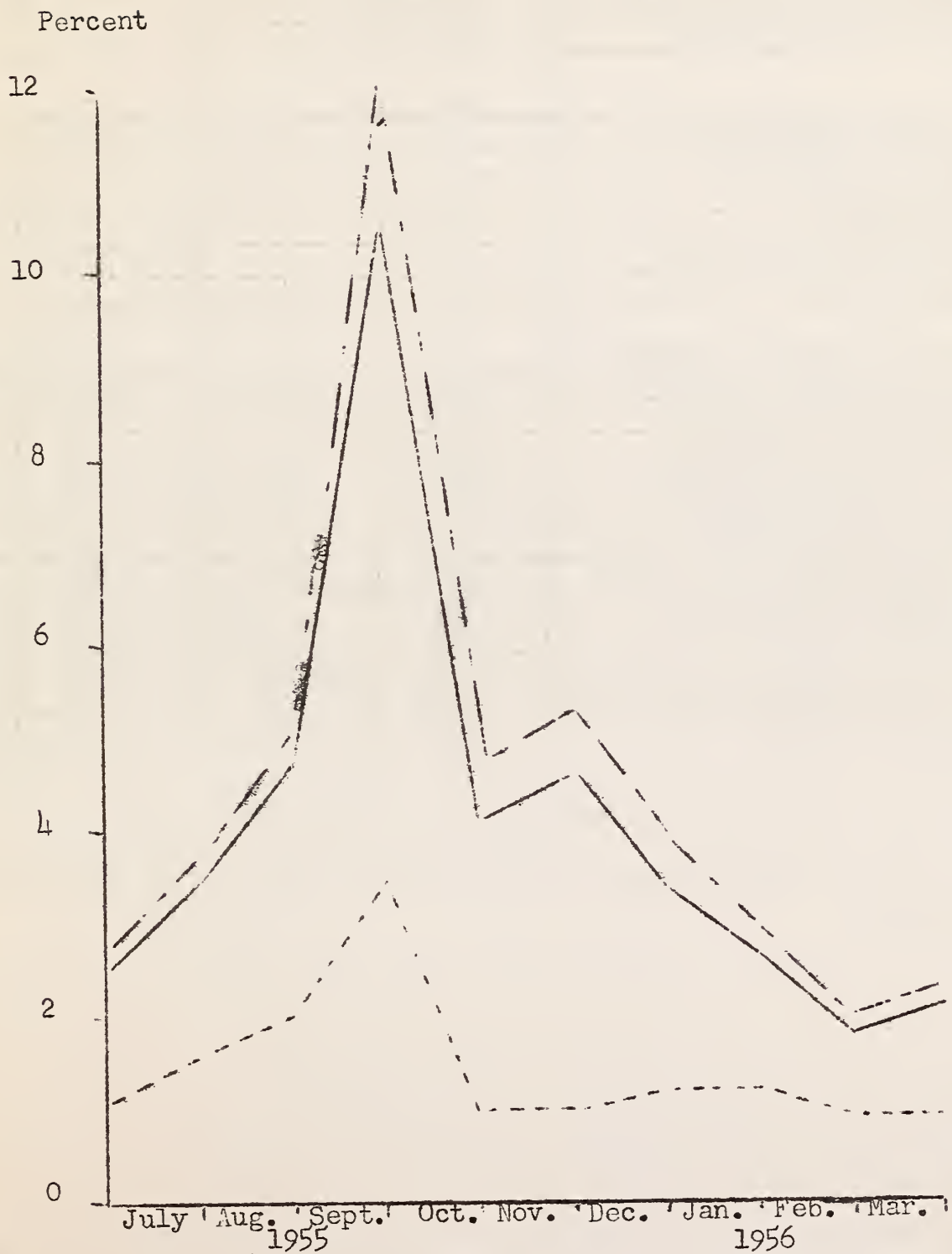

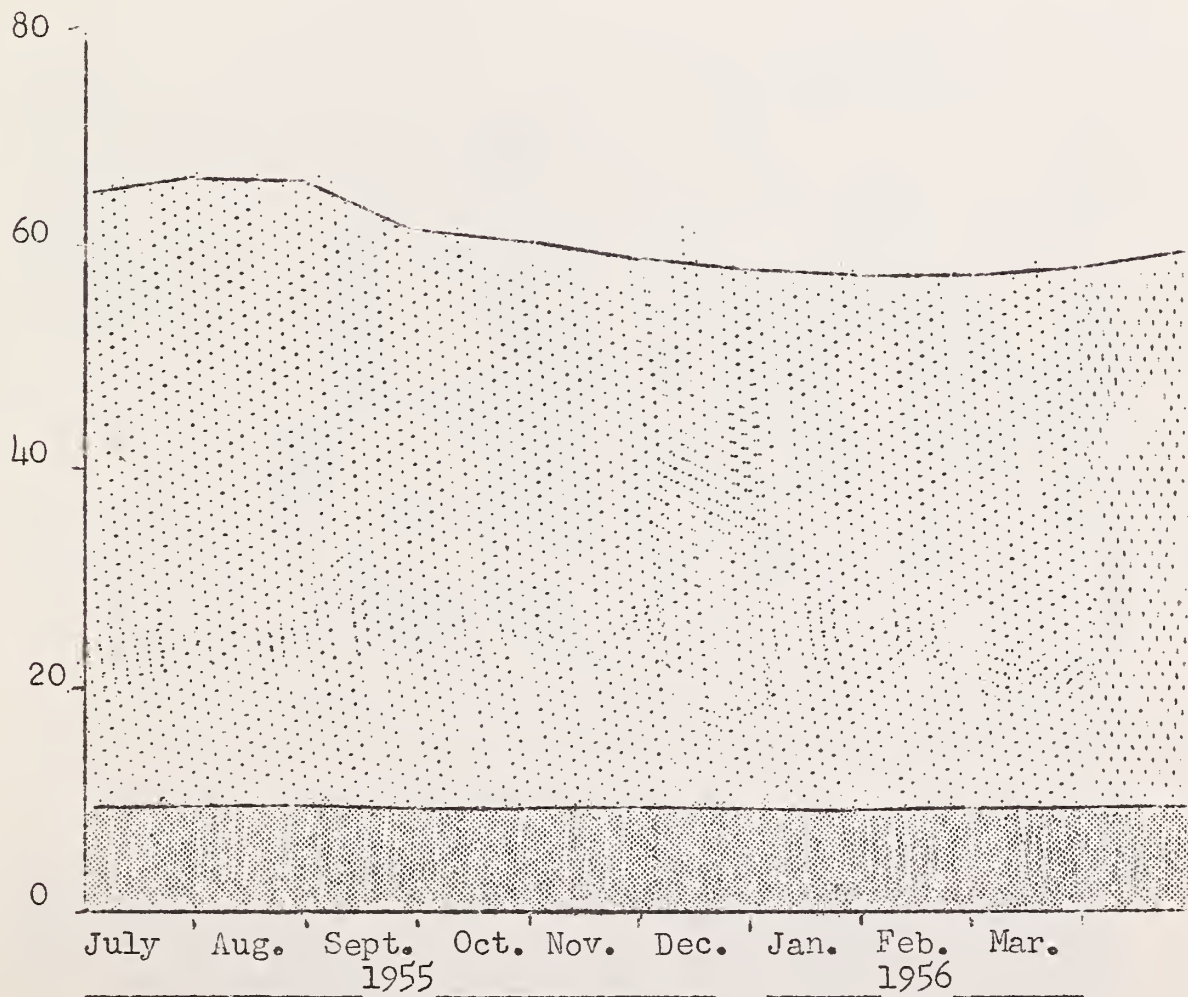

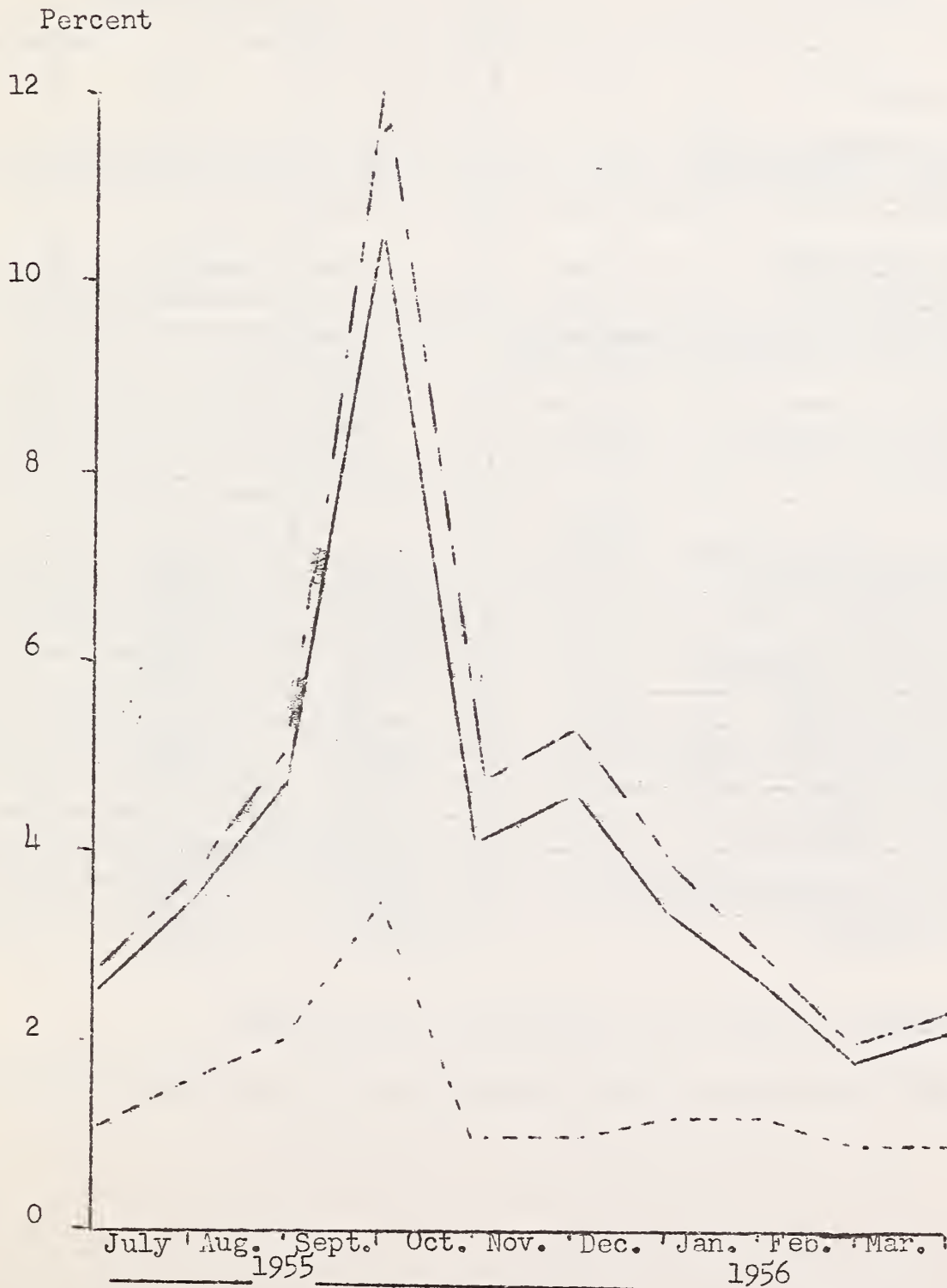

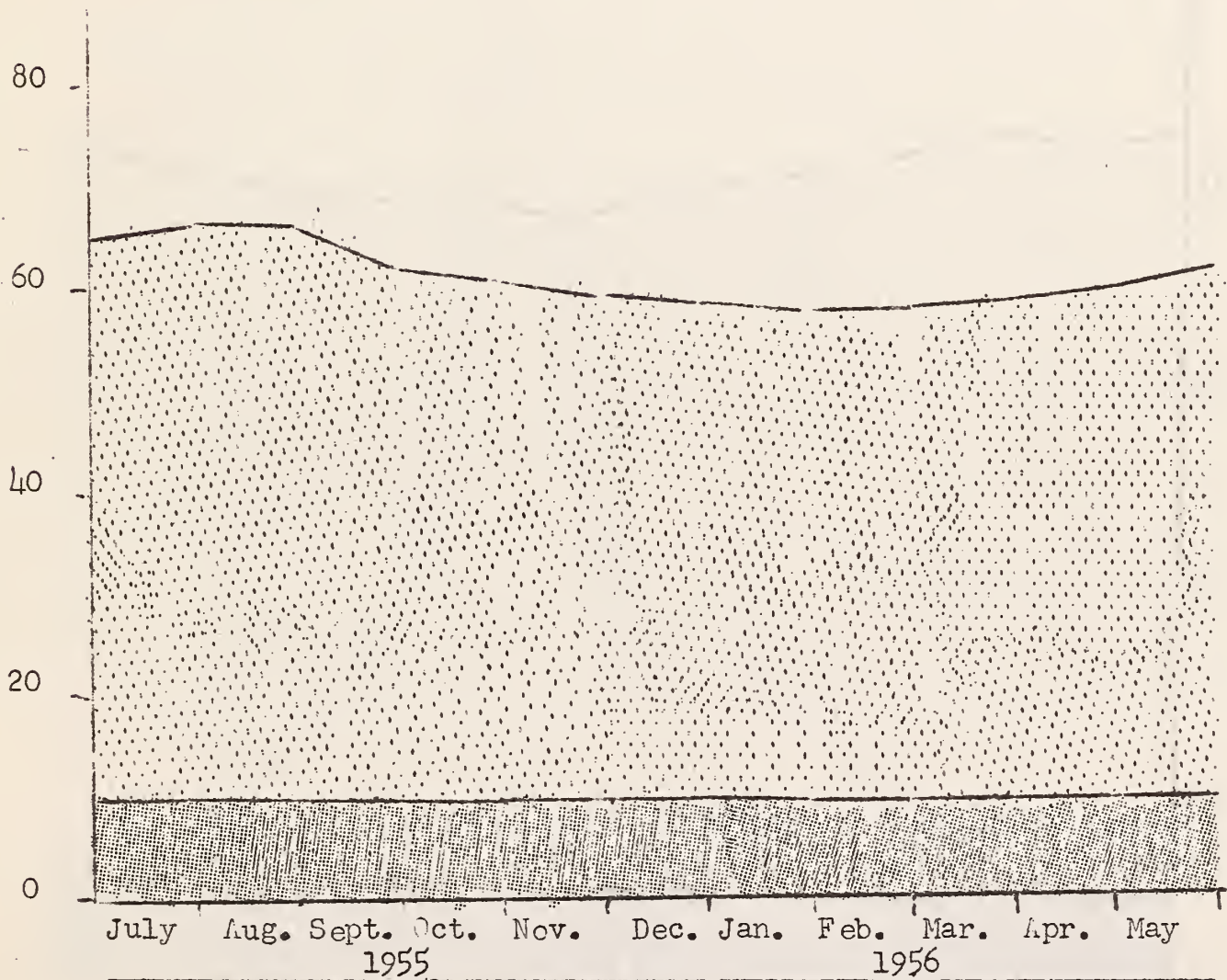

DEFINITIONS OF TERMS USED FOR REPORTING PURPOSES

1. Full-Time is the minimum number of hours constituting the official work week for a particular group or class of employees.
2. Part-Time Employees are those regularly employed on a pre-arranged schedule, whose hours or days of work are less than the prescribed hours or days of work for full-time employees in the same group or class.
3. Intermittent Employees are those employed on an irregular or occasional basis whose hours or days of work are not based on a pre-arranged schedule and who are compensated only for the time when actually employed or for services actually rendered.
4. W. O. C. (Without Compensation) represents those engaged to perform services on a regular or intermittent basis whose appointment does not provide for salary or wage payment.
5. Casual Employees are those hired informally "on the spot" for short intervals of time in connection with emergency work.
6. Persons on Leave Without Pay are those currently in a nonpay status for scheduled periods longer than 30 days (other than furlough by reduction in force).
7. Washington, D. C. Metropolitan Area includes the District of Columbia; Alexandria City, Arlington and Fairfax Counties, Falls Church City, Virginia; and Montgomery and Prince Georges Counties, Maryland.
8. Turnover Formula: Full-time accessions or separations divided by the average number of full-time employees for the period reported (the number of full-time employees at the end of the past period plus the number of full-time employees at the end of the period reported, divided by two.)

SUMMARY OF GROUPS OF EMPLOYEES REGULARLY EXCLUDED FROM THE MONTHLY REPORTS

1. All persons on a scheduled leave without pay period longer than thirty days.
2. All persons placed on furlough by reason of reduction-in-force after the last day of active duty specified in the reduction-in-force notice.
3. Casual employees (those employees hired informally by pickup "on the spot," for a definite job usually of short duration, and includes such classes as harvest hands, laborers on forest roads and trail work, emergency fire fighters). The number of casual employees will be reported from time to time when complete reports are received.
4. Personnel cooperating or collaborating with, but not appointed nor paid by the Department of Agriculture (included in this group are "ASC County Committeemen and County employees other than Committeemen, Extension Agents, REA cooperatives, Civilian Public Service Assignees, Crop Reporters, etc."). The number of those persons will be reported annually, as soon as possible after June 30 of each year.

TURNOVER

The separations from the Department on June 30, 1956, of full-time personnel within the Continental limits of the U. S., including temporary employees amounted to 1,880, or 2.8 percent, an increase of 0.5 percent since May 31, 1956. There were 142 separations, or 1.4 percent in the Washington, D. C. Area, an increase of 0.4 percent since May 31, 1956. Outside the Washington, D. C. Area, there were 1738 separations, or 3.1 percent, an increase of 0.6 percent since May 31, 1956.

The greatest percentage of separations falls in the terminations group which consists of separations of temporary employees, termination of excepted appointments, etc.

CASUAL EMPLOYMENT

Casual employees (not included in the regular monthly reports of employment) are reported whenever information is received. For the month of May, 1956, there were 2,144 casual employees in the Department, representing a decrease of 707 over the April, 1956, figure. The Forest Service is the only agency employing casual personnel during the period.

PERSONNEL TURNOVER

FOURTH QUARTER, FISCAL YEAR 1956

Accessions of regular full-time employees totaled 16,282 during the fourth quarter ending June 30, 1956, excluding transfers between reporting units. The accession rate of full-time employees for the fourth quarter of Fiscal Year 1956 was 25.3 percent. This represents an increase of 18.8 percent from the third quarter of Fiscal Year 1956.



TURNOVER OF FULL-TIME EMPLOYEES 1/ JUNE 1956

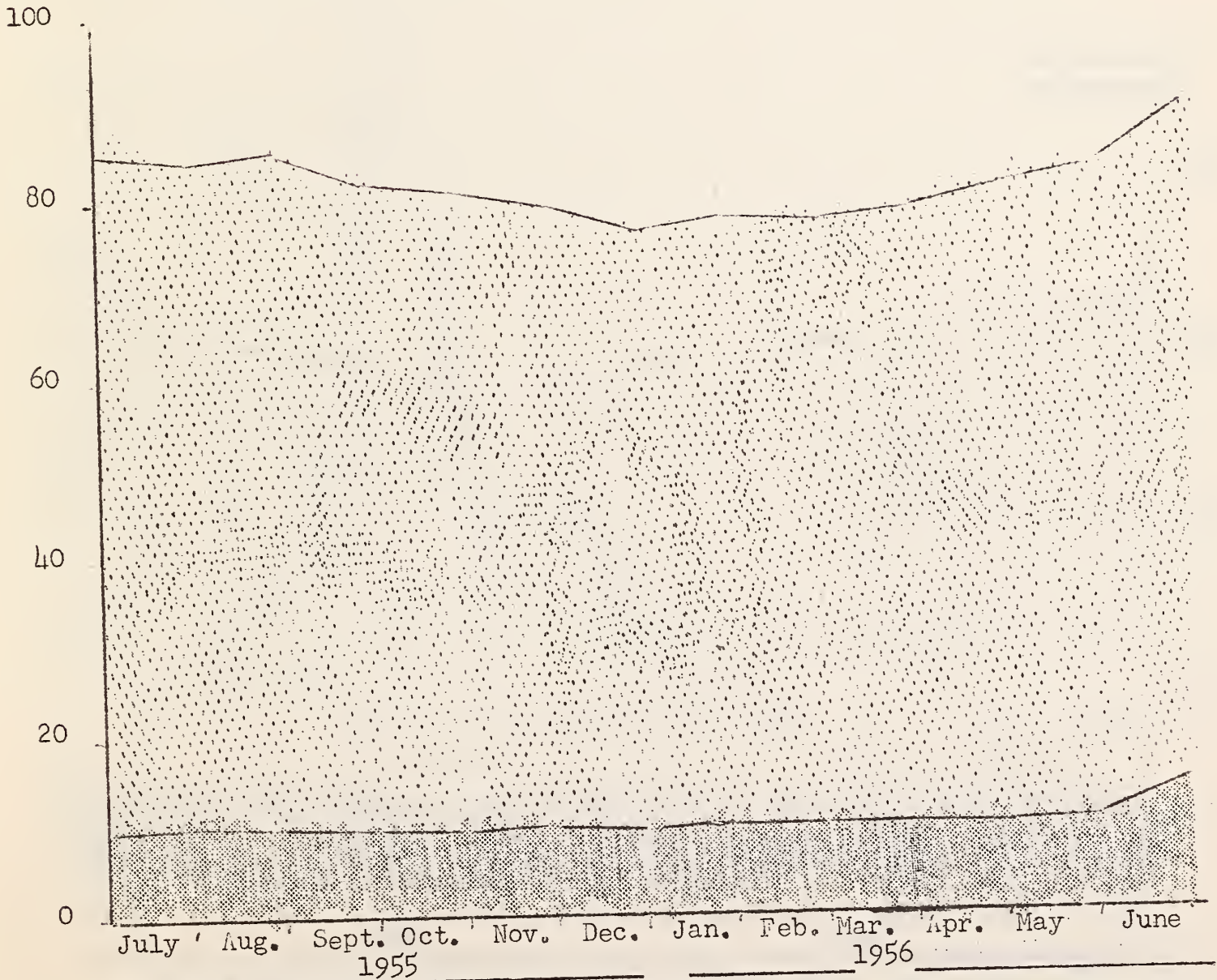

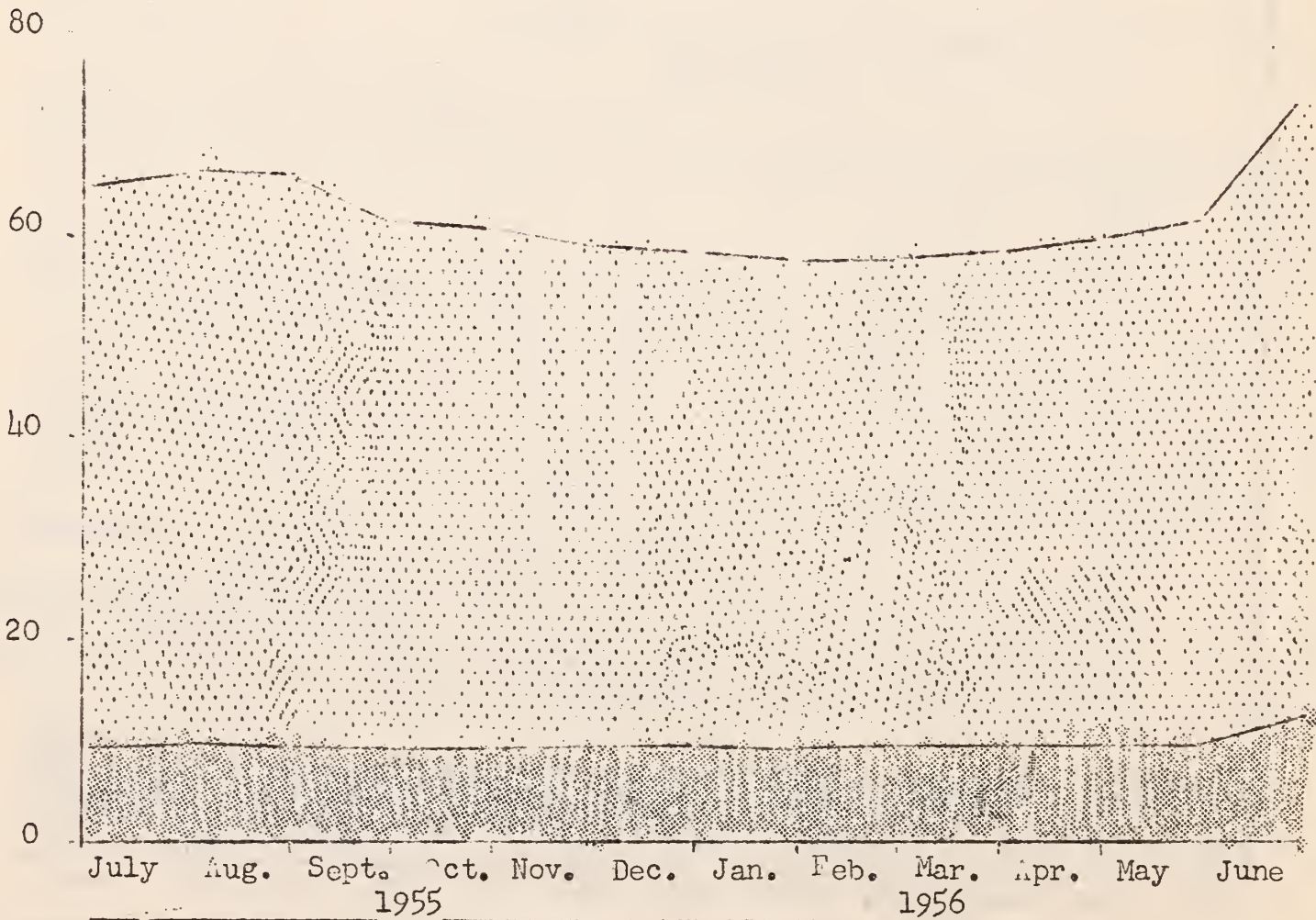

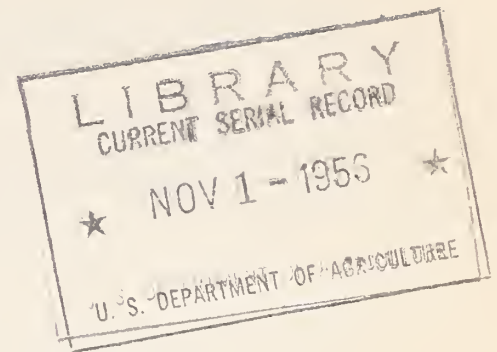

DEFINITIONS OF TERMS USED FOR REPORTING PURPOSES

1. Full-Time is the minimum number of hours constituting the official work week for a particular group or class of employees.
2. Part-Time Employees are those regularly employed on a pre-arranged schedule, whose hours or days of work are less than the prescribed hours or days of work for full-time employees in the same group or class.
3. Intermittent Employees are those employed on an irregular or occasional basis whose hours or days of work are not based on a pre-arranged schedule and who are compensated only for the time when actually employed or for services actually rendered.
4. W. O. C. (Without Compensation) represents those engaged to perform services on a regular or intermittent basis whose appointment does not provide for salary or wage payment.
5. Casual Employees are those hired informally "on the spot" for short intervals of time in connection with emergency work.
6. Persons on Leave Without Pay are those currently in a nonpay status for scheduled periods longer than 30 days (other than furlough by reduction in force).
7. Washington, D. C. Metropolitan Area includes the District of Columbia; Alexandria City, Arlington and Fairfax Counties, Falls Church City, Virginia; and Montgomery and Prince Georges Counties, Maryland.
8. Turnover Formula: Full-time accessions or separations divided by the average number of full-time employees for the period reported (the number of full-time employees at the end of the past period plus the number of full-time employees at the end of the period reported, divided by two.)

SUMMARY OF GROUPS OF EMPLOYEES REGULARLY EXCLUDED FROM THE MONTHLY REPORTS

1. All persons on a scheduled leave without pay period longer than thirty days.
2. All persons placed on furlough by reason of reduction-in-force after the last day of active duty specified in the reduction-in-force notice.
3. Casual employees (those employees hired informally by pickup "on the spot," for a definite job usually of short duration, and includes such classes as harvest hands, laborers on forest roads and trail work, emergency fire fighters). The number of casual employees will be reported from time to time when complete reports are received.
4. Personnel cooperating or collaborating with, but not appointed nor paid by the Department of Agriculture (included in this group are "ASC County Committeemen and County employees other than Committeemen, Extension Agents, REA cooperatives, Civilian Public Service Assignees, Crop Reporters, etc."). The number of those persons will be reported annually, as soon as possible after June 30 of each year.

Full-time employment of the Department of Agriculture numbered 73,355 on July 31, 1956, as compared with 71,494 on June 30, 1956. Part-time and intermittent employment totaled 17,319 as compared with 17,904 on June 30, 1956.

Total paid employment on July 31, 1956, was 90,674, an increase of 1,276 since June 30, 1956. This figure applies to total paid employment in the Department including employees outside the Continental limits of the United States and part-time workers as well as those regularly employed.

The increase in the Agricultural Marketing Service was due to the return to duty of Tobacco Inspectors and employment of seasonal personnel in the Cotton Division. The increase in the Agricultural Research Service was due to employment of personnel on research projects and animal disease eradication work. The increase in the Soil Conservation Service was due to employment of Student Trainees and filling vacancies due to normal turnover. The increase in Forest Service was due to fire control, timber management, engineering and construction work.


There were less Committeemen who performed service during the month which accounts for the decrease in employment in the Farmers Home Administration.


TURNOVER

The separations from the Department on July 31, 1956, of full-time personnel within the Continental limits of the U. S., including temporary employees amounted to 2,254 or 3.2 percent, an increase of 0.4 percent since June 30, 1956. There were 122 separations or 1.2 percent in the Washington, D. C. Area, a decrease of 0.2 percent since June 30, 1956. Outside the Washington, D. C. Area, there were 2,132 separations or 3.5 percent, an increase of 0.4 percent since June 30, 1956.

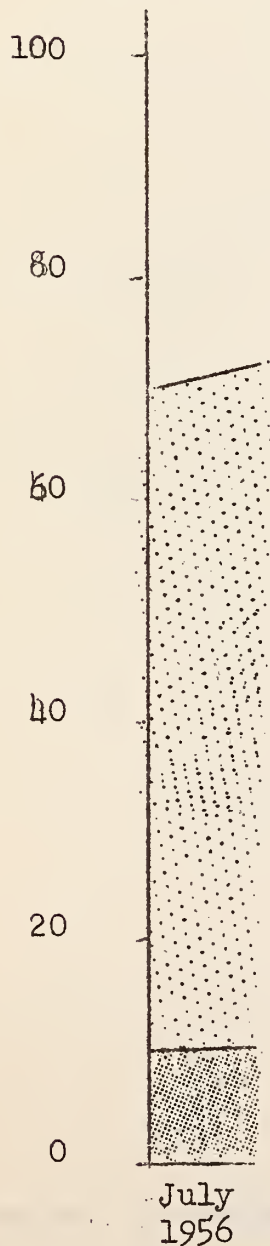
The greatest percentage of separations falls in the terminations group which consists of separations of temporary employees, termination of excepted appointments, etc.

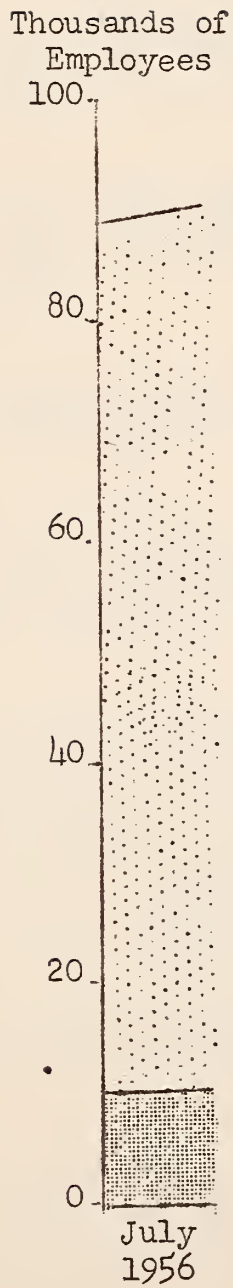

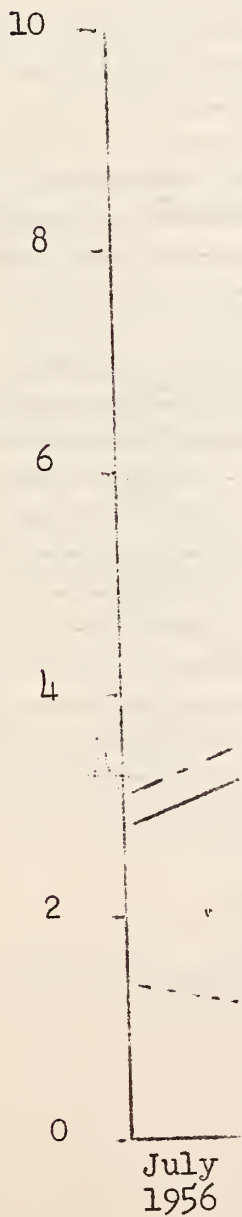

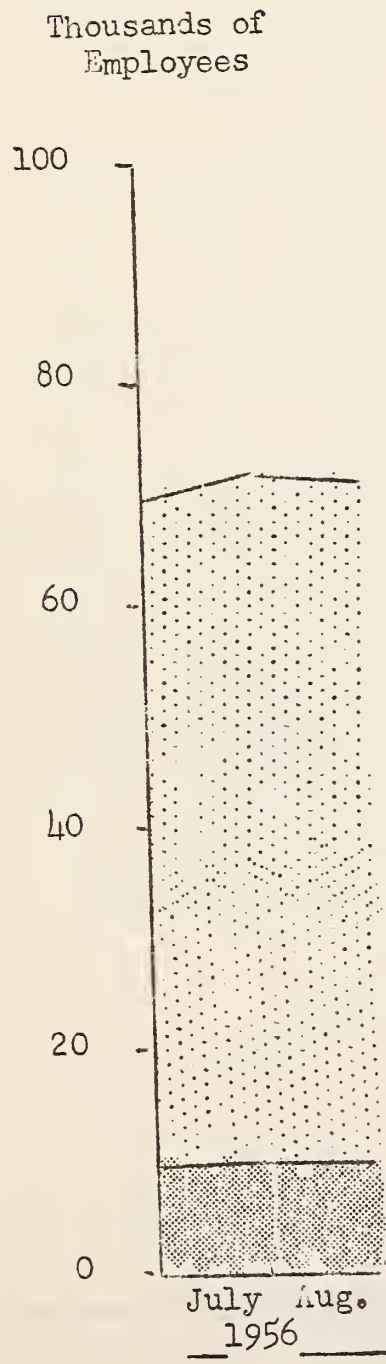

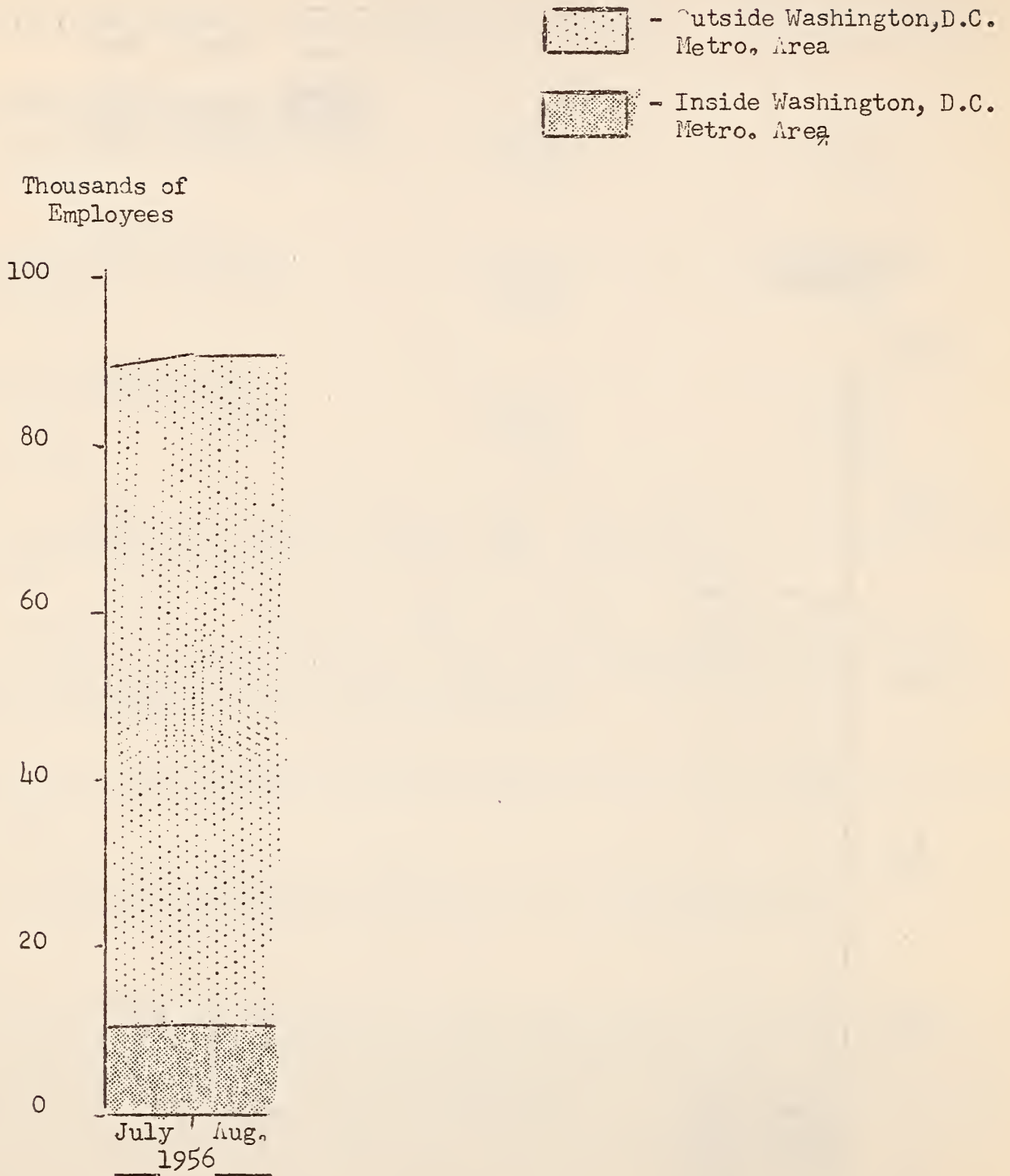
COMPARISON OF FULL-TIME EMPLOYMENT BY

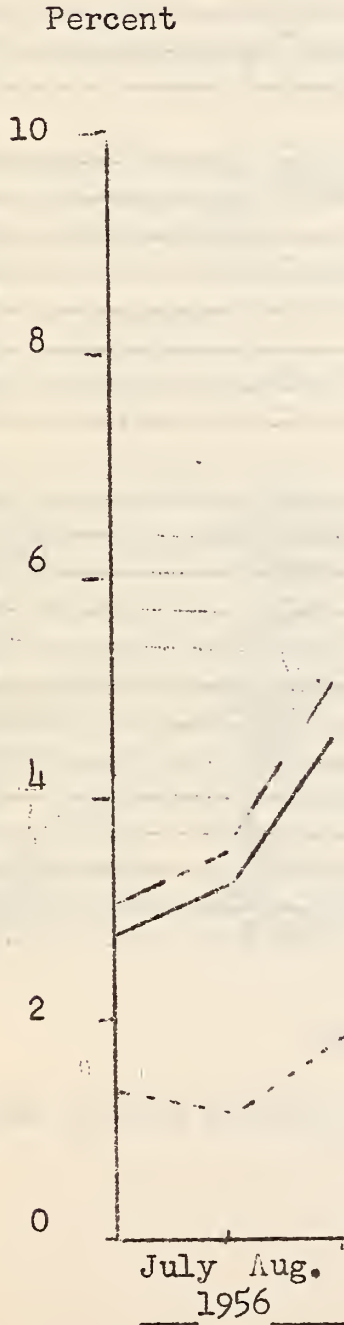
COMPARISON OF TOTAL PAID EMPLOYMENT 1/

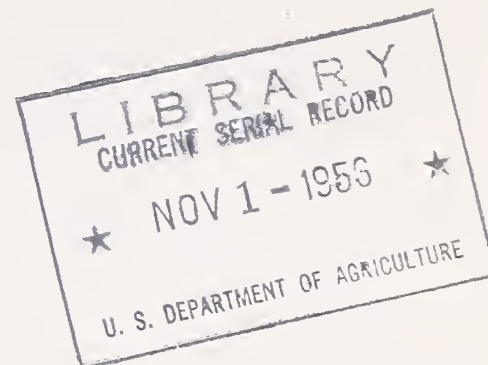

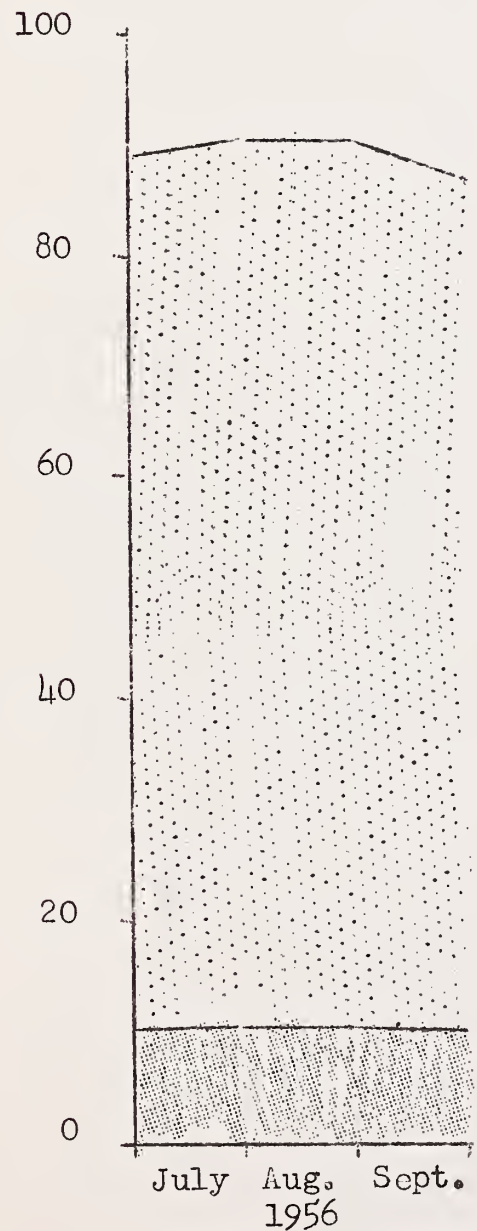

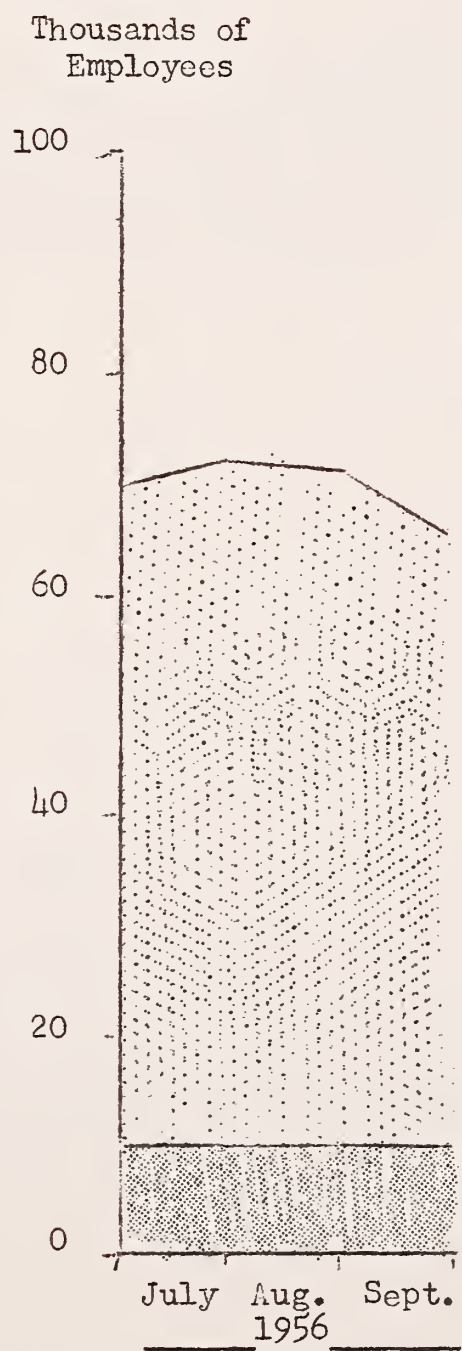

BY MONTHS FOR CURRENT FISCAL YEAR

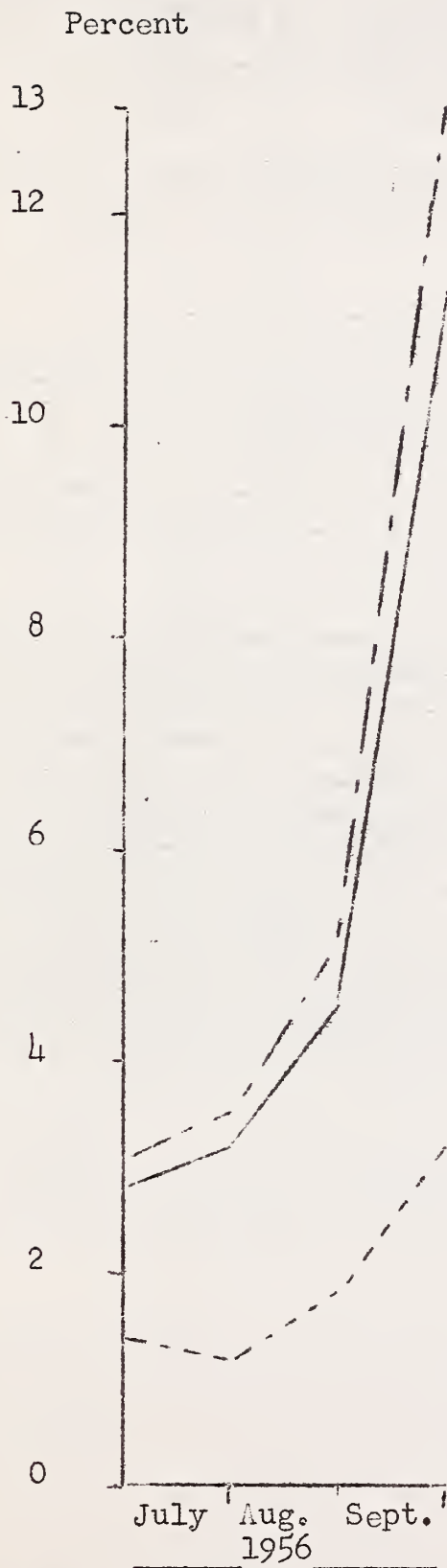

TREND OF TURNOVER OF FULL-TIME EMPLOYEES 1/

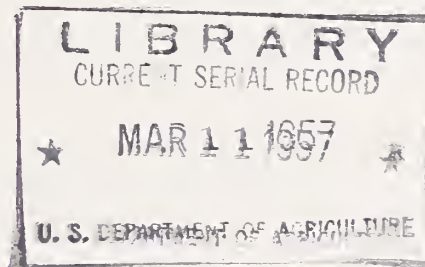

DEFINITIONS OF TERMS USED FOR REPORTING PURPOSES

1. Full-Time is the minimum number of hours constituting the official work week for a particular group or class of employees.
2. Part-Time Employees are those regularly employed on a pre-arranged schedule, whose hours or days of work are less than the prescribed hours or days of work for full-time employees in the same group or class.
3. Intermittent Employees are those employed on an irregular or occasional basis whose hours or days of work are not based on a pre-arranged schedule and who are compensated only for the time when actually employed or for services actually rendered.
4. W. O. C. (Without Compensation) represents those engaged to perform services on a regular or intermittent basis whose appointment does not provide for salary or wage payment.
5. Casual Employees are those hired informally "on the spot" for short intervals of time in connection with emergency work.
6. Persons on Leave Without Pay are those currently in a nonpay status for scheduled periods longer than 30 days (other than furlough by reduction in force).
7. Washington, D. C. Metropolitan Area includes the District of Columbia; Alexandria City, Arlington and Fairfax Counties, Falls Church City, Virginia; and Montgomery and Prince Georges Counties, Maryland.
8. Turnover Formula: Full-time accessions or separations divided by the average number of full-time employees for the period reported (the number of full-time employees at the end of the past period plus the number of full-time employees at the end of the period reported, divided by two.)

SUMMARY OF GROUPS OF EMPLOYEES REGULARLY EXCLUDED FROM THE MONTHLY REPORTS

1. All persons on a scheduled leave without pay period longer than thirty days.
2. All persons placed on furlough by reason of reduction-in-force after the last day of active duty specified in the reduction-in-force notice.
3. Casual employees (those employees hired informally by pickup "on the spot," for a definite job usually of short duration, and includes such classes as harvest hands, laborers on forest roads and trail work, emergency fire fighters). The number of casual employees will be reported from time to time when complete reports are received.
4. Personnel cooperating or collaborating with, but not appointed nor paid by the Department of Agriculture (included in this group are "ASC County Committeemen and County employees other than Committeemen, Extension Agents, REA cooperatives, Civilian Public Service Assignees, Crop Reporters, etc."). The number of those persons will be reported annually, as soon as possible after June 30 of each year.

Full-time employment of the Department of Agriculture numbered 66,421 on October 31, 1956, as compared with 67,210 on September 30, 1956. Part-time and intermittent employment totaled 20,810 as compared with 20,503 on September 30, 1956.

Total paid employment on October 31, 1956, was 87,231, a decrease of 482 since September 30, 1956. This figure applies to total paid employment in the Department including employees outside the Continental limits of the United States and part-time workers as well as those regularly employed.

The increase in the Commodity Stabilization Service was due to work in the cotton loan division in connection with the price support program. The increase in the Agricultural Research Service was due to increased employment in research branches due to availability of funds. The increase in Agricultural Marketing Service was due to increased seasonal work in the cotton and fruit and vegetable divisions. The decrease in the Forest Service was due to curtailment of seasonal activities.



There were less Committeemen who performed service during the month which accounts for the decrease in employment in the Farmers Home Administration.

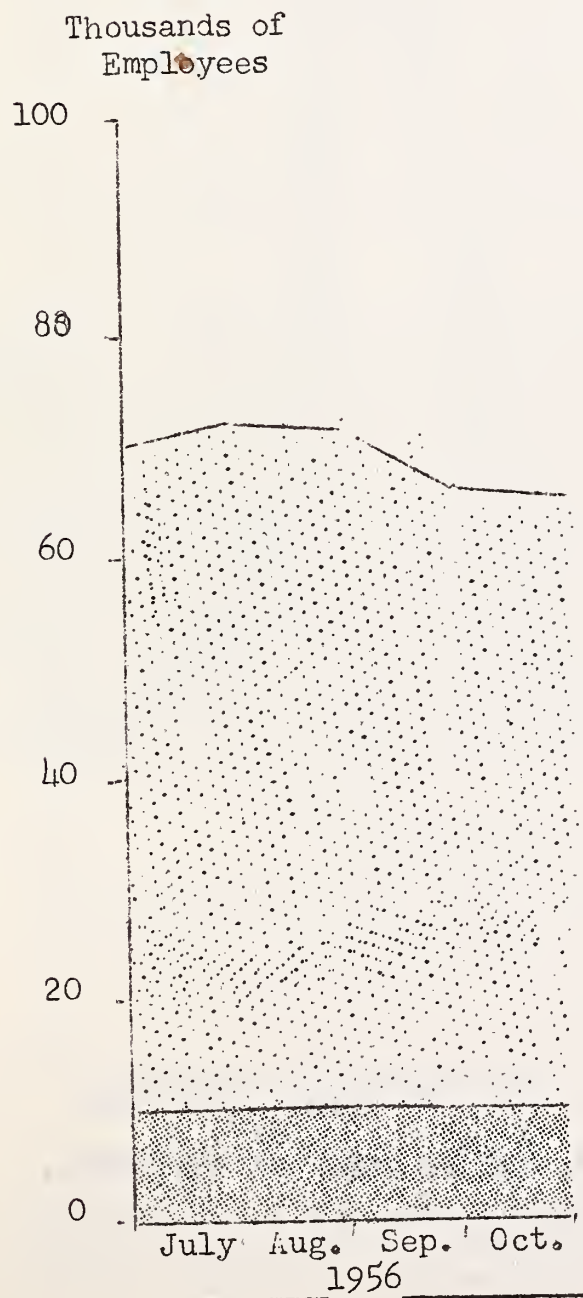
TURNOVER

The separations from the Department on October 31, 1956, of full-time personnel within the Continental limits of the U. S., including temporary employees amounted to 3,077, or 4.7 percent, a decrease of 6.8 percent since September 30, 1956. There were 149 separations or 1.5 percent in the Washington, D. C. Area, a decrease of 1.7 percent since September 30, 1956. Outside the Washington, D. C. Area, there were 2,928 separations or 5.3 percent, a decrease of 7.7 percent since September 30, 1956.

The greatest percentage of separations falls in the terminations group which consists of separations of temporary employees, termination of excepted appointments, etc.

 BY MONTHS FOR CURRENT FISCAL YEAR

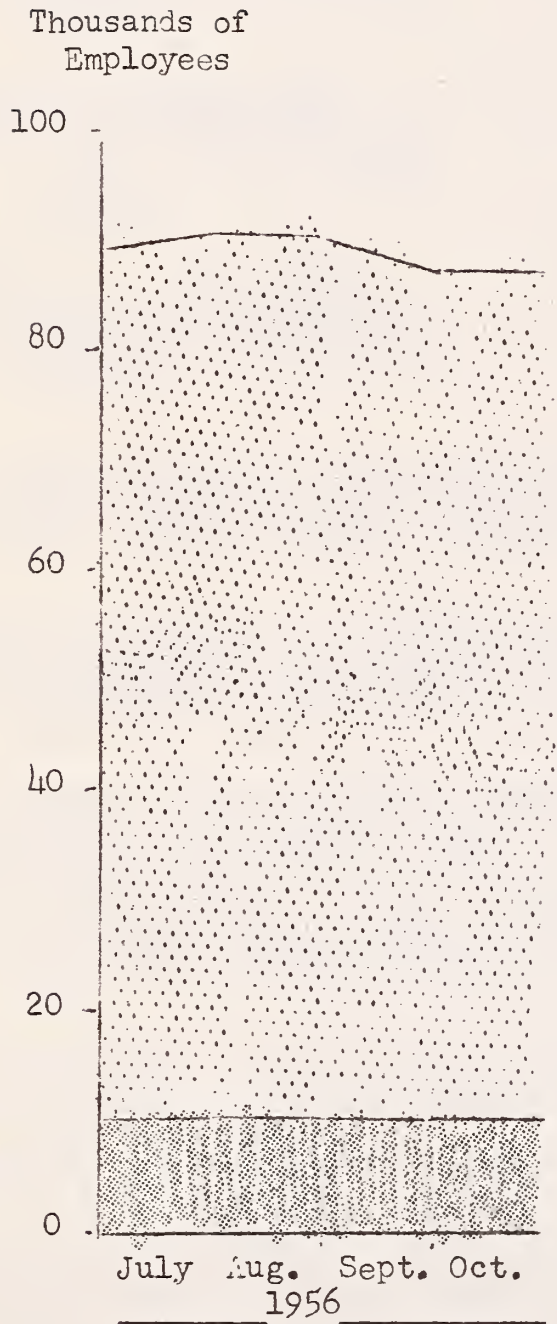

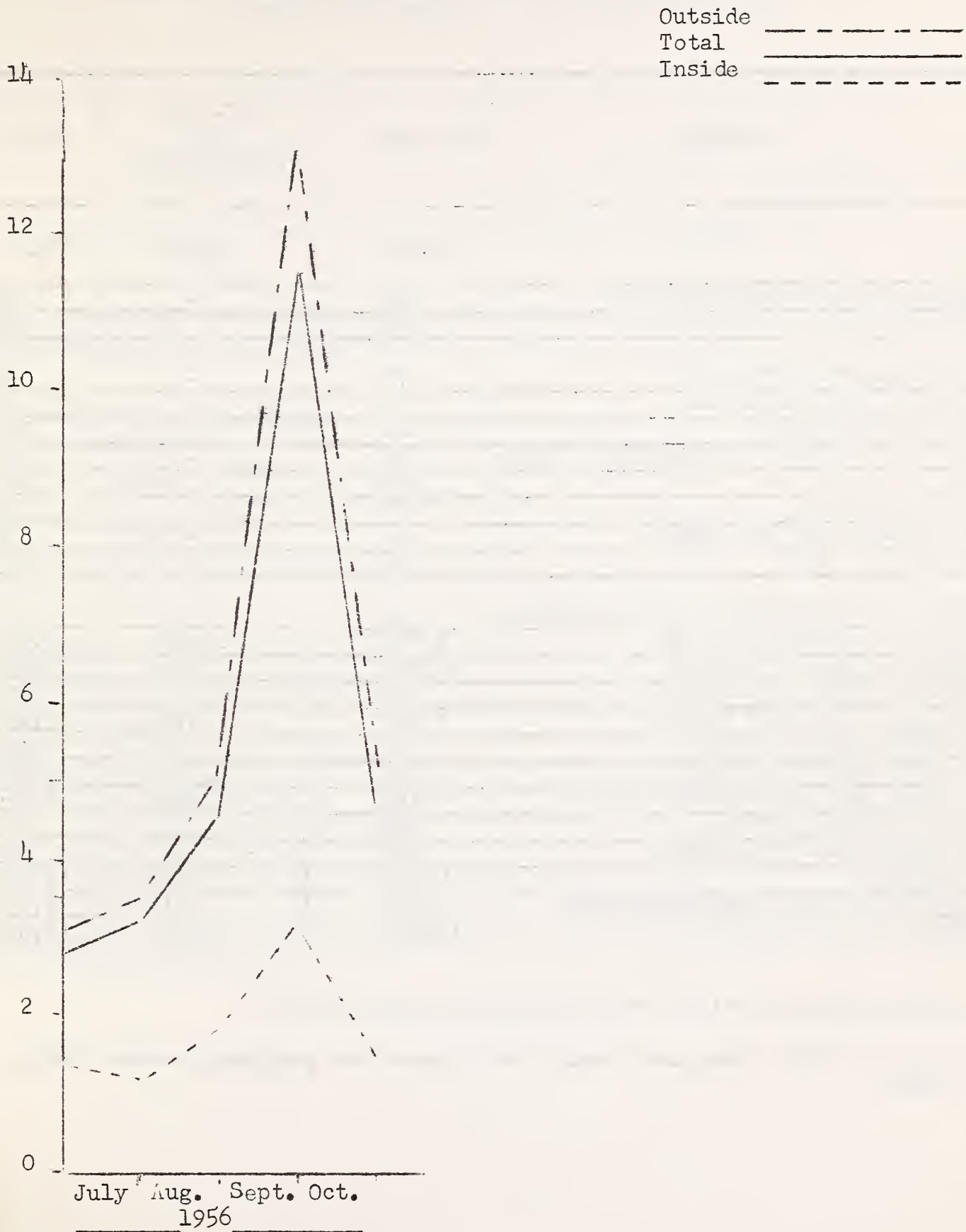
COMPARISON OF TOTAL PAID EMPLOYMENT 1/
