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

STATISTICAL SUMMARY OF EXPLOYMENT JANUARY 1956

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- 1. Full-Time is the minimum number of hours constituting the official work week for a particular group or class of employees.
- 2. Part-Time Employees are those regularly employed on a pre-arranged schedule, whose hours or days of work are less than the prescribed hours or days of work for full-time employees in the same group or class.
- 3. Intermittent Employees are those employed on an irregular or occasional basis whose hours or days of work are not based on a pre-arranged schedule and who are compensated only for the time when actually employed or for services actually rendered.
- 4. W. O. C. (Without Compensation) represents those engaged to perform services on a regular or intermittent basis whose appointment does not provide for salary or wage payment.
- 5. <u>Casual Employees</u> are those hired informally "on the spot" for short intervals of time in connection with emergency work.
- 6. Persons on Leave Without Pay are those currently in a nonpay status for scheduled periods longer than 30 days (other than furlough by reduction in force).
- 7. Washington, D. C. Metropolitan Area includes the District of Columbia; Alexandria City, Arlington and Fairfax Counties, Falls Church City, Virginia; and Montgomery and Prince Georges Counties, Maryland.
- 8. Turnover Formula: Full-time accessions or separations divided by the average number of full-time employees for the period reported (the number of full-time employees at the end of the past period plus the number of full-time employees at the end of the period reported, divided by two.)

SUMMARY OF GROUPS OF EMPLOYEES REGULARLY ENCLUDED FROM THE MONTHLY REPORTS

- 1. All persons on a scheduled leave without pay period longer than thirty days.
- 2. All persons placed on furlough by reason of reduction-in-force after the last day of active duty specified in the reduction-in-force notice.
- 3. Casual employees (those employees hired informally by pickup "on the spot," for a definite job usually of short duration, and includes such classes as harvest hands, laborers on forest roads and trail work, emergency fire fighters). The number of casual employees will be reported from time to time when complete reports are received.
- 4. Personnel cooperating or collaborating with, but not appointed nor paid by the Department of Agriculture (included in this group are "ASC County Committeemen and County employees other than Committeemen, Extension Agents, REA cooperatives, Civilian Public Service Assignees, Crop Reporters, etc.). The number of those persons will be reported annually, as soon as possible after June 30 of each year.

Full-time employment of the Department of Agriculture numbered 58,738 on January 31, 1956, as compared with 59,249 on December 31, 1955. Part-time and intermittent employment totaled 18,782 as compared with 17,109 on December 31, 1955.

Total paid employment on January 31, 1956, was 77,520, an increase of 1,162 since December 31, 1955. This figure applies to total paid employment in the Department including employees outside the Continental limits of the United States and parttime workers as well as those regularly employed.

The decrease in Soil Conservation Service was due to seasonal employment. The decrease in Forest Service was due to curtailment of an active field season. The decrease in Federal Crop Insurance Corporation was due to decreased seasonal activities.

There were more Committeemen who performed service during the month which accounts for the increase in employment in the Farmers Home Administration.


The separations from the Department on January 31, 1956, of full-time personnel withir the Continental limits of the U.S., including temporary employees amounted to 1,583, or 2.7 percent, a decrease of 0.7 percent since December 31, 1955. There were 121 separations or 1.2 percent in the Mas ington, D.C. Area, no change since December 31, 1955. Outside the Mashington, D.C. Area, there were 1,462 separations, or 3.0 percent, a decrease of 0.9 percent since December 31, 1955.

The greatest percentage of separations falls in the terminations group which consists of separations of temporary employees, termination of excepted appointments, etc.





- Outside Wash., D. C. Metro. Area







Full-time employment of the Department of Agriculture numbered 58,785 on February 29, 1956, as compared with 58,738 on January 31, 1956. Part-time and intermittent employment totaled 18,295 as compared with 18,782 on January 31, 1956.

Total paid employment on February 29, 1956, was 77,080, a decrease of 440 since January 31, 1956. This figure applies to total paid employment in the Department including employees outside the Continental limits of the United States and parttime workers as well as those regularly employed.

The decrease in Soil Conservation Service was due to seasonal employment. The decrease in Forest Service was due to curtailment of an active field season. The decrease in Federal Crop Insurance Corporation was due to decreased seasonal activities.

There were less Committeemen who performed service during the month which accounts for the decrease in employment in the Farmers Home Administration.

#### TURNOVER










- 3. <u>Intermittent Employees</u> are those employed on an irregular or occasional basis whose hours or days of work are not based on a pre-arranged schedule and who are compensated only for the time when actually employed or for services actually rendered.
- 4. <u>W. O. C. (Without Compensation)</u> represents those engaged to perform services on a regular or intermittent basis whose appointment does not provide for salary or wage payment.
- 5. <u>Casual Employees</u> are those hired informally "on the spot" for short intervals of time in connection with emergency work.
- 6. Persons on Leave Without Pay are those currently in a nonpay status for scheduled periods longer than 30 days (other than furlough by reduction in force).
- 7. Washington, D. C. Metropolitan Area includes the District of Columbia; Alexandria City, Arlington and Fairfax Counties, Falls Church City, Virginia; and Montgomery and Prince Georges Counties, Maryland.
- 8. <u>Turnover Formula</u>: Full-time accessions or separations divided by the average number of full-time employees for the period reported (the number of full-time employees at the end of the past period plus the number of full-time employees at the end of the period reported, divided by two.)

SUMMARY OF GROUPS OF EMPLOYEES REGULARLY ENCLUDED FROM THE MONTHLY REPORTS

- 1. All persons on a scheduled leave without pay period longer than thirty days.
- 2. All persons placed on furlough by reason of reduction-in-force after the last day of active duty specified in the reduction-in-force notice.
- 3. #### TURNOVER OF FULL-TIME EMPLOYEES 1/ March 1956



## COMPARISON OF TOTAL PAID EMPLOYMENT 1/ BY MONTHS FOR CURRENT FISCAL YEAR







## COMPARISON OF TOTAL PAID EMPLOYMENT 1/ BY MONTHS FOR CURRENT FISCAL YEAR









STATISTICAL SUMMARY OF EMPLOYMENT APRIL 1956

Prepared by: Office of Personnel Division of Employment May 18, 1956 

- 1. Full-Time is the minimum number of hours constituting the official work week for a particular group or class of employees.
- 2. Part-Time Employees are those regularly employed on a pre-arranged schedule, whose hours or days of work are less than the prescribed hours or days of work for full-time employees in the same group or class,
- 3. Intermittent Employees are those employed on an irregular or occasional basis whose hours or days of work are not based on a pre-arranged schedule and who are compensated only for the time when actually employed or for services actually rendered.
- 4. W. O. C. (Without Compensation) represents those engaged to perform services on a regular or intermittent basis whose appointment does not provide for salary or wage payment.
- 5. <u>Casual Employees</u> are those hired informally "on the spot" for short intervals of time in connection with emergency work.
- 6. Persons on Leave Without Pay are those currently in a nonpay status for scheduled periods longer than 30 days (other than furlough by reduction in force).
- 7. Washington, D. C. Metropolitan Area includes the District of Columbia; Alexandria City, Arlington and Fairfax Counties, Falls Church City, Virginia; and Montgomery and Prince Georges Counties, Maryland.
- 8. Turnover Formula: Full-time accessions or separations divided by the average number of full-time employees for the period reported (the number of full-time employees at the end of the past period plus the number of full-time employees at the end of the period reported, divided by two.)

SUMM'RY OF GROUPS OF EMPLOYEES REGULARLY ENCLUDED FROM THE MONTHLY REPORTS

- 1. All persons on a scheduled leave without pay period longer than thirty days.
- 2. All persons placed on furlough by reason of reduction-in-force after the last day of active duty specified in the reduction-in-force notice.
- 3. Casual employees (those employees hired informally by pickup "on the spot," for a definite job usually of short duration, and includes such classes as harvest hands, laborers on forest roads and trail work, emergency fire fighters). The number of casual employees will be reported from time to time when complete reports are received.
- 4. Personnel cooperating or collaborating with, but not appointed nor paid by the Department of Agriculture (included in this group are "ASC County Committeemen and County employees other than Committeemen, Extension Agents, REA cooperatives, Civilian Public Service Assignees, Crop Reporters, etc.). The number of those persons will be reported annually, as soon as possible after June 30 of each year.

Full-time employment of the Department of Agriculture numbered 61,033 on April 30, 1956, as compared with 59,262 on March 31, 1956. Part-time and intermittent employment totaled 19,465 as compared with 19,523 on March 31, 1956.

Total paid employment on April 30, 1956, was 80,498, an increase of 1,713 since March 31, 1956. This figure applies to total paid employment in the Department including employees outside the Continental limits of the United States and parttime workers as well as those regularly employed.


The increase in the Agricultural Research Service was due to seasonal increase in fee basis employees in the Animal Disease Eradication Branch. The increase in Soil Conservation Service was due to seasonal work. The increase in the Forest Service was due to commencement of normal field season, maintenance, and tree planting.

There were less Committeemen who performed service during the month which accounts for the decrease in employment in the Farmers Home Administration.


#### TURNOVER

The separations from the Department on April 30, 1956, of full-time personnel within the Continental limits of the U. S., including temporary employees amounted to 1,121, or 1.9 percent, a decrease of 0.2 percent since March 31, 1956. There were 109 separations or 1.1 percent in the Washington, D. C. Area, an increase of 0.2 percent since March 31, 1956. Outside the Washington, D. C. Area, there were 1,012 separations or 2.1 percent, a decrease of 0.2 percent since March 31, 1956.

- Inside Wash., D. C. Metro, Area




COMPARISON OF TOTAL PAID EMPLOYMENT 1/ BY MONTHS FOR CURRENT FISCAL YEAR



- Outside Wash., D. C. Metro. Area











Outside Wash., D. C. Metro. Area





#### CASUAL EMPLOYMENT

Casual employees (not included in the regular monthly reports of employment) are reported whenever information is received. For the month of May, 1956, there were 2,144 casual employees in the Department, representing a decrease of 707 over the April, 1956, figure. 





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#### DEFINITIONS OF TERMS USED FOR REPORTING PURPOSES

- 1. Full-Time is the minimum number of hours constituting the official work week for a particular group or class of employees.
- 2. Part-Time Employees are those regularly employed on a pre-arranged schedule, whose hours or days of work are less than the prescribed hours or days of work for full-time employees in the same group or class.
- 3. Intermittent Employees are those employed on an irregular or occasional basis whose hours or days of work are not based on a pre-arranged schedule and who are compensated only for the time when actually employed or for services actually rendered.
- 4. W. O. C. (Without Compensation) represents those engaged to perform services on a regular or intermittent basis whose appointment does not provide for salary or wage payment.
- 5. <u>Casual Employees</u> are those hired informally "on the spot" for short intervals of time in connection with emergency work.
- 6. Persons on Leave Without Pay are those currently in a nonpay status for scheduled periods longer than 30 days (other than furlough by reduction in force).
- 7. Washington, D. C. Metropolitan Area includes the District of Columbia; Alexandria City, Arlington and Fairfax Counties, Falls Church City, Virginia; and Montgomery and Prince Georges Counties, Maryland.
- 8. Turnover Formula: Full-time accessions or separations divided by the average number of full-time employees for the period reported (the number of full-time employees at the end of the past period plus the number of full-time employees at the end of the period reported, divided by two.)

#### SUMMARY OF GROUPS OF EMPLOYEES REGULARLY EXCLUDED FROM THE MONTHLY REPORTS

- 1. All persons on a scheduled leave without pay period longer than thirty days.
- 2. All persons placed on furlough by reason of reduction-in-force after the last day of active duty specified in the reduction-in-force notice.
- 3. Casual employees (those employees hired informally by pickup "on the spot," for a definite job usually of short duration, and includes such classes as harvest hands, laborers on forest roads and trail work, emergency fire fighters). The number of casual employees will be reported from time to time when complete reports are received.
- 4. Personnel cooperating or collaborating with, but not appointed nor paid by the Department of Agriculture (included in this group are "ASC County Committeemen and County employees other than Committeemen, Extension Agents, REA
  - 1. cooperatives, Civilian Public Service Assignces, Crop Reporters, etc."). The number of those persons will be reported annually, as soon as possible after June 30 of each year.

Full-time employment of the Department of Agriculture numbered 73,355 on July 31, 1956, as compared with 71,494 on June 30, 1956. Part-time and intermittent employment totaled 17,319 as compared with 17,904 on June 30, 1956.

Total paid employment on July 31, 1956, was 90,674, an increase of 1,276 since June 30, 1956. This figure applies to total paid employment in the Department including employees outside the Continental limits of the United States and parttime workers as well as those regularly employed.

The increase in the Agricultural Marketing Service was due to the return to duty of Tobacco Inspectors and employment of seasonal personnel in the Cotton Division, The increase in the Agricultural Research Service was due to employment of personnel on research projects and animal disease eradication work. The increase in the Soil Conservation Service was due to employment of Student Trainees and filling vacancies due to normal turnover. The increase in Forest Service was due to fire control, timber management, engineering and construction work.



#### TURNOVER

The separations from the Department on July 31, 1956, of full-time personnel within the Continental limits of the U. S., including temporary employees amounted to 2,254 or 3.2 percent, an increase of 0.4 percent since June 30, 1956. There were 122 separations or 1.2 percent in the Washington, D. C. Area, a decrease of 0.2 percent since June 30, 1956. Outside the Washington, D. C. Area, there were 2,132 separations or 3.5 percent, an increase of 0.4 percent since June 30, 1956.


The greatest percentage of separations falls in the terminations group which consists of separations of temporary employees, termination of excepted appointments, etc.


## COMPARISON OF TOTAL PAID EMPLOYMENT 1/ BY MONTHS FOR CURRENT FISCAL YEAR

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


#### TURNOVER

The greatest percentage of separations falls in the terminations group which consists of separations of temporary employees, termination of excepted appointments, etc.

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



 Metro, Area





Full-time employment of the Department of Agriculture numbered 66,052 on September 30, 1956, as compared with 72,911 on August 31, 1956. Part-time and intermittent employment totaled 20,503 as compared with 17,458 on August 31, 1956.

Total paid employment on September 30, 1956, was 87,713, a decrease of 2,656 since August 31, 1956. This figure applies to total paid employment in the Department including employees outside the Continental limits of the United States and parttime workers as well as those regularly employed.

The increase in Agricultural Marketing Service was due to seasonal employment in the Cotton Division. The decrease in Soil Conservation Service was due to the return of Student Trainees to colleges and termination of other summer employment. The decrease in the Forest Service was due to curtailment of seasonal activities.

There were more Committeemen who performed service during the month which accounts for the increase in employment in the Farmers Home Administration.

#### TURNOVER

The separations from the Department on September 30, 1956, of full-time personnel within the Continental limits of the U. S., including temporary employees amounted to 7,972 or 11.5 percent, an increase of 7.0 percent since August 31, 1956. There were 330 separations or 3.2 percent in the Washington, D. C. Area, an increase of 1.4 percent since August 31, 1956. Outside the Washington, D. C. Area, there were 7,642 separations or 13.0 percent, an increase of 8.0 percent since August 31, 1956.

The greatest percentage of separations falls in the terminations group which consists of separations of temporary employees, termination of excepted appointments, etc.

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#### CASUAL EMPLOYMENT

Casual employees (not included in the regular monthly reports of employment) are reported whenever information is received. For the month of August, 1956, there were 4,913 casual employees in the Department, representing a decrease of 1,076 over the July, 1956, figure. The Forest Service is the only agency employing casual personnel during the period.

### PERSONNEL TURNOVER FIRST QUARTER, FISCAL YEAR 1957

Accessions of regular full-time employees totaled 6,127 during the first quarter ending September 30, 1956, excluding transfers between reporting units. The accession rate of full-time employees for the first quarter of Fiscal Year 1957 was 9.0 percent, This represents a decrease of 16.3 percent from the fourth quarter of Fiscal Year 1956.



#### TURNOVER OF FULL-TIME EMPLOYEES 1/ SEPTEMBER 1956



# COMPARISON OF TOTAL PAID EMPLOYMENT 1/ BY MONTHS FOR CURRENT FISCAL YEAR





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


COMPLUISON OF TOTAL PLID EMPLOYMENT 1/ BY MONTHS FOR CULTERT FISCAL YEAR




