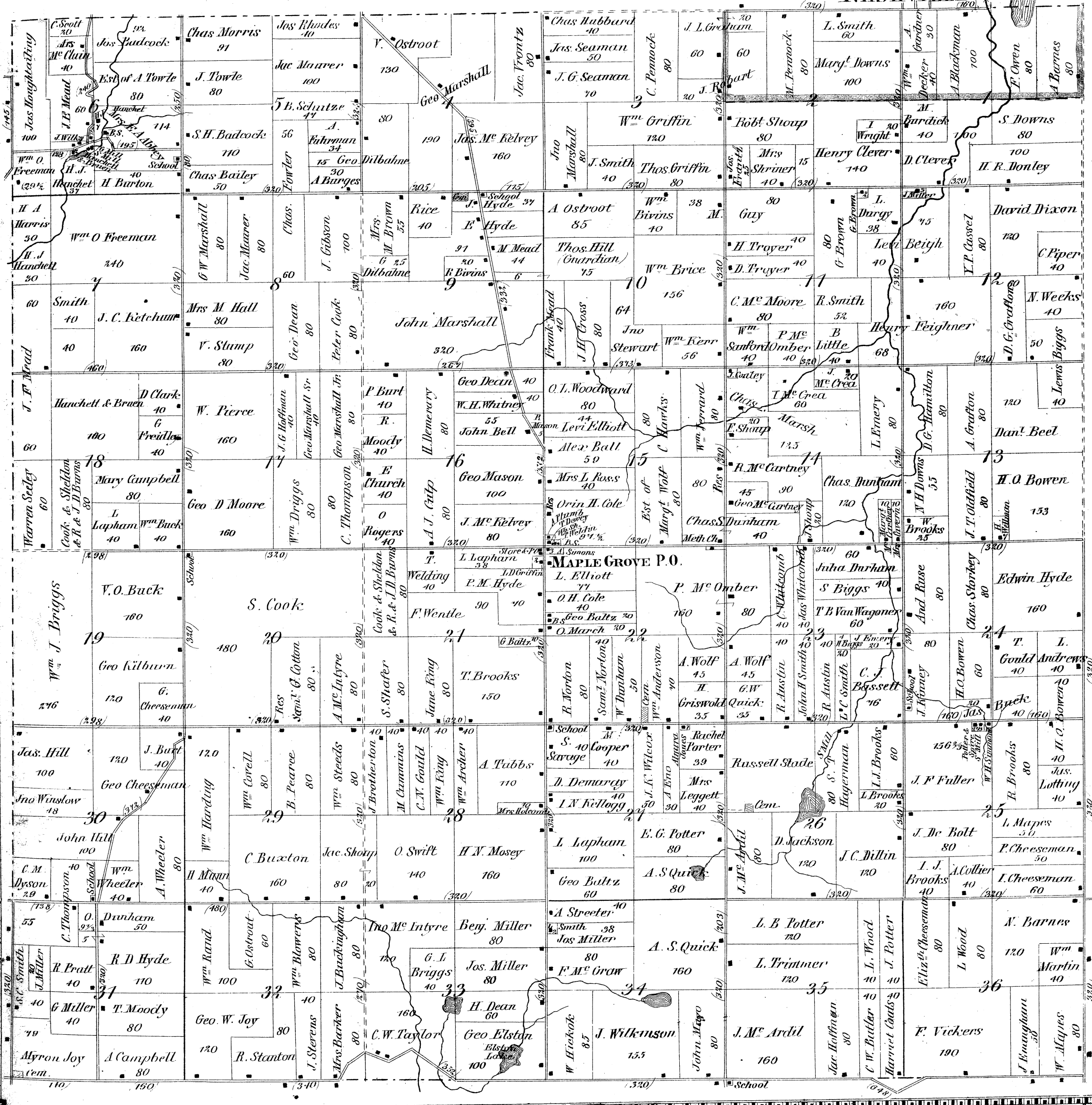




# MAPLE GROVE

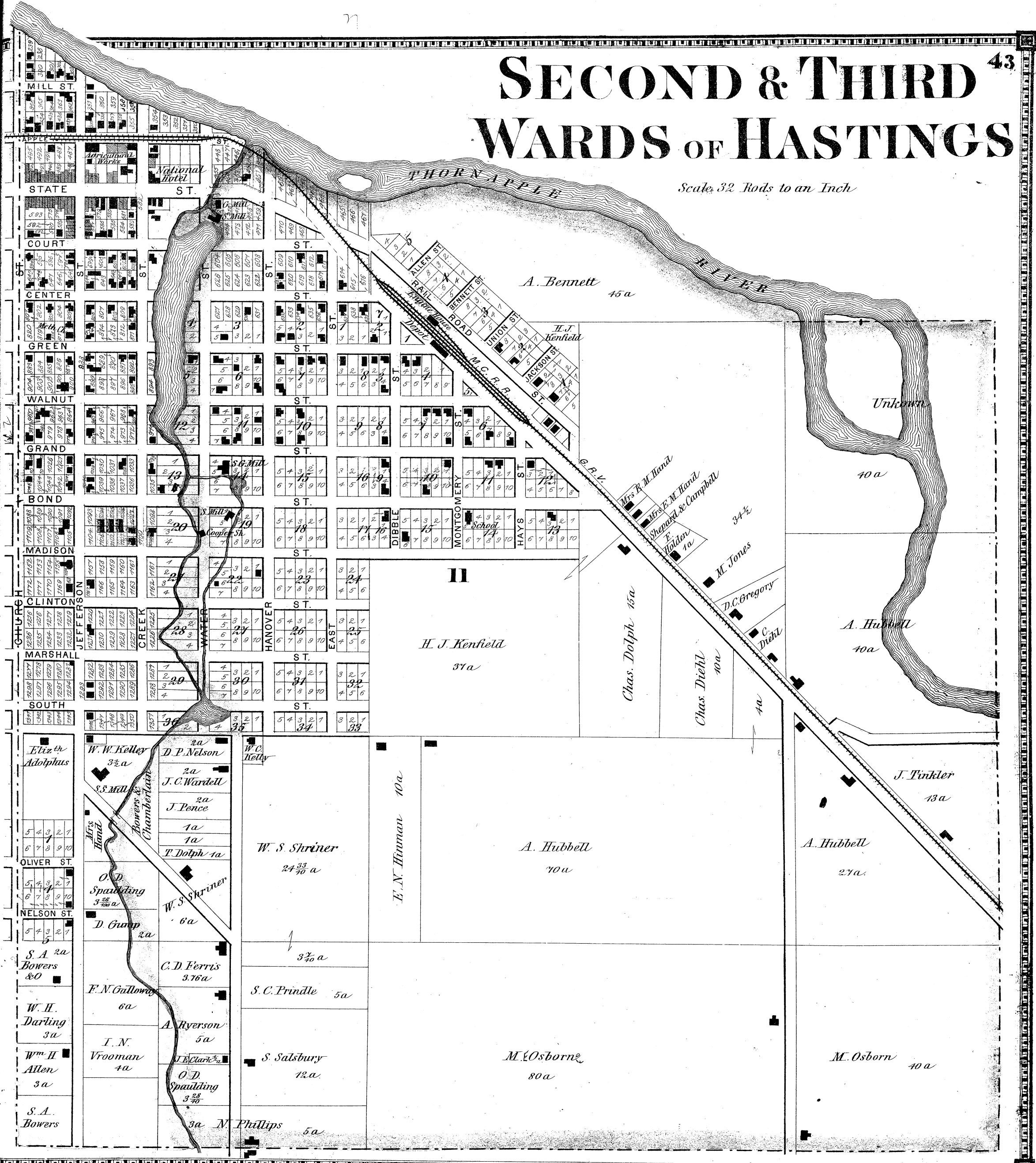
FIRST WARD OF HASTINGS

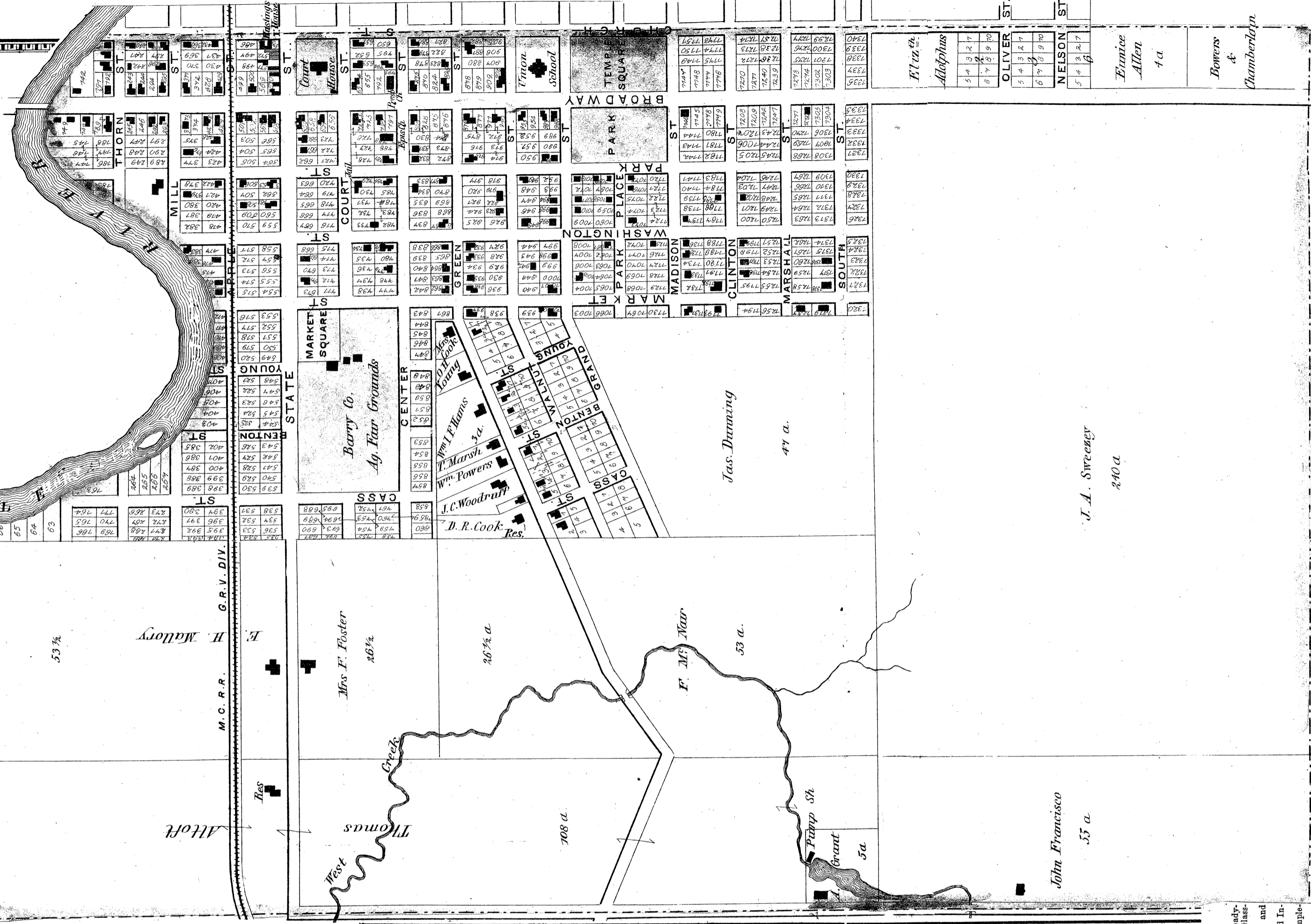






# FOURTH WARDS OF HASTINGS

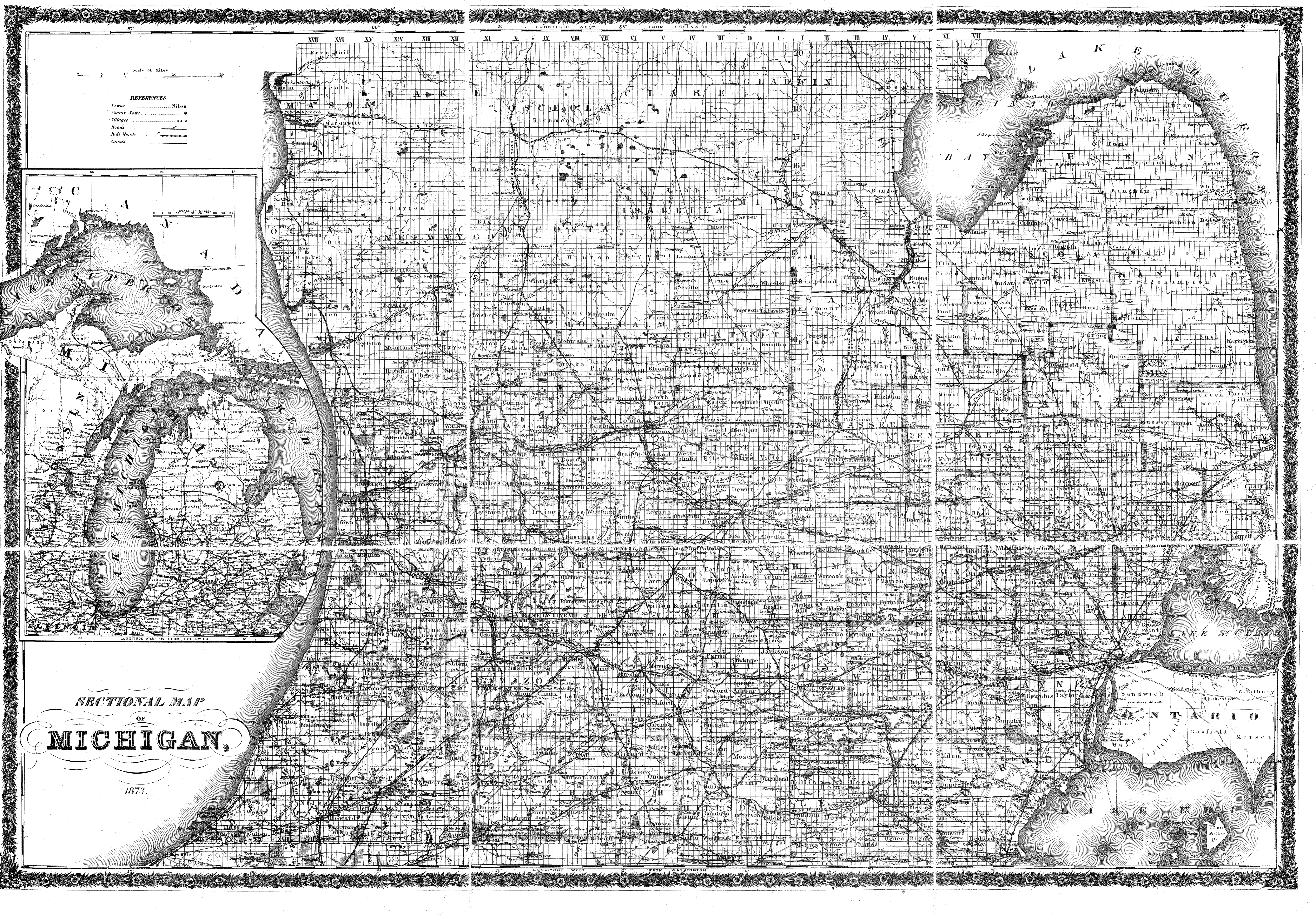
