TO BE SLAYER OF TAYLOR

Mystery May Be Cleared Up by Harry Fields' Confession at Detroit Today

By International News Service LOS ANGELES, Feb. 23.—The "confession" of Harry N. Fields, alias "Harry the Chink" who told the Detroit police that he assisted in the slaying of William Desmond Taylor, was received at the sheriff's office today. Fields names Wong Lee, alias "Sammie Lee" a Chinese, as the slayer. A woman known as Jennie Moore and a man known as Johnnie Clark were members of the "murder" party Fields said.

By International News Service DETROIT, Mich., Feb. 23 .- Harry Fields, county jail prisoner, today told authorities that he sat in an automobile outside the home of William D. Taylor, and heard the shot fired which resulted in the death of the film director.

Two men and a woman, passengers in his car, had just entered the bungalow when the shot was fired, he said. One of the men was a Chinese, a wealthy leader in Tong warfare and dope smuggling. It was this Chinese who fired the shot that killed Taylor, Fields said.

Fields said he could show Los Angeles officials the exact spot where the trio buried the revolver used in the shooting in an alley a few blocks from the scene of the murder.

Japan Has Lots of Oil; U. S. Very Little

NEW YORK, Feb. 23. - That Japan has three centuries of oil supply at her present rate of consumption, and the United States only twenty years of probable oil reserves, was the revelation made in a special report given out by the American Institute of Mining and Metallurgical Engineers, at the opening of its 125th meeting.

'If oil is all important, we have better cause than Japan to seek choice territory on the mainland of Asia," says the statement.

Japan possesses more oil than her propagandists have tried to make the world believe she has. Considering her actual requirements, it appears that Japan is more fortunate than most nations in the possession of oil reserves for the future. Her needs in this respect are not a good reason for keeping the northern, or Russian half of the Island of Saghalien nor any territory on the mainland


