 Your sense of touch can surprise you.

Try this:

- Slowly and lightly rub the big mesh disk between your hands. Some people get a velvety sensation when they do this. If you don't, keep trying—it can take a while to set in.
- Try it with your hand on one side and a friend's on the other. Does the sensation change with the smaller disk?

What's going on?

Your skin contains many touch-sensitive nerve cells. Some respond to pressure, some to stretch, some to vibration. Everything you touch stimulates a combination of responses that helps you identify what you're touching.

Here, rubbing the mesh stimulates nerve cells in a way that produces unusual sensations—but scientists do not fully understand how.

This phenomenon was first noticed by a staff member as a child. What does it feel like to you?





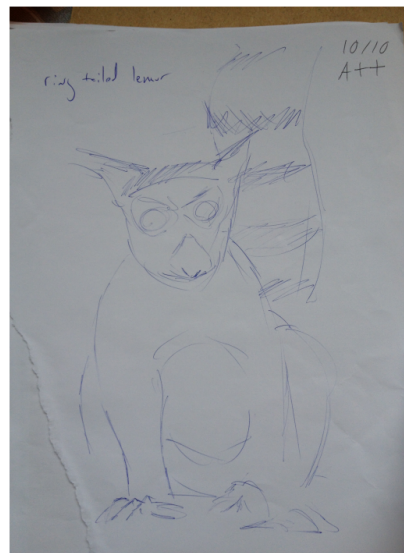
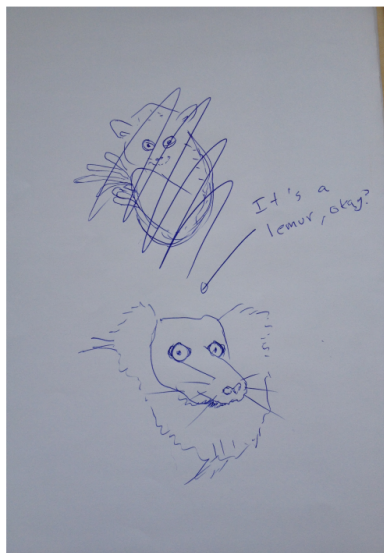
