

Central America | Food Insecurity in the *Dry Corridor*



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Only 15% of returnees from Mexico go back to cities, the rest go back to rural areas

396 300 refugees and asylum seekers (Honduras, Guatemala, El Salvador, Nicaragua) by the end of 2018

More than 50% of the remittances sent to Guatemala by migrants go to rural areas

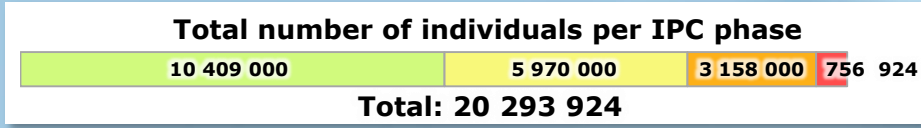
Only 11% of returnees from Honduras go back to cities, the rest go back to rural areas

60 000 Nicaraguans requesting asylum in Costa Rica since 2018

400 000 people from Central America crossed Mexico illegally in 2018
 50% are agricultural workers and 80% of Guatemalans are from rural areas
 More than 60% of unaccompanied minors from El Salvador are from rural areas
