 Plant in well-drained, light soil. Sandy loam, with a little leaf-mold preferable. Plant 2 or 3 inches deep; 1 to 2 inches apart.

3. Don't force too much. The *longer* the growing season the *better*.

4. Don't overwater.

5. Don't use rank manure.

The bulbs are *hardy*, anywhere in Eastern States or Europe, with light protection in winter outdoors. Indoors, grow well. Force well in boxes or pots.
