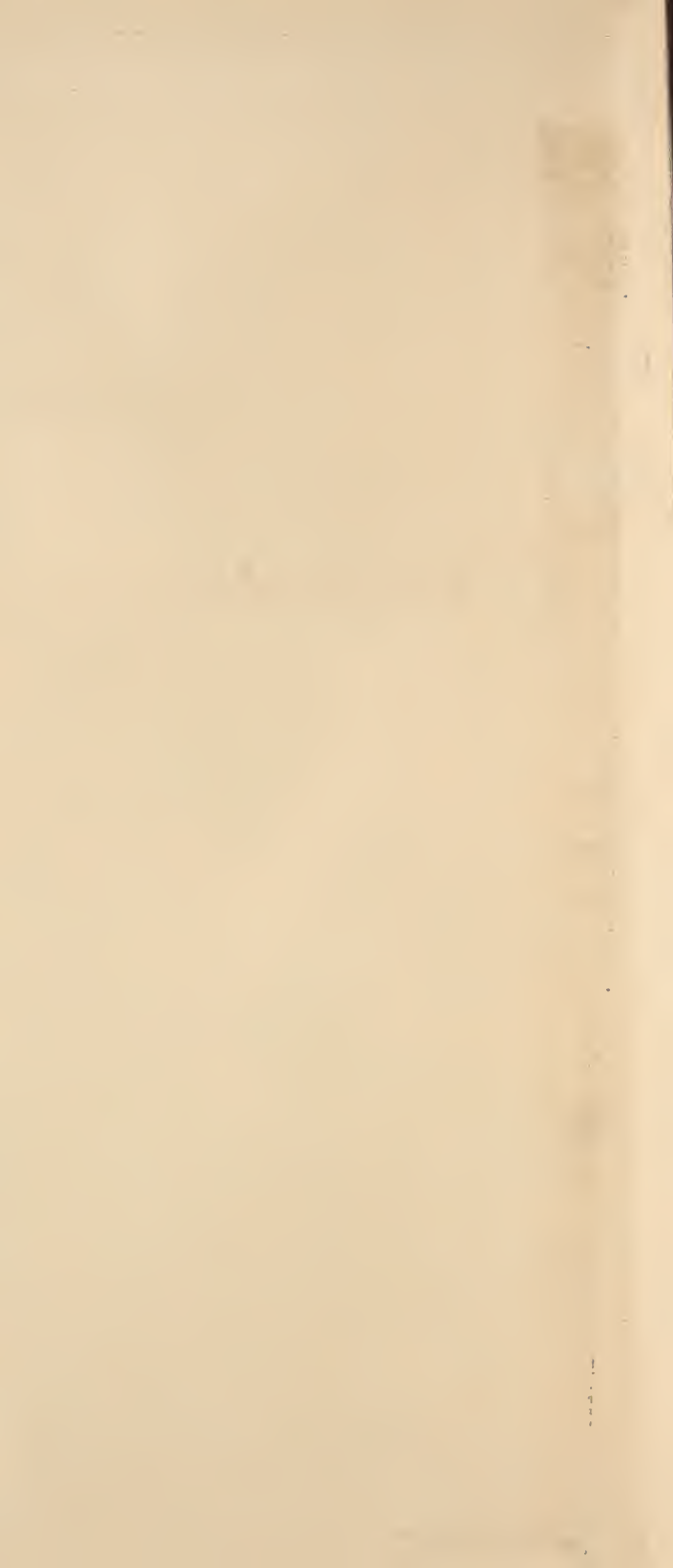
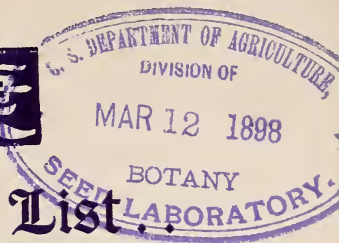

4. Don't overwater.
5. Don't use rank manure.
