**How are the Mighty Fallen!**

The Bank of Crawford County, Pa., at Meadville, has again got into trouble. The notes are not taken or paid out by any Bank in the United States. Kelsey, Wright & Co., who have been agents for the Bank of Crawford Co., for nearly two years in this city, have closed their office in Park Row, and no longer redeem the bills. Messrs. Clark & Williams, Bankers, at No. 1 Wall-st., were also for a long time agents and protectors of this Bank, and without their pecuniary aid the Bank would have failed long ago and been wound up, but they now refuse to redeem or lend any mere money to sustain the concern in its sickly and shattered condition, knowing, as they did,—

That old foggy John,  
With his candle apron on,  
Left the Breckenridge oil,  
For fear Crawford might spoil.  
Taking hold with the broker, Dick,  
They bought the Crawford very quick,  
As snug  
As a bug  
In a rug;  
So they thought  
After they had bought

of the Kelsey-Wisconsin party *one half* the franchises, privileges and charter from the Pennsylvania Legislature, to issue the modest sum of \$900,000, (not quite a million,) of beautiful looking bills, for the benefit and accommodation of the people to use and look at, in place of gold or silver, or other currency more substantial, such as they had found to be reliable.

The Dick, Thompsonian and Ohio party agreed to pay the Kelsey-Wisconsin party \$10,000 for one-half of the Bank, and, we are informed, did pay them a large portion of that amount, and took the Crawford for better or for worse on the statement of the Wisconsin bribery party, when the Dick-Thompsonian party found upon investigation of the affairs of the Bank, they had been *sold*. After it was too late a large defalcation and indebtedness was discovered, which was concealed from them by these most consummate sharpers, Kelsey & Co., who had departed. But it was diamond cut diamond, and an eye for an eye, as Messrs. Dick, Thompson & Co., were, or ought to have been, well posted about this Kelsey party long ago, especially if they read any number of our weekly JOURNAL for a year past, or the public report of the investigating committee of the Wisconsin Legislature, of 1857, showing plainly, on a dozen pages, E. B. Kelsey's name, as proved and acknowledged, to have received a \$20,000 bribe to vote for a corrupt Railroad project.

To show that the present owners, Dick & Co., are corrupt and entirely unreliable and not to be trusted to issue unlimited paper money, we here inform the public that after the sale of the Bank by the Kelsey party to them, they caused to be published a flaming card and editorial paid notices, setting forth the perfect solvency of the Bank, and that it was a *home* and sound institution, altogether owned by residents of Pennsylvania, which statements we knew to be wholly false, and proved them so, by showing the facts and documents under oath and seal, as well as public facts, and stopped their favorite scheme of paying out the worthless notes of the Bank of Crawford Co., over the counters of the State Bank of Ohio. Thus have we saved the community, as we have good reason to believe, nearly a *million of dollars* on this one institution alone, as there is no doubt but they would have succeeded in getting out a circulation of bills

to the full amount of the limits of the charter, if not large amounts of over-issue, as such men never scruple to violate laws. This is but one instance in which we have perseveringly exposed the venality of large schemes to rob the people, and if we are sustained in our course and our subscribers will only take pains to disseminate our JOURNAL OF FINANCE AND BANK REPORTER among their neighbors, we will soon exterminate this class of swindling institutions, that have been such a curse to the country and so large a yearly loss to the business men and laboring public.

It will be remembered by all observing patrons that the **Pittston Bank of Pa.**, has never been quoted in the JOURNAL without a *discredit mark* (of a D or a star,) since it was first attempted to be organized and managed by the original, notorious Buffalo shyster party of nominal bankers, Wallbridge, Thayer, Brawley & Co.

The *first move* made by these famous bankers after *paying handsomely* to grease this PITSTON BANK charter to make it palatable, so that the sensitive and unsophisticated members of the Legislature of Pennsylvania would swallow it without restriction to issue not less than

of these beautiful bills; *was to pay* in \$10,000—not as it should have been, "in gold, silver, or solvent bills of some specie paying Pennsylvania Bank," as the laws of the Commonwealth requires and prescribes, but the **Pittston Bank** was started by the brazen shysters paying the *first instalment* on the Pittston stock in the notes of the bogusly organized **Tioga County Bank**, which latter concern had just gone through an illegal process of fictitious organization, and which was owned by the same Buffalo party.

We have thus briefly and imperfectly shown, for want of time and space, in a succinct manner, how the **PITSTON BANK** was started, from its inception to the paying in of its *first capital*, and as this concern has "lately changed hands entirely and made a *home* and good institution," as the *Pittston Gazette* informs us and the public, we will in a future number of the JOURNAL *answer the challenge* thrown at us with so much abuse, venom and slander by the hiring penny-a-line press and venal Bank Note Reporters for the last two years, for our constant and persevering cautions, and effective discredit of this Pittston concern. We will show how this immaculate Pittston Bank, this *home* institution, has been managed under the administration of Geo. Sanderson & Co., John Thompson and the Burton-Thompsonian party for some time past, and last, but not least, and as always heretofore, we advise all parties to beware of the bills of any Bank so late and so long in the hands of these infamous bogus Burtons, or any men controlled and influenced by such men as foggy John, who paid but *eight cents* on the dollar to borrowed money creditors when he failed, and whose only subsistence is in breaking and cheating weak and ignorant Banks and Bankers who get in his clutches; but none but fools or knaves get there.

**PEOPLE GETTING IMPATIENT.****WHERE IS BILLY FITCH?**

The poor billholders of the bills of the **International Bank** of Toronto, Canada which failed so disastrously, are getting nervous and impatient, almost amounting to frantic madness, in some parts of the country at the delay, procrastination and suspense caused by the published card of Wm. FITCH, President of this *huge institution* of \$1,000,000 high-sounding capital banking concern. Wm. FITCH of Lockport, N. Y., was believed to be owner, director, manager—in short, the embodiment of this mis-called fictitiously and euphonesly named (bogus) **International Bank of Canada!**

Why don't this high-toned, deceptive, model banker, Wm. FITCH, fulfill the expectations held out to the poor impatient starving victimized bill holders, who have been induced to take the notes temporarily, as they thought, but permanently, as they found, through the influence of the high-sounding name, viz—INTERNATIONAL BANK OF CANADA.

WM. FITCH, (a rich man of Lockport, N. Y.,) President, Directors and all hands, except *one* Mr. NICHOLS, also of Lockport, who assisted the huge machine to manufacture and disseminate the International and COLONIAL bogus stuff in immense quantities, which is now in the hands of the people of Canada, Western New York, and in fact scattered all over the United States, among a class that can ill afford to their sell International notes, which they have on hand and worked hard for, or paid dollar for dollar in goods or other money, at 5 or 10 cents on the dollar—their present value. Is it not indeed cruel that the laws and public opinion of this country will permit such heartless swindles to be repeatedly and deliberately done and repeated over and over week after week, as we are reluctantly compelled to record such transactions of great amounts every few days, perpetrated by men making pretensions to respectability and decency, and manage to move in so-called decent society in small towns and third class cities of the rural districts, holding up their heads something like honest men.

**A New-Style Half Dollar.**

A new half dollar has been got up at the United States Mint, in Philadelphia, to be submitted to Government for its approval. The new coin, although of the *same diameter* as that now in circulation, is *much thicker* at the rim in consequence of the deeper sinking of the die, and hence much more durable. *On one side* is a medallion portrait of Washington, with the head wreathed with laurel; the word Liberty upon a scroll over the bust; at the bottom the date, 1859; and around the whole the words United States of America, in plain well-adapted raised letters. *On the reverse side*, a wreath of grain envelopes the words Half Dollar, in the same beautiful letters.

**Signs of the Times.**

The signs of the times in one of our Southern sister States, just south of Mason & Dixon's line, look as if there would be a repetition of the VALLEY BANK farce. *Breslin*, the notorious Ohio defaulter, and a notorious Wisconsin and Connecticut illegal wild cat and Savings Bank defaulter, each have their hands in *two* financial institutions—too deep for safety.

Further next week.

We learn that the ORLEANS COUNTY BANK has been organized at Albion, N. Y., under the General Banking Law. The capital stock is placed at \$100,000, but the articles provide that it may be increased to \$500,000.

**Bank Items.**

.....The NOROMBERGA BANK, ME., has been thrown out by the Suffolk Bank of Boston, Mass.

.....The supreme Judicial Court of Massachusetts has appointed the following receivers of the Bass River Bank:—John Lowell, of Boston, John H. Nickols, of Salem, and John J. Baker, of Beverly.

.....The Treasurer of the State of Virginia has been notified of the intention of the proper officers of the BANK OF WESTON of Va. to close up the affairs of this concern. We buy the notes at 25 per cent. discount.

.....Messrs. Cook & Sargeant, bankers, of Davenport, Iowa, have suspended, brought about by the suspension of their Boston house. This firm were largely interested in the Bank of Florence of Nebraska.

.....A new Bank will shortly be organized in Boston under the Free Banking law, with a capital of \$1,000,000, two-thirds of which has already been subscribed. The President will probably be Mr. Shaw, late President of the Bank of North America of that city.

.....Several of the Banks and brokers of Detroit, Mich. have been swindled by the purchase of a number of forged drafts from James C. Wallace, banker of Corouna, Mich. The amounts are variously estimated, and will probably reach several thousands. Wallace has disappeared, and the drafts have been protested. He has hitherto had the entire confidence of the community where he resided, and of the money dealers in this city, and was, we believe, rather on the sanctimonious order. There are some singular features about the operation, one of which is that he might, if he had chosen, have swindled some of his victims of much larger amounts than he did. The matter is involved in some mystery, and he is being anxiously looked after.

.....A case recently decided in New York, is testified by the Charleston Courier:—"An exchange and collection broker of New York sent a draft of \$250 to the Farmers' Bank of North Carolina for collection. The broker in question had frequently before done business with the North Carolina Bank, and in all cases heretofore the bank had remitted him by drafts. In this instance, however, the draft of \$250 was collected and sent in bills. He never received them, and sued the bank for the amount; and although the money was remitted in a registered letter, the jury before whom the case was tried decided that it was not a 'remittance' in the spirit of the law, and gave a verdict against the bank for the amount."

**IMPORTANT LIBEL SUIT  
IN THE SUPREME COURT OF MASSACHUSETTS.  
Damages Estimated at \$20,000.**

J. TYLER HODGES, Editor and Proprietor of Hodges' Journal of Finance and Bank Reporter, N. Y., vs. GEORGE H. DODGE, President of the WEARE BANK of N. H., and the Boston Traveler.

This case is conducted on the part of the plaintiff by the Hon. Henry F. Durant, assisted by Rufus Choate, Jr., Esq., of Boston. The ground for the libel, is a card published by Dodge in the Boston Traveler, and other papers, attempting to vindicate the WEARE BANK, and reflect upon Hodges and his publications at the expense of truth and the public good.

It is believed that this case, when tried, will develop and reveal facts and circumstances in New England Banking perfectly incredible heretofore, and show, "that all that glitters is not gold," and the means sometimes resorted to, to counteract the influence of reliable and incorruptible Reporters—also reasons why the people have so often suffered cruel losses, and been victimized by Bank failures in Maine, Rhode Island, Connecticut, Vermont and New Hampshire, of late years.
