It has come to the attention of this headquarters that the 25th Infantry Division Provost Marshal on or about 6 July 1946 forwarded a letter to the Governor of the Shiga Prefecture directing that a traffic safety week be held within that prefecture. A draft copy of this letter is attached as Inclosure No. 1.
- 2. Attention is invited that this directive, which in this case emanated from a staff source without command authority, is properly a function of Military Government. Paragraph 3 d (1) (b), Field Order No. 34, this headquarters, 20 March 1946 states as follows:
