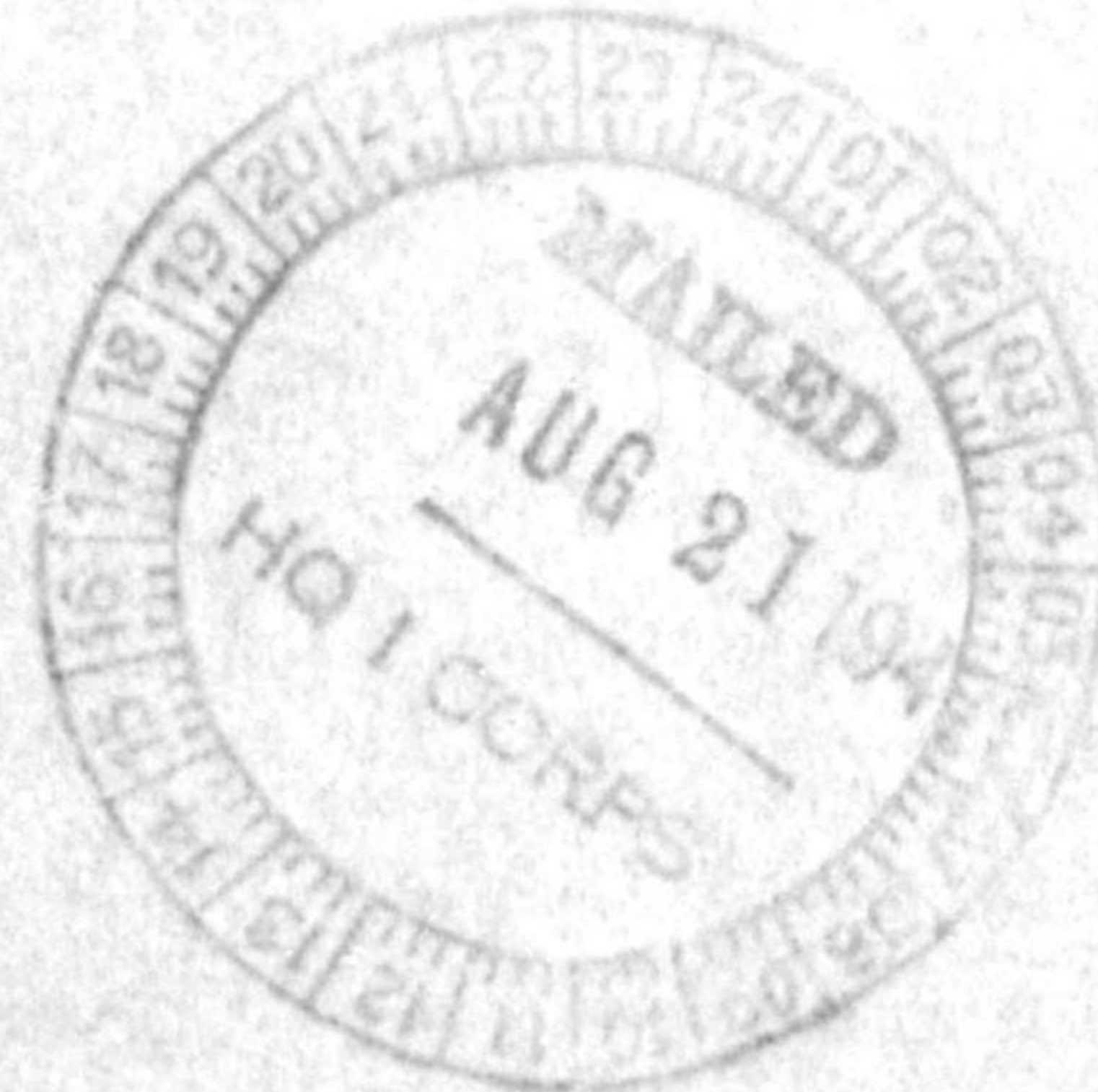

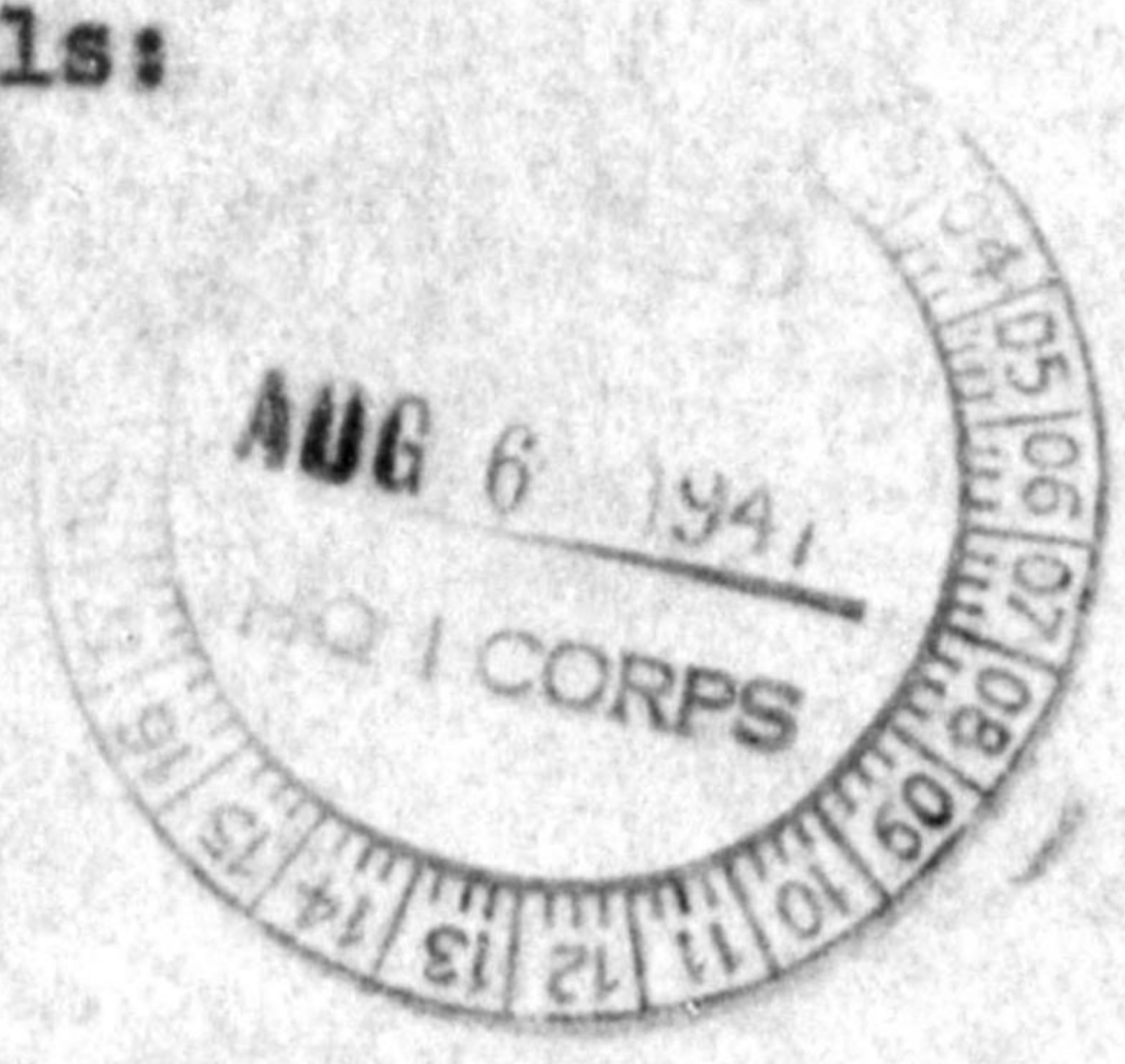

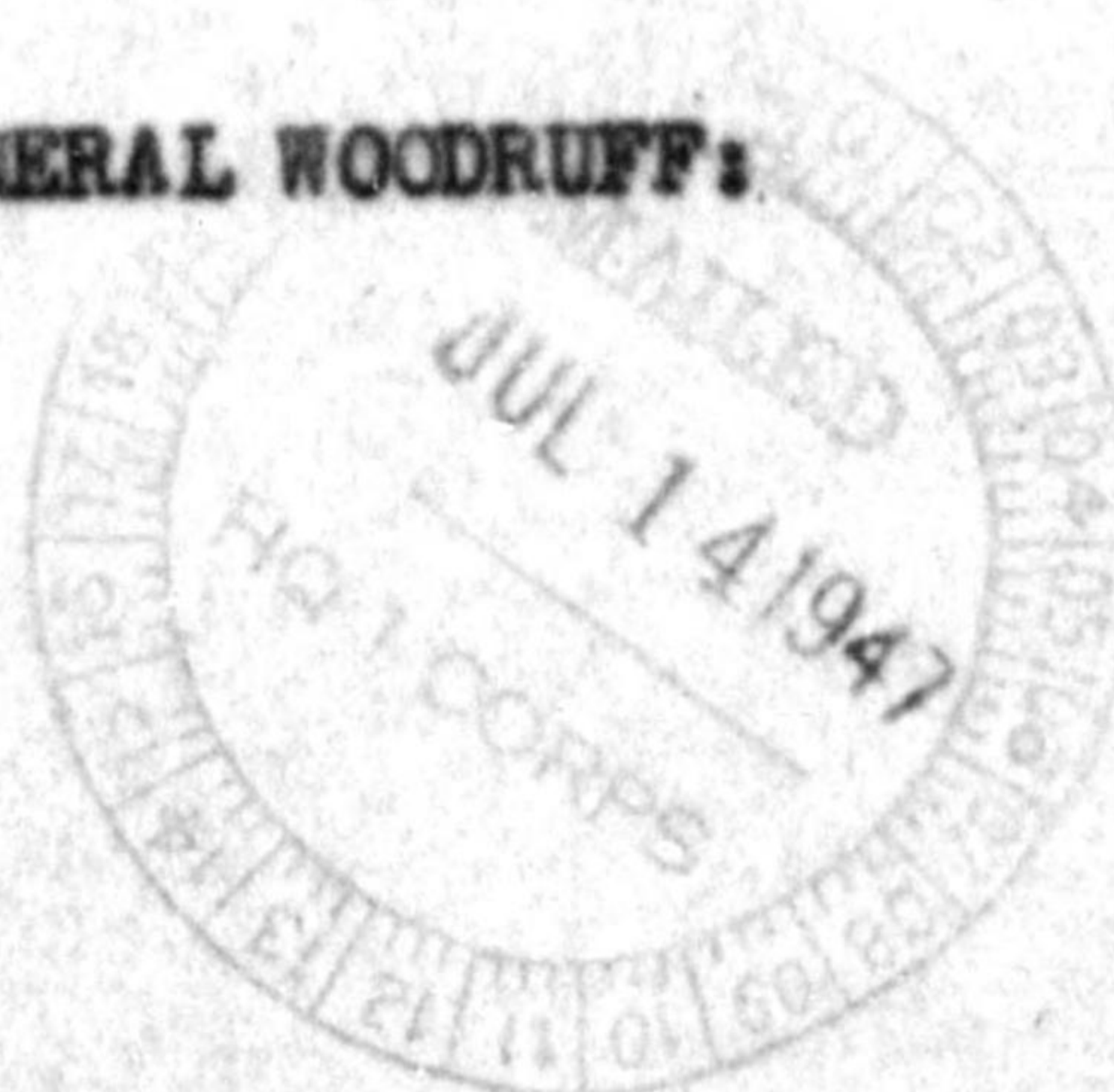

2. An officer is indicated for the Port Quarantine Section to replace the present officer who is to report for separation within a month. Two enlisted men are required as assistants to help with the necessary immunizations. They should be men who can be trained on the job for technical work. Ships arrive at all hours and frequently more than one arrive at a time, requiring long hours of work for this section.

3. Nearly all of the present travel is by United Nations nationals, whose baggage must be checked by military personnel of the Customs Section under the supervision of a commissioned officer. Ships dock only long enough for the Kobe passengers to disembark and for those leaving to embark. Not less than four enlisted men are required to check the baggage without delaying the sailing of the ship.

4. Since immigration duties must be carried on simultaneously with the customs inspection, another officer is required to check the authority for entry and exit and issue the necessary permits.

5. The present head of the Import-Export Section is not renewing his contract and is scheduled to leave the latter part of September. It is contemplated that the supervision of this section could be taken over by the officer who would have immigration as an additional duty. The duties of the Import-Export Section require supervision of cargo working and daily telephonic reports to I Corps. They also assemble all shipping documents, check them for accuracy, and forward them without delay to Headquarters, Eighth Army. The inspection of all SCAJAP shipping requires the full time employment of a capable enlisted man. In addition to the Kobe area, some SCAJAP vessels enter ports on the Japan Sea, necessitating occasional field trips to that coast of Hyogo Prefecture. Not less than two enlisted men are needed in this section.

6. With the exception of the Quarantine Officer and the War Department Civilian in charge of Import-Export, all personnel now employed in the above described sections have been taken from other sections of the team. This results in a definite loss of operating efficiency by the sections from which the personnel has been taken.

MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD

SUBJECT: Kobe as a Port of Entry

1. In SCAP Circular 10 (28 Oct 46) and SCAP Circular 8 (30 Aug 46), the Commanding General Eighth Army has been designated to establish control of entry and exit of individuals, aircraft and surface vessels into and from Japan.

2. In compliance with the references cited in paragraph (1) of this memorandum, the port of Kobe was visited on 12 December 1946 for the purpose of evaluating quarantine, customs and housing facilities and procedures. The following persons made the tour of inspection:

1st Lt. Stuart C. Finch, Port Quarantine Officer, 8th Army, MG.
 1st Lt. Robert W. Merkle, Port Quarantine Consultant, PH & W, SCAP
 Dr Yamaguchi, Japanese Chief Quarantine Officer

3. At the port of Kobe, the following Japanese officials were met and conferred with:

Dr. Kumo, Assistant Chief of Quarantine
 Dr Yamamoto, Prefectural Health Officer
 Capt T. Sasaki, Harbormaster
 S. Kimura, Customs Official
 S. Okada, Director of Maritime Bureau

4. Because of their close proximity, the port of Kobe is in essence the port of entry to Osaka. In the year 1937 the port of Kobe ranked first in Japan as a point of entry with an incoming net tonnage of about sixteen million. Osaka ranked third with ten million net tons.

5. The harbor is roughly oval shaped with Osaka on the west and Kobe on the East. Numerous breakwaters form protection for the port as well as the natural terrain features of Osaka-wan. The distance by water from Kobe to Osaka is roughly ten miles. The quarantine station is located at Kobe near the entrance to the harbor, and about three miles from the center of town. The customs area is centrally located near the main piers in downtown Kobe. These two facilities were used to service both ports before the war.

6. The pre-war commerce was coming from all over the world. It consisted chiefly of diversified cargo and passengers.

7. Port facilities at Kobe consist of 42 wharves, 92 godowns, 197 warehouses, adequate repair works, and a daily water supply of about 2200 tons per day. Up to 25,000 ton vessels can be moored alongside the piers. The buildings and various other installations at the port are now in fair repair. "adio communication

with ships is available. Quarantine anchorage is not marked off. The Kobe Maritime Bureau has under its jurisdiction fifteen launches of various types and ranging from light to 225 tons. This includes two gas fumigating ships. Most of these are badly in need of repairs.

8. Since 1941 there have been about 1100 cases of typhus in Kobe-Osaka area. Two cases of cholera were reported this year. No other cases of quarantinable disease have been reported. During the past twenty years 49 cases of cholera and 47 cases of smallpox were picked up on incoming ships. The Prefectural Health Team has been immunizing the harbor workers, and the Quarantine Station has been immunizing ships' crews. About 500 immunizations of crew members were done in the months of September, October, and November of this year.

9. Harbor rodent and sanitary situation at Kobe is bad. The prefectural Health Team has made some efforts to alleviate this situation, but they have not been very successful. Before the war this was a function of the Quarantine Station.

10. The Quarantine Station was constructed in 1935 and is located on the south side of the port at the entrance to the harbor. A recent typhon and bombings have caused considerable damage to the station, and at present many refugees are living in the building. However, the physical arrangement is such that that the station can be used with but a little repair. The buildings are all quite modern, and are well arranged. The landing piers have been destroyed. The chief buildings consist of an isolation hospital with a capacity of 30, detention facilities for 300, bacteriological lab, rat autopsy lab, large office buildings, incineration and sterilizing facilities.

11. The present personnel at the station consisted of 3 doctors, 2 clerks 2 nurses, and 11 miscellaneous. Before the war there were 6 doctors, 2 pharmacists, 6 clerks, 3 technicians, and 30 others. No trained cyanide personnel is available.

12. The large modern customs building is now occupied by the 7th Medium Port. The Port Surgeon has his office here, and at present he is maintaining quarantine service to all military vessels entering the Port. The customs building is located between piers 3 and 4. Directly across the street is a smaller building, but of adequate size and construction which now houses the Japanese customs and Maritime Bureau. At present they have 140 persons working for customs, and had 1300 before the war. The chief of customs is M. Takahashi.

13. At Kobe, Military Government has a very extensive physical arrangement. The quarters are in Fuji Hotel which is about five minutes from the customs building, and about fifteen minutes from the Quarantine Station. Housing facilities for many more officers and enlisted men are available.
