Currently Army Eight does not have means to effectively utilize the aerial photo arm in Korea and, despite continuing efforts to correct this serious deficiency in both operation and intelligence fields, no immediate solution can be seen if limited solely to means available to this command. Photo interpretation personnel at all echelons and photo reproduction personnel at Army level are currently operating at 1/3 strength needed for full utilization of Air Force capacity. Equipment shortages exist in all departments of this most important Army photo center and, apparently for lack of an established table organ and equip for its existence, available equipment has been secured on a loan basis from Air Force sources. Current Air Force coverage of Korea is about 50 percent that desired and being sought; however, this present capacity is about 6 times that which the Army Photo Interpretation Center can properly process with its present strength.

As a result of this personnel and equipment shortage, approx 60 percent of the photo intelligence now available to Army Eight is being lost. No interpretation is now being done for comparative studies, over-printed defensive maps and over lays, photo maps, uncontrolled mosaics, joint Army-Air intelligence summaries, or terrain and traffic ability intelligence. Personnel should be available for daily interpretation of approx 3000 square miles of terrain. No tactical air reconnaissance net for rapid dissemination of photo and reconnaissance information exists. 48-hour time lag in photo reports are frequent occurrences. Untimely delivery service exists as result of both shortage of photo interpreter personnel to process prints and aircraft personnel.

Required were immediately are 10 officers and 38 enlisted men trained in photo interpretation work; however, desirable solution by establishment of aerial photo interpretation company. Requirements for above officers and enlisted men, and long range replacement program set forth in CINCPAC msg CX 64032, 2 June 51, and CX 64741 dated 12 June 51. If photo personnel only partially trained they would be sent at present training level for on the job training here. In addition existing shortages of liaison pilots and ground crew personnel and SCR 399 radios in this command should be corrected without delay so that light aircraft delivery section and a tactical air reconnaissance net can be established at this center;

and engineer photo reproduction company organized under provisions of tentative table orgn and equip 5-54 should be dispatched to FEC without delay (as requested by CINCPAC msg CX 64836, 13 June 51) and a definite over-all organization for this center should be established soonest. Currently, no similar organization exists at theater level.

In the event these foregoing personnel requirements cannot be met from sources immediately available, request action be initiated to procure personnel from UK and Canadian sources.

1. Some time ago, informal reports reached this headquarters that adequate aerial photographic support was not being provided for use by the UN Ground Forces. This caused me considerable concern, and, as a result, General Partridge was requested to look into the situation to insure that the photographic capabilities of his command were being used to their utmost for this support.

2. I am pleased to learn that a substantial volume of photographic prints are being furnished Eighth Army units. For example, during the period 13 - 18 February 1951, I Corps received 2,697 photographs; 6,965 by IX Corps; and 14,070 by X Corps. At the same time the period between request and delivery of photography is being lessened. In many cases, the request received by G-2 Air is translated into a delivered photograph to the EUSAK Air Courier within 24 hours and in most cases the time is less than 48 hours.

3. This effort, however, is not without cost. The logistic drain in the case of sensitized photographic supplies is causing some concern to United States Air Force procurement agencies. The basis of this concern is the desirability of a build-up of reserve stocks against requirements resulting from a major emergency.

4. The present expenditure rate for sensitized materials for Eighth Army needs while large, can however be further increased when needed. The United States Air Force will unstintingly support fulfilling

this objective from its available resources. Effective exploitation of photographic effort however lies in photographic interpretation. FEAF is emphasizing the dissemination of interpretation reports rather than the distribution of photographs where practicable. This results in fewer prints but more readily applicable intelligence.

5. It may be that you might also want to examine into the exploitation of the volume of photos being delivered to the Eighth Army in relation to the number of photo interpreters available to you.

6. The foregoing is in no way intended to discourage requests for photography which will continue to be honored to the maximum of our ability. I feel though that we should run a check every once in awhile to make sure our efforts are not being wasted.
