

# THE P R E F A C E.

**H**AVING at length, by my own unwearied Application, and the kind Assistance of many Gentlemen and Gardeners, compleated my Collection of the various Kinds and different Sorts of FRUITS produced in this Kingdom; and having, according to my Proposals, disposed them in monthly Order on twelve Copper-Plates, coloured from the Oil-Paintings, after the real Fruits: Now in order to render this Work still farther useful, I take the liberty of presenting this little Book to my SUBSCRIBERS; hoping they will accept it as a Mark of my Gratitude for their Favours, and of my sincere Desire to render the whole Design, as useful and pleasant as possible.

It contains several Catalogues of Fruit, disposed in such a manner as to shew at one View all that a curious Enquirer can be desirous of knowing.—Would he learn what Kinds and Sorts every Month produces? The first Catalogue sets before him, under the Name of each Month, all that are then in Season, and informs him whether they are Standard, Dwarf, or Espalier, by the Letters S. D. E. And likewise what Aspect they require, by the initial Letters of the four Cardinal Points, East, West, North and South.—Does he want to know how many Sorts there be of any particular Specie, or Kind of Fruit? Let him but turn to the second Catalogue, and there he will find all the different Sorts brought together under the kinds they belong to: As for example, all Sorts of Apples under the word APPLES, all sorts of Pears under the word PEARS, &c.—Would he be informed what Fruit-Trees should be planted against each of his Garden Walls? The third Catalogue of Aspects will teach him fully.—Or desires he to see at once what Trees are proper for Standards, Dwarfs, or Espaliers? The fittest for either of these Purposes are ranged together in a Fourth Catalogue for his Information.—And as there are some uncommon Fruits, which are beautiful to the Eye, but unfit for eating, a List of them is also added.

By these Catalogues Gentlemen will be assisted in furnishing their Gardens and their Tables with the greatest Variety, and the best of Fruits, without being liable to such a Disappointment as usually follows an in-judicious or random Choice.

And that the Subscribers to my former Work of Flowers may be furnished with Directions how to chuse the properest for every purpose, I have annex'd a Catalogue of FLOWERS, wherein is shewn not only the Season of their blowing, but also whether they are most fit for open Borders, Edgings, Pots, &c. distinguishing as to the Culture of them, those which, growing in Beds, require a Covering from the Summer-Sun and Winter-Frost, as well as those which stand in need of the Green-House or the Stove.

Thus much I imagine needful towards understanding this little Book; and what follows, in relation to myself, will be I hope excused, since it is intended only to satisfy the Curiosity of those who do not know me, and may perhaps for that Reason have the worse Opinion of my Performances.

Gardening is the Employment Providence has allotted me; and it happily falls out to be a Business the most suitable of all others to my Genius and Inclination. I have spent many Years in collecting, cultivating and improving all the different Kinds of Trees, Plants, Fruits, and Flowers, that I could possibly

possibly obtain; and in doing this, have spared neither Cost nor Pains.

With intent to make the Love of Gardening more general, and the understanding of it more easy, I have from time to time published Catalogues, containing large Variety of Trees, Plants, Fruits, and Flowers, both Foreign and Domestic, cultivated by me for Sale. Nothing more need here be said of the Monthly Flower-Pieces, which I published some time ago, as they have been so generally approved; but it may not be amiss to give some little account of the Fruit-Pieces which this Book accompanies.

In making this Collection, I have been generously supplied with Choice of the finest Fruits, and Increase of the same, as well as greatly assisted in comparing and naming them, by a great many, both of Gentlemen and Gardeners, who are not only good Judges of the Culture, but exquisitely nice in distinguishing the Flavour, and most minute Difference of the several Sorts of Fruits; and no Name has been inserted at the Bottom of the Plates, or in the following Catalogues, but by their unanimous Opinion and Consent.—But after all, I don't pretend, that either the Plates or Catalogues contain every individual Species of the Fruits which may be found amongst us: new Sorts are frequently produced, and will, perhaps, be so as long as the World endures; nor can they be increased, dis-

dispersed, and known immediately: I may however venture to affirm, that I have collected a greater Variety than has yet been brought together, and few I hope will be found wanting.—As for the Designing, Engraving, and Colouring, I shall say no more, but that I have taken the utmost Care to have them performed in the best manner, by the most able Hands.

A Fondness for the Art I have spent my Life in, and a Desire to do some Service to the Publick, have been the chief Motives of all my Undertakings, and I must with the utmost Satisfaction and Thankfulness acknowledge that Heaven has blessed my Endeavours.

I shall only add my humble Thanks to all, who have assisted me in this Work; particularly to those, who, freely and unask'd, furnished me with several of the Choicest Fruits.

I likewise acknowledge myself obliged to all my SUBSCRIBERS, and hope my present Labours will be honoured with their kind Acceptance; and I am, with great Respect,

**T**H E R E are certain Terms used in speaking of *Fruits*, which perhaps will not be thought improper to be inserted in a Work of this Kind. We say of *Fruits*, that they are

- Of a grateful Taste or Flavour, of a fragrant or fine Smell.
- Aromatic* or *Spicy*, of a warm or spicy Taste or Smell.
- Musky*, or of a rich spicy perfumed Taste or Smell.
- Vinous*, or of a wine-like Taste or Smell.
- Odoriferous*, musked or perfumed.
- Sharp* or *sour*, or of a biting Taste.

Of the *Flesh* or *Pulp* we say, it is

- Soft*, buttery, melting, or sweet.
- Short* and crackly.
- Gritty*, sticky, or stony, hard or harsh near the Core.
- Tender* or soft.
- Firm*, not hard, but breaks short in the eating.
- Tough*, neither fine nor delicate.
- Doughy*, flattish or disagreeable.
- Mealy*, when dry or over-ripe.

The Flavour, Colour, Time of Ripening, Size and Goodness of FRUITS, vary a great deal, according to the Soil and Scituation, and as the Season proves either cold or hot, wet or dry.

FRUITS of a good Kind, planted in a proper Soil, and towards the right Aipe&t, will usually answer the Character they bear: But by an ill Soil, too much Shade, or a wrong Exposure, they will lose their fine Taste and Colour, and be good for little.

It has been observed that such FRUITS, as grow on *Dwarfs* or *Espaliers*, are better tasted, and will keep longer than those against Walls; but are not so large and beautiful.

All FRUITS should be gathered prudently, and eat seasonably.


