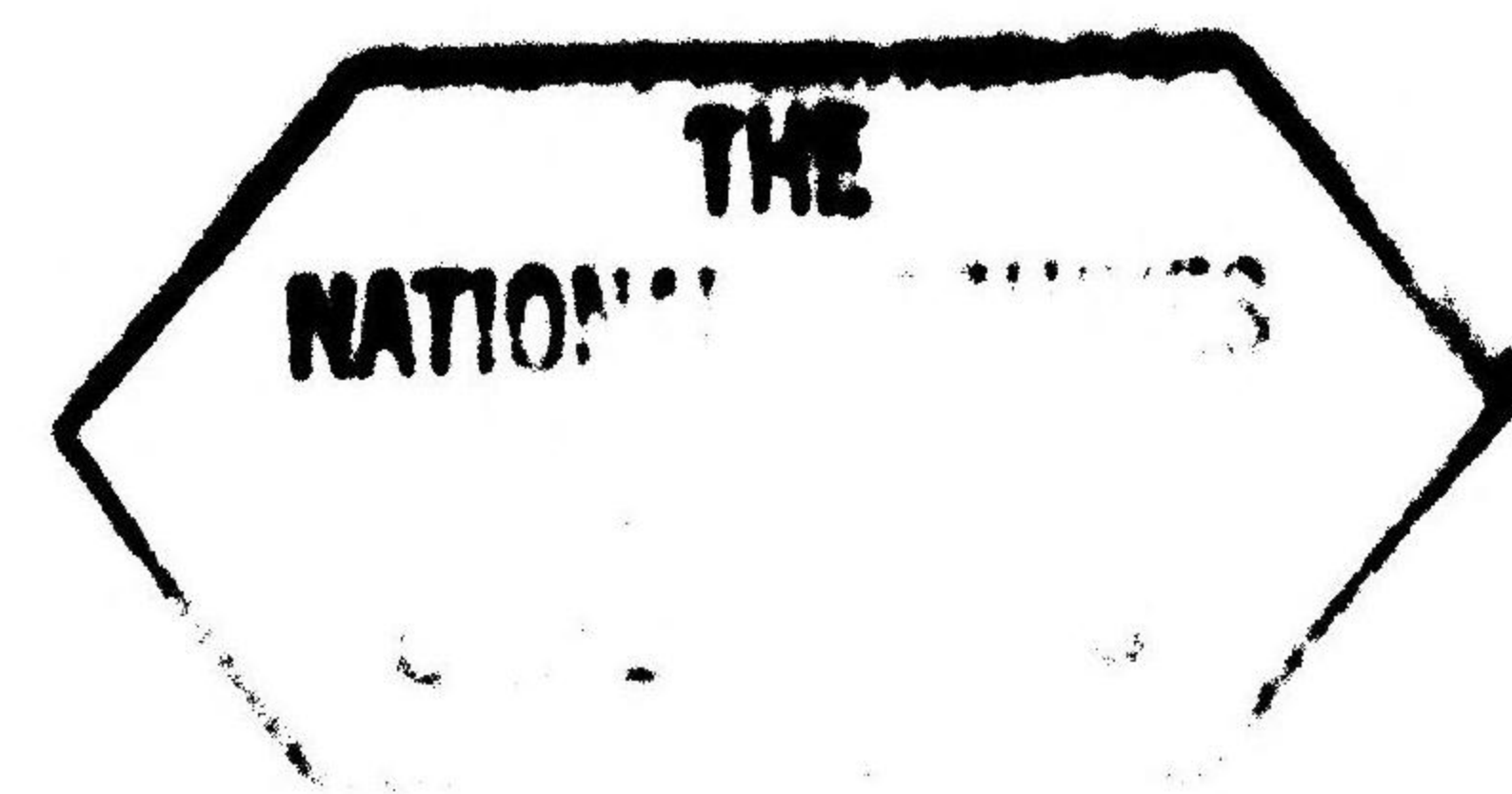

c. Both hotels are Japanese style, have no dining rooms, western style rooms or kitchens. American food is not available.

d. The hotels are located in Awara Town, 13 miles from Fukui City on the main highway between Fukui City and Kanazawa and can be reached by tram car from Fukui City in one hour. Taxi service is not available.

e. Sanitary conditions are in accordance only with existing Japanese hotel laws and do not meet American standards. Shoes must be removed upon entering. These hotels are the only ones available in this territory and are recommended as emergency billets only for foreign traders.

2. It is not anticipated that any additional hotels in Fukui Prefecture will be recommended by this headquarters for inclusion on future hotel lists.

1. In compliance with letter Headquarters Eighth Army, A3MGL 000.7, subject as above, 7 June 1949, the following report is submitted:

a. Police Wireless Bureau:

(1) At present, there is sufficient personnel available to meet minimum requirement. Training for additional first grade communicators is being conducted.

b. Equipment and Facilities:

(1) In accordance with directives of 30 Jun 48, equipment and facilities have been satisfactorily completed.

(2) Following defects and requirements are not known at this time:

(a) Whether present building will stand four degree vibration of wind or earthquake.

(b) Whether present equipment i.e: wooden aerial poles, will stand a 75MPH wind.

(3) Present equipment, especially transmitters, while meeting standard as shown in par b(1) above, is repaired ex-navy equipment, and does not meet requirements of the international treaty.

c. Police Emergency Wireless Bureau:

- (1) Estimate for emergency wireless is responsibility of N.R.P headquarters.
- (2) Efforts are being made to complete personnel requirements before 1 August 1949. On hand at present is one 2d and one 3d grade communicator.
- (3) It is anticipated that all equipment requirements will be met by 31 August 1949.

d. Recommendation:

- (1) Due to the 1948 earthquake, the present wooden communication building was constructed as a temporary measure. It is, at present, entirely inadequate for use as a communications office. It is recommended that an adequate structure be planned and constructed for NRP of this prefecture.

3. Japanese Tax Officials and key personnel in tax sections are greatly in need of education on taxes. Classes conducted by qualified instructors would improve the tax program greatly.

4. The present court system is greatly handicapping the clearing of delinquent cases and tax violation existing with in Fukui Prefecture. Violators have little fear of the tax penalties since they seldom have them imposed on them. They frequently compromise on the settlement and wave the penalty. There are to few qualified lawyers or judges in this prefecture and at present more than 300 cases on docket. Postponment is a frequent practice and violators continue to laugh at the court system and weakness of tax laws. A common practice is to file an income tax return then completely ignore payment having no fear of the high interest rate due to the compromise by tax officials.

1. Courts in Fukui Ken;

a. The Fukui District Court, Fukui Domestic Relations Court and the Fukui Summary Court are all located in Fukui shi.

b. Branches of these courts are located in Tsuruga-shi, Takefu-shi, Ono-machi and Obama-machi, respectively.

c. It is expected that another branch of the Summary Court will be opened after April 1949 in either Mikuni-machi or Kanazu-machi.

2. Judges:

a. Judges authorized - 14
b. Vacancies - - - 0

3. Cases tried by courts in Fukui Ken last Year:

a. 9226 criminal cases
b. 2674 civil and arbitration cases
c. 2145 domestic cases (trial)
d. 278 domestic arbitration cases

4. Number of cases in relation to number of judges:

a. At the present time there are insufficient judges in Fukui Ken to handle the increased number of court cases.

(1) After the Fukui earthquake, civil cases increased steadily with the number of suits and arbitration cases regarding home sites. Many of these cases are still pending.

(2) The revision of the New Criminal Procedure Code at the beginning of this year has slowed down the operation of courts in criminal cases. Owing to the short existence of the code, any recommendations or criticisms at the present time would be nullified.

(21)

(3) Murder cases alone increased from 4 to 26.

5. Status of judges in regard to other public officials:

a. Because judges and procurators were placed in office at the same time, there is no seniority.

b. Judges and procurators are generally paid on the same level.

6. Court Clerks:

a. The caliber of personnel assigned to the position of court clerks is declining. This is generally due to low pay as compared with other general court officials.

7. Procurators:

a. Authorized in Fukui Ken:

- (1) 8 procurators
- (2) 5 assistant procurators

b. Present strength of procurators in Fukui Ken:

- (1) 6 procurators
- (2) 4 assistant procurators

c. As shown by number of cases cited in paragraph 3 above, the average number of cases handled by the procurators and assistants in Fukui-ken is entirely too many for such a small staff.

d. Because of meager salaries and unknown future possibilities of the procuratorial assignments, it is difficult to fill existing vacancies.

8. Education of police under the New Code of Criminal Procedure:

a. At the present time the police are very inexperienced in collecting sufficient evidence to aid in court case procedures.

9. Law and reference books:

a. Because of the earthquake in Fukui, law books, reference books and other necessary legal materials were destroyed.

- (1) To date much of this material has not been replaced.

10. Recommendations:

a. That the present system be revised, whereby a "step-up system" could be used. Assistant procurators to become, in time, procurators and procurators to judges, etc.

b. That the pay scale for courts be adjusted upward in order

that more able personnel will be attracted to the positions.

c. That a uniform system of education for police in crime detection, especially in collection of evidence, be instituted.


d. That buildings, furniture, legal and reference books, etc., destroyed in the Fukui earthquake be replaced as soon as practicable.

e. That more judges be authorized for Fukui Ken.

f. That more procurators and assistant procurators be authorized for Fukui Ken.

g. That more pay be authorized for court clerks.

1. Kin Soo In alias Masao Nakamura, a Korean, was apprehended for fraud on 18 March 49 by a policeman in front of the Fukui Railroad Station. He repatriated to Korea in November 1944, but illegally entered Japan at Shimonoseki port on the Shakudo Maru alias Akagane Maru on 27 December 1948. Upon complete investigation, he will be transported by train to the Sasebo Repatriation Center.

2. Search for the escaped ship is being continued. Information has been turned over to local CIC for further investigation.

3. In accordance with Eighth Army Operational Directive 45, dated 24 May 1947, this team is submitting the enclosed information.

1. An all out effort has been made by the section using every available means of communications to encourage a 100% collection of all taxes.

a. Telegrams were sent to all tax offices frequently to stimulate and raise interest of the program. Telephone calls were made for the same purpose with the knowledge of how other tax offices were doing and encourage competition.

b. Visit to all tax offices once every week. Meeting with tax office chief and section chiefs. Meeting with delinquent groups.

c. Helped Nozei Kan-no-Undo to go throughout the prefecture to encourage the tax payment. More than 30 towns and villages were visited making approximately 120 talks to groups.

d. Education and information of the tax program has been stressed at every opportunity, including all meetings, dedications of construction and conferences with the cooperation of sections in Mil Govt.

e. Stressing the importance of Tax Collection.

- (1) Why the people pay taxes.
- (2) Where the tax money goes.
- (3) Knowledge to all of the penalties.
- (4) Encouraging tax offices to have men working in the field, we are receiving favorable results.
- (5) Pushing the sales transaction tax, self assessed income tax and sake tax.

SYNOPSIS OF PAST MONTH'S ACTIVITIES

Legal & Govt Section

Prepared and Submitted by Captain I N Munaker, Section Chief

1. Attended Ken-wide conferences of NRP wherein discussions concerning NRP policies were held. Toured Fukui Ken, interviewing Mayors, Public Safety Commissioners, District NRP Chiefs, MP Chiefs in 12 largest cities and villages, also six districts. Discussed various subjects including budgets, Korean problems, etc.
2. Inspected NRP school and discussed primary and advanced Police Education problems.
3. Much time and effort has been expended in combat with local communist party regarding attempt to recall Mayor and City Assemblymen of Tsuruga City. Through coordinated efforts with CI Section, advised as to countermeasures, publicity, and attended a public open discussion, the first in Fukui Prefecture. Communists have now retrenched and are now concentrating on recall of only 4 or 5 members of the assembly, and because of certain indiscretions on the part of these members, i.e., open parties, rambling, etc., it is probable this recall will succeed. Should this recall be successful, and a by-election become necessary, preventative measures have been taken to keep communists from gaining entrance to the assembly. An organization, known as "Tsuruga City Loving Ass'n" (brotherhood?), which is composed of businessmen and professional men, and is non-partisan, has been organized. Progress of this new organization will be observed.
4. Five Mock Trials were held in this prefecture during the past month. A great deal of interest in these trials was displayed by the general public, who were allowed to participate in the judging. Attendance total was approximately 7000.
5. Bomb disposal personnel were taken to sites of sea mines discovered by the Japanese and disposing operations were observed to safeguard any property nearby. Two sea mines, 27 grenades, and other materials were disposed of (destroyed). In all, there were 71 pieces.
6. Coordinating with Economics Section, results of Blackmarket Raids, Train Raids, Illegal "sake" Raids, etc., are being reviewed in order to produce suggestions for more positive results in the future.
7. Coordinating with Civil Education regarding legal aspects of schools being built and the redistribution law.

8. Attended town meeting of Katsuyama where three new Public Safety Commissioners were introduced by Mayor and Chief of Police.

Proposed Activities for the following Week:

1. Surveillance of by-election for Mayor of Nakagawa-mura, Imadate-gun.
2. Further surveillance of recall activities of communists.
3. Individual Civic Problem surveys.

Report on The Second People's
Yally at Tsuruga City.

18.00 - 22.00 12 March

at Citizen's Hall, Tsuruga City

About 1,200 people attended.

Mayor Kawahara, Municipal Assembly Members and other municipal officials attended the meeting to explain their position. Civil Information Officer and Chief, Public Safety Section of one Fukui Military Government were also present and, at the beginning of the meeting, reminded the audience that while citizens are legally entitled to scrutinize the municipal administration the debate should be conducted fairly and democratically.

The discussion was chiefly concentrated upon taxation, harbour, school affairs etc. After the discussion, however, audience generally admitted the sincerity of the mayor, but seemed to be still unsatisfied with attitudes of the several municipal assembly members whom they claimed to be undesirable. The mayor replied that he has no legal authority to discharge the members. Thereupon a majority opinion was expressed that, should such members do not retire voluntarily, a recall provisions should be invoked against them.
