Re telephone conversation this date, the following information is submitted:

1. Re procurement No. KNGC-193 dated 1 May 1946 Eighth Army for 150 tons of Talc monthly for a base for DDT the following production report is submitted.
 - a. The total number of tons ground talc powder shipped 1 June to 16 June was 26 $\frac{1}{2}$ tons.
 - b. Shortage for the period approximately 74 tons.
2. With the present facility and equipment at the mine the procurement demand of 150 tons per month will be materially in arrears.
3. During the 1st part of June 1946 the Vice Governor of Nara Prefecture was consulted about this procurement order with a view of stepping up production to the allotted quantity. The Governor inspected the mine and factory and reported that the bottle neck was at the mine. Due to lack of modern or adequate equipment to move the quarried rock from the mine to the railroad only about two tons of the material is reaching the railroad per day.
4. This date the Central Liaison Officer brought in the attached production report for first half of June and gave a verbal report on efforts to improve the transportation facility from the mine to the railroad.
5. In as much as the proposed changes are still inadequate and will not result in a satisfactory production rate the Senior Military Government Officer with the Central Liaison Officer will inspect this mine on Monday, 24 June for the purpose ascertaining if adequate facility can be installed.

7. It is further requested that this office be informed as to whether this procurement order may be reduced to (50) Fifty tons per month as desired by the mine owner, or that the Japanese Government require full delivery by the owner of the 150 tons as specified in the procurement order.

1. The following is quoted for your information and guidance from Operational Directive No 33, Headquarters Eighth Army, 26 March 1946, Inclosure 2, Paragraph 9d:

"d. The appropriate staff sections will prepare statistical reports on GPA Forms 4, 5, and 6 and forward to the appropriate military government unit for processing."

2. GPA Forms 4, 5 and 6 will be used to report certain statistical data which will serve as a basis for evaluating supplies and facilities not evaluated in the field.

3. These reports should not be confined to supplies and facilities obtained on procurement demands but will include all items having substantial value irrespective of how originally obtained.

4. There will be excluded from these forms enemy surrendered supplies and facilities, equipment held for reparations, and supplies and facilities (including real estate) of United States, Allied, and neutral nationals.

5. Generally items entered on these forms will be preceded by a procurement demand and receipt or by a labor requisition. In most cases the procurement receipts will not have had a monetary or relative value placed thereon, but will have been endorsed "GPA Form 4" (or 5 or 6).

6. In order to prevent the value of any item being recorded twice, enter after each item the letter "VR"

(value reported) if the monetary or relative value was reported on a procurement receipt (GPA Form 2) or on a labor requisition (Labor Form No 1).



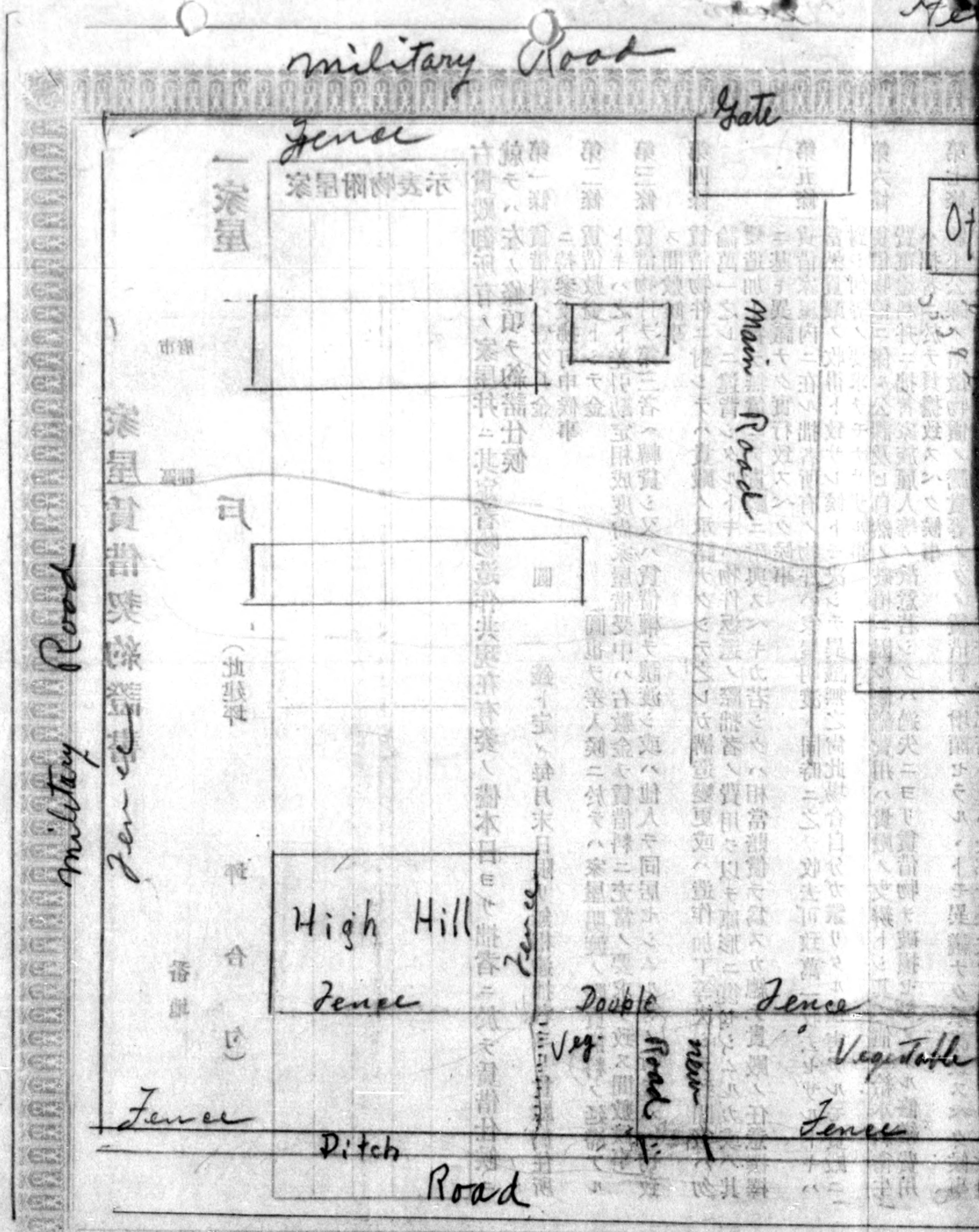

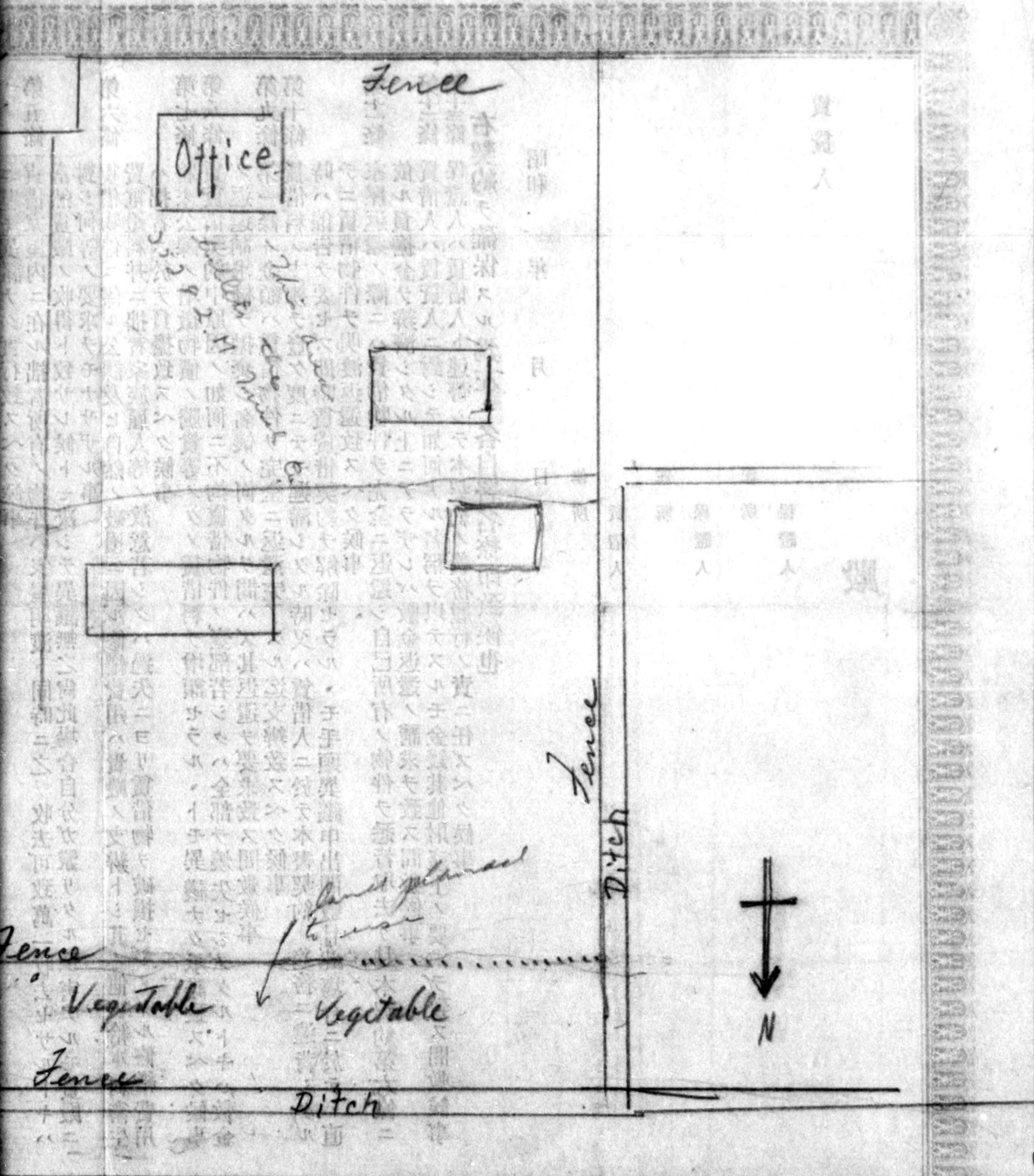

1. Reference is made to attached letters from Osaka Liaison Office and from Okada Gumi and Co., Ltd.

2. This headquarters has been informed that the U.S. Navy (Kobe Base) plans to procure the S.S. "Miyajima Maru" in the near future. We have no conception of the plan the Navy has for her, but this ship has been very valuable in moving food and fuel to Osaka for civilian consumption.

3. The Okada Gumi Co has a sister ship the S.S. "Tokushima Maru" which is in drydock at Osaka. It can be made fit for use in approximately a month. If the Navy's need is not urgent, request that this substitution be attempted so that food and coal could continue to move to Osaka at a regular rate.

TO : 109th Military Government Company

I beg to inform you that our office is in receipt of a petition enclosed herewith in regard to the requisition of S.S. "Miyajima Maru" by the Occupation Forces, presumably by Kobe Base.

As you are all aware of the fact that this vessel in question is busily engaged in transporting important commodities such as coal, lumber, rice and others from Kyushu to Osaka as well as to Shikoku in order to relieve the acute situation prevailing therein. At present this vessel being chartered by the Japan Coal Controlling Company is scheduled to engage in transporting commodities as mentioned above upon receipt of a permit for her navigation to be granted by the authorities concerned of the Occupation Forces.

In view of the prevailing situation in urban districts of the Kinki District, it is absolutely necessary to have coal and lumber from Kyushu by vessels while the number of large vessels engaging in transportation of cargoes is very few at present. It is, therefore, highly appreciated if you would be so good and considerate to render your good-offices so that such requisition of the vessel in question may not be realized.

SUBJECT: Navigations of S.S. "Miyazima Maru"

TO : The Chief of Osaka Liaison Office

We have duly received with many thanks the copy of your letter dated May 31, 1946, applying to the 109th Military Government Company for the permission for navigation of S.S. "Miyazima Maru."

We, however, very much regret to receive from the authority concerned the unofficial information that the Allied Navies in Kobe have the intention to operate the above mentioned steamer by their own hands. If it will be carried into effect, we and the party concerned of her proposed navigations, mentioned below, will fall into adverse circumstances because in order to relieve the present acute situation of Japan, she has already been scheduled and prepared for to carry out the important voyages as follows:

1. She arrived at Usunoura, Nagasaki Prefecture on May 14 to load the coal, destined for Osaka, but on account of the bad conditions of the port, the loading have been delayed and now expected to begin on June 3. The unloading of her cargo at Osaka will be finished, therefore, on and about 10th inst.
2. On her next voyage, she is proposed to tow the dredger boat of the Home Ministry from Osaka to Chyoshi, Chiba Prefecture and then she will return to Osaka from Yokohama towing the crane for dragging operations use. This voyage must be pursued during the month of June because the weather is not generally so good in and after July.
3. After the above, we are now requested urgently by the authority of Tokushima Prefecture to ship the coal and lumber from Kyushu to Tokushima.

In this connection, we are very much obliged if you would be so kind and considerate as to render your good offices so that the intention of Allied Navies may be changed, if possible, or may not be put into operation until the termination of her above mentioned navigation.

These studios are sound-proof and therefore, airtight. It is anticipated that temperatures will reach unbearable levels this summer unless the required chemical is obtained.

SUBJECT: About the Use of the Imperial University Athletic Field.

To : Lt. Roots, 800 M.P. Headquarters.

Both the Kyoto Athletic Association and the Kyoto-Fu Secondary School Athletic League have been doing their best trying to get the physical activities in general as well as in Schools within the prefecture developed in right direction and perfect condition ever since the war ended. Especially in the field of sports they have never spared any effort for their spread and progress.

In order to put into practice what we are preaching, we have made plans as shown in the separate pamphlet. However the Nishi-Kyogoku Ground has been taken over by the Occupation Forces. Moreover I hear that the Kyoto University Ground to which we have entertained a great hope as the only good remaining ground is likely to be also taken over before soon. If this be true, I am afraid our hope of making this prefecture good for Athletic activities will be entirely destroyed. It will be, I am sure, detrimental to the General health of the people and the development of democratic ideals.

This is the reason why I dare to appeal to you asking for your kind and special consideration about the use of the Ground in question.
