MEMORANDUM FOR: JAPANESE GOVERNMENT

SUBJECT: Petroleum Distribution - Reports Required

1. Rescission: Memorandum for the Japanese Government from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, File AG 463.7 (10 Jun 46) GD, SCAPIN 1688-A, 10 July 1946, subject: Common Terminology, is rescinded.

2. References:

a. Memorandum for the Japanese Government from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, AG 463.7 (2 Sep 48) GD, SCAPIN 1930, 2 September 1948, subject: Restoration to Private Enterprise of the Operation of Petroleum Main Terminal Facilities.

b. Memorandum for the Japanese Government from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, AG 463.7 (2 Sep 48) GD, SCAPIN 1930/1, 10 January 1949, subject: Restoration to Private Enterprise of the Operation of Petroleum Secondary Distributing Facilities.

3. The restoration to private enterprise of the petroleum distribution system in Japan necessitates a revision of the current procedure for reporting statistical data pertaining to the petroleum industry to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

4. The Japanese Government will, as of 1 April 1949, assume full responsibility for submission to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, at the time and in the form prescribed, the summaries and/or reports relative to the petroleum industry described herein. Initial reports will cover the month of April 1949.

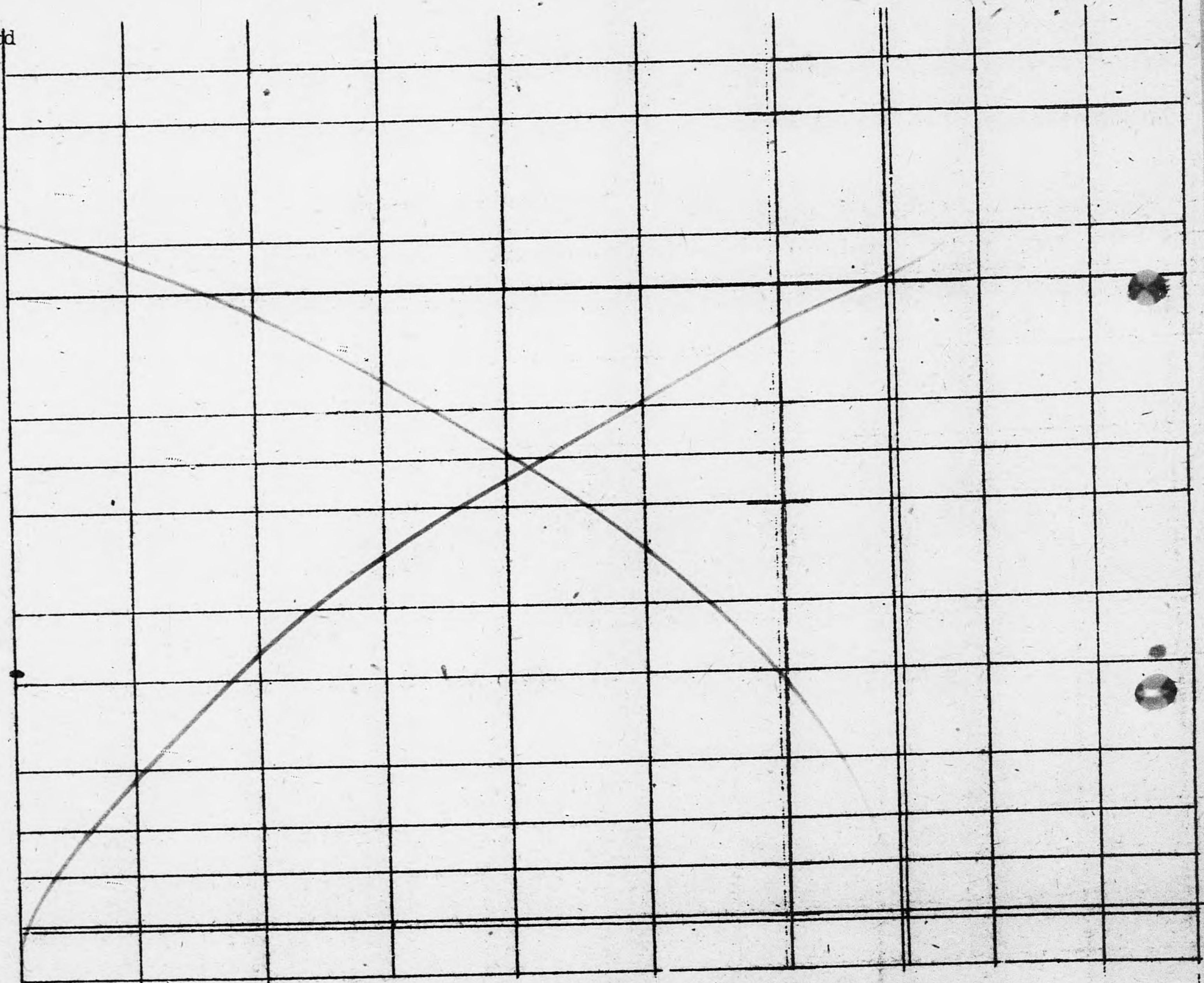

e. Column (5) indicates the destination within Japan to which the products are consigned by Japanese Government.

f. Column (6) indicates type of container used.

g. Column (7) reflects the total of each quantity by product, imported, expressed by barrels and kiloliters, and unit of measure.
