Usury Laws.

Much of the space in our columns has been claimed by the friends of the obsolete policy of regulating the price of money, but we have seen very little sound argument adduced thus far. Writers have floundered through columns, but we do not find them taking a single position capable of being defended upon the ground of expediency, or of common sense, The strongest point made by those who wish to see borrowers protected from lenders, is the assertion that such laws have existed in past time. So did our ancestors hang witches, whip quakers from the street, prescribe the cut of a man's hair, and enact all sorts of tom foolery in the way of special legislation. Those days of fanaticism have been succeeded by a more sensible state of public opinion upon the subjects we have named; but upon no point has the change of opinion been more marked, than upon the question of the value of money.

Legislators have, it is true, kept up the farce of "supposing" the proper rate of usance to be about six per cent. and legislating to make this the rate, but their efforts have ever been abortive. The laws have always been evaded, and always will be, simply because every man will use his own judgment as to what money is worth to him at a particular time. Suppose a merchant with ten thousand barrels of nour, has paper to meet to the extent of eighty thousand dollars and is destitute of coin. What is the plan common sense dictates to free him from his trouble : Is it to sell his flour at any sacrifice and pay as far as it will go, leaving him bankrupt the legal rate, depriving himself of a portion of profit, that he may save himself from the immediate ruin a sale would cause.

What right has a legislature (to go to the business of its constituents, and tell A. he need not pay B. above a certain amount for his potatoes, or money in another form, and say ,we have fixed the legal price at a dollar the bushel. "But," interposes A., "I must have the potatoes, they are indispensable, and the price is five dollars in the market: and B. will not sell for less." I can afford to pay this: for I must have them, though potatoes are high. Very well, says the legislature, do not give this price. Plead the " baby act" when you come to pay for the potatoes. Say potatoes should grow larger and more of them, and that you have been cheated. Go farther than this, say that potatoes in Maine can be had for ten cents the bushel, and, that comes to the plain truth of the matter, the legal price of one dollar is all moonshine, and that you shall only settle at the lowest natural price-of ten cents the bushel.

If it is "good democracy" for the California legislature to fix the price of potatoes at one dollar the bushel, it is equally imperative upon the democracy of Maine to insist that

California Anti-Rentism. perceive this species of ism is quite rife throughout the State, and seemingly on the increase. It commenced in earnest at Sacramento City, some time since, and resulted, in its resistance to the mandates of the law, in the sacrifice of valuable lives and much bloodshed, without any good effects to its advocates. Since which, it has made its appearance in various parts of the State, with more or less virulence. In our own city, it is now agitated to a degree that bids fair to involve our citizens in personal conflict, and over-ride law and order. Already, and in

several instances, has it encroached upon us to an alarming extent, and violence grown out of it.

By an advertisement in the Stockton Journal, we notice that the citizens of French Camp, near that place, are moving in opposition to the claims of Capt. C. M. WEBER, an extensive land owner in that region, and a meeting of the citizens of the place has been held, to make common cause with one of their number, who has been served by Capt. Weber, with a "writ of forcible entry and detainer," and thus test the question of his right or title to the lands claimed by him, and upon which the most of them reside. Were those opposing these land claims to peaceably await and abide the legal decision of the case, they would be perfectly justified. But where they resort to a resistance of law in the matter, before the question is adjudicated upon, they are decidedly in the

wrong : as well are they in the wrong to take forcible or quiet possession, and refuse to pay rent or leave the location, when so ordered by the known or reputed claimant of the land. If they dispute a title, let them test it legally, or avoid all resistance or illegal acts, until the question is settled. It is no easy matter to wrest possession from an old claimant to property; and it can only be done through the judicial tribunals of the country. Let them decide the matter, and if the contestants are in the right, it will be so determined, and they can then take possession of that which they struggled for, without "let or hindrance." If, in the meantime, still. Will he not rather pay interest above they have made any purchases, or paid any rents, that they were not bound to pay in law, they have their remedy for its restoration. But, for the good name and salvation of

Let the tenant purchase, pay rent, or vacate the ranche, until the law settles the matter. Public Lauds within the City. On Saturday last, Mr. HEYDENFELDT, of the Senate, introduced a bill granting to the corporation certain public lands within the City of San Francisco, and tor quieting titles of claimants thereto. The bill empowers the city to reclaim within its corporate limits, all the land between a natural high water mark and ship channel, and to improve the same for the benefit of commerce and navigation, by the construction of piers. wharves, and docks, and otherwise to promote the public interests of the city:

All lands mentioned, to be subject to the authority of the Common Council, and any grant made by any Alcalde, and ratified and confirmed by the Common Council previous to the 1st day of April, 1850, shall forever remain to such holder or holders, in fee simple. In case of the loss of the conveyance from any Common Council, Avuntamiento,

or Alcalde, the records of their respective Courts shall be sufficient evidence where the title of the land is brought in question.

BY LAST NIGHT'S BOAT.

News from the Sacramento Valley. Palmer & Co. furnished us with Sacramento papers of yesterday morning.

The Index states that Mr. A. P. Petit, of Sacramento, has closed a contract with Gen. Vallejo for the erection of a number of buildings for the use of the State. The Index adds:

"Most of these buildings are to be built of brick, and completed in a substantial manner. The main building is to be 60 feet front by 100 feet deep, and 30 feet high. The State is to use these buildings for three years, until the capitol can be completed. Mr. Pettit has been over the grounds, and has selected localities for brick yards, and has contracted to be on the ground within six days after the passage of the bill, and is to have the main building finished by the first day of June next."

Two men named George Knight and Daniel A. Lewis, underwent an examination on Sunday, for an alleged attempt to drown R. G. McCubble, by throwing him from a small boat in which they were crossing the river. The result of the investigation is not stated.

An excess of money beyond the wants of the community, for regulating the balances of trade, is the only cause for a reduced and low rate of interest; while, on the other hand a stock of money inadequate to perform the work of settling differences of values, must enable the little money. to command a high rate for its services. The man who borrows is alone qualified to say how much the State, will most effectually secure the prosperity of her citizens by allowing the right of private judgment in monetary affairs, for have it they will, in'spite of all the laws that can be framed.

The latter class, with their a large amount, choosing to forego the temporary profit upon loans, rather than to have the usury law. Could the borrowers, whose facilities have been cut off, be gathered in a mass, we should see the faces of many who creditors: men who would plead the "baby

act" every week if it were profitable. No legislation can free our State from the remarkable position she holds in monetary affairs. To time must be left the regulation of the value of money. To attempt to legislate the rate of interest down to the Atlantic standard, where money is in excessive supply, is as futile as to attempt to legislate the average profits of all California business, down to the rates of the older States. Supply and demand must govern the price of money, and no special legislation can relieve us from this fundamental law of commerce. Our correspondent, J. But the most important advantage is that which the State will derive from the payment of such a large proportion of her present debt by this capitalist In the short space of three years, thegreater part of our present debt will be liquidated. by the bonus paid for removal, a fact that cannot be too often brought to mind. The fear has been expressed in many quarters, that the they put our citizens to of life and limb, or present evidences of the State debt will be bought up for this purpose. We hope this fear will be realized, for it is of no sort of consequence how the State receives her dues, whether in gold or her own notes. The sooner the present floating debt of warrants is absorbed the better for the not seem to abate for all that. A man was State, and tax payers. So long as they bear no interest. so long will every man who supples the State with any article, charge enough in warrants to nett him cash. The powers of the legislature in regard to borrowing money have very properly been restricted, but members need not attempt to persuade themselves that the framers of the constitution, meant to tie the hands of the legislature, thus allowing the finances of the State to fall into hopeless insolvency. When the constitution was framed. the condition of monitory aflairs was such that its framerwere warranted in their supposition, that the small rate of taxes upon our great wealth would be readily paid, and the State, at the end ot each year, be left with a surplus Experience has show that California, so far as taxation is concerned, does not differ from the rest of the world. Th restoration of the credit of the State is no small task, but it can be readily done, by adhering to the course common sense points out. To an economical administration. must be added the smallest efficient taxation, but the amout levied must be collected resolutely. Some legis lature must take the responsibility of adopting a system of imance for the State, nor do we think an abler or better

one can ever be selected than the present. To them, while the task is comparatively easy, the people confidently look for action. It is clearly within their power, and duty, to give life to the State debt, by the payment of the nominal interest of 1% per cent. ; nor can there be the smallest doubt of the sanction of their constituents. Could the popular vote be taken to-day, there would be scarcely a dissenting voice, against any feasible policy that would redeem the State from dabt, or free her from the imputaof indirect repudiation. We hope the next mail to the Atlantic will tell our sister States that though temporarily embrassassed, California has taken every means to keen her financial character, where the credit of the State should be, that exports her three millions of gold per month, and saves the Atlantic cities from bankruptey, through the

loss of their coin.
