The News from the Atlantic Side.

By the arrival of the steamer Oregon yesterday, we are in possession of Atlantic dates to the 28th of February, two weeks later than those previously received. The intelligence, though not of particular importance, possesses much interest.

In speaking of the action of Congress upon various measures, a States' journal remarks that it was much to be feared that none of the important measures on which legislation is so necessary for the welfare of the country, will be passed before the 4th of March, except the appropriation bills, and there is some doubt even that they will be passed in time. If they fail, of course an extra session will be called, and the parties who will have rendered an extra session necessary will be marked and remembered.

On the 26th February, the bill for establishing a hospital for wounded and disabled soldiers of the United States was ordered to be engrossed, and the remainder of the day was taken up in discussing the bill directing that all moneys collected by the United States military authorities in California, from the commencement of the war with fornia, for the expenses of the convention of that State: that \$100,000, which was expended by the people of California, for the relief of emigrants, be refunded; and also appropriates \$300,000 for the expenses of the California State government, up to the time of the admission of California as a State. The last named sum was inserted on There is not probably a parallel case in the anthe amendment of Mr. Gwin.

Mr. Rusk's substitute for the Postage Reform bill, passed by the House of Representatives, was put upon its passage in the Senate, and adopted. The main difference between this and the House bill is, that the rates of postage on letters are fixed at three and five cents; the former in case of their being prepaid: whereas the House bill fixed a uniform rate of three cents. The time was so brief before the day of adjournment, that unless the House take up this subject at once, and either agree to the Senate's substitute, or appoint a committee to confer with a similar committee of the Senate, postage reform must inevitably go over to the next session. As it passed the Senate, the bill contains an appropriation to the amount of sixty-six thousand dollars for paying incidental expenses of the Post Office Department in California.

The Senate likewise passed a resolution, placing at the disposal of Kossuth, the Hungarian hero, a United States vessel to convev him to the United States in case he be liberated, and should elect to make this his

On the 26th, a great deal of the time of the House, was devoted to a debate between Messrs. Allen and Ashmun, of Massachusetts, as to whether or not the Hon. Daniel Webster made it a condition that he should receive the sum of fifty thousand dollars before he took the office of Secretary of State, the one affirming it, and the other denying it. The debate grew out of the discussion on the bill appropriating three millions one hundred and eighty thousand dollars, for the payment of the last instalment to Mexico. under the treaty of Guadalupe Hidalgo.

In referring to this charge, the Herald well remarks that Messrs. Allen and Ashmun are not only wasting the time of Congress, but trifling with the country, in this futile discussion. Whether Mr. Webster did or did not receive that, or any other sum of money, on the condition mentioned, is very immaterial. His constituents, and the public at large, have the fullest confidence in his integrity, and the day is far distant when they will entertain any other opinion of him. He is one of our great men, of whom the country is justly proud, and nothing derogatory to him will be listened to. On many occasions he has shown himself to be a patriot of the first water, and superior to party or party considerations when the honor or interest of his country is at stake. Recently he took a stand in opposition to fanaticism, abolitionism and free-soilism; and probably that is the cause of the recent attack upon him. Mr. Webster, however, is so firmly anchored in the hearts and affections of the people, by that he may challenge and defy assaults, come from what quarter they may.

Two more attempts have been made by the Legislature of Massachusetts, to elect a United States Senator in the place of Mr. Webster, or rather in the place of Mr. Rantoul, whose term will expire in the present Congress. We are glad to perceive a disposition on the part of Congress to do something for California, which shall resemble partial justice and which will have the effect to relieve our young State from the pecuniary weight which is now so burdensome.

Aorrid Murders on the Isthmus.

The last steamer brings us Panama papers, which are filled with detailed accounts of horrid and atrocious murders on the Isthmus. which we have before mentioned. About the latter part of February, a number of dead bodies were found near Vamos Vamos, on the Chagres river, horribly mangled and bruised. and leaving no doubt but that they had been cruelly murdered. Public indignation was immediately aroused, and parties set out in all directions, scouring the country to secure the perpetrators. Information was received from a boatman at Chagres which implicated four persons, who were subsequently arrested and confessed to the crime. They acknowledged to being concerned in the murder of six persons. whom they killed while lying asleep in the bottom of the boats. The bodies of the person slain were found upon the beach, mutilated by the buzzards, and so much disfigured as not to be wholly identified. A chest of tools, which the scoundrels no doubt thought was well filled with treasure, was found broken open, and several articles of clothing found strewed about in the neighborhood. The bodies were in part identified, properly taken care of by the citizens, and decently interred. The persons who were arrested were brought up in chains to where the bodies were lying, and there made a confession of the facts.

As soon as the fact was known, that the murderers had been arrested, the excitement arose to a terrible pitch, and many were in favor of immediately hanging them. The feeling however subsided, and they were allowed to be taken to Panama, where they were lodged in

A large meeting of the American and other foreign residents at Panama was held to memorialize the Governor, asking his aid and influence in ferreting out the whole affair, and adopting efficient and immediate measures to prevent the recurrence of similar enormities. The report, he said, seemed to approve the course of the Secretary of the Navy, but he knew that the Secretary thinks that a dock for all purposes can be constructed for half a million of dollars, instead of a million and a half, as now proposed. He knew that grave charges as now proposed. He are that grave charges are pending, affecting persons connected with the transactions, and Congress ought to suspend action until the charges can be looked

Mr. Stanton said that the offer of the department was accepted, and the department ordered the contract to be drawn, and it was after this the resolution was offered

Mr. Toombs repeated that the contract had not been concluded, and moved to refer the report to the committee of the whole on the state

Mr. Stanton replied to Mr. Toombs, vindicating the character of the transaction; and said that the dry dock in New York cost two millions of dollars, and would not perform onetenth of the service of the combinations of structures on the Pacific coast, costing twothirds less money. Henry M. Weston had created the difficulty to which Mr. Toombs had alluded. The morning hour had now expired, and the House went into Committee.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 28th. Mr. Howard, of Texas, presented a memorial to the House yesterday from citizens of Texas, charging John C. Watson, U. S. District Judge of Texas, with malfeasance in office, and asking his impeachment. The Legislature of Texas had previously, by a joint resolution, requested him to resign.

The Committee of Ways and Means have agreed upon reporting an additional sum in aid of Collins' mail steamers. The House Post Office Committee will not

agree to the Senate amendment to the cheap postage bill, and serious fears are entertained of its failure. The Harbor bill it is said, will be loaded with

amendments in the Senate in order to prevent its passage into law.

LOUISVILLE, Feb. 27. TORNADO AND LOSS OF LIFE. - A terrible tor nado nearly destroyed the town of Fayetteville, Tenn., on the 24th inst. Several lives were lost, and many persons seriously injured. The wind blew a perfect hurricane, amidst which could be heard the screams of women and children falling houses and crumbling walls, mingled with peals of thunder. The air was alive with electricity. Rain subsequently fell in torrents, and impenetrable darkness prevailed. tornado came from the southwest.

scalded, or are missing NASHVILLE, 23th Feb.-The Democratic Convention, which met here yesterday, resolved that they would abide by the compromise mea sures of the last session of Congress, provided they do the same; but should the North evade the compromise, or repeal the same, abolish slavery in the District of Columbia, or refuse to admit new States, because they were slave States, they would adopt such measures of defence and redress as the honor and safety of the South would require.

Later from Europe. The arrival of the British mail steamer Europa at Halifax, Feb. 26th, has furnished a

week later news from Europe. The news, in brief, is that Lord John Russell had succeeded in obtaining permission, by a vote of 332 majority, to introduce into Parliament his bill to prevent the assumption of certain ecclesiastical titles in respect to certain places in the United Kingdom. The papal aggression, which gave rise to this bill, continu enlist public attention, and was the absorb ing topic of interest in Parliament. The protectionists were congratulating themselves upon brightening prospects for their cause. They had achieved a sort of triumph in the House of Commons, upon a motion of Mr. D'Israeli, in which the government had barely succeeded in reasserting the free trade principle, obtaining

a majority of fourteen only in the House. In France, the bill for the relief of the President, called the Dotation bill, granting him s been defeated in the Assembly, by a vote of 386 against 284. The breach between the President and the Assembly is represented as be-coming wider and wider. There is a report that Russia, Austria and Prussia were about to undertake the reconstitution of the German central power, agreeing among themselves to take the presidency or federal head by turns.

THE SALE OF CITY PROPERTY .-- It will be recollected that a sale of city property by the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund, is advertised to take place to-day. Yesterday, however, the Legislature passed a bill which restrains them from such sale, and we are informed that it has been signed by the Governor, and is therefore a law.
