



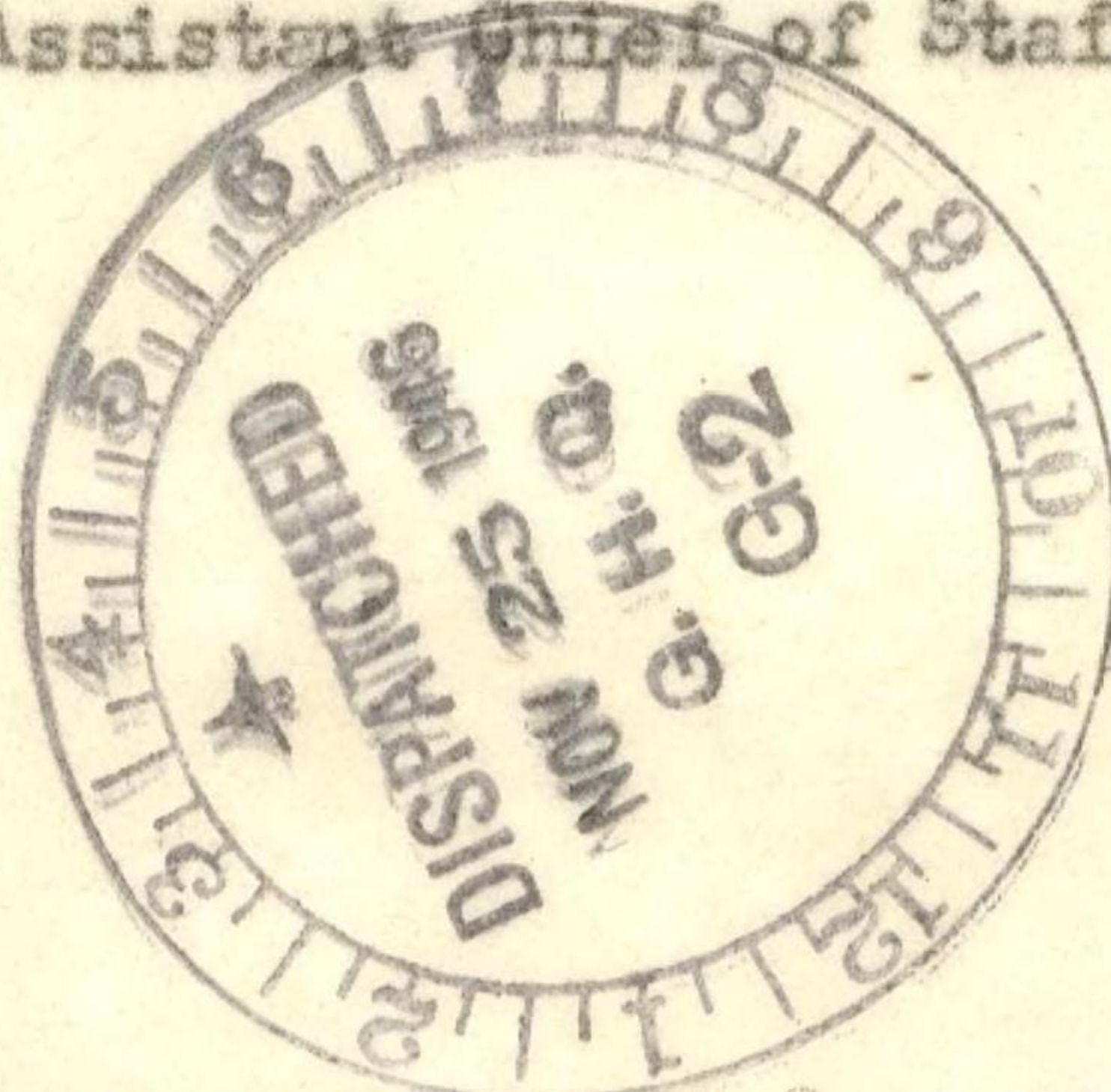
SUBJECT: Subversive Distribution in Central Luzon

TO : Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, AFWESPAC, APO 707

1. Reference is made to copy of translation of information on the above subject distributed by the Communist Party and the National Peasant's Union.

2. It is suggested that in the future extensive reports of this and similar nature carry a brief in order that the material may be used as a direct insert in the Daily Intelligence Summary and other G-2 publications. It will be seen that the briefing by this Headquarters of an extensive document of this nature may, through inadvertance on the part of the research writer, omit certain salient facts and other data which may distort the true meaning of the material submitted. G-2, AFWESPAC, is in a better position to draw such briefs being closer to the scene of action and possessing background information which may or may not be available to the research writer.

1. It is requested that action be taken to counterfeit fifty (50) copies of Inclosure 1. This identification card of the Korean Democratic Young Men's Association was obtained by agents of the 607th Counter Intelligence Corps, APO 925, in Kimpo Township, Kimpo, Korea. This league has recently been organized, and for proper infiltration of agents and informants of this headquarters, it is desired that exact reproduction be obtained. Inclosure 2 is a description of the document.

2. It is desired that reproduction of the basic card be made minus the number, name, dates, signature of official witness, date of issue, all in India black ink, and a purple Hahn stamp on the inside front cover.

3. It is further requested that a Hahn stamp consisting of three concentric rings with interior equilateral triangle in purple ink be reproduced with a hard-surfaced impression face for accurate counterfeiting in this headquarters. The facilities for reproduction of this document are not available to this command.

The following identification card was obtained by this headquarters through its informant net. It is believed that the translation is correct.

According to Kimpo Police (Kimpo, Korea), all personnel belonging to the Democratic Young Men's League are Communists. They further state the only reason for this league is for the purpose of mutual identification and aid to party members.

It is anticipated using this information in determining the complete breakdown of the party association and membership and request that a number of these cards be counterfeited for future use.

"Identification card of the Korean Democratic Young Men's Association. This card is composed of a piece of paper $9\frac{1}{2}$ x $3\frac{1}{4}$, folded the long way twice, making it into a book approximately $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ ". The outside, both front and back, is greyish-white with what appears to be a wood block overlay of red wavy lines. All printing is in blue ink. The inside pages of the book are of the same color as above with all printing and borders in blue; all entries made thereon in India black ink. A Hahn stamp in light purple ink of the issuing individual is placed next to the blank block for an identification photograph. Unfortunately, prior to this unit's obtaining the card it had been stapled twice."

1. Forwarded herewith are eleven (11) reels of microfilm photographs of three hundred eighty-one (381) chapters of the records of Prince Saionji, the last of the Elder Statesmen, and his secretary, Baron Harada. These notes were dictated by Baron Harada to Viscountess Konoye as a person who could be trusted with knowledge of their contents.

2. These documents cover the period from March 1930 to November 1940, the latter date being slightly before the death of Prince Saionji which occurred on November 24, 1940. Due to the position of Prince Saionji as the last of the Elder Statesmen (Genro), they are the records of a man who was close to all major Japanese political activities during the period in question and who exerted a strong influence in the political affairs of the empire.

3. Among the major items of interest covered in these records are the following:

- a. Naval Disarmament Conference records.
- b. Records concerning the assassination of Chiang Tso-lin.
- c. Memo written by Prince Saionji (marked to be burned) re Emperor's instructions regarding selection of a Premier to replace Inukai Takeshi who was assassinated in May 1932.

- d. Many interesting references to persons of influence in Japan who are now being investigated for the parts they played during the period leading to the outbreak of war with the United States.

4. The records in question are also of interest in that they contain typewritten copies of a number of documents which are missing in the original because of having been confiscated by the Japanese Military Police in April 1945 at which time they raided the homes of Baron Harada, Count Kabayama, and Shigeru Yoshida (present Foreign Minister). The documents confiscated on that occasion related to the Naval Disarmament Conference.

5. These documents were obtained by Lt. Col. Paul Rusch, a member of the Counter Intelligence Section, through personal contacts with persons in whose custody they were. He is to be commended for his work in obtaining them. They were received under conditions which involve a promise by this office to return the originals.

6. In addition to the micro-film copy forwarded herewith there is another copy in this office. It is now being used in preparing reproductions for translation and as working copies for investigations which are now underway. A copy of the local translation will be forwarded upon completion, as it is considered that these documents may well be of great historical interest.

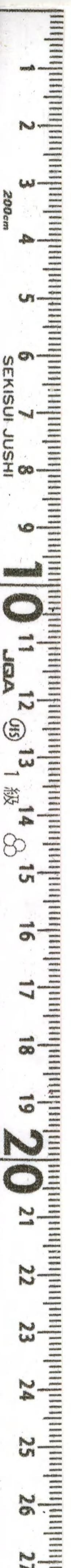
