A lugger was strafed and left smoking near Ishigaki.

Eight FM-2s of VOG-1 took off on a sweep of the airfields on Ishigaki Shima for the purpose of neutralization during the Okinawa invasion. A VF from the USS RUDYEBD BAY accompanied them to the target and made a separate attack on Miyara airfield on the same island.

The division led by Lt. Odr. Bringle struck at Ishigaki field firing 24 rockets at revetments and installations and administering a general strafing. A single engine plane east of Ishigaki town was burned by Lt. Odr. Bringle. He also put two rockets into an AA position. An oil storage dump was set afire by two rocket hits of Lt(jg) Eckever. Lt(jg) Skelly started a fire in the wooded area south of the field.

The division led by Lt. Stratton attacked a grass field in the center of the island. 22 rockets were launched at AA emplacements south of the field. Four hits by Lt(jg) Wood in one emplacement and two hits by Lt(jg) Lider were observed. Two fires were started. A lugger was strafed near lahigaki town by Stratton and Wood and fire started.
