Second stage:

- Construct the basement floor for furnace, boiler, and store rooms.
- Construct concrete footings for the frame-work of the building.
- 3. Build the ground-floor rooms.
- 4. Equip the rooms with beds and necessary fittings.

Third stage:

- Construct the concrete frame-work of the secondfloor rooms.
- 2. Build the second-floor rooms.
- 3. Equip the rooms with beds and necessary fittings.

Fourth stage:

- Construct the concrete frame-work of the thirdfloor rooms.
- 2. Build the third-floor rooms.
- 3. Equip the rooms with beds and necessary fittings.

With the completion of the work of the first and second stages, we will have a complete operating room, a complete X-ray room, an office, a reception room, fifty-seven beds, a nurse-desk, a food-distribution room, a miscellaneous room, a bathroom, and W.C., a kitchen and stoves, a coal-room, and a store-room.

After the third stage, we will have sixty-two beds, three stairway rooms, a nurses' room, a diagnosis room and another food-distribution room. When the fourth stage is completed, we will have the same number of rooms as at the end of the third stage.

PROPOSED EXTENSION AND MODERNIZATION OF THE HOSPITAL BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS OF THE CHINA RED CROSS PEIPING HOSPITAL

The China Red Cross Peiping Hospital is located on the north side of the National Peiping Library and on the west shore of Pei Hai Park. Its surroundings are clean and calm; its scenery is attractive and beautiful. It is an ideal place for the recuperation of the sick. But the present flat houses are old, and they are not so well-adapted for hospital use. The present entrance opens on Yang Feng Chia Tao, a narrow lane which is not a convenient road from the Wen Tsin Chieh. With the recent improvements in medical science and appliances and the increased demand for more sick beds, the Hospital feels it absolutely necessary to construct new buildings inside the Hospital premises and open up the Yang Tseh Men at Wen Tsin Chieh as the main gate. In order that the new buildings and the changes there-of may be harmonious with the fine scenery of Pei Hai Park, the new buildings will be of the Chinese architectural style, and the front, back and side court-yards, together with the paths and railings be so arranged as to conform to its environment. The design is made by the LUNG-HU Architects and Engineers with complete drawings.

The construction work will proceed as soon as the money is available. The whole project is arbitrarily divided into four parts.

First stage:

- 1. Remodel the Yang Tseh Men, main gate.
- Construct the concrete railing along the west bank of Pei Hai lake.
- Pave the road from the main gate to the main building.
- 4. Construct an inner gate near the main building.
- 5. Repair the stone shore of the lake.

The gate Known as Yang Tze Men, just to the East of the National Library on Wen Ching Chieh (street) will be used as the front gate or main entrance of our premises thus adding beauty to convenience.

The Red Cross Mospital

In 1926 the Chinese Red Cross Association of Peking established an emergency hospital for the benefit of those wounded and destitute resulting from the civil war then going on. Dr. Ch'üan Shao-Ch'ing was appointed Superintendent of the newly created Red Cross Hospital.

During its first year of service over 16000 patients were cared for. Subsequently, the Chinese Government provided the Hospital with funds and equipment and it also donated a site, one of the most beautiful spots within the city of Peiping called Shang Ssu Yuan, on the West shore of Pei Hai Park, to be its permanent home. Dr. Ch'uan continued to head and to develope the institution until his retirement from active service two years ago.

As organized, the Hospital not only provides out-patient treatments but also ward service for those requiring hospitalization. In the course of time various services such as Medical, Surgical, Eye-Ear-Nose-Throat, and X-ray were added one after the other. Aside from these general services the Red Cross Hospital has given itself a special task which is to provide a suitable sanatorium within the city for the care of the patients suffering from tuberculosis. Thirty beds were at first reserved for this purpose. The demand for such accommodation was so great that the number of beds had to be increased very quickly to 45 and soon to 70 which is the present capacity of the Hospital. The beds are always full.

As the name and good will of the Hospital continues to spread patients from other parts of the country begin to come in greater numbers. This together with the ever increasing number of tuberculous patients demanding sanatorial care within the city has taxed the capacity of the Hospital to its very limit. It becomes necessary to enlarge and modernize the present buildings and grounds in order to meet the situation.

Plans have been made for the construction of a new and modern hospital of 500 beds at an estimated cost of one billion C.N.C. Owing to bad times the work of construction has to be divided into seven
