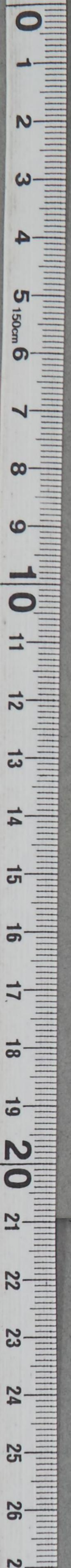

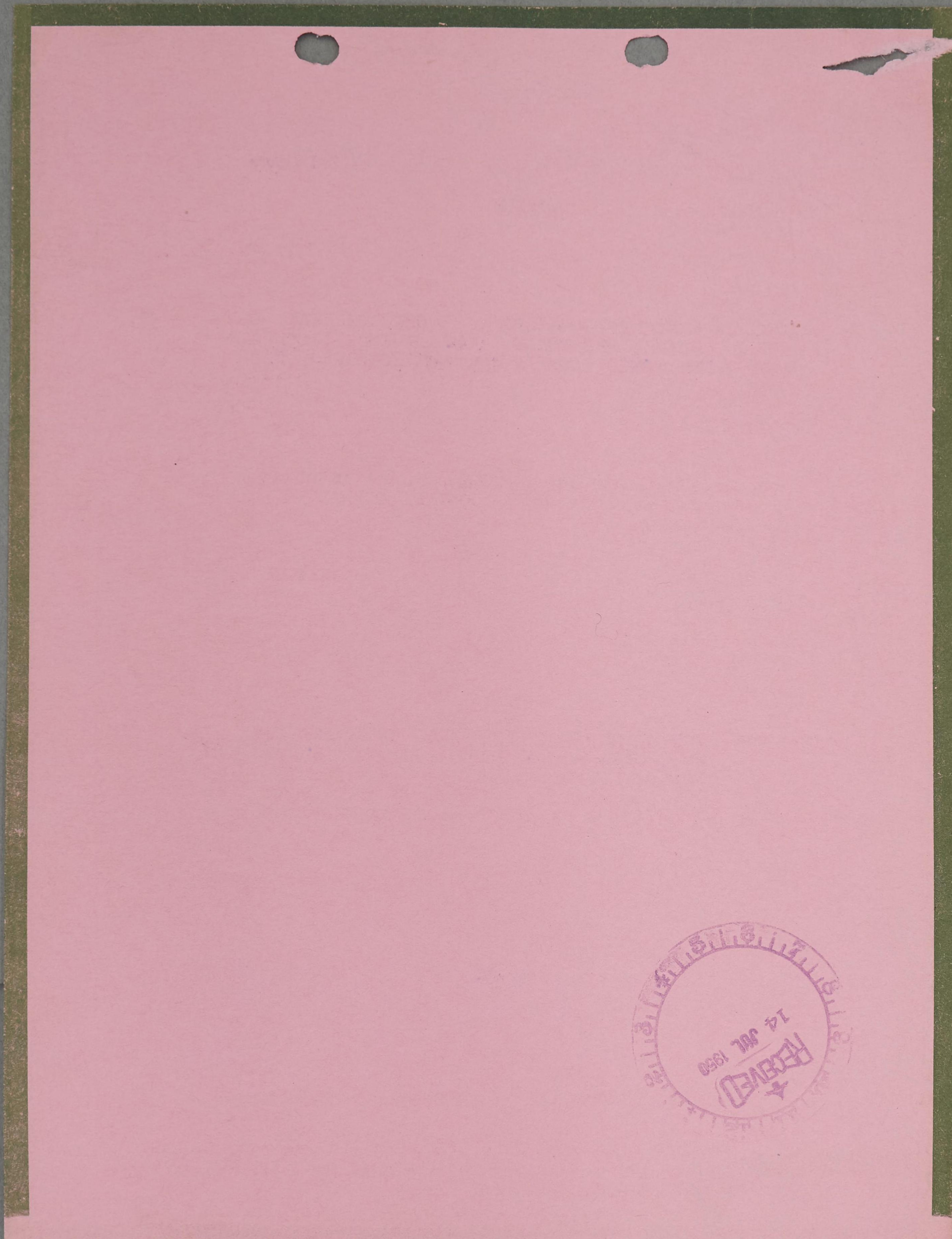

Subject: Signal Support Units

1. For additional background see G-4 Journal Nos 8011, 8075 and 8076.
2. On 11 Jul 50 G-4 (Maj Tilton) in a conference with representatives of the technical services requested the submission of a report as to what service type units would be required from the ZI to support the units listed in DA msg W 85347, 10 Jul 50. This list when submitted to G-4 would be considered as a supplemental list to the master list of service type units completed on 10 Jul 50 and submitted to G-3 that date.
3. Basic C/N 1, Sig to G-4, 11 Jul 50, states that no additional Signal service units will be required other than those listed on the master list submitted 9 Jul 50. The only exception stated by the Sig Owas that, in the event operational planning envisions the employment of two corps, an additional Signal Battalion Corps will be required.
4. At the present time future operational planning does not envision the employment of two corps; therefore no change or additions are necessary for the list of Signal units desired. Basic C/N confirms information submitted informally by Signal (Maj Stitt) to G-4 (Maj Tilton) on 11 Jul 50.

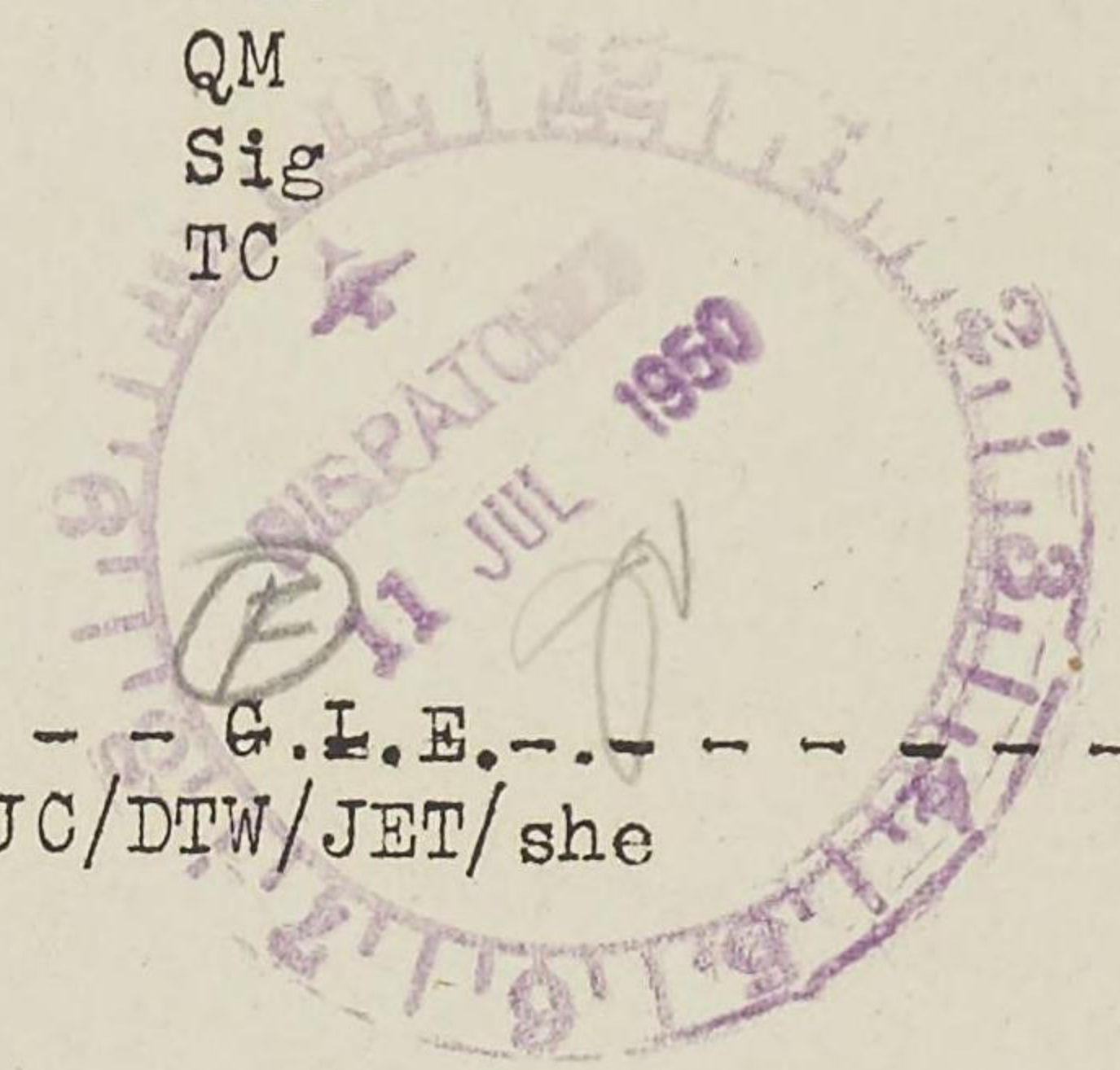

PART I. Request division alerted for movement to FEC be brought to war TO&E strength to extent practicable without delaying current ETD. Balance personnel required to bring division to TO&E strength should be added to PART IV below.

PART II. Request following units and/or organizations required to bring FEC division up to TO&E strength be moved to Japan as soon as possible.

- a. Four heavy TK Bns; one per Div, reference CINCFC rad C-57093, 2 Jul 50.
- b. Twelve heavy TK Cos; one per Inf Regt.
- c. Eleven Inf Bns; one per Inf Regt less 24th Inf Regt.
- d. Eleven FA Btrys (105 mm How); one per FA Bn (105 mm How) less 159th.
- e. Four AAA (AW) Bns less four btrys; one per division.

PART III. For such units or organizations mentioned above as are not now available, it is requested that trained cadres be furnished for those units or organizations with filler replacements to follow; for priority see PART V.

PART IV. In addition to PART II above, request additional personnel in bulk required to bring all elements of the four divisions from current authorized strength to TO&E strength.

PART V. Priority for movement of above will be:

- a. Units or organizations already organized in ZI whether or not at TO&E strength. Necessary fillers will be furnished in FEC.
- b. Trained cadre personnel (ship concurrently by air).
- c. Fillers (bulk personnel) indicated in Part IV above and those who have previously been requisitioned to bring units up to current authorized strength.

PART VI. Divisions now in FEC are unable to furnish cadres requested in PART II above, inasmuch as only 60% of first three graders of current authorized strength available in units here. Urgency of situation requires all speed possible in accomplishing above. Request ETD and mode of travel be furnished CINCFC when and as soon as they become known.

PART VII. Administrative and service personnel requirements to organize, supervise and support the training and operations of above units and individuals will be furnished initially to maximum extent within local capabilities; however, anticipate augmentation will be required from ZI. Problem now under study and will be included in requisitions.

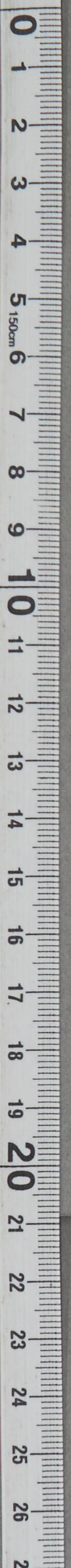

While the action recommended in that message will eventually materially strengthen the combat effectiveness of the infantry divisions of the FEC, I am sure that the Joint Chiefs of Staff realize that the division now in action in Korea, and the other 2 divisions soon to be committed, are at neither war strength T/O nor full authorized peace strengths. It should be borne in mind by all concerned that for the immediate future the forces now available for combat must fight with each infantry regiment short 1 infantry battalion, with each 105mm How FA Battalion short 1 battery, with no divisional tank battalions and no separate tank companies for the infantry regiments. The urgency of the situation, therefore, requires both the augmentation of existing units in the FEC to full war strength as well as the immediate reinforcement of these forces with completely manned and equipped units from the ZI. Whenever possible elements for the augmentation of FEC divisions should be shipped as complete and full

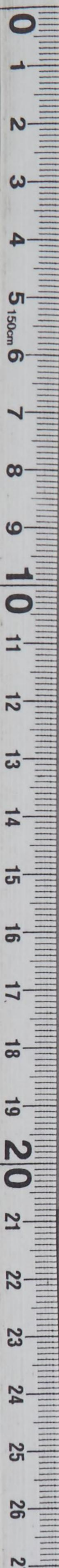

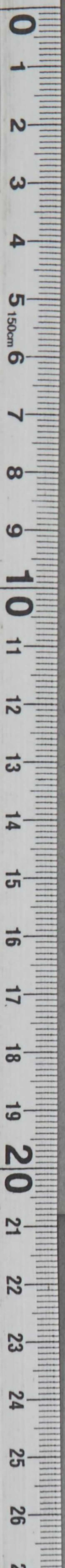

MEMO FOR RECORD:

1. Basic was C/N 1, G-3 to CofS, concerning the provisional Ordnance Detachment for Korean Operation. Correspondence was routed thru G-4 for Ord O and G-4 concurrence prior to presentation to CofS. Basic included an attached draft message to CG 8th Army directing CG 8th Army to establish a provisional Ord Detachment of not less than 60 officers and E.M. Proposed msg suggested augmentation with Korean labor upon arrival in Korea. Discussion given in the basic stated that the employment of tanks in support of US ground forces in Korea requires adequate field maintenance facilities. 1st and 2nd echelon maintenance is available to the units at the present time. However, it is necessary to provide for facilities for a 3rd and 4th echelon maintenance. Basic proposed that the provisional unit be organized by drawing from Ordnance units of 8th Army. This method was desired rather than drawing the entire platoon from any one 8th Army Ordnance unit which would materially impair the efficiency of that unit.

2. In conversation between G-4 (Major Tilton) and Ord O (Lt Col Stuart) on 4 Jul 50, the latter stated that the action was being coordinated by the Ord O (Col Billingsley) with 8th Army. On 5 Jul 50, Ord O (Lt Col Wilson) informed G-4 (Maj Tilton) that 8th Army would not concur with the action recommended in the basic and that 8th Army felt that they could not supply personnel desired. General Niblo in conversation with Ord O (Lt Col Wilson) stated that the request for the provisional unit would be expedited to the DA. This action by Ord O was followed by a request that the basic be returned without action.

Present plans envisage the use of Pusan as the location of the advance headquarters of the Fifth Air Force, as an F-30 emergency field and as the airhead in Korea.

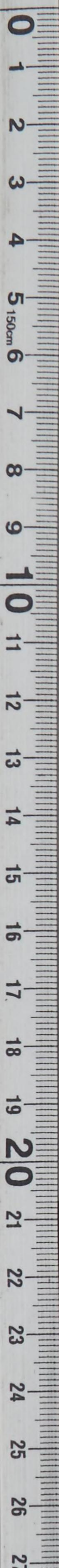

MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD:

SUBJECT: Redeployment of U. S. Forces in Connection with ECOF Withdrawal.

1. At a conference held on 5 June 50 by G-4 on the above subject, certain information was requested of the major commands. In a letter from 8th Army, dtd 24 June 50, there is included information relative to logistic action required by 8th Army. Letter also requests approval for the redeployment of a regimental combat team to the Kure area.

2. In C/N, dtd 20 June 50, Journal #6728, G-4 requested the comments of G-1 relative to such a redeployment in light of certain G-4 provisions.

3. By C/N 2, dtd 21 June 50, G-1 favors a redeployment under the following assumption:

a. Adequate post exchange, theater, commissary, chapel, dispensary, and the other facilities that usually go with and are part of the American way and standard of living are available.

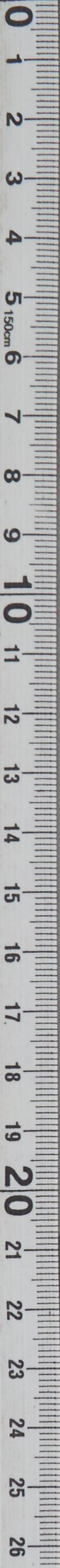

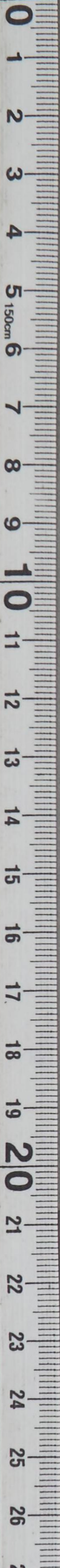

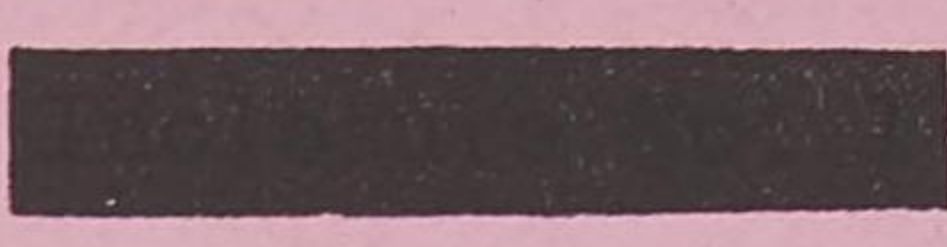

1. A decision has been made at this headquarters to pass control of the area now occupied by the British Commonwealth Occupation Force to the 24th Infantry Division upon the withdrawal of Australian troops and to occupy the area by one Regimental Combat Team. The preliminary survey conducted by this headquarters has indicated that the location of the two battalions in the Hira area, the regimental headquarters and separate companies in the Kure area and one battalion in Iwakuni is feasible.
2. In view of this decision your recommendations are desired for the use of available facilities in the Hiroshima Prefecture and the Iwakuni Police District. A list of available facilities, together with plot maps of the area, is attached as Inclosure 1 herewith. Your consideration in this matter should include:
 - a. Redeployment of elements of your command to include attached units and to consider the forming of combat teams as practicable (Suitable protection of the Naval Base at Sasebo will be required.)
 - b. Location of elements in the present BCOF Area to insure maximum utilization of available dependent housing.
 - c. Troop housing by type and location to become excessive to the needs of the 24th Infantry Division and to be made available for release to the Japanese Government.
 - d. Other facilities, by type and location, to become excess to the needs of the occupation forces as a result of such redeployment and to be made available for release to the Japanese Government.
3. The recommendations which should include alternate solutions to problems presented in Par. 2 should reach this headquarters not later than 1 July 1950. Direct communication with the General Officer Commanding.
