
When Mr Mosman was here for the Civil Affairs Economics Conference, I had a pleasant talk with him about my proposed trip to Kyushu. Later he very graciously prepared a tentative itinerary and forwarded it to me.

This will be my first trip to Kyushu since the Occupation. Consequently I am anxious to investigate the natural resources as thoroughly as possible in the short period of time available. I am bringing representatives from my technical divisions of agriculture, fisheries, forestry, and mining with me. They have worked out the inclosed itinerary covering areas of greatest interest in their fields and following the suggestions of Mr Mosman insofar as possible. We will have our own railway cars so we will not have to impose upon you or the Japanese for sleeping accommodations or for meals. I know how eager the Japanese always are to entertain and I prefer to avoid as much of that as is diplomatically possible.

I regret that there will not be sufficient time to visit Aso National Park and Beppu as I recall from pre-war visits that they are beauty spots indeed. We will just have to absorb the scenery as we travel from town to town on the inclosed itinerary.

I appreciate the opportunity of meeting with your Team on 6 December 1949 and being oriented on your activities. I am particularly interested in knowing about your operations under the new civil affairs organization and in determining how the Natural Resources Section can be of help to you.

COMMENTS ON PUBLIC WELFARE FOR COLONEL SCHENKS

6 December 1949

I do not believe that the public welfare situation in Kyushu varies a great deal from what it is elsewhere in Japan.

The fundamental need here is to stress the importance of always making sure that the person who receives the help is entitled to that help and that the person who is entitled to the help is not denied the help. We emphasize the point that an eligible case load can be maintained only by frequent re-determination of need and faithful recording of all changes of income and resources. Thus each case record is always up to date and constitutes a dependable substantiation of each disbursement.

We point out that it is easy to accept a family for some type of assistance and then relax on the case, but by continued review of eligibility we strengthen the welfare program by avoiding needless disbursement and dissipation of public funds as well as give better service to those really in need.

The total number of persons receiving aid in Kyushu is about 200,000, representing less than 2% of the population. The national figure is a trifle more than 2%. The total cost of cash aid in this region is about ¥90,000,000 which equals about 10% of the total national cost, although the population of Kyushu is about 15% of the national population.

In the field of child welfare, our next major responsibility ~~in the way~~ of priority, we also consider eligibility of primary importance, because if the investigation of the application for placement of a child is inadequately done and the child is placed unnecessarily under the care of the public, it means unnecessary drains of public funds as well as needless emotional disturbance to the child, when arrangements might have been made with its own people.

It has been urged that the paid welfare officials take a more active part in the welfare program especially with regard to investigation of eligibility, that point of course is now being definitely emphasized by the new Hatsu-Sha #72 which makes it obligatory for the larger centers to have the paid officials do the work rather than depend upon the volunteer system. The cities included in the new program are presently reorganizing in accordance with the new law.

We have one more major responsibility, namely Social Insurances. Kyushu is one of 3 Regions which have been directed to have one member of the Welfare Staff give special attention to the surveillance of this program. We have a person so assigned, who, I understand will be called up to Headquarters soon to receive special instruction in how to carry on this work.

There are four kinds of social insurance administered by the Welfare Ministry. These are: Health Insurance, Welfare Pension Insurance, Seamen's Insurance, and National Health Insurance. The provisions are broad in coverage and, on paper, provide liberally for the insured individual. In actual operation, however, there is at present a great discrepancy between income and expenditure, due largely to delinquency in payment of premiums. No large reserve fund has been established and this makes it necessary to ^{delay} payments to doctors for services rendered. Possibly, because of this, doctors have submitted bills which were in excess of treatment and medicines actually prescribed. Obviously, this is a rather unwholesome condition which prefecture officials are meeting and attempting to mitigate.

These and other problems we plan to concentrate on in the future.
