





No. 1828/CA (50) Reference is made to General Headquarters' Memorandum No. AG 095 (6 March 50) GA of 14 March, 1950, for the Chief of the Chinese Mission in Japan, in which the Mission is advised that Mr. Chang Kun-chieh, Chinese national, is granted an extension of 90 days of the period of stay in Japan and that the Mission's request for expeditious treatment of Mr. Chang's allegation against Mr. Yasuji Fujita and for authorization of payment of money due to him from the Bank of Japan (8 # 1847) is under consideration. Since the above mentioned additional period of 90 days of stay granted Mr. Chang will soon terminate on July 17, 1950 and since the recovery of Mr. Chang's property is a decisive factor in the consideration of granting him and his family permanent resident status in Japan, the Mission requests that General Headquarters kindly inform the Mission of its decision as soon as possible.
