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Extract from Interrogation of Hideki Tojo, 8 February 1946 P. 2

- Who attended the Imperial Conference on December 1st or 2nd, 1941?
- A I was there as Premier; the President of the Privy Convoil was there, and all or nearly all of the other Cabinet Ministers, as I recall. The two Chiefs of Staff were there. I am not sure whether the Assistant Chiefs of Staff were there or not, but the Cabinet would know. Those were the responsible people that were there. There were also probably three other persons in the capacity of secretaries for these three usually came to Imperial Conferences. The three were the Chief Cabinet Secretary, Mr. HOSHING; the Chief of the Military Affairs Section of the War Ministry, Mr. Shō MUTO, who was then a Major General, I believe. (At the end of the war, he was General YAMASHITA'S Chief of Staff); and the Chief of the Military Affairs Section of the Navy Ministry, Vice Admiral CMA. These last three are according to my recollection. I am not positive that they were there...
