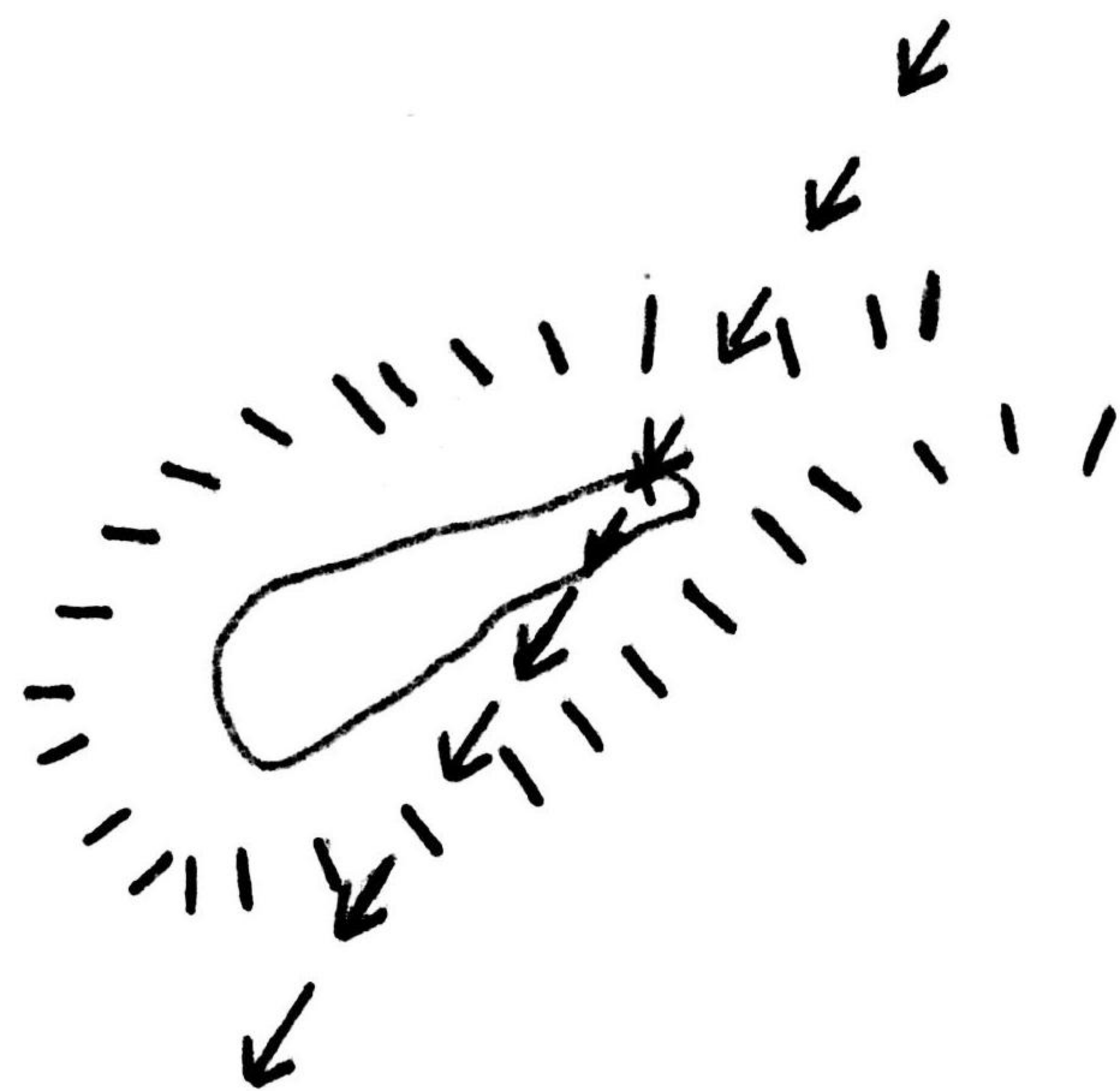

Morning search planes (21 and 24 V311) were engaged in a perimeter search of Wotje Atoll when they observed a 35 foot powerboat on the lagoon beach near the NW end of Bikeichi Island. The boat appeared to have about a ten foot beam and was situated with its stern in the water and bow on the beach. Midship there was located a small cabin. Ten strafing runs were made and numerous hits from 1200 rounds of .50 cal. bullets were observed. The boat was left on the beach in its original position.
