THINGS TO OBSERVE

Articles in this list will be sold at prices named as follows: 5 at the 10 rate; 50 at the 100 rate; 500 or more at the 1000 rate.
 Prices subject to change without notice. Cost of packing material added.
 All orders should be sent in as early as possible. Terms cash before delivery or satisfactory references.
 No claims for errors and deductions must be made within ten days after receipt of goods.
 Our nursery stock is strictly first-class in every particular and free from disease and insect pests.
 We warrant all trees and plants to be good and healthy, but for the reason that we have no control over the planting, pruning and care of the trees and plants after they leave our hands, we will under no circumstances replace anything that may die.
 In grading and furnishing all nursery stock we use the greatest care to have it true-to-name, and will replace any that may prove untrue. But for any error we shall not be liable for any more than the purchase price.

INSTRUCTION.

As soon as the trees and plants are taken from the Nursery, see that the roots are not exposed to the sun and heat them in as quickly as possible and settle with water till ready to plant.
 When planting fruit trees, prune the trees about eighteen inches from the ground. (There are some exceptions.) See that the hole is large enough to admit the roots in natural condition. The trees should stand a little deeper than they did in the Nursery row. All broken or bruised roots should be cut off with a sharp knife, and settle the dirt around the roots with a liberal application of water.
 And owing to the heat in this valley it is advisable to give the trunk some protection from the sun the first year.

DISTANCE OF PLANTING.

Standard Apples and Apricots should be planted from 24 to 30 feet apart. Standard Pears and Strong Growing Cherries, Standard Palms and Prunes, Peaches and Nectarines, 20 to 24 feet. Walnuts, 40 to 60 feet, and Grapes 7 to 10 feet apart.
