In grawing and furnishing all unreery slock we use the greatest care to have it true-to-mane, and will replace any that may prove untrue. But for any error we shall not be liable for any more than the purchase price.

INSTRUCTION.

As soon as the trees and plants are taken from the Narsery, see that the roots are not exposed to the san and heel them in as quickly as possible and settle with water till ready to plant.

When planting fruit trees, prane the trees about eighteen inches from the ground. (There are some exceptious.) See that the hole is large enough to admit the roots in natural condition. The trees should stand a little deeper than they did in the Narsery row. All broken or bruised roots should he ent off with a sharp kulfe, and settle the dirt around the roots with a liberal application of water.

And owing to the heat in this valley it is advisable to give the trunk some protection from the sun the first year.

to give the trunk some protection from the sun the DISTANCE OF PLANTING.

Standard Apples and Apricots should be planted from 24 to 30 feet apart. Standard Pears and Strong Growing Cherries. Standard Palms and Prines, Peaches and Nectarines, 20 to 24 feet. Wainnts, 40 to 50 feet, and Grapes 7 to 10 feet apart.


