Whatever else may be wrong with the postal service, it is cer- Where can you beat these bargains! tainly handicapped by under-pay. This is true of carriers and clerks in the cities, and it is painfully true of the rural carriers.

The National Rural Mail Carriers' Association is asking the Senate postoffice and post roads committee for an increase in pay, with a minimum base of \$1920 per year. In view of the fact that rural carriers must furnish their own transportation over the long routes which they cover, a little less than \$2000 a year does not sound like an exorbitant minimum salary. Most of them now receive less pay than farm laborers.

The rural mail carrier, like his fellow-worker in the city, must keep the mail going through all weathers. Rural roads, in most places, are better than they used to be, but they are still bad enough to make delivery of the mail a task of real endurance and loyalty to service. The work requires a high degree of efficiency. But the general public takes about as much interest in paying a decent wage to its very essential letter carriers as it does in the salaries of its school teachers. As a result of low pay, the rural service is actually threatened with disintegration. Capable, ambitious men are leaving as fast as they can get into other lines of work which compensate them in proportion to their ability and effort.

In its search for places to economize, let Congress remember that true economy means efficiency, and efficiency must be paid for. -Long Beach Telegram.


