The MNRK has registered with the Department of Justice as an agent of a foreign principal under the Foreign Agents Registration Act.

The subject stated that he talked with ZARO on a number of occasions concerning international and Hungarian relief work. The subject recalled that he also met and spoke with Mr. ZARO, who was also connected with the MNRK. According to the subject, the MNRK also maintains an organization in the United States. The subject admitted that he recently attended a function of the MNRK in New York City and met one of its leaders, IASZAR O. S. Subject said he did this in order to find out how this organization functioned.

NEGRANDY denied that he has ever been a member of the MNRK or has ever taken an active part in its behalf. He said that the MNRK, an allegedly charitable, does not appear to him to be a fascist organization, but if they ever come to power in Hungary, subject continued, "I would have been a member."

The subject stated that the only other organization he was connected with in Austria was a Catholic parish at Gunzbruck.

Since his arrival in the United States, the subject has continued his association with the Hungarian National Council, and is presently Vice President of the Social and Cultural Section of the Hungarian National Council. In this connection, it is the subject's task to try to bring about contact among the various Hungarian political sections abroad. In this capacity, the subject receives mail from persons of various shades of political belief, both in the United States and abroad.

Subject admitted that he frequently meets LEVA TRIVNI in connection with his work at the Hungarian National Council. He advised that his closest friends in the United States are Hungarian National Council members, LEVA TRIVNI, LEVA TRIVNI and LEVA TRIVNI.

#### 10. ACTIVITIES IN THE UNITED STATES

After the subject arrived in the United States, on April 10, 1951, he resided at the Chelsea Hotel, 220 West 23rd Street, until May 2, 1951. During this period, he was unemployed. The subject resided at and was

Under Miklos KISS, former captain of General Staff. About 600 men originally organized for partisan warfare against Russians. About 50 in British zone in Austria. KISS and informers scattered throughout all Hungary and maintains regular courier service. British know about activities. The group is disintegrating rapidly for lack of food and other supplies. Courier service may be used by JIC29 in Plan FORWARD.

Consists of some 50-100 men, according to a proven informant.

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Group intends using Group, combined with TASSO's men. This group was originally part of the Hungarian paratrooper regiment under Gen. SZOKSI. The services of this regiment were offered to the British. At the same time, the Russians urged the British to deliver SZOKSI and staff to them as war criminals. The British replied fostering hostile sentiments among the paratroopers toward the British. The paratroopers then formed two groups - one under SZOKSI and the other under KISS, the latter group absorbed those other than the paratroopers. At the present time, the KISS do not cooperate in any way with the British and have no contact with them whatsoever. The group is not suspected by the British, directly or indirectly, and they suffer from starvation. In the British zone, the KISS are reported to have some money.

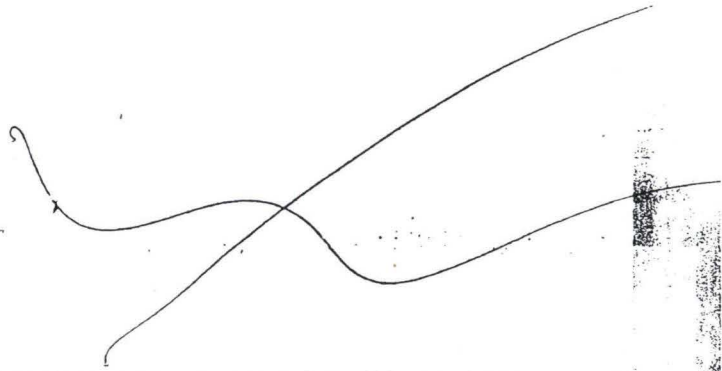

In spite of their pro-British protestations, members of the movement are on what they regard as the certainty of being sent to the East. 1. The source of subject reports is Laszlo AGH, a Hungarian national who was born 11 February 1908 in Kesmark, which is now in Czechoslovakia. He arrived in the US in November 1947 and took out his first papers for US citizenship in February 1948. He is presently employed as a baker in New York City. The only additional background available is that during the period 1936-1947 subject was in Rome, Italy, as a Papal Assistant.

2. While AGH is nominally the source of subject reports, he actually receives his information from a number of sub-sources in Europe, where he claims to operate his own information net. He is willing to pass on to us the names of his sources, but does not have this material available in this country. He is not willing to use normal postal channels to get it out of Europe, but will arrange to have his friends there use a CIA mail drop if such a channel is made available to him.

3. AGH has stated that he wishes his group to receive US official recognition, and be supplied with arms and equipment for a future fight to liberate Hungary from the Soviets in conjunction with a US-Soviet war which he is sure will take place. His ambitions along these lines have been discouraged by our [ ] office, and he has been informed that no decisions can be reached until we have all possible information on his group.

4. In accordance with Mr. Helm's oral request of 16 November 1949, we are now prepared to obtain answers to questions you submit to AGH through this office.

5. We have informed our [ ] Office that no CIA contact will be made with subject except through it.

Reference: Memorandum from Chief, Contact Division, dated 1 February, subject Laszlo AGH; Memorandum from Chief, Contact Division, dated 23 December 1949, subject, Report by Laszlo AGH.

1. With reference to your request for assistance in evaluating subject individual as a continuing source of foreign intelligence, we cannot make any definite suggestion without a complete list of the members of AGH's group. On the basis of reference memorandum of 23 December 1949, we assume that AGH is in contact with the Fellowship of Hungarian Combattants although it is not clear to us whether that is "his group."

2. If AGH's sources are primarily the Hungarian Combattants, we would not advise continued use of him as a source for foreign intelligence. The loyalty of the Hungarian Combattants lies primarily with the French and it can be assumed that all of their reports go to the French. Furthermore this organization is the most widely known Hungarian emigre group. Consequently it has been and is being tapped in Europe by CIC, ~~representatives of CIA~~ etc.

1. Forwarded attached for your information is a copy of a letter from General Zako to Laszlo AGH. A rough translation of this letter follows:

Please notify my yellow friends immediately and tell them the following message:

(a) The iron curtain is becoming daily more hermetically sealed, not only as far as penetration is concerned, but even as far as working within the iron curtain. The Russian methods undergo constant change, and appear in newer forms, and if we don't build up there a trustworthy operational mechanism and leave behind us before the very last five minutes of the closing of the gates, then soon we will have a situation of complete inaction. The work which they are doing here in our country through the Germans [i.e., US authorities] is soulless "ad hoc" work.

(b) For this very reason, I would like to bring this case to a close. We must know what the prospects for the future are in this field. This can be determined only through a personal conference and try to place into process practically anything [i.e., begin anything we can]. There are very many such momentums [i.e., forces] which we must neatly clear up, for you yourself know how many enemies are intriguing against us.

(c) I would like to come out to see you for these discussions (of course, in connection with this, I would arrange everything with Tibor E. and all others who are interesting.)

(d) On the other hand, it is only natural that I don't have any money for such a trip. Our friends must risk either an airplane ticket or a steamship ticket (whichever is more expedient for them) in the interest of this affair.

(e) I can go at a moment's notice to Munich or Frankfurt. I have a passport into which could be stamped an American visitor's visa. This visa should be sent by them to the American Consulate at Munich. Afterwards, either by means of a courier plane from Frankfurt (which would cost them nothing) or through an airplane or a steamship ticket available at the consulate in Munich, I could start from one or more German ports of embarkation.

(g) I am not mentioning this to anyone, not even to my immediate associates.

1. Lajos NADAS, former Hungarian colonel and now a staff member of MHBK, showed GVA's 17585 a letter sent by Logala AGH from the USA. AGH reported in his letter to NADAS that he had been in frequent negotiations with an officer of the 'central American intelligence service'. However, this American officer had finally stated that the American intelligence was completely satisfied with their three lines bringing out intelligence from Hungary, and that it was not planned to lay on additional chains.

2. The above information comes from GVA, and is dated 1 October. Source 17585 assumes that ZAKO had requested AGH to bring up directly in the USA ZAKO's offer of an intelligence network into Hungary.

As a consequence of the undersigned's briefing of the IAC on 9 August 1951, Mr. Cartha B. Dalloch and Mr. Daniel X. Callahan, FBI Hungarian Desk, visited the undersigned for a half-hour talk on Hungarian matters of mutual interest.

Most of the discussion consisted of a rehash of the true assets of ZAKO's organization in Austria for Mr. Callahan's benefit. Callahan was concerned over the status of Tiber ECKHARDT, an FBI source in this country who on occasion produces information from Hungary. I pointed out that, in view of the political tie-up between ECKHARDT and ZAKO, there was on the face of it little doubt that he had access to some information and probably distributed it. However, since the FBI do not indicate on their disseminations to us where they get their material, there is no way for us to make any definite statements on this subject.

It was decided that the FBI would make an attempt to determine from Mr. ECKHARDT where he obtains his material whenever he produces information from abroad. Mr. Callahan felt that this was not likely to be very successful because ECKHARDT was primarily a reporter on domestic affairs and if he were pressed too hard for information concerning sources overseas, they might lose his confidence. We had polite go-arounds on this pattern of intelligence officer - agent relationships.

Dear Sir,

It would be difficult for me to become reconciled to the fact that nothing was to be done about my previously outlined plan. I particularly regret that I have not received a reply to my last letter. Therefore, I feel I must inform you of matters accumulated in the meantime.

Unfortunately, it is difficult for the soldiers of a defeated nation to gain the sympathy of the victors. On the other hand, the emigrant body, for a long time, has shown the signs of confusion and bewilderment, and it was comparatively easy for clever opportunists among them to misrepresent them and misguide the leaders of the victorious countries. There are some good examples of this in our case. For instance, among the members of the former Hungarian Parliament there are certain individuals who sided with the Germans, underwrote the Jewish laws, approved participation in World War II, then, in the last phases of the war, sided with the Soviet and, now, these same individuals are enjoying the confidence of the United States as members of the Free Europe Committee.

I do not wish to be an informer yet, in the eleventh hour, I must call your attention to a report from the central office of the Collegial Society of Hungarian Veterans which shows concern over the fact that these opportunist elements have influenced your Hungarian policy in such a manner as may cause serious repercussions.

We first came in contact with you through 'Interpreter D' and our relationship had a most auspicious beginning, due to the cooperation received from you and your representative from Washington. We also received the warmest acknowledgement from you. However, I do feel that Interpreter D's behavior since that time has not been beneficial to our cause. As my position is much the same as that of our Central office, I must mention that during the Fall of 1950 Interpreter D was in Europe on a charitable mission and upon his return he reported on the Collegial Society of Hungarian Veterans to the Hungarian National Council. According to their record of his report, he claimed to have conferred with our leaders and stated that they are involved in undesirable political activities; he warned the American Hungarians to be cautious in their attitude towards the Collegial Society of Hungarian Veterans. The truth of the matter is, however, that Interpreter D (who was among the first to accept our insignia from me, and among the first to come to our financial aid) did not even meet any of our leaders in person and, therefore, could not possibly have spoken to them. Just as they behave against us here in the United States, unscrupulous politicians are active the world over in their attempts to destroy us. They do not hesitate to resort to the most vicious lies and slander to attain their ends.

I have lived in the United States for four years and, during this time, have observed that all propaganda against us originates with these opportunists, among whom pro-Communist sentiment is not absent even today.

Disregarding all these attacks, I have proved that I am a modest worker of a vigorous organization. In spite of the heavy physical work with which I earn my living, with my own money and effort I have built up the United States branch of the Collegial Society of Hungarian Veterans to such an extent that in seven large cities of my foster country there are Society representatives, and the anti-Communist American Hungarian newspapers and institutions are happy to cooperate with us. As I emphasized then, I repeat now, that we not only are grateful and loyal residents of the United States, but we shall be also her protectors in need and danger, as were our forefathers. In this sacred cause I work, struggle and tolerate slander. For the independence of my mother country, against Communism, and as well as for the welfare of my adopted land, I shall fight until death. The Collegial Society of Hungarian Veterans demands this mental attitude on the part of the Veterans.

The President of the United States, the Secretary of State, other statesmen and generals, have urged us day after day to stand united against the Soviet danger. We Hungarian veterans have united, and the political opportunists fear our power. We have never taken part in infamous deeds; we were soldiers and fought exclusively against Russia: to protect his country is the right and duty of every patriotic citizen. We did only that, and shall do so in the event of a third World War. Surely no one will hold such conscientiousness to be a sin.

In 1949 I registered the Collegial Society of Hungarian Veterans with the United States Department of Justice, in the spirit that:

1. When the opportunity came, we would form a Hungarian Legion.
2. Through the channels of the Collegial Society of Hungarian Veterans underground, in the event of a third World War, we would take advantage of every opportunity to aid the United States and Hungary.

Today, despite the strongest Iron Curtain secrecy, the activities of the underground and the gathering of news is centered in the hands of the Collegial Society. Unfortunately, many possibilities remain neglected for, as yet, no relationship exists between you and the Society.

After all this, I ask of you only to accept our sincere friendship and that you find the means of contacting our Central office, in order that at last we may work together in guarding our mutual interests.

Finally, I wish to inform you that, out of strong respect and devotion to the United States, the next issue of our paper (Hadak Utjan) will appear with an English section.

When the time permits, kindly visit us, that we may discuss these matters further. I arrive home from work after 5 P.M. and could arrive in New York only after 8 P.M. I am usually free on Saturdays, Sundays and holidays. My home address is: 16 Menzel Avenue, Maplewoods, New Jersey. Telephone: South Orange 2-4857.

INTERNATIONAL MEMO NO. 11

RE: The case of Stephen L. Swift, Ultra-liberal Communist group in the U. S., Communist penetration of CIC. More no paper will report, complaint with request to investigative efforts aimed at us by some U. S. agency.

1. We made a report and requested information as to whether this individual was working for CIA, as we had heard rumors that his trip, sponsored by Reader's Digest, had been requested indirectly by some Intelligence Agency. We were told that he was not working for CIA.
2. Subject is a member of a large Hungarian group of extreme liberals, leftists, Socialists and former or neo-Communists, on which there is no proof or indication as to just where their ideologies leave them with respect to definite loyalty. A great number of this group were, during the war, in more or less important spots in G2, OSS, CIA and State and many are still there. Mr. Clay, alias Mr. Ziklai, is another of this group who is still in the State Department.
3. We have indications that there are quite a number of this group in CIA and we strongly suspect, and confidentially, so do some individuals in the FBI, that the great efforts toward emphasis on the Hungarian Intelligence paper mill, aimed principally at General Z., has foundation or help from this group. As a matter of fact, I have been reliably informed that the FBI requested the CIA and me to prove certain statements made with regard to duplication in connection with certain individuals who for a long time have been their informers on Hungarian affairs and particularly Hungarian refugees arriving here, but no proof has been forthcoming.
4. To return to Swift, since our report on him and our discussions, we have found out the following additional information:
  - a. That a reliable source in contact with Reader's Digest believes that indirectly one of the personnel of Reader's Digest, sworn to secrecy, was approached by some Intelligence agency, believed to be the Navy, but this is not confirmed or even certain, with respect to sponsoring Mr. Swift's trip. It is further known that Mr. Swift, this trip, and this request to Reader's Digest, had a connection with Mr. Nagy, said by some to be working for the CIA, by others the Air Corps, and by still others, the Navy. There are indications but no evidence of Swift and Nagy being connected with Ladislav Farsago and Admiral Zacharias on the one hand, and with CIC's principal in Vienna, Colonel Ringer, and his Hungarian Communist penetrated organization on the other hand. Several

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years ago, we submitted to G2 positive documentary proof, including photostats of loans and money transactions between known Communist agents in Vienna with this man. There are also indications to connect Swift and Nagy [redacted], also of the CIA and well known for associating with Hungarian Communists and agents of the Communist Hungarian Secret Police.

- b) That Swift has a contract and a book "Along the Iron Curtain"; that his bank in Europe is Schweizer Bankverein, Bahldorfstrasse, Zurich, Switzerland; that he was scheduled to be in Sweden, and Northern Europe in September, along the Czech border to Berlin in October, in Paris on November 15th to cover the UN, and in Austria in December. Also that his "confidential" address is c/o PID (or FID—through bad writing not certain of first initial), USPA Headquarters, APO 166, U. S. Army, c/o Postmaster, New York, N. Y.
5. Colonel Ringer is the man whom we made numerous reports on over the past few years, including one which contains documentary proof, in the form of signed notes and papers, proving that he was obtaining money and loans from known Communist agents in Vienna.
6. In the last few years, we also reported another Hungarian suspect as definitely being a Soviet double agent working for CIC in Vienna. In our reports we named him as Thomas. We have since discovered, through a reliable American Military Intelligence source, formerly with a high commission in Hungary, that Thomas' real name is Szentgyorgyi, and that there is absolutely no question that he has been (all along) and still is, a double agent. This man originally worked for the former Chief of the Air Section of the U. S. Element, Allied Control Commission for Hungary during the years of 1945 to 1947. His employer, Colonel Richel, was, according to report, responsible for his obtaining the confidence of U. S. Intelligence. This was the same Colonel Richel who was later court-martialed on 32 counts in Vienna, but acquitted. It is reported that Martin Himler, then of the OSS, has further evidence and knowledge of the fact that this man is a double agent.

There are indications that the large, but very hazy, group of Hungarian emigres to the U. S., many of whom have been certified or recommended by such individuals as outlined above, have formed a cabal against General Z., his underground, the Hungarian Veterans Associations throughout the world, and more particularly, in the U. S., against Tibor Eckhardt. While there is no doubt, as will be proven in a separate report, that there are many good reasons why the CIA should believe that General Z. runs a so-called paper mill, it will be shown that he actually does not, and it is believed that some of the characters and biased parties involved in the ultra-liberal and former Communist groups are behind these reports and attacks.

8. In this connection, we would like to point out that our security today is being endangered and the counter to we have with CIA is being, at least technically and innocently, violated. While we have no absolute proof of this, we have the following indications which I believe you will agree, warrants more than a suspicion.

a) The [ ] report mentioned that Tibor Bohardt, as a member of General G's paper mill, was supplying information through his organization, Paragran Research, 1760 Broadway, New York City, to the FBI and the State Department.

b) Paragran Research was one of our cover organizations which we had to terminate, and, through all sorts of means-possibly, had to move out of its site and buildings. The reason we had to do this was that the firm of the Research and Security Corporation, through one of its Directors, Robert S. Judge (formerly with ONI and a former Chief of the FBI office in Pittsburgh), conducted a personal or confidential investigation of me at 1760 Broadway, of such a nature that it aroused the suspicion of the building authorities as well as the suspicions of neighboring offices. As a result of his snooping around and his questioning of so many people in the building, including personnel in the office of Paragran Research, of whom he also asked a number of questions about me personally, our cover was so endangered that we had no alternative but to maneuver a termination. The Research and Security Corporation is located at 521 Fifth Avenue, and its President is Mr. Frank Blasiak. Mr. Judge is Special Counsel to this organization.

c) This organization also checked the Corporation papers and passed the former landlady of Miss Virginia Schomaker, who was listed as owner of Paragran Research.

We asked specifically whether CIA had anything to do with this and were told no.

Mr. Andrew Clay, alias Mr. Andrew Griffith, working in the Intelligence Division of the State Department, or who to have contacted a number of reports, and who was connected with the pro-socialist, neo-socialist, pro-Communist and neo-Communist Hungarian infiltration into various agencies of the US Government, is - it is understood - up before the Loyalty Board.

A most interesting reliable report has come to my eyes one of our Hungarian intelligence lines and sources. This one to which I shall refer with the original source. A Captain Leslie Agh, 16 Second Ave., Hempstead, N.Y., who for a long time has been associated with General Zabo in Hungary and in Austria, has been approached by Mr. Clay within the last few months. Mr. Clay asked Captain Agh to pass on to him any information he could get out of Hungary. Mr. Clay represented himself as being in the foreign collection field or being interested in collecting foreign intelligence for his organization in the State Department. Captain Agh being very anti-Communist, did pass on bits of information which he obtained in letters and talks with various Hungarian sources and from other friends of his working with or for General Zabo. Mr. Clay then came to him and insisted that he has to get all names, sources, and sub-sources, and desired to get detailed information with regard to General Zabo. It was not stated whether Mr. Clay told Captain Agh that General Zabo was considered to be running a paper mill by State or CIA, but he further gave the impression that he was officially concerned with the collection of intelligence.

Captain Agh, however, became suspicious with respect to this, and it is believed on checking other Hungarians, also became suspicious with respect to Mr. Clay, and therefore gave no further information.

We have been able to locate and hope to obtain photostats of letters and memoranda in Free Europe and Police of America involving policy matters and involving a number of ideas which appear detrimental to US interests. These were written by Mr. Clay on the stationery of the State Department, signed or initialed by him under the title of director or chief of the Eastern European branch.

We also have an unclassified report, which we except conclude, that Mr. Clay was friendly with and in contact with a [redacted] of the CIA.

As far as we can ascertain, Mr. Clay's alleged assignment in the State Department's Research and Intelligence Division is neither in the policy field for Free Europe, the Voice of America, or any activities, nor is it in the field of intelligence collection, other-work or secret. This last, however, we are not certain of. We do know, however, from considerable

experience and from considerable evidence that there is a leftist, if not pro-Communist, group of Hungarians in various Government agencies in Washington, and we are also certain that there are leaks from Washington and from US intelligence to the Hungarian Communists. That we are certain of.

SUBJECT: "Informational Memoranda"

1. As requested by you on 4 February 1952, I herewith present my comments on "Informational Memoranda" numbers 10 and 11 of 18 December and 3 December 1951 respectively:

General

2. During the period 1 May 1949 to 1 October 1951 I was chief of the Austrian-Hungarian desk of OSO. In the course of our work my colleagues and I became aware of the multiple distribution and intelligence fabrication activities of General ZAKO's refugee organization in the French Zone of Austria. Our evidence consisted of operational reports from various stations of OSO and ZAKO information reports which were either identical or closely resembled each other, and came to the U.S. Government through many channels. My desk consequently disseminated background information concerning ZAKO to various stations of OSO who had contributed ZAKO reports to Headquarters and to other Agencies of the Government. Upon the request of the Director of Central Intelligence, I presented the ZAKO paper mill case to a meeting of the Intelligence Advisory Committee on 9 August 1951.

3. On 10 September 1951 I was visited by two representatives of the F.B.I. who were interested in details concerning the involvement of Mr. Tibor ECKHARDT in the ZAKO case. See memorandum of my minutes, a copy of which I turned over to you yesterday.

4. Between August and October, I participated in the compilation of a study on paper mills and fabrication (copy attached) in which the ZAKO case is Exhibit No. 1. ECKHARDT's "Paragram Research" organization is mentioned in the study on the chart opposite page 16 as feeding information to the F.B.I. This study, under a Secret/Control classification, has been disseminated within CIA only.

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Specific

5. Re "Informational Memorandum" No. 10, paragraph 5: I have never met Mr. Clay. I believe that Clay and I participated in an interrogation in Central Building of a returning member of the U.S. Legation in Budapest sometime last year. I had previously heard of Mr. Clay and speculated with a colleague as to who among the 20-odd persons present he might be. I have never talked to him, have never been "friendly with" him, and have never been "in contact with" him either professionally or personally. This is an accident. It appears that Clay deals with Hungarian matters in the Department of State, and liaison with him is a normal function of my office if business requires it. The qualification "unconfirmed report which we cannot evaluate" underlines the deliberate manner in which this falsehood is introduced into the record.

6. Re "Informational Memorandum" No. 11, paragraph 3: Your attention is drawn to the last sentence of this paragraph. The F.B.I. did, in fact, request details of our knowledge concerning Mr. ECKHARDT in the meeting of September 10. See minutes referred to above. I know of no channel to the writer of this "Informational Memorandum" concerning the facts of this meeting except through the persons who participated in it.

Re paragraph 6: A verbatim extract from this paragraph was furnished by Col. M. W. Pettigrew to Staff G on 10 December 1951 as coming from "one of the sources whose reports pass through my hands." Parts of the information in this paragraph closely resemble material made available by OSO to the Army, the F.B.I., the I & N S, and the Department of State. The Army, in turn, forwarded our information to the G-2, US Forces Austria, who investigated the subject of this paragraph. The sentence concerning Col. Richel and the 32-count court martial leads me to the conclusion that the leak of this paragraph occurred in Salsburg rather than in Washington, since our correspondence with other Agencies of the Government made no mention of this matter. The Hungarian desk, acting on Col. Pettigrew's extract mentioned above, queried the Austrian Station on the possible source of the information. You will be advised by separate memorandum on the Station's conclusions, which have just reached us.

Re Paragraph 8: This paragraph leads to the conclusion that the memorandum was written by Tibor ECKHARDT. There is no record in OSO that he has a contract with CIA, and the circumstances, contents, and scope of this contract are unknown to us. It is obvious in this situation that whoever runs the ECKHARDT operation takes his chances on what the latter calls his "security."

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7. There is no hiding the fact that I am disturbed by this incongruous situation. A Hungarian emigre politician, whose primary loyalty is to a right-wing emigre General, who in turn is anathema with the emigre National Council of that nationality recognized by our Government, appears to have a contract with this Agency which he uses for special pleading. In turn, neither the contract nor the operation appears to have been tied in with the background files and accumulated knowledge available to OSO. By some means as yet undetermined, an emigre politician has obtained access to true names of staff members engaged in tracking down his connections and purposes and has proceeded to attack their integrity by deliberately fabricated statements. The case presents proof of the points made in the attached study on paper mills and their political purposes.

SUBJECT: Collegial Society of Hungarian Veterans.

1. Attached for the possible interest of the Hungarian desk is a autostat copy of minutes in Hungarian, taken at Collegial Society of Hungarian Veterans (Buffalo-Lackawanna Group) meeting on 1 May 54. This meeting was held at the International Institute in Buffalo and was a direct result of the National Convention on 30 Apr 54 in New Jersey.

2. A translation of the minutes is as follows:

a. They express their lack of confidence in the national leader, Dr. Iasslo Agh, because he failed to execute orders and regulations decided upon by the Central of the Organization in December 1953.

b. They decide to dissolve and cease the Buffalo-Lackawanna Group of Hungarian Veterans.

c. Decision is made to form an organization based upon the Constitution of the US complying with all the rules and regulations set by US authorities; this new organization shall bear the name of "Magyar Society of Zrinyi Miklos".

d. Appreciation is extended to the group leader and officers of the group and their resignations are accepted.

e. Appoints a temporary leader in the person of Arpad Galocsy and also appoints a committee to draw up the charter with instructions that it be drawn up in the spirit of declared purposes and in a manner that it should be applicable to a national organization.

f. Approves the text of circular to be sent to all group leaders in the US.

g. Orders the minutes of this general assembly to be sent to Andras Zako in Munich, Germany, Elemer Meszoly at 1022 E. Willow Grove Ave., Philadelphia 18, Pa., and Dr. Iasslo Agh at 1821 Vanor Dr., Newark, New Jersey.

3. Arpad Galocsy, the temporary leader, is seriously ill and hospitalized in Hamilton, Ontario. Elemer Meszoly resigned as the North American leader and, to this date, no successor has been appointed.

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4. According to our source, the response of groups in Chicago and Cleveland has been tremendous. He is confident that the various groups in the US will become chartered organizations and sever their relations with Zako.

5. If additional information concerning the Hungarian Veterans organization is requested, we will request further details of our source.

6. Please direct any questions resulting from this memorandum to ~~61-10000~~ on extension ~~2113~~.

Reference is made to our letters of February 4 and April 2, 1954, to the Department of State, copies to your Agency, concerning the subject, who while residing in Austria allegedly indicated a willingness to engage in espionage for the Hungarian Government. As of March, 1954, the subject was reportedly in the custody of the Belgian police.

On April 21, 1955, Dr. Laszlo Agh, United States Representative of the Collegial Society of Hungarian Veterans, made available data in the Hungarian language he had received from General Andras Zako, Munich, Germany. Both Zako and the Society are known to your Agency.

According to a translation of the data reportedly originating with Zako, the subject was arrested during February, 1954, by Belgian authorities and reportedly confessed his connections with the Hungarian Government. The subject allegedly had in his possession when arrested a notebook containing several names, including the following: "Leopold Bauer, 35-36, Jackson Heights, N.Y. USA; Ernest and Fred Fox/av. Rooklin Boed, New York."

While the above addresses are apparently incomplete and possibly incorrect, we would appreciate being advised if you possess any information or are in a position to obtain same from Belgian authorities which would indicate the significance of the above names in the possession of the subject.
