## PLANETS.

MERCURY will be the Evening Star until January 31; after which it will be the Morning Star until April 9, it will then be the Evening Star until June 1, then Morning Star until July 23, then Evening Star until September 30, after it will be Morning Star to November 24, thence Evening Star until January 15, 1858.

MERCURY will be in its greatest Western Elongation February 25 June 24 and October 16. It will be in its greatest Eastern Elongation January 16, May 8 and September 5.

VENUS will be the Evening Star until May 8, after which it will be the Morning Star until February 11, 1858.

VENUS will be in its greatest Eastern Elongation February 27 and in its greatest Western Elongation July 19.

MARS will be the Evening Star until June 6, after which it will be the Morning Star to the close of the year.

JUPITER will be the Evening Star until April 12, it will then be the Morning Star until October 20, after which it will be the Evening Star.

SATURN will be the Evening Star until July 11, after which it will be the Morning Star.

## ECLIPSES IN 1857.

There will be Two Eclipses this year—both of the Sun.

I. March 25. A Total Eclipse of the Sun, commencing 3h. 6m. afternoon, and ending 8h. 54m. afternoon, mean time at Halifax.

It will be invisible in Nova-Scotia and New England, but will be partially seen in California, Texas, and in most of the Western States. This Eclipse will commence in Australia and end in Mexico. Its centre will pass through the Northern and Southern Pacific Oceans.

II. September 17 and 18. An Annular Eclipse of the Sun, commencing Sept. 17th, 10h. 23m. P. M., and ending Sept. 18th, 4h. 18m. A. M., mean time at Halifax. It will be invisible in all parts of America, but may be seen in the eastern part of Europe, in all the southern parts of Asia and in the north-eastern part of Africa.

## DIRECTIONS FOR FINDING THE TRUE TIME.

The Sun is on the Meridian at 12 o'clock on four days only in the year. It is sometimes as much as 15 minutes before or after twelve, when its shadow strikes the noon-mark on the sundial. Thus, on the 25th January when the sun is on the noon-mark the watch must be set 12 minutes 41 seconds past twelve, which will be the true time. The practice of setting time pieces by the rising or setting of the Sun or Moon is not strictly correct, as the unevenness of the earth's surface and intervening objects, such as hills and forests near the points of rising and setting, occasion a deviation in every place from the time expressed in the Almanack, which time is adapted to a smooth level horizon. The only means of keeping correct time is by the use of a noon-mark or a meridian line.

EXPLANATION OF THE CALENDAR PAGES.  
LEFT HAND PAGE.

- Column 1 and 2—Days of the Month and of the Week.  
 3 " 4—The rising and setting in *mean time* of the highest point,  
     or of the *upper limb* of the Sun, corrected for refraction.  
 5—The Sun's declination for the same as the Equation, 6th column.  
 6—Equation of time, (or quantity by which the Sun is *slow* or *fast*  
     of the clock at noon, apparent, not mean, time at Greenwich,  
     or at a quarter before eight o'clock in the morning at Halifax.)  
 7—Days' length in hours and minutes.  
 8 and 9—The rising and setting of the Moon.  
 10—The time of the Moon's southing, or passing the meridian. This  
     column also gives the time of High Water at Parrsboro', Horton,  
     Cornwallis, Huntsport, Windsor, Newport, Truro, &c.  
 11—The symbols in this column indicate the moon's place in the  
     Signs or Constellations of the Zodiac.

The top of the columns of each month gives the Moon's Phases,  
 or times of New and Full Moon, and of the First and Last  
 Quarters, or quadratures with the Sun.

THE FARMER'S CALENDAR is placed at the foot of the columns of  
 each month.

## RIGHT HAND PAGE.

- 1—Contains the days of the month.  
 2—Sundays, Weather, Anniversaries, &c.  
 3—The time of High Water at Halifax, N. S.  
 4— " " " Pictou, N.S., and Cape Tormentine, N.B.  
 5— " " " Annapolis, N. S.; St. John, N. B., and  
     Portland, Maine.

6— " " " St. Johns, Newfoundland,  
 of that tide which immediately precedes the southing of the Moon.  
 These four columns are computed on the supposition that the time  
 of High Water on the days of New and Full Moon (*L'establissement  
 du port*) is at Halifax, 7h. 30m.—at Annapolis, St. John, N. B., and  
 Portland, 11h. 14m.—at Pictou and Cape Tormentine, 10h. and St.  
 Johns, Newfoundland, 6h. 30m.

All the calculations are made to *mean solar time*, which has super-  
 seded the old mode of reckoning by *apparent time*.

THE EPHÉMÉRIS OF THE PRINCIPAL PLANETS—The hour of *meridian  
 passage, right ascension and declination* of each of the principal planets  
 is given for the 1st and 15th of each month. For any other day  
 than the 1st and 15th of the month, apply a correction at the rate  
 of 3m. 55.91s. per day, reckoned from the nearest given day, to be  
 added for an earlier day—subtracted if for a later day.

Spring tides are the highest, and occur at or about Full or New  
 Moon. Neap tides are the lowest, and occur at the first and last  
 quarters. Ebb tide is that between high and low water, lasting,  
 on an average, 7 1-4 hours; and Flood tide is that between low and  
 high water, lasting about 5 1-4 hours. During strong north-west-  
 erly gales the tide rises earlier but does not rise to its usual height,  
 while the ebb tide runs out longer and falls lower; but upon the  
 gales abating and weather moderating they are later, higher and  
 stronger. A south-westerly gale has a contrary effect; and an  
 easterly gives some additional water.

No greater element of success can be introduced into the habits of a farmer, than a strict, methodical manner of conducting the business of the farm. The *successful* management of a farm requires a vast amount of care and attention, a close oversight; in short, an incessant watchfulness. There must be brought to the task no insignificant quantity of the most multifarious talents, and they must be steadily and sturdily exercised. The details of farm management are of the most extended and complicated character, and can be fully and successfully compassed but by the active exertion of a disciplined mind, which must call out its full resources, not for getting the systematic arrangement and prompt execution of all requirements for labor and skill. The farmer who lacks method has many places for every thing, and far too frequently places of full exposure to all changes of the weather. Orderly arrangement leads to neat arrangement, and therefrom springs the sure beginnings of refinement and rural taste, which is a way mark in the direct road to honor, usefulness, true gentility, and a happy life.

In all the arrangements for constructing and keeping stables in order, the comfort, and consequently the health and thrift of the animal, should be kept constantly in view. Cleanliness under foot is all important to the comfort of animals. This can only be secured by a good stone or plank floor, very frequent cleanings, and a sufficiency, not superabundance, of clean dry litter. Remember, it is about as easy to throw out a cart load of fresh droppings in fifty different operations performed three times a day, as to do it once a week at one formidable and disagreeable task. A stable clean under foot is absolutely essential to a pure air. All kinds of grain fed to stock should be ground. One bushel of ground oats or corn will furnish as much nourishment as one bushel and a peck of whole grain. Two bushels of oats and one of carrots is better food for a horse than three bushels of oats; and when need for light work the proportions of carrots may be increased. With such food horses will enjoy good health and spirits, a loose hide, shining coat, and improved digestion. The carrot is equally valuable for fattening animals and for milch cows. With proper cultivation, from 600 to 1000 bushels of this valuable root can be raised on an acre.

AGRICULTURAL implements and machinery are receiving more attention from the public than they have formerly done, and are destined to receive far more attention than they now do. It is but a few years since the horse rake came into use; now a farmer would almost as quick think of getting his hay without a pitchfork as without a horse rake. It was at one time thought impossible to use a horse rake on any land that was not perfectly smooth and level; now a farmer would be lost to mow a meadow that is so rough that he cannot use the horse rake. If you have any meadows or old fields that are sward bound, or which bore indifferent crops of hay last season, give them a thorough harrowing as soon as the frost is out of the surface in the spring, while the ground is soft; then sow to each acre four quarts timothy seed, ten pounds red clover, five bushels wood ashes, and five bushels fresh slack lime, all well mixed, and roll it well in. This will insure you a good crop of grass, without the labor of ploughing immediately.

Every farmer has no doubt decided before this on what field to sow this or that particular crop. He only now awaits fine weather and a dry soil to commence operations. In the mean time there is work enough to do. Fences to put up, ploughs, harrows, hedges, &c., to be examined and repaired if needed; seed wheat, oats, timothy, clover, &c., should be procured now. The shortness of our sowing season makes it desirable that the farmer, above all others, should take time by the forelock. Too many neglect all preparations for spring work, and when the fine weather comes, having every thing to do in a few weeks, they are in too great a hurry to do any thing well. The best way to use muck is in mixture with yard manure. If the muck is well dried, it operates beneficially in two ways — by its own fertilizing ingredients, and by absorbing the liquid manure. It usually contains, when wet, about seven or eight times its own weight of water, and if made perfectly dry, will absorb a like amount of the drainings of the stable, cattle yard, &c. Muck may also be used with loam and turf to great advantage in forming compost heaps.

DRAINING and manuring are the principal means which have hitherto been employed for improving the condition or composition of soils. Almost all agriculturists are now pretty well acquainted with the advantages to be derived from the above named methods of improvement, and are convinced that all judicious expenditures, either in the way of draining or of manuring, will or may be made to pay. But there is a method of improving soils, to which the attention of farmers has not been, as yet, directed. We refer to that method which consists in adding to soils those earthy substances in which they are deficient. Light sandy and gravelly soils, upon which wheat cannot be raised to any advantage, are benefited by additions of clay, peaty earth, or meadow muck, or a mixture of all in a compost with stable and barn manure. Clay soils, again, are benefited by additions of lime, sand, gravel, loamy sand; and peaty earth. Upon both these kinds of soil, and indeed upon almost every variety of soil, peat earth acts favorably. It should always form a part of any mixture which is added to a soil, if it can be had conveniently.

MULCHING consists in covering the surface of the ground around the roots of trees or vegetables with sea weed, fine hay, spent tan, straw, or any other litter, and may be beneficially applied to all kinds of trees, shrubs, or vegetables. By this process the moisture produced by the spring rains is retained in the ground, for the use of the root during the drought of summer. The surface is also kept in a proper state to absorb the dews, and gentle rains; and being thus protected from the rays of the noonday sun, rapid evaporation is prevented. This process applied to small fruits, such as currants, raspberries, strawberries, &c., has never failed of producing a large crop. On light, gravelly soils it will insure a good crop of any kind of fruit. To secure a fine and early crop of the tomato it is only necessary to head in the plants as soon as the fruit is about the size of a cherry — this will throw the strength of the plant into the fruit, the size and quality of which are consequently greatly improved.

As the growing of fruit is becoming quite an object, not only for family comfort, but also as a source of profit, too much care and attention cannot be given to young trees, in the present condition of our old lands, which have been under cultivation such a length of time. When our country was new and rich, large orchards were planted, and grew rapidly, with little care except an occasional trimming; but a great change has taken place. Long cultivation has deprived our land of its natural richness, and according to some, has robbed the soil of some of the most essential ingredients required to produce a good growth of trees. Be that as it may, a few years of experience in attempting to grow trees on an exhausted soil, will convince any one of the utter folly of attempting to raise fruit trees on such soil, without high cultivation and unremitting care and attention;—they require constant care and watchfulness to keep them in a healthy and thriving condition. No doubt much depends on having the tree properly set in the first place; but let that be done right, the tree will not flourish unless it is highly manured and otherwise cared for.

We have sometimes wondered if selfishness—total absorption in one's own interest, and total indifference to the interests of others—could ever be indignded to such a degree as to become wholly blind and even suicidal. It has seemed as if no other inference was admissible, when we have seen men neglect to repair some little defect in the road near their premises, which they had to suffer from every day.

THERE are many farmers who, by the continual selection of their best animals for breeding, might have a stock equal to any of the high sounding English names. Would it not be wiser, then, to keep more prominent this fact, and excite emulation in improving our stock at home than to search creation over after improved animals? Deep ploughing will not cause a large crop on poor land without manure. Feeding a colt on hay alone, will not be likely to produce a high spirited creature from a low stock in a single generation; but let a few oats be added, preserve the best for breeders for a series of years, with other things corresponding, and you may work wonders. There undoubtedly is a great difference in the quality of stock: yet it is an old and true saying that "a bad cow may have a good calf" and when this happens take good care of it. The conclusion to be drawn from these remarks is, that from the best materials we can obtain, by the best means in our power, we should improve our stock, never forgetting that what has been done may be done again.

Then move on, and crowd your garners with the golden ears; fill your cellars to the brim with early blues and calicoes. Gather in the fruits of your gardens, and your orchards; let nothing be wasted and lost. Leave not your tools in the field, as the manner of some is, who do business without system or order. Some men might perhaps get along without helpmeets, but what could farmers do without their wives? Who will take the interest that a wife does in the household duties, the dairy, and a multitude of other concerns that belong to the female department? There is a partnership interest and sympathy which no woman other than a wife can feel. There is, therefore, nothing better for a farmer than a good wife!

There is at least one very good reason why the work of the last of the autumn months should be promptly attended to. If not seasonably performed, every thing will be transfixed with chains and bolts of frost, and four months must elapse before emancipation takes place. In any other month, what happens to be neglected, may be done in the first few days of the next; but here no allowance is usually given the tardy and negligent farmer. Carrots, Rutabaga, Beets, and Mangold Wurtzel should be harvested, as they are never positively safe beyond the first of the month. Ample preparations should be made for shelter to domestic animals during winter. Sheds, stables, feeding racks, and troughs often save in a single winter their entire cost, by avoiding the needless consumption of food to impart warmth, and by preventing a waste of fodder under foot. A general supervision should be kept of the premises, and every preparation made for winter — loose boards on barns and fences should be nailed fast; sagging gates righted; broken windows furnished with glass; stables made secure against cold currents; and a general and particular vigilance pursued in relation to the care and management of the premises, preparatory to the arrangements for another year.

All improvements, all designs for new operations, all the work to be done, should then be considered and prepared for, so that when the time for work arrives he will have nothing to do but to "go ahead." Then he has no time to think; but if he has been wise during winter he will have no need of it. It is a pitiful sight to look at in the spring, when all nature is in an ecstasy of delight, to see a farmer flying about "like a hen with her head cut off," trying to do a thousand things at once, not knowing which to do first, running here and there in search of his rusty implements, some of which require repairs, some can't be found; the ploughing season passing away, the planting season rapidly advancing, and he not prepared for any thing. Every body, who is any body, likes to see system and order in the various operations of the farm; and even the most negligent admire and approve the practice of him who has "a place for every thing, and every thing in its place."

**LIGHT HOUSES ON THE COAST OF NOVA-SCOTIA,  
AND ON THE  
COAST OF NEW-BRUNSWICK, IN THE BAY OF FUNDY.**

*Meagher's Beach*—East side Halifax harbor. A fixed light.

*Sambro Island*—Western entrance Halifax harbor. A fixed light.

*Devil's Island*—An Octagonal Light Beacon on the S. W. point of Devil's Island, at the entrance of the eastern passage to Halifax harbor, and exhibits a red light on the seaward sides to distinguish it from Sambro and Meagher's Beach lights; stands forty-five feet above high-water mark; rise and fall six feet. The Tower is painted dark brown, with a white belt between the Balcony and Lantern, to distinguish it in day time.

*Cross Island*—Entrance to Lunenburg harbor. Two lights—flash light above; fixed light below.

*Liverpool*—South end of Coffin's Island. A plain revolving light.

*Fort Point Harbor Light*—at the head of Liverpool harbor, southern entrance of the River. A bright fixed light visible from all points of approach, and must be left on the larboard hand when entering the harbor.

*Port Medway*—Beacon light on Admiralty Head west side of the entrance to the Port. Building square, painted white, with black square in the centre of the seaward sides; plain white light forty-four feet above sea level, and stands within thirty fathoms of the shore.

*Shelburne*—McNutt's Island. Two fixed lights, one above the other.

*Barrington*—Baccara Point, east side of the entrance to Barrington Bay. A flash light of fifteen seconds.

*Yarmouth*—West side of the harbor. A plain revolving light.

*Cape Sable, Seal Island*—The first light on approaching the Bay of Fundy is on the south point of Seal Island. A plain white light, elevated about eighty feet above high-water mark, and may be seen on approaching the Island from any point of the compass. A very dangerous rock, under water, but upon which the sea always breaks, called Blonde Rock, lies about three and one-third miles S. by W. by compass from the Light House. Between this rock and the Island there are some dangers: the ground is rocky throughout, and large vessels, therefore, ought not to attempt passing between them.

*Brier Island*—A plain white light, situate about half a mile N. E. from the N. W. point of the Island.

*Westport*—Peter's Island at the south entrance of the east side of the Bay of Fundy. Two WHITE LIGHTS, placed horizontally, (to distinguish it from Brier Island Light) at an elevation of forty feet above high-water mark.

*Digby Gut Light*—On the west side of Digby Gut, from Brier Island north-eastward. This light is chiefly intended as a guide into Digby Basin. A fixed white light.

*Black Rock Light*—On the South Shore of the Bay of Fundy. A fixed light.

*Horton Bluff Light*—In the Basin of Mines, ninety-five feet above sea level high water; rise and fall forty to forty-five feet. Building square, painted white; stands sixty feet from the Bluff, and shows a White Light, which may be seen in clear weather over the greatest part of the Basin of Mines, (after passing Cape Blowmedon,) and

**Apple River Light**—North side of the entrance to Apple River, in Chignecto or Cumberland Bay. Two fixed lights placed horizontally.

**Partridge Island River**—An Octagonal Light Beacon on the west side of the entrance to Partridge Island River, Parbozo', on the north side of the Basin of Mines, and exhibits a plain white light, at an elevation of thirty feet above high-water; rise and fall about forty-five feet; the Tower is white, and stands close to high-water mark on the beach. Vessels can only enter the harbor at high-water, and must lie aground on soft bottom when the tide is low.

**Eastern Beaver, or Williams' Island**—A revolving light.

**Canseau, Cranberry Island**—Two fixed lights, one above the other, west side of the Gut of Canseau. A fixed light.

**Eddy or Sand Point Light**—On Eddy or Sand Point, on the west side of the south entrance to the Strait of Canseau, distinguished by two white lights placed horizontally, twenty-five feet above the sea level. Building square, painted white with a black diamond on the seaward side.

**Guy'sborough Harbor Beacon**—On the west side of the entrance to the harbor, head of Chedabucto Bay. A fixed light.

**Pictou Light**—On the south-east side of the entrance to the harbor. A fixed light.

**Pictou Island Light**—On the S. E. point of the Island. Building square and painted white. A fixed light, fifty-two feet above high-water mark.

**Arichat Beacon**—A Light on Point Marichi, on the east side of the southern entrance to the harbor. Building square, painted white. A white light thirty-four feet above the sea level.

**Louisburg**—On the east side of the entrance to the harbor. A fixed light.

**Low Point Light**—East side of Sydney, Cape Breton, harbor. A fixed light.

**Rugged Island Harbor Light**—On Gull Rock, off the entrance of the harbor. Building square, and painted white, exhibiting a clear fixed light at an elevation of fifty-one feet above the sea level, and is situated in latitude  $43^{\circ} 39' N.$ , and longitude  $64^{\circ} 66' W.$

**Pubnico Harbor Light**—A Beacon light on the S. E. side of the entrance to Pubnico harbor, situated on the east side of the entrance to the Bay of Fundy, about thirteen miles northerly of Cape Sable. Building square, painted white. A fixed red light on the seaward side, twenty-eight feet above high-water level, (rise and fall twelve feet,) and stands fifty fathoms from low-water mark. The point of Beach is bold.

**White Head Island Light**—On the S. W. point of White Head Island. The Tower is square, painted white, standing seventy-five fathoms from the water's edge, with an Octagonal Iron Lantern, sixty feet above sea level at high-water; rise and fall six feet. The light is distinguished by bright flashes of ten seconds duration, followed by eclipses of ten seconds, displaying alternately three flashes and three eclipses in a minute. The light will not be totally obscured during the eclipse.

*Sea Wolf or Margarie Island Light*.—Situated on the N. W. side of the Island of Cape Breton, nearly midway between Port Hood and Cheticamp harbors, and distant from Cape Breton two and a half miles. A plain white light. The lantern is placed on a square wooden Tower, painted white, near the centre and summit of the Island. The lantern is two hundred and ninety-eight feet above sea level—visible from all points of approach. To vessels in proximity to the Island, the light may become obscured by the abrupt cliffs or sides of the Island, which may serve as a guide to tack or anchor by, as hundreds of vessels find anchorage on the S. E. side. The chief landing is near the S. W. end, in shore, where a few fishing stages and boats are kept in use during the fishing season.

*Port Hood Light*.—Changed from white to red, when seen from the northern entrance, to distinguish it from Margarie and N. Canso lights.

*Iron-bound Island Light*.—Off the entrance to LaHave River—a bright flash light of ten seconds duration, followed by eclipses of thirty seconds. The lantern is placed on a square wooden Tower, painted white, on the southern side of the Island, and is visible from all points of approach. Elevation seventy feet above sea level.

*St. Paul's Island*.—A fixed light on the north-east end; and a flash light on the south-west end.

*Scattarie Island*.—A revolving light on the east end of the Island.

*Gannet Rock Light*.—This light is intended to warn vessels of their approach to a very dangerous range of shoals and ledges, which extend from the Old Proprietor to the Seal Islands off Machias, a distance of about twenty miles. A white Flash Light, twenty seconds dark, and forty seconds light in each minute. Building painted in stripes, vertical, black and white.

*Machias Seal Island Lights*.—Two Fixed White Lights upon the Machias Seal Islands, forty-five feet above high-water, and bearing from each other E. S. E. and W. N. W., distant about two hundred feet, by which circumstance, of two light houses at the same station, they will be immediately distinguished from all other lights upon the coast, British or American. Both buildings painted white. Vessels standing to the northward between these lights and the Gannet Rock should tack or haul off the moment they bring these lights into one, as they will be then not more than three-fourths of a mile from the Mun Ledges, if more than five miles to the E. of the lights.

*Head Harbor Light*.—Next in order, after passing Grand Manan, and the plain White Light (American) on West Quoddy Point, is Head Harbor Light, placed on the N. E. extremity of Campo Bello, and is a guide to vessels entering the main channel to West Isles, Moose Island, and the Inner Bay of Passamaquoddy; it enables vessels also, at all times, to enter Head Harbor. A fixed white light. Building painted white, with a red cross on it.

*Point Le Preau Lights*.—Upon this projecting headland Two Lights are placed, one above the other, in the same house, and distant twenty-eight feet. Both lights can be seen from every point of the coast pass where they may be useful; both are fixed and white. Building painted red and white, in stripes, five feet broad each, horizontally.

*Partridge Island Light*.—At the entrance of the river and harbor of St. John, N. B. A red and white light. The building painted red and white in vertical stripes.

*Beacon Light*.—Within Partridge Island, and upon a spit or bar which extends about half a mile S. S. E. off Sand Point, and which dries at two-thirds ebb, stands the Beacon Tower. A fixed white light. Building painted white and black, in stripes, vertically.

*Quaco Light*.—A Revolving White Light, placed on a small rock off Quaco Head, showing twice full and twice dark in a minute. The light can be seen from any quarter where a vessel can approach. Building painted white and red in horizontal stripes.

*Cape Enrage Light*.—On the Point of that name in Westmoreland, nearly opposite Apple River Harbor, N. S. Building painted white, about 120 feet above the tide. A plain white light.

*West Quoddy Light*.—This is an American light, placed on the west side of the entrance into the St. Croix, by Lubec and Eastport.

Letters, &c., for England, which may be dropped into the box after the hour of closing and up to the arrival of the Packet, will be forwarded in a Bag, loose—but such letters CANNOT be PREPAID, either in money or stamps. The Royal Mail Steamers leave Boston for Halifax and Liverpool, G. B., every alternate *Wednesday*; arrive at Halifax on *Thursday evening* or very early the succeeding morning, leaving Halifax immediately after receiving the Mails.

Letters to or from England, 7½d., *prepayment, optional*;—can be prepaid by using a 6d. or two 3d. Stamps, together with half of a threepenny Stamp cut diagonally. Newspapers free.

Closed Mails for the United Kingdom via United States are made up at Halifax to meet the Steamers leaving New York for Liverpool. Letters to be specially addressed "via New York." Letters 10d.; Newspapers 1d. each.

The Mails for the United States via Boston, per Royal Mail Steamers are made up on *Tuesday Evening* of the week in which the Packet from England is due, at 8 o'clock. Should the Steamer not arrive by 6 o'clock the following morning, supplementary Mails will be made up. Should the Steamer from Liverpool arrive previous to Tuesday night—the Mails as heretofore will close *immediately on her arrival*.

A closed Mail for Canada is made up and forwarded at the same time in charge of the British Officer. Letters so forwarded must be specially addressed "Closed Mail for Canada; postage 7½d.;" viz.: 5d. Packet Rate, and 2½d. Colonial Rate—*prepayment optional*.

The Mails for Bermuda and the West Indies, are made up *finally* at Halifax on the *Thursday Evening* of the week in which the Royal Mail Steamer is expected to arrive from Boston, at 8 o'clock.

Letters 5d—when posted in the interior, 3d. additional, this must be prepaid. Newspapers 1½d. each, which must be paid by Stamp.

Letters posted in any Town within the Province for delivery in the same Town, are liable to a rate of *one penny* for every  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz.

For Dartmouth, *daily*—postage 1d.

For Musquodoboit Harbor, every Tuesday morning, at 9 o'clock. Return Mail due on Monday afternoon at 5 o'clock.

For Prospect, on Saturday afternoon, at 2 o'clock. Return Mail due on Saturday morning, at 11 o'clock.

For Ketch Harbor and Sambro, on Friday evening at 10 o'clock. Return Mail due on Saturday.

All letters are charged by weight, and a uniform rate of postage of 3d. on a letter not exceeding half an ounce in weight has been established throughout British North America. To any part of the United States 6d. ; to Oregon and California, 9d., *prepayment optional*.

Newspapers *pass free* to any part of the Province, British North America and the United States when sent by *land Mail*—to be put up in covers open at the ends.

Printed Circulars, Prices Current, Handbills, and other printed matter of a like description, put up in covers open at the ends, and without any written communication, may be sent from any part of the Province to any place within the same, as well as through Nova-Scotia, at the rate of *one penny* per oz.—*prepayment optional*, except when addressed to the United States, in which case the postage must be *prepaid*.

Pamphlets, Magazines, Periodicals, or Books, bound or unbound, done up in covers open at the ends, unaccompanied by any written communication, may be transmitted as above mentioned through the Mail in this Province: not exceeding 2 oz., in weight—free; 2 oz. and not 3, 1d.; 3oz and not 4, 1½d.; 4 oz. and not 5, 2d.; adding ½d. for every additional oz. up to 48 oz., beyond which weight they cannot be sent by Mail.

British reprints of copyright works from the United States, by *land mail* or *steamer*, charged letter postage.

The Postage on Books from Great Britain to Nova-Scotia, or *vice versa*, is at the rate of 7½d. currency, if not exceeding  $\frac{1}{2}$  lb.; exceeding  $\frac{1}{2}$  lb. and not exceeding 1 lb., 1s 3d. ; and so on adding 1s. 3d. for every additional pound or fraction of a pound. One book package may contain separate Books, Publications, Almanacks, and Maps and Paper, Parchment or Vellum; the latter three materials may be written or printed on—the package may contain the name and address of the sender. Rollers may accompany prints and maps, and markers may be sent with books. No letter must be sent with or written on a book package, and no such package must exceed *two feet* in length, width or depth. The postage must in all cases be *prepaid* by Stamps.

**L**etters intended to be *Registered*, must be posted half an hour previous to the closing of the particular mail by which they are to be forwarded, and the *postage*, as well as the registration fee, must be *prepaid*.

Letters *prepaid by Stamps*, and dropped into the Letter Box any time during the night, and up to 5 o'clock, A. M., will be forwarded by the mails despatched same morning.

When the Mails from England arrive before 9, P. M., they are delivered the same evening, and after that hour, at 7 next morning.

All other mails arriving before 7 P. M., will be delivered the same evening,—if after that hour and before 8, at 6 o'clock,—and if after 8, at 7 o'clock the following morning.

The Postmaster-General is not liable for the loss of any letter or packet, unless such loss should arise from his own default.
