As cadets we never knew much about the problems of organizing and managing the affairs of a large Army Flying school. Advancing from one school to another we were rather vague about why some of the posts at which we had trained seemed to operate so smoothly while at others everything went wrong with the least provocation We did know, however, that someone, or probably, more than one, made this school tick.

Our life here was pleasant. Schedules were arranged without a minute to spare; there were no threats hanging over our heads, yet cooperation and trust from those in command were met in the same spirit. Everyone knew what was expected of him and schedules were fulfilled. We, as trainees, re-

ceived the benefit.

No unit is stronger than its leadership; therefore, much of the credit is due Colonel Davenport. The chain appeared strong throughout, however,

and was reflected down through every enlisted man at the field.

Lieutenant Mills' ground school and staff did a fine job in teaching six month's work in one. Patiently they saturated us with knowledge, yet the courses never were carried quite to the extreme that we gave up in disgust.

We marveled too at the way in which the Link Trainer department worked nights and Sundays to afford us every grain of additional knowledge which might benefit us some day. The instructors, many of them ex-cadets who did not make the grade, were conscientious, thorough and demanding.

Occasional complaints were registered against the tactical department, but theirs was the job of discipline a duty which never could escape complaint from those on the receiving end. Captain Miles headed an excellent staff, Lieutenants Harold, Clark, Anderson and Griffeth were humane and

fair. We each gained by their association.

On the flight line, Major Eppright, Captain Karle and the squadron commanders managed to graduate the largest class in Frederick's history. They accomplished this task without additional equipment or outside manpower and we finished ahead of schedule. Each graduate cadet will tell you he had THE best instructor and squadron commander, and that speaks for itself.





Several days after the type was set, printed, and bound into this book, the men whose pictures appear on these next few pages became officers. They had won the cherished Wings of the Army Air Corps and then were scattered to the winds.

Some fourteen months ago a few of us here were welcomed to a college training detachment which was to mark the real beginning of our cadet mission. At this particular station it was four a. m., most of us were rather seriously ill with influenza, we were tired and cold after a long ride on a troop train, but still we formed ranks and stood at attention for the welcoming address.

The officer, fresh from Officer's Candidate School, was on his first assignment and knew little more concerning why we were there than we did. He told us, however, we could expect the finest living conditions and treatment the United States Army ever had afforded anyone, but that, in his own words, "You are embarking on the busiest and most rigorous period of your life up to now, and probably, ever."

Every man here undoubtedly was told something very similar—either he was told or he soon discovered for himself. That was more than a year ago. Class 44-C thereby benefitted by the longest training period for pilots since the beginning of the war. It has been difficult, but each man is better equipped to fight a winning war, both for his country and himself. The extra training has proved itself, for the class suffered few training casualties as compared to the past, and the elimination ratio has been amazingly low. We are starting into battle proud and confident.

Graduation will not be without regret, however. In most cases the men have lived and struggled together throughout a long year. Like all soldiers thrown together and dependent on each other, they formed fast friendships.

In a few weeks Class 44-C will be in every sky over the earth. The only tangible remainder of the unit will be this book. Therefore, now, as you are browsing through these pages, be it 1944 or 1984, the staff proposes a toast . . . to our class! T. E. D.

To absorb the knowledge given on the flight line is our primary purpose at Frederick Field. Of course it is necessary to march in formation from the barracks to the line, giving us a chance to show off those smooth ranks for which 44-C is noted.





We start the day by saluting our instructors, and eagerly listening to the flying assignments.

There are always some Cadets to be sent to Link Trainer department for that all important foundation to actual instrument flying. One of the most emphasized phases in our twin-engine school is this blind flying. Over twenty hours are spent in the air, learning to depend solely on the instrument panel for controlling the plane's flight.









