



NEW GIANT EARLY FLOWERING SPENCER SWEET PEAS.

BLOOM FOUR WEEKS EARLIER THAN THE LATE SPENCERS

The plants of this new race, grown under congenial conditions, are of strong constitution, vigorous growth, profuse and bloom continuously for about four months. Grown in the open ground they begin flowering in about 106 days from seed sowing or fully four weeks sooner than late flowering Sweet Peas sown at the same time, and they continue to flower in profusion for fully 4 months. It is predicted by Sweet Pea authorities that this race will supplant all other early and late flowering Sweet Peas for winter flowering under glass, and also for open ground culture in our Southern States—sown preferably in fall or winter.
