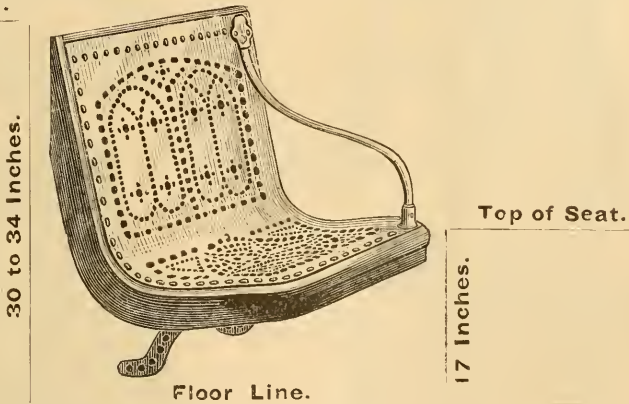


No. 4--Side Seating--(See opposite page.)



The cut on the opposite page shows our No. 4 Side Seating which is recommended for places where permanent seating is wanted. The cut shows on the right a square finished end and on the left a round corner end. The division arm on the right is either nickel plated or japanned; in the centre is a wood brace arm; and on the left is a T arm. One of the advantages of our No. 4 Side Seating is that there are no legs in the way when the floor is to be scrubbed or swept.

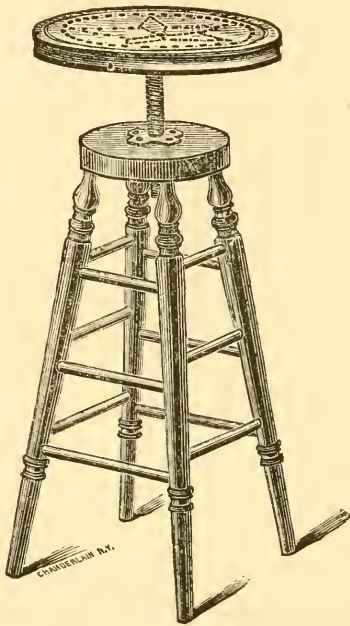
Top of Rail.

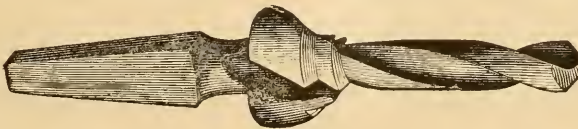


End of Leg  
Showing Rubber Protector.

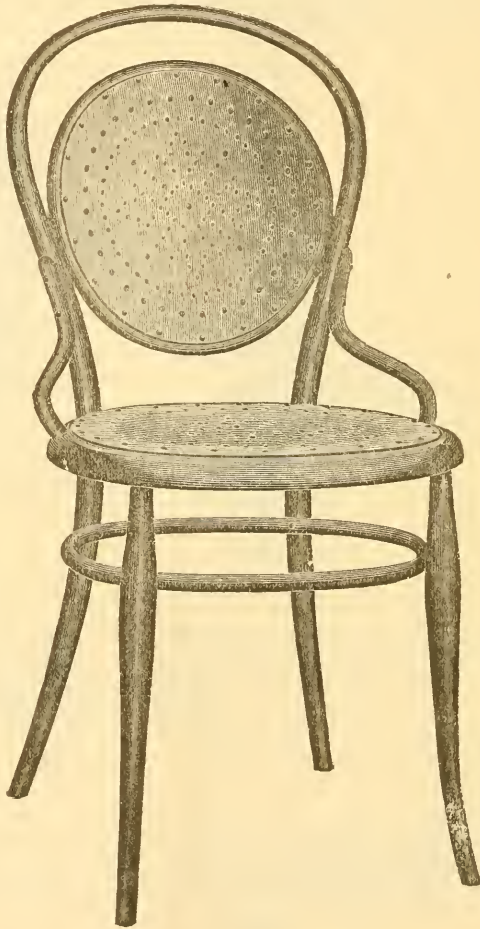

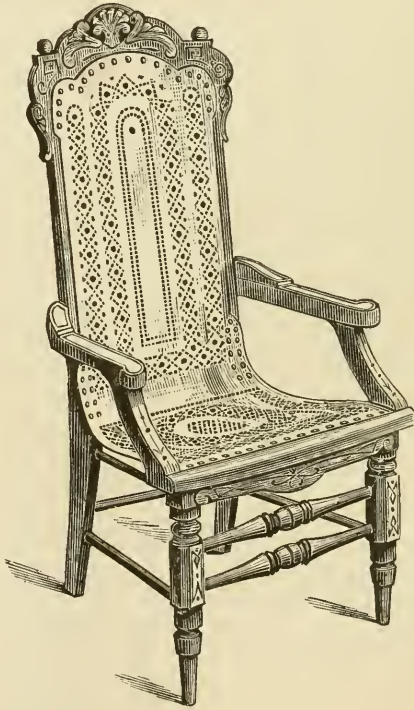
