Explanation of the Articles of the Calendar.

These pages are calculated for Toronto, Quebec, Fredericton and Halifax, and for ordinary purposes will serve with sufficient accuracy for every city in the Dominion of Canada.

MOON'S PHASES.—This Table gives the times for the four meridians when the moon passes the geocentric longitudes of 0°, 90°, 180° and 270° east of the sun. It gives also the times of her greatest and least distance from the earth.

TWILIGHT.—In this table are given the times at which twilight begins in the morning and ends in the evening, i. e., the times when the sun's centre is 18° below the horizon.

GREATEST ELONGATION OF THE POLE STAR.—This column gives the greatest azimuth of the Pole Star east or west from the meridian as observed at a place in latitude 45°. When the greatest elongation corresponding to any other latitude is required, the number given in the column should be corrected by means of the following table.

The 1st correction for the degrees of latitude is to be subtracted from the greatest elongation given in the calendar, or added to it, according as the degrees of latitude are less or greater than 45°.

The 2nd correction, which is always additive, is found by multiplying the number given in the third line of the table by the number of minutes in the latitude.

Thus for latitude 43° 20'...1st correction = -4' 5"	2nd correction + 2.0 × 20 = + 40"

THE PLANETS.—The times of rising and setting of the five chief planets are calculated for Toronto, and are corrected for refraction. The times of culmination, although computed for the meridian of Toronto, will serve approximately for the whole of Canada. The meridian zenith distances, being designed merely to aid in finding the planets, have been given only to the nearest tenth of a degree, as seen from the latitude of 45°.

When the planetary day is shorter than the mean solar day, and commences soon after the midnight of the preceding day, the planet will sometimes arrive a second time on the meridian before the expiration of the actual civil day. From analogous causes a planet will sometimes rise twice or set twice in the same civil day. When two culminations occur in the same day, or two risings or settings, the times of both are registered.

The times of the **SUN'S RISING AND SETTING** are given for the upper limb, and are corrected for refraction for Toronto, Quebec, Fredericton and Halifax.

The civil times both for the rising and setting of the Moon's centre are given for every day for Toronto, Quebec, Fredericton and Halifax.

The column **SUN ON MERIDIAN** gives the time that a watch should show when the shadow of a sun dial is on the noon mark.

MOON'S AGE.—This column shews to the nearest tenth of a day the Moon's age at Toronto Noon.

The column, **MOON ON THE MERIDIAN**, gives the mean time at which the moon's centre passes the meridian of longitude 4 h. 46 m. W. When in the column headed Moon's rising or setting or Moon on meridian the letters A.M. occur, unaccompanied by any number, they denote that the numbers given for the succeeding days relate to the morning, and those for the preceding days to the afternoon, but that the Moon does not rise or set or cross the meridian (as the case may be) on that day.

The **MOON'S MERIDIAN ZENITH DISTANCES** are given to the nearest tenth of a degree for a point in latitude 45° and longitude 4 h. 46 m. W. They are not corrected for parallax or refraction.

The column, **UPPER TRANSIT OF POLE STAR** shews for every day the mean time at which the Pole Star makes its upper transit across the meridian of longitude 4 h. 46 m. W. It passes in the morning from April 9 to October 9, and in the afternoon for the rest of the year. On October 9 there will be a second transit, occurring at 11 h. 56 m. 52 s. p.m.

The six last columns will serve with sufficient accuracy for the whole of Canada.

The times at which the lower transit of the Pole Star occurs may be found by adding 11 h. 58 m. 2 s. to the time of its preceding upper transit.

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From the time of the upper transit of the pole star may be found the time of its greatest western or eastern elongation, by adding or subtracting the constants given in the annexed Table.

Star Table.

From the times of the upper transit of the Pole Star may be derived, with the aid of the following table, the times of culmination, and of the rising and setting of the principal fixed stars, as seen from the parallel of 45° north latitude.

To ascertain when any star found in the following table will be on the meridian, add the number in the left-hand column of figures to the preceding meridian transit of the pole star given in the calendar. To find the time of rising of a star, subtract the number opposite to it in the right-hand column of figures from the time of its meridian passage. For the setting of a star, add the same number to the time of its meridian passage. Those stars marked (.....) revolve in a circle of perpetual apparition, and do not rise or set at places in and to the north of latitude 45°.

Eclipses.

In the year 1869 there will be two Eclipses of the Sun, and two of the Moon.

I.—A partial eclipse of the Moon, January 27, 1869, visible in Canada.

The following Table shows the local mean astronomical time at which the several phases occur:

The first contact with the shadow occurs at 50° from the northernmost point of the Moon's limb towards the east; and the last contact at 31° towards the west; in each case for direct image. Magnitude of the Eclipse (moon's diameter=1) 0.450.

II.—An annular eclipse of the Sun, February 10-11, 1869, invisible in Canada.

III.—A partial eclipse of the Moon, July 22-23, 1869, invisible in Canada.

IV.—A total eclipse of the Sun, August 7, 1869, visible as a partial one in Canada.

Persons postpaid careful to require the Post Master's receipt.

Both the post and the registration are charged on the sender, and can be traced without posting and delivery. Registered Letters are subject to the same regulations as the receiver, or Letter.

LETTER RATES.

Letters posted in Canada addressed to any place within the Dominion pass, if prepaid, for 3 cents per 1/2 oz., but if not prepaid such letters are charged 5 cents per 1/2 oz.

On Letters to Prince Edward's Island, the rate is 3 cents per 1/2 oz. if prepaid, 5 cents if unpaid.

The rate on Letters to the United Kingdom is, by Canadian Packet, sailing from Quebec, Portland, or Halifax,

Not exceeding 1/2 oz. - - - - - 12 1/2 cents. Exceeding " and not exceeding 1 oz. - - 25 " and so on, increasing one rate of postage for each additional half ounce.

And by Cunard Packet, 15 cents per 1/2 oz., &c. Letters for the United Kingdom must be prepaid, or they will be charged a fine of 6d. sterling on delivery.

Letters for British Colonies and Possessions beyond Sea, and Foreign Countries, via England, must be prepaid.

The rate on letters for the U. States, is 6 cents per 1/2 oz. to Cuba - - - - - 10 cents per 1/2 oz. United States letters 6 cents if prepaid, 10 cents if unpaid.

The rate of postage on letters to British Columbia and Vancouver's Island is 10 cents per 1/2 oz., which must be prepaid. An additional charge is made on these letters on delivery, for sea postage on the Pacific side. Newspapers 2 cents each, Books 4 cents per 4 oz. Red River letters 6 cents per 1/2 oz.; newspapers 2 cents each, or commuted rate if from Red River to regular subscribers in Canada.

MAILS FOR CANADA FROM ENGLAND.

Two Ocean Steamers carrying mails for Canada leave Liverpool in each week, viz.: a Canadian Packet on every Thursday, via Derry on Friday, sailing to Quebec in summer and Portland in Winter, by which the Postage rate is 6d. stg. per 1/2 oz.; and a Cunard Packet every Saturday, via Cork on Sunday, bringing Mails for Canada to New York, by which the Postage rate to Canada is 7d. stg. per 1/2 oz.

A Canadian Packet leaves Liverpool every alternate Saturday for Halifax, calling at Queenstown en route. Postage 6d. stg. per 1/2 oz., same as by Canadian Packet to Quebec or Portland.

The British Post Office forwards letters to Canada by the first packet sailing after the letter is posted, unless the letters bear a special direction—"By Canadian Packet" or "By British Packet"—and in that case they are kept over for the Packet designated. "By Canadian Mail" is not a distinctive superscription; for any Mail for Canada is a "Canadian Mail," by whatever Packet forwarded.

WEST INDIES VIA NEW YORK.

West Indies (British) letters 10 cents per 1/2 oz., newspapers 2 cents each. (Foreign) letters 22 cents per 1/2 oz., newspapers 3 cents each. Books (British only) 2 cents per 4 oz.

Letters, &c., prepaid for transmission, *via* New York, are forwarded direct on New York with every mail made up for that Post Office; whence West Indian mails are despatched as follows:

For Havana and the West Indies, *via* Havana, every Thursday afternoon.

For St. Thomas, the West Indies, and Brazil, on the 23rd of every month.

Letters for the West Indies, British and Foreign, are also sent *via* Halifax and Bermuda; postage 12 cents per 1/2 oz., newspapers 2 cents each.

REGISTRATION OF LETTERS.

Persons posting Letters containing value, should be careful to require them to be registered, and to obtain from the Post Master a Certificate of receipt for registration.

The charge for Registration, in addition to the Postage, is as follows, *viz.*:

- On Letters to any other place in Canada, or British North America 2 cents.
- On Letters for the United States 5 "
- On Letters for the United Kingdom 8 "
- On Letters for British Colonies or Possessions, sent *via* England 25 "

On Letters for France and other Foreign Countries, *via* France an amount equal to the postage rate.

On parcels, patterns, or samples, in Canada, 5 cents.

On book packets and newspapers to United Kingdom, 8 cents.

Both the postage charge and registration fee must in all cases be prepaid.

Registration is not an absolute guarantee against the miscarriage or loss of a Letter; but a Registered Letter can be traced when an Unregistered Letter cannot, and the posting and delivery or non-delivery can be proven. A Registered Letter is thus secured against many of the casualties which, from incorrect address, forgetfulness of the receiver, or other error, may affect an Unregistered Letter.

These rates must invariably be prepaid on transmission from Canada. Photographs, provided they are not upon glass or in cases containing glass, may be forwarded to Great Britain, &c., at the *Book rate of postage*. Book Packets addressed to the United Kingdom may be registered on payment of the ordinary registration fee, *viz.*, 8 cents in addition to the postage.

All book packets must be open at both ends or both sides to allow of the inspection of the contents.

MISCELLANEOUS CHARGES.

The charge on Parcels by the Parcel Post, which is limited to places within the Dominion, is 12 1/2 cents per 5 oz. (with 5 cts. additional if Registered.)

One cent per oz., payable in advance by Postage stamp, is the rate on Printed Circulars (Printed Circulars, if sent in envelope, whether sealed or unsealed, are liable to letter postage), Prices Current, Hand Bills and other Printed Matter of a like character, and on Books, bound or unbound, when posted at a Canadian Post Office addressed to any place in the Dominion of Canada, British North America generally, or the United States.

The postage upon Prices Current addressed to the United Kingdom is *two cents each*, which must be prepaid by postage stamps, or they will be sent to the Dead Letter Office to be returned to the senders.

NEWSPAPERS AND PERIODICALS.

Newspapers published in Canada may be sent by Post from the office of publication, addressed to any place in Canada, at the following rates, if paid quarterly in advance by either the publisher at the post office where the papers are posted, or by the subscriber at the delivering post office:

- For a paper published 6 times a week, 30 cents per quarter.
- " " 3 " " 15 " "
- " " 2 " " 10 " "
- " " 1 " " 5 " "

When the above rates are not paid in advance by either publisher or subscriber, such Papers are charged one cent each on delivery.

TRANSIENT NEWSPAPERS.

Transient Newspapers—that is to say, Canadian Newspapers posted otherwise than from the office of publication, and American or British papers posted or re-posted in Canada, must be prepaid 2 cents each, by postage stamp, or they cannot be forwarded—except only British Newspapers distributed to regular subscribers by Canadian Booksellers or News Agents—such papers pass free as they would do if received in the Canadian Packet Mails.

NEWSPAPERS BY MAIL FROM ENGLAND OR UNITED STATES.

Newspapers received from England by the Canadian Packet Mails are delivered free.

Newspapers from England by the Cunard Packet Mails are charged 2 cents each on delivery. (This is the American transit charge.)

United States Newspapers, brought by mail into Canada, to regular subscribers, are charged one cent each on delivery, transient papers 2 cents each.

PERIODICAL PUBLICATIONS.

The rate on all Periodicals, other than Newspapers, passing by mail in Canada, save such as may be addressed to or received from the United Kingdom, is one cent per cwt. weight of package containing periodical matter, whether the package contain one or more numbers.

Any fraction of 4 oz. to be charged as a full rate.

After 31st December, 1868, no periodicals whatever, except exchanges, (*i. e.* periodicals passing between publishers in Canada, and between publishers in Canada and publishers in the United States, Prince Edward Island, or Newfoundland) will be entitled to exemption from postage.

Transient Periodical matter posted in Canada must in all cases be prepaid by Postage Stamp.

The above rate will be payable on delivery on all Periodical matter received from the United States, except that Canadian Editors may receive Exchange Periodicals from the United States free of Canadian Postage.

Periodicals, printed and published in Canada, may be posted addressed to any place in the United Kingdom by Canadian Packet, on prepayment by Postage Stamp of two cents each number.

No package of periodicals can be sent through the Post, if it exceed 4 lb. in weight.

POSTAGE RATES ON MISCELLANEOUS MATTER.

Patterns or samples of merchandise and goods for sale, not exceeding 24 oz. in weight, may be posted in Canada to be forwarded to any place within the Dominion, on prepayment by postage stamp of a rate of 2 cent. per ounce, under the following regulations:

Patterns or samples must be sent in covers open at the ends, so as to be easy of examination. Samples however of seeds, drugs, and so forth, which cannot be sent in open

covers may be enclosed in bags of linen or other material, fastened in such a manner that they may be readily opened; or in bags entirely closed, provided that they be transparent, so that the officers of the Post Office may be able to satisfy themselves as to the nature of the contents.

The Packet may bear on the outside the address of the sender, in addition to the address of the person for whom it may be intended; also a trade mark and numbers, and the price of the article enclosed; *inside*, there must be no enclosure but the samples or patterns themselves; the particulars however of the trade marks, numbers and price, may be marked on the articles themselves, instead of on the outside of the Packet, at the option of the sender.

Any sample or pattern Packet containing a letter, or otherwise violating the conditions of the preceding rules, will be rated and treated as a letter.

The rate of one cent. per ounce is to be pre paid by postage stamp, and, if such rate be not fully pre-paid by the stamps affixed, the Packet is to be rated with the deficient postage and a fine of five cents in addition.

Packets of samples and patterns may be registered on pre-payment by postage stamp of a registration fee of 5 cents in addition to the postage rate, and provided such Packets be duly handed in to the post office for registration.

No Packet of samples or patterns must exceed 24 oz.

These regulations apply only to the transmission of Packets of samples and patterns within the Dominion of Canada, and will not in any manner interfere with the regulations governing the exchange of samples and patterns with the United Kingdom, or with the foreign countries to which the same advantage extends, namely, France, Belgium, Italy, German States, Netherlands, Portugal, Switzerland, and Denmark.

No provision as yet exists for the exchange of such matter with the other British Colonies, with the U. S. or with other foreign countries than those above named.

Book and newspaper manuscript, and printers' proofsheets (whether corrected or not), maps, prints, drawings, engravings, photographs when not on glass or in cases containing glass, and sheet music (whether printed or written), may pass in covers open at the ends or sides, and provided that no letter, or other communication intended to serve the purpose of a letter, be enclosed therein, on pre-payment, when posted in Canada, by postage stamp of the ordinary printed matter rate of one cent. per ounce; or upon payment of that rate on delivery of such matter when received in the mails from the United States.

POSTAGE OF BOOKS, PATTERNS AND SAMPLES.

Patterns of merchandises, and samples, may be forwarded between Canada and the United Kingdom, France, Italy, German States, Netherlands, Portugal, Switzerland, and Denmark, by the Canadian Packet mails, at book post rates, and subject to the following conditions:

There must be no writing or printing other than the address of the person for whom the packet is intended, the manufacturer's or trade mark and number, and price of the article.

Any infringement of the above regulations will render the packet liable to be treated and charged as a letter.

Samples of seeds, drugs, and similar articles intended for delivery within the United Kingdom, are now allowed to be sent in bags entirely closed, provided such bags be transparent, so that the officers of the Post Office may be able to satisfy themselves of the contents.

The rule which prohibited the transmission through the Post, as patterns, of articles of cutlery, &c., has been rescinded; and scissors, knives, razors, forks, steel pens, nails, keys, watch machinery, metal tubing, pieces of metal or ore, and such like articles, are now allowed to be forwarded by the Post as samples, provided they be packed and guarded in so secure a manner as to afford complete protection to the contents of the mail bags, and to the persons of the officers of the Post Office. Such articles, however, must be so packed that they may be easily examined; and it is made a rule that any packet containing such articles, which may be found to be insufficiently guarded, shall not be forwarded through the Post.

None of the articles named in the next preceding paragraph may be sent as patterns or samples to any place abroad, except Germany, Belgium, and the British Colonies, and not to these places when addressed *via* France.

PATTERNS, LIMIT OF SIZE AND WEIGHT.

The limits of weight and size are as follows:— If for Canada, 24 oz.; the United Kingdom, 24 oz.; France, 36 oz.; Germany, 8 oz.; the Kingdom of Italy,

36 oz.; Belgium, 8 oz.; the Netherlands, 16 oz.; Portugal, 16 oz.; the Azores, 16 oz.; Madeira, 16 oz.; Denmark, 48 oz.; Switzerland, 48 oz.

If for Canada or the United Kingdom, 24 inches in length and 12 inches in breadth or depth. If, for France, Portugal, the Azores, or Madeira, 18 inches in length and 12 inches in breadth or depth. If for Germany, the Kingdom of Italy, Belgium, the Netherlands, Denmark, or Switzerland, 24 inches in length and 12 inches in breadth or depth.

Any infringement of the conditions laid down as above will render the packet liable to be treated and charged as a letter.

Bags entirely closed, even though they may be transparent, must not be used for the transmission of seeds to foreign parts.

No prints or printed matter will be allowed to pass by book post between the United Kingdom and Canada, unless printed on paper, parchment or vellum.

MONEY ORDERS IN ONTARIO AND QUEBEC.

All the Money Order Post Offices in Ontario, Quebec and New Brunswick, are authorized to draw Money Orders on each other for any sum up to \$100, and for as many Orders of \$100 each as the Applicant may require, upon the following terms, viz.:—in Ontario and Quebec,

Table with 2 columns: Amount and Rate. Rows include: On Orders up to \$10 (5 cents), Over \$10 and up to \$20 (10 do.), Do. 20 do. (20 do.), Do. 40 do. (30 do.), Do. 60 do. (40 do.), Do. 80 do. (50 do.)

In New Brunswick, the rate of commission is 5c. for each \$10 or fraction thereof.

MONEY ORDERS ON THE UNITED KINGDOM.

The Money Order Offices throughout the Dominion also draw upon all the Money Order Offices in England, Ireland and Scotland, and the Channel Islands, for any sum up to £10 sterling, and grant as many Orders for £10 sterling each as may be needed to make up the amount to be remitted. The terms are as under:—

MONEY ORDERS ON THE LOWER PROVINCES.

The Money Order Offices in Ontario, Quebec and New Brunswick, draw also upon the Money Order Offices in Nova Scotia, Prince Edward Island and Newfoundland. The Orders, like those of the United Kingdom, are made payable in sterling money, and for sums up to £10 sterling. The terms are:—

The Money Order Post Offices are furnished with Lists of all the Money Order Offices in the United Kingdom, Ontario, Quebec, Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, Prince Edward Island, and Newfoundland; and the Postmasters are instructed to afford every information in their power, in respect of the places upon which they draw, together with any other information relating to such issues as the intending Remitters may desire.

POST OFFICE SAVINGS BANKS.

The Post Office Savings Banks, established by statute in the last session of Parliament, commenced operations in Ontario and Quebec on the 1st April, 1868.

The direct security of the Dominion is given by the statute for all deposits made.

At each Savings Bank Post Office the regulations may be read by the public, giving full information with respect to the mode of depositing and withdrawing money, and these regulations are printed on the cover of the Pass Book supplied to each depositor.

Any person may have a deposit account, and deposits are received daily, during the ordinary hours of Post Office business, of any number of dollars, from \$1 up to \$300, the total amount which can be received from a depositor in any one year, except in cases to be specially authorized by the Postmaster General.

The Postmasters of Savings Banks will act as agents for the receipt of the money deposited for transmission to the Postmaster General, and for the payment by the Postmaster General of money withdrawn by depositors.

Each depositor is supplied with a pass book, and the sums paid in, or withdrawn, are entered therein by the

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Postmaster receiving or paying the same. In addition, a direct receipt for each amount paid in, is sent to the depositor from the Postmaster General, and the Postmaster General will issue a cheque, payable at any Post Office Savings Bank desired, for any sum withdrawn.

Every depositor's account is thus kept with the Postmaster General, and a depositor may pay into his or her account with the Post Office Savings Bank, at any of the Savings Bank Post Offices which at the time may best suit his convenience, and may exercise the same choice in drawing out money, subject only to the obligation of producing the pass book, in proof of identity—whenever paying in or drawing out money.

Interest at the rate of 4 per cent. per annum is allowed on deposits lying in the ordinary deposit accounts, but when a depositor has \$100 deposited, he or she may request the Postmaster General to transfer this sum to a special account, and will then receive a certificate of such special \$100 deposit, bearing interest at 5 per cent. per annum.

Postmasters are forbidden by law to disclose the name of any depositor, or the amount of any sum deposited or withdrawn.

No charge will be made to depositors on paying in, or drawing out money, nor for postage on communications with the Postmaster General in relation thereto.

The Postmaster General will be always ready to receive and attend to all applications, complaints, or other communications addressed to him by depositors or others, relative to Post Office Savings Bank matters.

Additional Post Offices will from time to time be authorized to act as Savings Bank agencies.

POSTAGE STAMPS.

Postage Stamps are provided for sale of the respective values of 1 cent for Newspapers; 2 cents for Prices Current and Periodicals for the United Kingdom; 3 cents for ordinary Dominion Letters; 6 cents for United States rate; 1 1/2 cents for Canadian Packet; and 15 cents for Cunard Packet.

PENAL CLAUSES.

To steal, embezzle, secrete or destroy any post letter, shall be felony; punishable in the discretion of the court by imprisonment in the Penitentiary, for not less than three nor more than five years; unless such post letter contains any chattel, money or valuable security, in which case the offence shall be punishable by imprisonment in the Penitentiary for life, or for a period not less than five years.

To steal a post letter bag, or a post letter from a post letter bag, or a post letter from any post office, or from any officer or person employed in the Canada post office, or from a mail—or to stop a mail with intent to rob or search the same—shall be felony; punishable by imprisonment in the Penitentiary for life, or for a period not less than five years.

To open unlawfully any post letter bag—or unlawfully to take any letter out of such bag—shall be felony; punishable by imprisonment in said Penitentiary for five years.

To steal, embezzle or secrete any parcel sent by parcel post, or any article contained in any such parcel, shall be felony; punishable by imprisonment in the Penitentiary for a period of not less than three years.

To receive any post letter, or post letter bag, or any chattel, money, or valuable security, parcel or other thing, the stealing, taking, secreting or embezzling whereof is hereby made felony, knowing the same to have been feloniously stolen, taken, secreted or embezzled, shall be felony; punishable by imprisonment in the Penitentiary for any term not less than five years,—and the offender may be indicted and convicted either as an accessory after the fact or for a substantive felony, and in the latter case whether the principal felon hath or hath not been previously convicted, or is or is not amenable to justice. And however such receiver be convicted, the offence shall be punishable as aforesaid.

To forge, counterfeit or imitate any postage stamp issued or used under the authority of this act, or by or under the authority of the government or proper authority of the United Kingdom, or of any British North American Province, or of any Foreign Country,—or knowingly to use any such forged, counterfeited or imitated stamp,—or to engrave, cut, sink or make any plate, die, or other thing whereby to forge, counterfeit or imitate such stamp or any part or portion thereof,—or to have possession of any such plate, die or other thing as aforesaid, except by the permission in writing of the Postmaster General, or of some officer or person who, under regulations made in

that behalf, may lawfully grant such permission,—or to forge, counterfeit or unlawfully imitate, use or affix, to or upon any letter or packet, any stamp, signature, initials or other mark or sign purporting that such letter or packet ought to pass free of postage, or at a lower rate of postage, or that the postage thereon or any part thereof hath been prepaid or ought to be paid by or charged to any person, department or party whomsoever,—shall be felony; punishable by imprisonment in the Penitentiary for life, or for a period not less than five years, and to such felony all the provisions of any Act respecting Forgery shall apply as if such offences were made felony under that act, in so far as the provisions thereof are not inconsistent with this Act, and the accessories to any such offences shall be punishable accordingly.

To forge, counterfeit or imitate any post office money order, or advice of such money order, or post office savings bank depositor's book, or authority of the Postmaster General for repayment of a post office savings bank deposit, or of any part thereof,—or any signature or writing in or upon any post office money order, money order advice, post office savings bank depositor's book, or authority of Postmaster General, for repayment of a post office savings bank deposit, or any part thereof, with intent to defraud, shall be a felony; punishable by imprisonment in the Penitentiary for any term not less than two years and not exceeding seven years, and the accessories to any such offence shall be punishable accordingly.

To enclose in or with any letter, packet or other mailable matter sent by post, or to put into any post office any explosive, dangerous or destructive substance or liquid, or any matter or thing likely to injure any letter or other mailable matter, or the person of any officer or servant of the post office, shall be a misdemeanor, unless such offence is or shall be by law constituted a crime of greater magnitude.

To enclose a letter or letters, or any writing intended to serve the purpose of a letter, in a parcel posted for the parcel post, or in a packet of samples or patterns posted to pass at the rate of postage applicable to samples and patterns, or to inclose a letter or any writing to serve the purpose of a letter, or to enclose any other thing, in a newspaper posted to pass as a newspaper, at the rate of postage applicable to newspapers (except in the case of the accounts and receipts of newspaper publishers, which are permitted to pass folded within the newspapers sent by them to their subscribers), or to enclose a letter or any writing intended to serve the purpose of a letter in any mail matter sent by post not being a letter, shall in each case be an offence punishable by a penalty of not less than ten and not exceeding forty dollars in each case.

To remove with fraudulent intent from any letter, newspaper or other mailable matter, sent by post, any postage stamp which shall have been affixed thereon, or wilfully with intent aforesaid remove from any postage stamp which shall have been previously used, any mark which shall have been made thereon at any post office, shall be a misdemeanor.

It shall not be lawful for any person other than a postmaster to exercise the business of selling postage stamps or stamped envelopes to the public, unless duly licensed so to do by the Postmaster General and under such conditions as he may prescribe; and any person who shall violate this provision by selling postage stamps or stamped envelopes to the public without a license from the Postmaster General, shall, on conviction before a justice of the peace, incur a penalty of not exceeding forty dollars for each offence.

If any person wilfully or maliciously injures or destroys any street letter box, pillar box, or other receptacle established by authority of the Postmaster General, for the deposit of letters or other mailable matter, such person shall on conviction be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, punishable by fine or imprisonment or both, in the discretion of the court before which the offender is convicted, and every person who aids, abets, counsels or procures the commission of this offence, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and be indictable and punishable as a principal offender.

If any person uses or attempts to use in preparation of postage on any letter or mailable matter posted in this Dominion, any postage stamp which has been before used for a like purpose, such person shall be subject to a penalty of not less than ten and not exceeding forty dollars for every such offence, and the letter or other mailable matter on which such stamp has been so improperly used may be detained, or in the discretion of the Postmaster General forwarded to its destination charged with double postage.

On every promissory note, draft, or bill of exchange, not less than \$25, 1 cent; over \$25 to \$50, 2 cents; over \$50 to \$100, 3 cents.
 On every promissory note, draft, or bill of exchange, executed singly, for the first \$100, 3 cents; for every additional \$100, or fraction of a \$100, 3 cents.
 On every draft or bill of exchange executed in duplicate, for the first \$100, 2 cents; for every additional \$100, or fraction thereof, 2 cents.
 On every draft or bill of exchange executed in more than two parts, for each part for the first \$100, 1 cent; for every additional \$100, or fraction thereof, 1 cent.

The duties to be paid by stamps affixed to each Promissory Note, Draft, or Bill of Exchange; but the person affixing such stamp shall, at the time of affixing the same, write or stamp thereon the date at which it is affixed, and each stamp shall be held *prima facie* to have been affixed at the date stamped or written thereon, and, if no date be so stamped or written thereon, such adhesive stamp shall be of no avail.
 Penalty for neglecting to affix stamps, or for wilfully writing or stamping a false date thereon \$10.
 The Governor in Council may direct stamped paper to be prepared for the purposes of this Act.

PRACTICE COURT AND CHAMBERS.—One of the Common Law Judges holds a Court during each Term, called the "Practice Court," for hearing matters relating to the adding or justifying bail, discharging insolvent debtors, administering oaths, hearing and determining matters out of motion, and making rules and orders in causes and business depending in either of said law courts. Chambers are held each day in Common Law and Chancery by one of the Judges of the said courts, for such business relating to suits therein as may be transacted by a single judge out of court. Routine business in Chancery Chambers, by a recent order, is also taken before T. W. Taylor, the Judges' Secretary. *Clerk, Common Law Chambers*—W. B. Heward. *Reporter Common Law Chambers*—Henry O'Brien. *Reporter Chancery Chambers*—Charles W. Cooper.

HEIR AND DEVISEE COURT.—Commissioners, the Judges of the Superior Courts, and such other persons as may be appointed by commission under the Great Seal. Their duties are to determine claims to lands in Upper Canada, for which no patent has issued from the Crown in favour of the proper claimants, whether as heirs, devisees or assignees. Sitings at Toronto, first Monday in January and July in each year. *Clerk of Commissioners*, W. B. Heward.

COUNTY COURTS.—Presided over by a resident Judge in each county. Their jurisdiction extends to all personal actions where the debt or damages claimed do not exceed £50; and to all suits relating to debt, covenant or contract, where the amount is ascertained by the acts of the parties or signature of the defendant, to £100; and to all

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ball bonds and recognizances of bail given in the County Court, to any amount; but not to cases involving the title to lands, validity of wills, or actions for libel, slander, crim. con., or seduction. An appeal lies to either of the Superior Courts of Law. These Courts also possess equity powers, to the amount of £50, subject to an appeal to Chancery.

SURROGATE COURTS.—The jurisdiction of these Courts relates to all testamentary matters and causes, and to the granting or revoking of probate of wills, and letters of administration of the effects of deceased persons having estate or effects in Upper Canada, and all matters arising out of or connected with the grant or revocation of probate or administration, subject to an appeal to the Court of Chancery. The County Judges are also Judges of the Surrogate Courts. *Surrogate Clerk, Sir J. L. Robinson, Bart.*

COURTS OF QUARTER SESSIONS.—Chairman, the County Judge in each county, who, with one or more Justices of the Peace, holds a Court of Quarter Sessions in his county four times a year for trials by jury in cases of felony and misdemeanor, but treason and capital felonies are exempted from their jurisdiction.

RECORDERS' COURTS.—In the Cities of Toronto, Hamilton, London, Kingston, and Ottawa, the Recorders' Court takes the place of the County Sessions, the Justices for Counties having no jurisdiction in the Cities—the care of which is confided to the Recorder, Mayor, Aldermen and Police Magistrate of each. Sessions held first Monday in March, June and September, and third Monday in December. *Recorders*—George Duggan, Toronto; James O'Reilly, Kingston; John E. Start, Hamilton; William Horton, London; J. B. Lewis, Ottawa.

INSOLVENT DEBTORS' COURTS.—By the "Insolvent Acts of 1864 and 1865," 27 & 28 Victoria, cap. 57, and 29 Vic. cap. 18, provision is made "for the settlement of the estates of insolvent debtors, for giving effect to arrangements between them and their creditors, and for the punishment of fraud." In the Province of Quebec, this enactment applies to traders only. In the Province of Ontario, to all persons whether traders or non-traders. In these courts, the county court judge in each county presides—the only appointments made in pursuance of this statute being those of "official assignees," who are to be nominated "by the Board of Trade at any place, or the council thereof, within the county or district in which such Board of Trade exists, or in any county or district adjacent thereto in which there is no Board of Trade."

DIVISION COURTS.—For the summary disposal of cases by a Judge; but a jury of five persons may be demanded in certain cases. Their jurisdiction extends to actions of debt or contract amounting to £25; injuries or torts to personal chattels amounting to £10; and personal actions to that amount, if not excepted from their jurisdiction; but not to actions for gambling debts, liquors drunk in a tavern, or notes of hand given therefor, ejectment, title to land, &c., or any toll, custom or franchise, will or settlement, malicious prosecution, libel, slander, crim. con., seduction or breach of promise, or actions against a J. P. for anything done by him in the execution of his office, if he objects to it. Each judicial district is divided into court divisions, and courts are held once in two months in each division, or oftener, at the discretion of the Judge. The Divisions are established by the Courts of Quarter Sessions.

CLERK OF THE PROCESS.—For sealing and issuing Writs of Summons and other Writs in the Queen's Bench and Common Pleas (alternately)—Alan Cameron, *Assist. Clerk*—A. H. B. Wadsworth. The Deputy Clerks of the Crown in the several Counties are supplied with writs from Toronto, and re-issue the same in their respective counties.

Terms of the Courts.

APPEAL TERMS commence on the second Thursday next after Hilary, Easter and Michaelmas Terms.

LAW TERMS.—Hilary begins first Monday in February, and ends Saturday of the ensuing week; Easter begins 3rd Monday in May, and ends Saturday of the second week thereafter; Michaelmas begins third Monday in November and ends Saturday of the second week thereafter. By the act 24 & 30 Vic. cap. 40, Trinity Term, hitherto commencing on the Monday after the 21st August, is abolished; but the same statute gives power to the Courts of Queen's Bench and Common Pleas, at their discretion, to hold sittings in hanc in time of vacation (except long vacation), by virtue of a rule or order of the court, respectively to be made in or out of term, for the hearing of such special cases or rules for new trials as shall be named in a list to be attached to any such rule or order, and for giving of judgments in cases previously argued, and for disposing of such other business as the court in its discretion shall see fit. Notice of such rules to be given in form and manner prescribed by the act, six clear days before the day appointed. Long vacation extends from 1st July to 21st August.

CHANCERY TERMS.—*Examination Terms*—From 1st Tuesday of February to the Saturday after 2nd Tuesday of April; and from 1st Tuesday of September to the Saturday after 1st Tuesday of November. *Hearing Terms*—From 4th Monday in April until Saturday of the following week; and from 3rd Monday in November until Saturday of the following week. The Court also sits every Tuesday (except during the regular vacations) throughout the year, for hearing motions for Decrees, motions for or to dissolve special injunctions, and appeals from the reports of the Master or Deputy Masters. Long vacation from the 1st July to 21st August.

COUNTY COURT TERMS commence on the first Monday in Jan., April, July and Oct., and end the following Saturday.

Circuits of the Courts.

LAW CIRCUITS.—Courts of Assize and Nisi Prius and of Oyer and Terminer and General Gaol Delivery shall be held twice a year in each County or union of Counties, in the vacation between Hilary and Easter Terms, and between that period of the vacation after the 21st of August and Michaelmas Term, except in the County of the City of Toronto and the County of York, in each of which counties there shall be a third such Court in every year, in the vacation between Michaelmas and Hilary Terms. There are six Circuits, as follows, viz:—

The *Eastern*—Brockville, Cornwall, Kingston, L'Orignal, Ottawa, Pembroke, Perth. *Midland*—Belleville, Cobourg, Lindsay, Napanee, Peterboro', Picton, Whitby. *Niagara*—Barrie, Hamilton, Milton, Owen Sound, St. Catharines, Welland. *Oxford*—Berlin, Brantford, Cayuga, Guelph, Simcoe, Stratford, Woodstock. *Western*—Chatham, Goderich, London, Sandwich, Sarnia, St. Thomas, Walkerton. *Home*—Brampton, City of Toronto, County of York at Toronto.

The Courts in each Circuit shall be presided over by one of the Chief Justices or Judges of the Superior Courts, or, in their absence, by some one Judge of a County Court, or some one of Her Majesty's Counsel learned in the law, requested by any one of the Chief Justices or Judges of the Superior Courts to act in that behalf.

CHANCERY CIRCUITS.—For the Examination of Witnesses and Hearing Causes are held in the Spring and Fall of each year as follows:—

MEDICAL INSTITUTIONS AND SCHOOLS.

MEDICAL COUNCIL.—The act under which the Upper Canada Medical Board was constituted was repealed, in 1865, by the Medical Act of Upper Canada. The governing body of the medical profession in Ontario is now styled the General Council of Medical Education and Registration of Ontario. This Council is at present composed of twenty members; eight represent universities and medical schools, and twelve represent medical electoral divisions, and are elected by the registered medical men, every three years, residing within the limits of these divisions.

The same act which established the Medical Council authorized the publication of a list of the persons who were legally entitled to practice medicine in the Province of Ontario. This list is called the Medical Register for Ontario; and no person, whose name does not appear in that Register, is entitled to charge for any advice, or for any medicine which he shall have both prescribed and supplied. No one can collect fees in court for advice in either medicine, surgery, or midwifery, unless he be registered according to law, and his name be in the "list" of the current year. Nor can any unregistered person be appointed as medical officer, physician or surgeon in any branch of the public service, militia or otherwise, or to any hospital or other charitable institution not supported wholly by voluntary contributions; neither can any unregistered person give evidence (of a professional nature) before any coroner's or other court; nor is a certificate of lunacy valid from an unregistered person, nor any other certificate which the law requires from a physician or surgeon. Any person can obtain the "list" or "register" referred to by applying to the Registrar of the Medical Council—Dr. Strange of Hamilton—who will also give information upon the necessary steps to be taken to secure the registration of diplomas, and send forms for certificates, upon application.

The Sessions of the Normal School commences on the 8th of January and 8th of August, and close on the 16th of June and 16th of December in each year.

GRAMMAR SCHOOLS.—Each of those Schools (which form the intermediate link between the Common Schools and the Universities) is managed by a Board of Trustees appointed jointly by the County and Town Councils. In cities, the Trustees are all appointed by the City Council, except where there is only one School in the county. The head master must be a graduate of a British or Colonial University, unless certified and appointed before 18th September, 1865. Besides fees, local rates or contributions to the extent of half the government grant must be raised for the master's salary. The grant is payable to those schools only which attain a certain standard, and is based on the average attendance of pupils in the prescribed studies. An extra grant is provided for masters taking certain Meteorological observations and giving military instruction. Pupils attending these Schools are prepared for matriculation in the Universities. There were 102 Grammar Schools, with 5,096 pupils, in Ontario, in 1867. Rev. J. G. D. Mackenzie, M.A., Inspector of Grammar Schools.

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PUBLIC SCHOOL LIBRARIES.—Each School and Municipal Corporation, desirous of establishing Free Public Libraries, is aided by the Educational Department granting 100 per cent. on local appropriations, and supplying books from the Depository in connexion with the Department. Up to the end of Dec. 1867, about 1,035 Libraries had been thus established, with 221,037 volumes.

EDUCATIONAL MUSEUM.—Connected with the Educational Department is a Museum, containing specimens of School apparatus and furniture; a valuable collection of Italian, Dutch and Flemish Oil Paintings and Statuary casts and busts. The Museum is freely open to the public, from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.

THE TOTAL NUMBER OF EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS of all kinds reported by the Educational Department as in operation in the Province of Ontario during 1867, was 4,855, attended by 410,812 pupils, and expending \$2,127,568 in their support.

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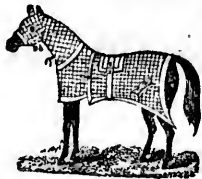

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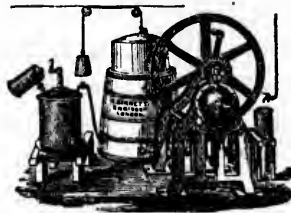

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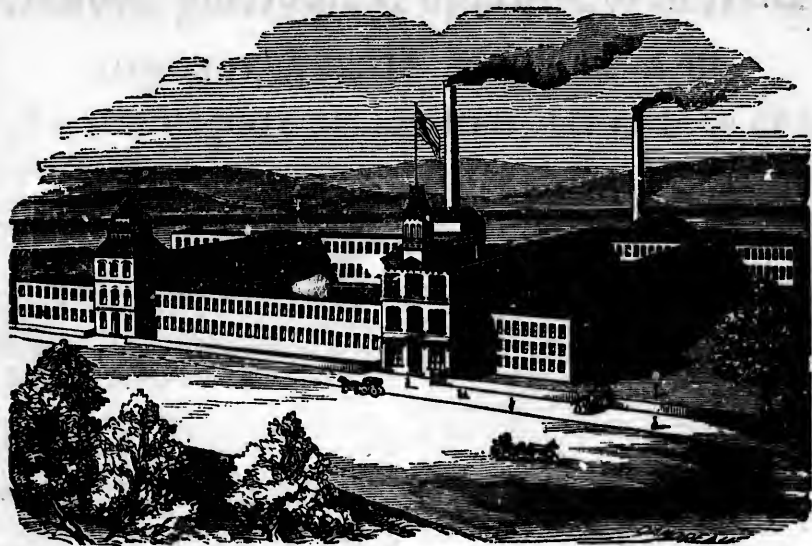
