

4 WF from VC-83 and 4 WF from VC-88 on station at assigned orbit point near Iwo Jima were directed to make rocket and straf-ing attacks against target areas 251 P and 250 T.

The VF made six runs against the target area. One plane of this squadron had HVARP and fired two on each of first two runs! Many caves and mortar positions were heavily strafed with the results elwewhere noted. The Air Coordinator reported the attack as very good.

No AA was encountered.
